One of the most popular seasonal festivals in recent years is returning to Perry Hall this weekend, Sept. 17 and 18, from 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. each day.

The annual Perry Hall Apple Festival, co-hosted by Chapel Hills Farm and Nursery and the Perry Hall Improvement Association, has grown in both attendance and offerings over the years becoming more like their own town fair, especially since the official Perry Hall Town Fair moved out of the area.

This growing popularity coupled with good weather led people in and around Perry Hall to flock to the festival by the thousands last year, according to Russell Berk, owner of Chapel Hills.

Unfortunately, the high attendance also led to some long lines for the more popular activities. But Berk says he has prepared for that this year, adding more cashiers and ticket booth attendants where necessary.

"We'll be ready with everything this year," Berk said. He added that he is just hoping for good weather again to be able to replicate last year's turnout.

But with the weather forecast as of Tuesday calling for temperatures in the upper 70s, partial sunshine and a low chance of precipitation, that should not be a problem.

Parking and admittance to the festival are free as always, and mainstay activities of sack races, pony rides, hay rides and other great offerings will, of course, be available.

The Masters of the Chainsaw will also attend the festival, showing off their chainsaw skills and creating beautiful

### MR. TRUMP GOES TO DUNDALK

The excitement was palpable all throughout the day on Monday, Sept. 12, as rumors of a Donald Trump visit to east Baltimore County swirled. And when his motorcade arrived in front of Boulevard Diner in Dundalk, a crowd of hundreds, both inside and outside the diner, erupted.

Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump's visit to Dundalk marks the first time a presidential candidate has visited the east side since Democratic nominee Jesse Jackson visited the steelworker's union in 1984.

"When Donald J. Trump comes to Dundalk, that speaks extreme volumes about how much things have changed in this area," said Delegate Ric Metzgar. "I never would have expected him to visit here. Things have changed so much around these parts, and it's apparent."

The crowd gathered at Boulevard Diner adorned "Make America Great Again" hats and held signs that read, "The Silent Majority Supports Trump." But anyone inside around the diner yesterday can tell you there was nothing silent about

One Sparrows Point resident stated that he'd taken off from work as soon as he heard that Trump was going to be in the area, a sentiment echoed by many throughout the gathering.

"He's an absolute rock star," he said. "But more than that, he wants to help make this country right again. We've slipped in recent years, and we need to get steady. And I think Trump is the only one that can help us get to where we need to be as a nation.'

Trump was in Baltimore on Monday to address the National Guard Association of the United States at the Convention Center. Outside on Pratt Street, Trump

### Marshy Point Fall Festival features loads of activities from around the area

Marshy Point Nature Center in Middle River will hold its ninth annual Fall Festival on Saturday, Sept. 24, from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m., featuring endless fun for the whole family.

Some of the main attractions of this year's festival include live music, apple cider pressing, children's crafts and games, early American life demonstrations, canoe rides, Chesapeake Bay retriever demonstrations, beekeeper demonstrations and honey for sale, as well as the fourth installment of the Marsh Mucker obstacle course for kids.

"It's fun; kids enjoy climbing around

and getting muddy," said Ben Porter, lead naturalist for the center.

The obstacle course will be held back along some of the nature center's trails, "but everything [else] is really pretty well located right out in front of the nature center or indoors," Porter said.

One of Marshy Point's largest events, the Fall Festival also functions as a fundraiser, helping to care for the nature center's animals, maintain its facilities and trails and create different exhibits and interactive activities at the center. So while admission and parking for the event are free, some of the activities do have associated costs, such as the scarecrow

stuffing and pumpkin painting.

"Everything that we raise at the event benefits the nature center and our environmental education programs, animals and exhibits," Porter explained.

Also part of the festival will be DeJon Vineyards, waxsmith demonstrations, various craft vendors, birds of prey such as owls and hawks, wood carvers and the Bowleys Quarters Volunteer Fire Department with some of their equipment for visitors to see.

"We've packed a lot of activities into the area around the nature center, and we're going to definitely fill the park," Porter commented. He added that their main goals are to give people a good time and get the word out about "Marshy Point back here in the woods" so people will come back and visit again.

Porter also pointed out that the nature center is currently looking into how to build a "bird corner" exhibit around the osprey camera that launched this year in the spring.

"It's kind of going in in stages, but the idea is to devote that whole corner of the building to bird corner things about nests and eggs for eagles and ospreys,"

The camera, which allowed anyone around the world to get an up-close look at an osprey nest on Dundee Creek in real time via a live Internet feed on their own computers as well as in the nature

center, did really well, Porter said. It showed people all around the area as the inhabiting osprey parents successfully fledged one chick.

The camera was able to do some good for the nesting ospreys as well when nature center volunteers noticed via the feed that the chick had become entangled in fishing line that had been attached to some of the nesting twigs. As a result, they were able to call the Phoenix Wildlife Center for help untangling it and the chick was fine.

"But how often does that happen out in the wild where no one is watching?" Porter asked

The nature center also recently embraced the Pokemon GO craze, inviting the public to come to Marshy Point to play the game at a Midnight Madness event on Friday, Sept. 2, which was "really well-received," Porter stated.

He noted that more people playing the game in one area increases the chances of seeing rare Pokemon, and about 700 people attended the event.

Since it was so successful, the center is looking to hold another such event on Friday, Oct. 7, and possibly continuing to hold them on the first Friday of each month depending on the weather.

"People were really having a lot of fun," Porter said. "Everybody was really positive and in a good mood, and we're happy to offer it again."

### Annual BRRC rockfish tournament garners record participation

The Back River Restoration Committee's ninth annual rockfish tournament on Saturday, Sept. 10, brought in a record 63 boats to enjoy the day and try to catch some rockfish.

An average of four anglers per boat meant that around 250 participants contributed a tremendous amount of money toward the event, which benefitted the BRRC, according to BRRC Board Chairman Larry Farinetti.

"It's a great day for Back River," Farinetti exclaimed, adding that he and BRRC President Sam Weaver were "dancing" when they got the final boat count. "I don't think you can beat it. We've got [food for everyone], \$1 beers and all the money goes to benefit the river."

Farinetti and Weaver graciously thanked all of the sponsors as well, noting that the event brought in over \$17,000 in sponsorships.

The first-place fish, measuring in at 34.5 inches, was caught by Captain William "Three" Corley III's team on boat 12, earning them the first prize of \$2,500. The

three-man team did not specify which of them reeled in the winning quarry, stating instead that they all caught it as a team.

Corley revealed that the winning fish was caught near Rock Hall.

The second-place fish measured in at 32.625 inches and third place came in at 32.25 inches. These catches earned their teams \$1,000 and \$500, respectively.

Corley said the weather was great for the event - hot, muggy and calm in the morning. But the wind picked up in the afternoon, making it a bit choppy.

Corley noted that the BRRC tournament gets bigger and better every year and has become "a big deal" since he keeps his boat docked on the river as well.

"I use this river and my kids play in this river, so cleaning it up is a big deal," he commented.

Corley donated \$300 of the winnings immediately back to the BRRC, but said there would be more once the team figures out their costs.





- continued from page 1 - supporters and protesters gathered and exchanged chants, some notably crude, and waved signs. The atmosphere in Dundalk was less tense, which should come as no surprise considering the staggering amount of support he has in the Sixth District.

Trump was flanked by former New York City mayor Rudy Giuliani and former Maryland governor Bob Ehrlich, and was welcomed to the east side by Metzgar, Delegate Bob Long, Senator Johnny Ray Salling, Delegate Pat McDonough and hundreds of constituents.

"It was a great opportunity to sit down and have lunch and talk about some of the good things happening in our state and what's needed for our nation," said Salling.

Salling mentioned that Tradepoint Atlantic was discussed with Trump, though the details of the conversation were not revealed.

The emergence of Tradepoint Atlantic couldn't come at a better time for east side Republicans and Trump. Job opportunities and economic growth have disappeared from this area since the steel mill began

shedding jobs by the thousands decades ago and culminating in 1,975 R.G. Steel employees getting laid off in 2012.

The loss of union jobs undercut the political shift that took place in 2014 when the historically blue Sixth District turned completely red and helped Larry Hogan get elected as governor.

"People want to work," said Kyle Evans of Dundalk. "I'm hoping that with all of these jobs coming into the area that I'll be able to find something steady. And that just wasn't happening under the last officials we had in office."

After announcing that Under Armour would be bringing an e-commerce distribution center to Tradepoint, it looks as though development on the east side is about to get a huge bump.

At a *Baltimore Business Journal* forum last week, Tradepoint CEO Michael Moore noted that there are seven other businesses whose leases for the site are being finalized, and that announcements will be coming "as soon as the ink dries."

Moore also noted that his "inbox has been blowing up" since the Under Armour announcement. He stated that while e-commerce has been the main focus of what Tradepoint has been doing, they're constantly evaluating how they operate and who they're looking to bring in.

"The arc of e-commerce is increasing literally on a weekly basis," said Moore.

"We had a great strategy but we are going to be very flexible. We are going to change as the market changes."

While nothing has been officially stated about what companies are going to be moving to Tradepoint, one source told *The East County Times* that wind turbine manufacturing could find a spot on the Tradepoint property.

Regardless of what the businesses are that move in, the excitement felt at the Trump visit to Boulevard Diner is starting to seep its way into everyday life.

"These are just really exciting times," said Metzgar. "The Tradepoint guys can get anyone they want now. It's basically like opening a catalogue and choosing."

Metzgar stated that he thinks Tradepoint will be well ahead of the 10,000-jobs-in-10 years plan they had when the venture was first announced. By 2018, he thinks that it's a safe bet to make that Tradepoint will have more people working than when R.G. Steel shut their doors.

For a guy like Evans, steady employment might be closer than he thinks.

"I understand that these illegal [immigrants] coming in have it rough, but our politicians have to look after their own citizens first and foremost," he said. "If I could tell my mother I got a job at Under Armour or something like that, her mind would be at ease. My mind would certainly be at ease."





### Dundalk stopped short in big 3A matchup against Milford

It was a slow weekend for sports, due to excessive heat wiping out more time in classrooms and on the field for high school students in Baltimore County.

Normally, something like that would make me slightly agitated. After all, each week I pick the contests I want to see, so to have essentially no choice in the matter felt a little odd. But, it did end up benefiting me, because I got to see a great game between Dundalk and Milford Mill, which I most likely was going to skip over this weekend.

But before we get into a rundown of activity, just a few thoughts on the heat problem.

First and foremost, as much as cancellations are frustrating, safety needs to come first. And considering a lot of these kids had been off from school on Thursday and Friday due to the heat index flirting with 100 degrees, why rush them onto a field? Going from not practicing a couple days to being thrown to the lions isn't a smart play. Mainly due to lack of oversight when it comes to hydration. What kids need to do to prepare for heat and what they think they need to do are two different things. I can basically guarantee that there were a few who hadn't been filling themselves up with water in the

24 hours leading up to what was supposed to be game time. And all it takes is one kid to go down.

I can understand the frustration to an extent. From a player's perspective, you want to be out there all the time. From a parent's perspective, however, I'm not too sure I get the complaints. Anytime the safety of children isn't top priority, there's hell to pay. So yes, it may be annoying and frustrating, but better a little frustration over, say, a heat stroke.

That said, game cancellations can really screw up a season. Playoff positions are determined by a point system, so if you're playing teams that aren't exactly top-notch teams and your only game against a top team gets canceled, you just lost a lot of potential points. Last year I wrote about how the playoff process needs to be changed, and the fact that teams can miss out on a spot due to a canceled game should be enough to prompt a change. But on to the games.

The kickoff between Dundalk and Milford Mill was delayed - not because of air conditioning - because Milford's bus driver took them to Dunbar. Close enough, right? But when the game finally did get underway, it was a real doozy.

The first quarter was back and forth,

with neither team really able to get much going offensively. Milford got on the board first when quarterback Kyrel Eley hit one of his receivers for a 43-yard touchdown as the first quarter wound down.

The second quarter was much of the same as both teams employed a benddon't-break approach to defense. Milford's secondary was doing well to lock up the passing options for Dundalk quarterback Darrius Sample, but that just meant there was more room on the ground. Running back Isaiah Antol was the first to benefit as he bounced off the line and made his way through several tackles before finding the endzone just before half.

The second half turned into Sample's time to shine, and he certainly did. Sample used his legs predominantly in the second, but in the third quarter he managed to hook up with wide receiver Daquan Thomas for a 24-yard touchdown, giving Dundalk a 14-7 lead.

While Dundalk's offense stalled a bit, their defense was sharp. They were also a bit fortunate, with Eley fumbling a ball out of the endzone towards the end of the third quarter.

In the fourth, they wouldn't be as lucky.

Milford put up two quick touchdowns in the fourth, but failed on their

extra point conversions.

Sample responded by tearing off big run after big run. In total, Sample put up 241 yards on the ground, 168 of them coming in the second half. And on this particular drive, he accounted for 60 of his team's 65 yards. He ended the "drive" with a 41-yard touchdown that put Dundalk in front 22-19 after the two-point conversion.

Milford answered with 1:17 to go, giving them a 27-22 lead.

Sample proceeded to march his team downfield with a 54-yard pass to receiver Eddie Dickerson. A facemasking penalty added 15 yards and put Dundalk in prime position, only seven yards from the endzone. Over the next four plays, Sample would pick up six yards on the ground and miss on two throws as the Owls lost what could prove to be a decisive game when it comes to postseason play. Last year, Milford missed out on the postseason thanks to Dundalk.

### Around the league

Sparrows Point was probably wishing their game could have been canceled, or at least postponed, as Randallstown jumped down their throat from the get-go en route to a staggering 36-0 win.



### **County police** give body camera update

Back in July, the first batch of body cameras to be worn by Baltimore County officers were sent out to each precinct. Initially, just ten cameras were in use. Now, that number is up to 100.

Last week in Rosedale, Baltimore County Police Captain Christopher Kelly of the White Marsh precinct and Captain Joseph Conger, commander of the Technology and Communications Section, met with a couple dozen citizens to hear of any complaints or concerns with the body camera program.

"This is obviously a new area for law enforcement," said Conger. "Body worn cameras is a cutting edge solution, another tool in the professional toolbox, and there's not a lot of charted territory, so there's a lot of opportunity to say what concerns we are not able to anticipate."

While the issue of body cameras has been a divisive one amongst policing communities, as is evident by Boston Police Department's response to having to wear cameras. When asked if there were any issues of the sort in Baltimore County, Kelly and Conger noted that everything was running "smoothly."

There wasn't much in way of new information being disseminated, but the evening did serve as a good reminder of what can be expected from the body camera program.

Both Conger and Kelly stressed that body cameras were mutually beneficial, in that they allow prosecutors - and those who are worried about brutality or civil rights issues - to get a relatively clear look of

Despite the fact that there were no new major updates, the fact that this meeting occurred was met with praise.

"You can talk all day about transparency, but what are you doing to actually be transparent? In Baltimore County's case, they're taking it right to the citizens," said Barry Lenken, a Rosedale resident in attendance. "That's good community outreach."

One of the bigger issues regarding body camera footage is privacy, though Conger reiterated that there will be redactions in footage if the suspect is a juvenile, personal identifiers are seen or anything of the sort. He also reminded that the department has the right to redact or withhold footage to protect someone's safety and for graphic content.

Kelly and Conger confirmed that they're still on track to have most of the department covered by July 2017, and that the program will cost approximately \$12.5 million.

### **Tractor trailer crash in Essex** leaves one injured

Baltimore County Police are investigating a Monday afternoon crash on Eastern Boulevard involving a tractor trailer.

The preliminary investigation into the crash has indicated that around 1:14 p.m., a tractor trailer was exiting off of Route 702 to go west-bound on Eastern Boulevard. ### 'SULLY': A good movie about a great pilot

There have been a handful of negative reviews for "Sully." And just about all of them seem to say basically the same thing. "Well, it's a solid, workmanlike film from director Clint Eastwood" or "Yeah, it's good. But it never soars." Or, "Tom Hanks gives his usual, movie-star performance. Nothing more." To those critics, I say... these are NOT problems! After a summer of mostly dreck at the local movie theaters, to get an early fall docudrama where I was in the hands of a good director, watching good actors working from a good script, was a breath of fresh air. Is it great? No. But let's not decrease the value of being good, of being professional and workmanlike and noble. These are the qualities of "Sully" the movie.

The film chronicles the "Miracle on the Hudson," the January 2009 incident in which a US Airways passenger jet took off from LaGuardia Airport in New York, then almost immediately slammed through a flock of geese that damaged both engines and forced veteran pilot Captain Chelsey "Sully" Sullenberger (Hanks) to put the plane down in the Hudson River. The daring move, the only one he could make at the time, saved the lives of all 155 souls onboard.

The best decision Eastwood and screenwriter Todd Komarnicki make is in crafting the structure of their film. The movie doesn't start off with the spectacular forced water landing. Both men know that the crash is the BIG sequence of the flick. If you put it up front in the first 15 minutes, you run the risk of turning the rest of your flick into a dry legal movie about the airline's attempts to determine whether Sully and copilot Jeff Skiles (Aaron Eckhart) could have made it back to an airport without having to put the jet down in the drink. So, instead, they begin the film with the incident having already happened, with Sully about to go into a hearing and looking out the window at Manhattan and its magnificent, but always vulnerable skyline. He imagines his jet not kissing the waters of the Hudson and coming to a safe halt. He envisions the plane crashing into the city itself.

Not quite halfway through, Eastwood then finally stages an extended flashback showing the takeoff and crash in harrowing, beautifully edited, "you-are-there" detail. Later, he shows the plane's unnerving descent from several different perspectives of people in different parts of the New York metro area - an office employee in a boardroom meeting, a helicopter pilot taking tourists up to see the city's skyline, etc. And there is a final restaging that dwells less on the emotional immediacy of the event and more on what Sully and Skiles did technically in that cockpit.

At just around 95 minutes, this is as tightly focused an Eastwood film as I've seen. Flaws? A few. With so much of the film playing out SO authentically, I found the final, climactic hearing a bit jive. First of all, I'm pretty sure all the investigative stuff took much longer than the couple of compressed weeks depicted in the film (Sully's wife played by Laura Linney doesn't even get a chance to travel to her husband). And did a key piece of debris really get discovered at that absolute perfect time?

The legal aspect of the film is the thing "Sully" is being sold on... the part of the story you DIDN'T know. Actually, there IS a part of the story that nobody has covered yet. WHAT THE HELL WERE THOSE BIRDS THINKING?! First of all, why hadn't they flown south for the winter? It was bleepin' January! The wind chill on that day was 5 degrees below! Did these birds have a death wish or something? Was it a mission? Was this some form of... poultry jihad?! Should Eastwood have subtitled their final squawks: "Humans out of the skies! We're taking back the clouds! AHHHHH!!"

OK, the wife says I need to stop watching animated bird flicks. Maybe someday. But I'll never stop watching good movies like "Sully."

"Sully" is rated PG-13 for some peril and language.






