"It gets bigger and better every year," says Festival Co-Chair Carina Ramirez-Johnson. "There's so much activity and there are so many things going on that we have to keep track of, but we make sure everything goes well. I love it when people come to the festival and say, You ladies put this huge festival on every year with this much detail and passion and you pulled it off.' They're in awe."

For the Almaden Valley Women's Club, the festival is the culmination of a year's work. "It's an amazing thing to go through the process leading up to the festival and finally come to that day," says Ramirez-Johnson. "It's like waiting to take a trip somewhere and you're so excited—you've worked hard for it and you can't wait—and then it's finally here. You have so many emotions throughout the day. It's all of our blood, sweat and tears that goes into the festival and upwards of 20,000 people attend. By the end of the day, you take a deep breath and say we did it again and we'll be able to give back to our community.'

The festival began about 40 years ago when members of the Almaden Valley Women's Club wanted to create a lasting community-oriented event committed to raising funds for organizations in Almaden Valley. "It was built on the backs of previous Women's Club members," says former Vice Mayor and Women's Club member Pat Dando. "They were the original Almaden Valley community activists that wanted to work to improve their local community for their children and their families." Dando credits the festival's longevity to the strength of the women that have been involved in the organization all these years. "The

Women's Club is small in number but mighty in the talent, time and energy," she says.

Revenue raised at the festival was initially allocated for schools and programs in Almaden Valley; the first major purchases were a Jaws of Life for the Almaden fire station and a piano for the Almaden Community Center. As the festival became more successful, the Women's Club decided to assist organizations throughout San Jose and Santa Clara County. At the same time, the festival remains a community event. "As big as it gets, it's important to keep a down-home neighborhood feel," says Dando.

"It's a great opportunity for local schools to show off the talent of their students from designing logos to the children participating in the entertainment. That's what gives it a special flair, as compared with other festivals."

In addition to entertainment at the main stage and Kid's Fun Zone ranging from bands to cheer and dance teams, children can enjoy rock climbing, inflatables, carnival games and gymnastics.

"We always try to include school students in our entertainment and highlight them in our festival," says Ramirez-Johnson. "We include cheer groups from local high See ART & WINE, page 6



The Festival opens at 10 a.m. on Sunday, Sept.

The weather is forecast is calling for temperatures in the mid 80's, great news for the Festival which has experienced some very hot temperatures during its 40 year run.

Almaden adult ESL classes marks 13th year anniversary

his year marks the 13th anniversary of the sponsorship of adult ESL Classes held in Almaden.



schools and have a local high school student sing *The Star-Spangled Banner*. We have many bands that return year after year. This year, we're pushing to have high school music groups play between acts. It's fun and they get to showcase their talents on a big stage."

"We're really excited. We have a great lineup," says Festival Entertainment Chair Linda Stone. Three Miss California teens will Emcee the festival, including Athenna Crosby who attended Leland High School, and Councilmember Johnny Khamis is speaking around noon. "People from our community come together to celebrate and participate so we can raise money for local charities," says Stone. "It's a win-win situation. We have something for everybody. There's the Kid's Fun Zone, about 90 artisans, music for children and adults, great beer and wine, local food vendors and more than 120 student volunteers helping at the festival."

The Women's Club reaches out to local schools and art programs to ask students to develop a logo for the festival, which is featured on the commemorative glasses. "We've had beautiful submissions and it's terribly difficult to pick one," says Festival Co-Chair Ellen Hudson-Snyder. This year's logo contestants include: Jacqueline Toh, Galen Ducker, Tifani Ebrahimi, Diana Wong and Miki Kinoshita. Ebrahimi is this year's winner.

When the Women's Club first started talking about having an art and wine festival, says Dando, they visited local wineries to see if they could convince them to participate. One winery looked at the three or four women and said, "It sounds like you're a group of Almaden women who want to do a little wine tasting." They told him that it was something they wanted to continue for 15 to 20 years to support local schools and organizations. "You're gambling people will want to come," he said, "especially in Almaden, which is removed from the city at large." They asked him to take a chance and support them that year, and if it didn't pay off, they'd reconsider. "Obviously, it did," says Dando. "It was gangbusters from the beginning."

"The first year was successful and the second year was wildly successful," says Dando. "We had grossly underestimated the amount of ice we needed to keep the wine cold and it was a very hot day. My husband ran to every grocery store to buy every bag of ice he could." He also went downtown to a San Jose ice company and bought a ton of ice from them. "It was a major catastrophe but we sur-

vived and not many people knew we had a problem with the ice," she says. "That's the success of solving a problem; it's when people don't even know you've had it."

Sponsorship can also be a challenge. "We have some sponsors who have been with us forever," says Ramirez-Johnson, "but when others struggle financially, we have to find new sponsors." They also have to pay fees to the city for services such as police, security, fire and equipment. "As the fees go up, it makes it harder for us," says Ramirez-Johnson, "and we have to have more sponsors to cover the cost."

The festivals ongoing sponsors are extremely appreciated by the Women's Club. "Bloomster's is one of those community businesses that have stayed so committed," says Dando. "They support the festival not only monetarily, but also hand out their beautiful sunflowers every year. That's one of the touches that makes the festival so successful; when people support it, they're all in."

Other ongoing sponsors include: Jackie Jones, Almaden Times, 95120 Almaden Lifestyle Magazine, Amato Pizza and Skip's Tire and Auto Centers.

The Women's Club tries to allocate funds for every organization that applies for a grant. "At the end of the day, when we have our net profits, it all goes back to the community," says Ramirez-Johnson. "We earmark a certain amount for scholarships for graduating seniors and the rest of the money goes out to the grantees. The amount varies on their need and what we have available." In addition to local schools, some of the organizations which receive these community grants include: Almaden Valley Counseling Services, Animal Assisted Happiness, Assistance League of San Jose, Child Advocates of Silicon Valley, Family Supportive Housing, Kara Grief Support, Loaves & Fishes, Martha's Kitchen, Next Door Solutions and Turning Wheels for Kids.

"This year, we've had grant recipients come back to our meetings and talk about what they do with the funds," says Hudson-Snyder. "It's been very meaningful."

The festival features a wide variety of artists and craft vendors. Long-term participants include: Nan's Gourmet Foods (blended olive oils, flavored pasta and grilling sauces), Irma Longley (canvas artist featuring flowers, birds, churches and people), Elegant Toes (toe and thumb rings and anklets), Rita Johnson (elegant jewelry made with semi-precious stones) and Ben Leone "Flash Back" (pop and rock artwork).

There are many new artists as well, with Continued on next page

works ranging from leather journals to robes and scarves. Joji Creations, which was new last year, is a favorite of Artist's Festival Chair Sue Datta's. "Kyle Joji is 27 and autistic and sews with his mother to make market bags and iMesh bags," she says. "I love their love of life and love for each other."

Local artists include: Ben Leone "Flash Back," Fredericks Field; (lotions, soaps, lavender bundles), Katy Dolmatch (city and landscape photography), Diane Washington (homemade soaps), Jeanine Meininger (ceramics) and Uncorked Decor (lighted bottle art).

"The community loves all the different art work," says Datta. "Some to buy and decorate their homes with and others to admire the workmanship of the artists. Many fill their Christmas lists here at the festival."

Wine from local vineyards and premium beer are featured at the festival and served in commemorative souvenir glasses. Partnering with the festival are: David Bruce Winery, Clos LaChance Winery, Winery, Gianelli Vineyards, J. Lohr Vineyards, Leal Vineyards, Martin Ranch Winery, Rombauer Vineyards and DBI Beverage.

Food offerings include Carmen's Taqueria, Asian fusion from Cross Hatch Eatery, Mayuri Indian Cuisine, pizza from Oak & Rye, Falafel Fresh Food Truck, Posh Bagel, fish tacos from Shark Bait and chicken wings from West Wing.

This year's silent auction includes artwork by Salvador Dali, Picasso and Chagall, autographed sports memorabilia, designer jewelry, kayaking at Moss Landing and a vacation getaway to Lake

In 2014, the Women's Club honored Dando's contributions on the festival's stage. "It was wonderful having the chance to hear her stories about the club and what the festival meant to her," says Ramirez-Johnson. "I was very touched to have her there."

"Of the many organizations I've been involved with in my career," says Dando, "I can't think of any that I value more than the Almaden Valley Women's Club. With the quality of the women and their dedication, hard work and commitment to make things happen, it's been a real honor to be involved with that group through the years."

Ramirez-Johnson agrees. "It's a

wonderful group of women, past and present," she says. "It's an opportunity to work together and do something great for the community," says Hudson-Snyder. "It's been a pleasure to work with everyone who's stepped up to work on the festival."

"We've been able to bring families out to enjoy a beautiful day and the surroundings, from the arts to good food and games for children," says Dando. "Whenever the Almaden Art & Wine Festival comes around, there's always a special place in my heart for it. I hope this is another special year and I'm sure it will be."

"I hope the people who attend the festival

have a fabulous time," says Hudson-Synder. "I hope they enjoy the wine and entertainment, that their kids have a great time in the Kid's Zone bouncing in the jumpy house and taking shots at the San Jose Barracuda's net. I hope

they have a tasty meal and listen to great music and have a wonderful day. When they leave. I want them to know that their participation has helped make Almaden a better place.'

Just what is a contract, anyway?

This week's question:

I have often wondered just what is a contact. I do not have any contractual problems right now, but I am really curious about the legal definition of a contract. Please address this issue in one of your future columns. Thanks.

Dear Denise:

That sounds like a very simple question, Denise, but volumes have been written about that word. In law school, one of the important courses in the first year in this country is

The California Civil Code (herein "C.C.") Section 1549 defines a contract as "an agreement to do or not to do a certain thing.'

Almaden Times readers can go to their computers and enter any of the California Civil Code sections in their favorite search engine and that particular section will be up on their monitors in a heartbeat.

It is essential to the existence of a contract that there should be: 1. Parties capable of contracting; 2. Their consent; 3. A lawful object; and, 4. A sufficient cause or consideration, according to C.C. Section 1550. (This section, by the way, was adopted by the State Legislature in 1872; yes, that's 1872.)

You may also wonder about just who is capable of entering into a contract. That question is answered in C.C. Section 1556

that provides "All persons are capable of contracting, except minors, persons of unsound mind, and persons deprived of civil rights".

Two people can enter into a contract for the benefit of a third person and the third person may enforce that contract at any time before the contracting parties rescind it, pursuant to C.C. Section 1559.

According to Witkin. Summary of California Law, Tenth Edition, Contracts, p. 59, the word "contract" is often used with different meanings, e.g., as a synonym for "agreement" or "bargain." It may refer to legally ineffective agreements, or wholly executed

transactions; to acts of parties, to a document that evidences them, or to resulting legal relations; and a statute may give still other mean-

You will note in the third paragraph of this response above that "consideration" is essential to the existence of a contract. Consideration is covered in Chapter 5 of the California Civil Code, starting with Section

It provides that any benefit conferred, or

agreed to be conferred, upon the promisor, by any other person, to which the promisor is not lawfully entitled, or any prejudice suffered, or agreed to be suffered, by such person, other than such as he is at the time of consent lawfully bound to suffer, as an inducement to the promisor, is a good consideration for a promise.

> Of course, the consideration of a contract must be lawful, i.e., not contrary to an express provision of law, not contrary to the policy of express law, though not expressly prohibited, and not otherwise contrary to good morals, according to C.C. 1667.

There are, of course, many different types of contracts. A contract is either express or implied. An express contract is one, the terms of which are stated in words. An implied contract is one, the existence and terms of which are manifested by conduct, according to C.C. Sections 1619 to 1621.

Pursuant to C.C. Section 1622, all contracts may be oral. except such as are specially required by

statute to be in writing. If the contract is required by law to be in

writing, if it is prevented from being put into writing by the fraud of a party to the contract, any other party who is by such fraud led to believe that it is in writing, and acts upon such belief to his prejudice, may enforce it against the fraudulent party.

One of the more recent additions to the California Civil Code concerning contracts is

Title 2.5, entitled "Electronic Transactions". It is known as the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act and it was passed into law in 1999.

Said Act provides new or expanded definitions of such things as "Agreements", "Automated transactions", and "Computer programs." Under Section 1633.2(e), "Electronic" means relating to technology having electrical, digital, magnetic, wireless, optical, electromagnetic, or similar capabili-

Under that same law in 1633.2(f), "Electronic agent" means a computer program or an electronic or other automated means used independently to initiate an action or respond to electronic records or performances in whole or in part, without review by an individual.

So, you can see, Denise, that the definition of a "Contract" is very broad and has many implications and much involvement with other areas of the law, such as family law, property rights and obligations, criminal law, and much, much more. I wish we had more time and space to address those issues.

Thank you for contacting us with that very good question.

ony Bennett is celebrating his 90th birthday with a tour and he has scheduled a stop in San Jose at the City National Civic on Nov. 5, 2016.


According to Tony's spokesperson, San Jose will be the only scheduled tour stop in Northern California.






