'Battle of the Big Bands'with GLEE star set to perform **October 1 in Campbell**

elive the music of the 1940's when two big bands comprised of 30

musicians play a musical tribute to the 1940s big band kings of swing, Tommy Dorsey and Glen Miller, on Saturday, Oct. 1 at the Heritage Theater in Campbell.

Battle of the Big Bands, a Las Vegas production, will feature vocalist Bill A. Jones (also known to millions

as 'Rod Remington' on FOX TV's "GLEE"). Bill, who sings songs made famous by Frank Sinatra and others, toured with The Glenn Miller Orchestra.

In the tradition of the Big Band battles from the '30s and '40s, the two bands take the stage in a backand-forth competition that showcases jazz, swing and favorite standards from the glory years.

The live musical performance

will run non-stop for two hours plus a 15 minute intermission. The audience will vote at the end of the evening for their favorite Big Band;

Tommy Dorsey was an American jazz trombonist, composer, conductor and bandleader of the Big Band era. He was known as the "Sentimental Gentleman of Swing," because of his smooth-toned trombone playing. Although he was not known for

being a notable soloist, his technical skill on the trombone gave him renown amongst other musicians. He was the younger brother of bandleader Jimmy Dorsey. After Dorsey broke with his brother in the mid-1930s, he led an extremely popular and highly successful band from the late 1930s into the 1950s. He is best remembered for standards such as "Opus One", "Song of India", "Marie", "On Treasure Island," and his

Russell will be booked into the Santa Clara County Jail on two counts of Attempted Kidnapping, two counts of Attempted Kidnapping to Commit a Sexual Offense, two counts of Assault with Intent to a Commit a Felony, and an outstanding misdemeanor no bail warrant for DUI.

A suspect allegedly physically assaulted and attempted to kidnap a young female victim in the area of Meridian Avenue and Hamilton Avenue on Aug. 29. Russell again allegedly physically assaulted and attempted to kidnap another young female in the area of Hillsdale Avenue and Narvaez Ave. on Sept 2.

Russell is a convicted sex offender with prior violent assaults against women.

Cambrian Park Plaza's carousel sign officially declared a historic landmark

ambrian Park Plaza's whimsical carousel sign is officially a historic landmark.

The county's cheerleader for the sign's designation, supervisor Ken

Yeager, said The Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors gave it that status on Aug. 30, and said it is "great news for supporters of the landmark.'

The iconic carousel has served as an unofficial "welcome" sign for locals and visitors for more than 60 years.

Cambrian Park residents were nervous about the plaza's new owner-Texas-based Weingarten Realty Investors. They were worried the sign



criteria to qualify for historic designation, per county ordinance. For example, being more than 50 years old and have historical integrity and distinctive regional qualities.

"Weingarten consultants had said that the sign had been altered so much that it no longer had its architectural integrity," Yeager said. "But now the developer is on board."

A Weingarten spokesperson said in a statement that the developer is "committed to preserving the carousel as part of any potential redevelopment of the center due to its iconic nature and importance to the community."

Egyptian mummy's face recreated with science, 3D printing

n Egyptian mummy's head and face have been reconstructed with forensic science and 3D printing.

The final rendition offers scientists and the pubic a tantalizing glimpse of the individual's life and death.

The mummified head was discovered by accident in Australia at the University of Melbourne. A museum curator found the remains and sent it for a computed tomography (CT) scan for preservation.

A university team used the scans to create a 3D-printed replica of the mummy's skull, and a detailed study of the specimen's facial-bone features including the size and angle of the jaw and eye sockets.

It was determined that the head belonged to a female, named Meritamun who died at the age of 25. Here death was important enough to be mummified nearly 2,000 years ago.

From the distinctive style of the linen bandaging and embalming of the specimen, the researchers think Meritamun was mummified in Egypt and that she may have lived at least 2,000 years ago. They will now use radiocarbon dating to date the specimen more precisely, the scientists said.

Scientists believe Meritamun was suffering from a thinning skull bone brought about by anemia and dental pathologies.

Tony Bennett is celebrating his 90th birthday with a tour and he has scheduled a stop in San Jose at the City National Civic on Nov. 5, 2016.

According to Tony's spokesperson, San Jose will be the only scheduled tour stop in Northern California.

With millions of records sold worldwide and platinum and gold albums to his credit, Bennett has received seventeen Grammy Awards-including a 1995 Grammy for Record of the Year for his MTV Unplugged CD, which introduced this American master to a whole new generation-and the Grammy Lifetime Award.

Tony's initial successes came via a string of Columbia singles in the early 1950's, including such charttoppers as "Because of You," "Rags to Riches," and a remake of Hank Williams "Cold, Cold Heart." He had 24 songs in the Top 40, including "I Wanna Be Around," "The Good Life," "Who Can I Turn To (When Nobody Needs Me)."

Tony's signature song, "I Left My Heart In San Francisco," garnered him two Grammy Awards.
