'Battle of the Big Bands' with GLEE star set to perform October 1 in Campbell

Relive the music of the 1940's when two big bands comprised of 30 musicians play a musical tribute to the 1940s big band kings of swing, Tommy Dorsey and Glen Miller, on Saturday, Oct. 1 at the Heritage Theater in Campbell.

Battle of the Big Bands, a Las Vegas production, will feature vocalist Bill A. Jones (also known to millions as 'Rod Remington' on FOX TV's "GLEE"). Bill, who sings songs made famous by Frank Sinatra and others, toured with The Glenn Miller Orchestra.

In the tradition of the Big Band battles from the '30s and '40s, the two bands take the stage in a back-and-forth competition that showcases jazz, swing and favorite standards from the glory years.

The live musical performance

will run non-stop for two hours plus a 15 minute intermission. The audience will vote at the end of the evening for their favorite Big Band; but the clear winner is always the audience.

Tommy Dorsey was an American jazz trombonist, composer, conductor and bandleader of the Big Band era. He was known as the "Sentimental Gentleman of Swing," because of his smooth-toned trombone playing. Although he was not known for being a notable soloist,

his technical skill on the trombone gave him renown amongst other musicians. He was the younger brother of bandleader Jimmy Dorsey. After Dorsey broke with his brother in the mid-1930s, he led an extremely popular and highly successful band from the late 1930s into the 1950s. He is best remembered for standards such as "Opus One", "Song of India", "Marie", "On Treasure Island," and his

biggest hit single "I'll Never Smile Again." Dorsey passed away in his sleep on Nov. 26, 1956 at the age of 51 in his Greenwich, Connecticut, home.

Glenn Miller was an American big band musician, arranger, com-

poser, and bandleader in the swing era. Glenn Miller made his first movie appearance in the 1935 Paramount Pictures release The Big Broadcast of 1936 as a member of the Ray Noble Orchestra performing "Why Stars Come Out at

Night." He was the best-selling recording artist from 1939 to 1943, leading one of the best known big bands. Miller's recordings include "In the Mood," "Moonlight Serenade", "Pennsylvania 6-5000", "Chattanooga Choo Choo", "A String of Pearls", "At Last". "(I've Got a Gal In) Kalamazoo", "American Patrol", "Tuxedo Junction", "Elmer's Tune," and "Little Brown Jug." While he was traveling to entertain U.S. troops in France during World War II, Glenn Miller's aircraft disappeared in bad weather over the English Channel on December 15, 1944.

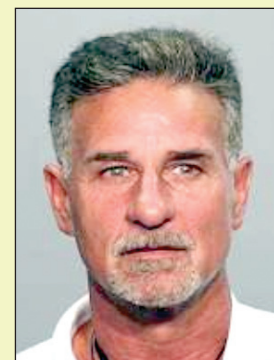
San Jose Police received numerous tips from the community that ultimately resulted in Russell's arrest. Russell will be booked into the Santa Clara County Jail on two counts of Attempted Kidnapping, two counts of Attempted Kidnapping

to Commit a Sexual Offense, two counts of Assault with Intent to a Commit a Felony, and an outstanding misdemeanor no bail warrant for DUI.

A suspect allegedly physically assaulted and attempted to kidnap a young female victim in the area of Meridian Avenue and Hamilton Avenue on Aug. 29. Russell again allegedly physically assaulted and attempted to kidnap another young female in the area of Hillsdale Avenue and Narvaez Ave. on Sept 2.

Russell is a convicted sex offender with prior violent assaults against women.

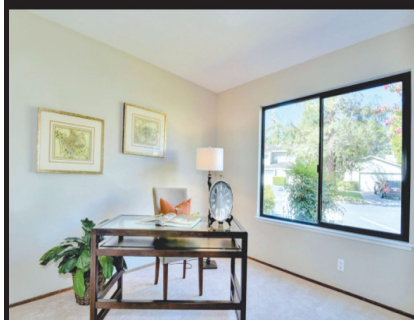
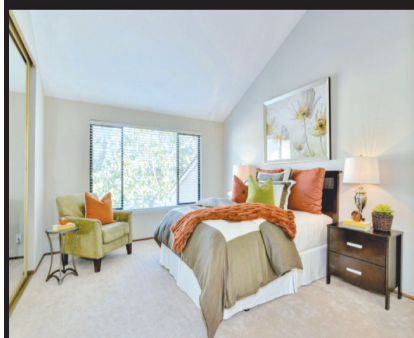

Cambrian Park Plaza's carousel sign officially declared a historic landmark

Cambrian Park Plaza's whimsical carousel sign is officially a historic landmark.

The county's cheerleader for the sign's designation, supervisor Ken Yeager, said The Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors gave it that status on Aug. 30, and said it is "great news for supporters of the landmark."

The iconic carousel has served as an unofficial "welcome" sign for locals and visitors for more than 60 years.

Cambrian Park residents were nervous about the plaza's new owner-Texas-based Weingarten Realty Investors. They were worried the sign



would be torn down during the redeveloping of the 17-acre site.

The carousel had to meet several criteria to qualify for historic designation, per county ordinance. For example, being more than 50 years old and have historical integrity and distinctive regional qualities.

"Weingarten consultants had said that the sign had been altered so much that it no longer had its architectural integrity," Yeager said. "But now the developer is on board."

A Weingarten spokesperson said in a statement that the developer is "committed to preserving the carousel as part of any potential redevelopment of the center due to its iconic nature and importance to the community."

Booming to your 70's and 80's

Unlike the 1960's, many Baby Boomers today are planning to continue working well into their 70's and 80's in what is being called a "worktirement."

Worktirement is for people concerned about running out of money, or what many call out-living the money. Others are working longer because they enjoy being around people and get satisfaction from their job.

The benefits of having the additional income from working — even part time — helps supplement Social Security checks and IRA or 401K withdrawals.

In a recent study by Smart Asset, several

factors were studied, including the number of seniors, the average effective tax rate, and the senior unemployment rate to identify the best cities for a worktirement.

Egyptian mummy's face recreated with science, 3D printing

An Egyptian mummy's head and face have been reconstructed with forensic science and 3D printing.

The final rendition offers scientists and the public a tantalizing glimpse of the individual's life and death.

The mummified head was discovered by accident in Australia at the University of Melbourne. A museum curator found the remains and sent it for a computed tomography (CT) scan for preservation.

A university team used the scans to create a 3D-printed replica of the mummy's skull, and a detailed study of the specimen's facial-bone features including the size and angle of the jaw and eye sockets.

It was determined that the head belonged to a female, named Meritamun who died at the age of 25. Her death was important enough to be mummified nearly 2,000 years ago.

From the distinctive style of the linen bandaging and embalming of the specimen, the researchers think Meritamun was mummified in Egypt and that she may have lived at least 2,000 years ago. They will now use radiocarbon dating to date the specimen more precisely, the scientists said.

Scientists believe Meritamun was suffering from a thinning skull bone brought about by anemia and dental pathologies.

Smith: Florida is not only a popular destination for retirees, but also a great state for a "worktirement," according to our study. Four of the cities in our top 10 are located in the Sunshine State. 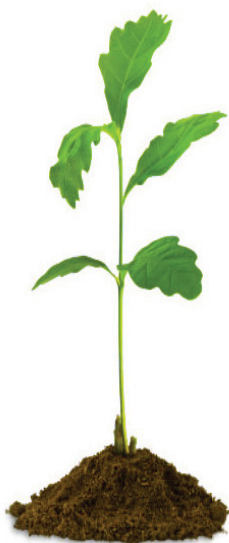

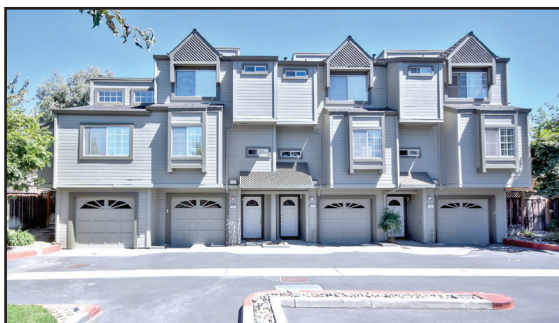

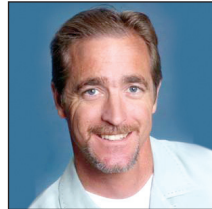
