Deckelman, a 'legend' on the water, leaves behind a legacy of helping

On Thursday afternoon, Sept. 15, Jack "Elvis" Deckelman II, described as a "legend" on the waterfront in eastern Baltimore County by those who knew him, passed away at the age of 71.

Bob Palmer, who along with Deckelman was a founding member of the Marine Trades Association of Baltimore County, said he met Deckelman in 1985 and considered him a very good personal friend who was "always there."

The Deckelman family goes back to about 1930 on eastern Baltimore County waterways, according to Palmer, and have been involved in the marina, marine towing and marine salvage businesses.

Although the business has more competition now, "for a long time he was the only local tower that was there when you needed him," Palmer explained.

"He was a character and a half," Palmer said of Deckelman, who he called "one of the originals on the water." Palmer added, though, that Deckelman was always ready

Palmer noted endearingly that Deckelman was "a little rough around the



edges. But that just comes with being on the waterfront for all those years, I guess," he said.

"If you were a friend of Jack's, you were a friend of a good guy," Palmer commented. "And if you weren't really a friend of his, he'd let you know it," he laughed.

Jeanie Riley, another longtime friend of Deckelman's, said they have been "very dear friends" since they were both teenagers. She pointed out that she remembers when Deckelman's two sons, Jack and Jeff, were born, adding that she has a son of her own just one year younger than Jack.

"[Ours] was a group that just stuck together, through everything," Riley explained, adding that they were always there for each other when they needed

She said they had both been born into the marina industry, following in their

fathers' footsteps.

"He took it all the way to another leap with the towing business," Riley said.

She also said that if anyone in the neighborhood or on the water ever needed help with anything, Deckelman was always

"He didn't know what the word 'no' meant," Riley said. "He did anything to get it done, and that's just the type of man he was.

"That was Jack; Jack was the water," she stated.

Riley also explained that Deckelman's "Elvis" nickname came from his love for Elvis Presley going back to when he was a teenager.

"He idolized Elvis, in no uncertain terms," Riley said.

Deckelman had the Elvis hairstyle, an Elvis Boulevard street tag at his marina, had visited the Graceland estate in Memphis, Tenn., several times and even had an Elvis Christmas tree.

"He could be rough at times, but he had one of the kindest hearts of anybody on the waterfront," Riley affirmed. "He was a gem that's going to really be missed."

Although the Deckelman family could not be reached for comment, Rockaway Beach/Turkey Point Improvement Association Vice President Kevin McDonough said the community mourns Deckelman's loss along with the family.

"When you think of Baltimore County waterfront, you have to think of Jack Deckelman," McDonough stated.

McDonough, who is also involved in organizing the Middle River Fireworks Extravaganza, said Deckelman was always involved in helping with the event and

was its "saving grace" this year.

According to McDonough, the company that previously donated the towing for the barge platform from which the fireworks are fired was financially unable to do it this year. And other companies were asking very high prices to get the job done.

But Deckelman stepped up to give them an affordable price and ensure the fireworks could go on, McDonough said.

McDonough also referenced Deckelman's quick action to prevent further disaster in 2013 when a boat caught fire at Baltimore Yacht Club.

In that incident, three boaters had neglected to turn off their boat's ignition while refueling which resulted in an explosion, throwing all three into the water. Deckelman, who arrived on-scene before police, firefighters or U.S. Coast Guard personnel, pushed the flaming vessel out into Sue Creek before it could drift into other boats docked at BYC and potentially spread the blaze.

"Had it not been for Jack's quick thinking, it could have been something that was really fatal," McDonough commented. "He was not only a local legend, but a bit of a local hero too.

"The impact that he had in the little amount of time that I knew him was quite impressive," McDonough continued. "I can guarantee that his legacy will live on in eastern Baltimore County for decades to come."

Jack Deckelman II leaves behind his loving companion of many years, Laura Wilmoth; two children, Jack III and Jeffrey; brother, Alan "Mort" Deckelman; several grandchildren and many other loving relatives and friends.

Communities have mixed feelings about Sixth District CZMP decisions

The Baltimore County Council voted on Aug. 30 to finalize their decisions on new zoning designations around the county. And ever since, communities throughout the seven councilmanic districts have been poring over those decisions to digest exactly what was done.

In the Sixth District - which includes Middle River, White Marsh, southern Perry Hall, Overlea, and parts of Rosedale and is represented by Councilwoman Cathy Bevins - some zoning change requests were granted, opening the door for new development, and others were not.

Bevins has been criticized by some since the 2012 Comprehensive Zoning Map Process (CZMP) for allowing more development through higher density zoning decisions in the district.

But she has maintained that she visits each property raised as an issue during the year-long CZMP and assesses them in an effort to make appropriate decisions for smart growth. And much of the criticism results from frustration over recently begun development projects that were actually approved before Bevins was elected in 2010.

One of the highest-profile zoning issues raised during this year's CZMP was the nearly 80-acre property along Philadelphia Road in White Marsh slated as the future site of the Paragon Outlets.

Paragon Outlets White Marsh Center, LLC requested this year that their property be changed from a light manufacturing zoning designation to Business Major to allow the outlet mall by right, regardless of the pending ballot referendum. Bevins obliged, allowing the project to move forward, stating that the property was "designed for retail."

"It was designed for exactly what's happening at the Avenue [at White Marsh] and at White Marsh Mall and along Campbell Boulevard," she said. "I only live a couple of miles from it, so if I was afraid to have the traffic and the people I wouldn't have wanted to do it."

Bowleys Quarters resident Allen Robertson noted at the Sept. 7 meeting of the Essex-Middle River Civic Council, however, that a petition drive could be planned to put the zoning decisions on the 2018 ballot in order to stop the new outlet mall from proceeding.

Another property for which some expressed opposition to a zoning change was the site of the Fullerton Manor Bingo building on Belair Road in the Overlea-Fullerton area.

Royal Farms requested a change to BL-AS which allows for a convenience storetype business with gas pumps. Bevins granted the change over the objections of some neighbors who were concerned about traffic and other issues.

She justified her decision in that several community associations in the area wrote letters of support for the project and that it would hopefully bring about some revitalization of the Belair Road corridor

"We're trying to revitalize Belair Road," Bevins explained. "We need some new, shining businesses; we need to create some jobs.

"The [Royal] Farms store is something that, they give back to the community, they give back to the schools, it's a business that does not create traffic," she contin-

ued. "Those types of businesses serve the traffic already

Bevins also denied some requests in her district, such as on the 32-acre Stokers Farm property south of Bird River Road in Middle River. A developer had requested DR 16 on that property which would have allowed up to 524 residences on the property in the form of apartments. The councilwoman denied the request, calling it too dense for the area.

She also granted no change for a 7.5-acre property abutting the Bowerman-Loreley Beach community in White Marsh where a developer intended to build nearly 80 townhomes. Instead, Bevins announced that she has been able to secure Program Open Space funding to preserve the land as public open space.

On other properties, Bevins compromised between the community and a property owner's request. For instance, at an 11.7-acre property on Leland Avenue in Middle River, the developer had asked for a zoning change from light manufacturing to DR 16, which would allow up to 187 homes to be built. Bevins granted a zoning of DR 3.5 instead, allowing up to 40 homes on the undeveloped parcel.

And at the site of Vince's Auto Parts in White Marsh, a developer had requested a zoning of DR 10.5 on the 32-acre site, but was granted DR 5.5. This decision allows 178 homes to be built instead of 340, and the site will undergo an environmental clean-up, Bevins said.

EMRCC President Bob Bendler said they got some





of what they wanted from the CZMP, but not all. In general, they were looking to restrict increased housing density in the district and focus development in areas that are equipped to handle it.

The organization expressed concern over the decisions on three properties in particular because of density and traffic concerns.

On two properties along Mohrs Lane in Nottingham near Philadelphia Road, the owners had requested zoning changes to Business Major with the intent of putting in new retail centers at the sites. But the EMRCC membership is concerned about the traffic problems that could arise since the Maryland State Highway Administration currently has no budget for expanding Philadelphia Road in that area.

The third site, a total of about 29 acres along Rossville

Boulevard in Rosedale, requested and was granted a change to OR2, which allows office space as well as housing up to 10.5 units per acre.

Bevins said the plan there is for townhomes, with the potential for professional office buildings, noting that CCBC and Franklin Square hospital - the county's second-largest employer with over 3,400 employees are both "bursting at the seams."

She explained that some hospital employees work up to 14-hour shifts and want to be able to get home in a short amount of time, but are not interested in renting anything already available in the area.

Bevins also pointed out that the property falls under the purview of the South Perry Hall Improvement Association, which is very active with zoning issues and did not oppose the decision.

MDE gives update on oil leak at North Point Government Center

Members of the Maryland Department of the Environement (MDE) stopped by the Eastfield-Stanbrook Civic Association (ESCA) meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 6, to give an update on an oil spill that was leaking into Lynch Cove.

Back in February, residents in the Eastfield-Stanbrook community noticed that the water in Lynch Cove in Dundalk had been emitting a petrol odor and had a grayish color. This was reported to the MDE, according to Drew Miller and Chris Ralston, who work in the oil control division of the state agency.

Miller stated that it was investigated two days later, but that nothing could be found. Baltimore County had also investigated the issue and couldn't find anything wrong with the water. On Feb. 20, an emergency response team was sent out to Lynch Cove and a heavy sheen was detected.

It was around this time that it became apparent there might be an issue with the underground oil tanks that provide heat to the North Point Government Center building. Baltimore County conducted a tightness test on the tanks and determined that things were up to par. But, according to Miller, the MDE took a look at the test and required Baltimore

County to retest the tightness in front of MDE inspectors. The tank inspection failed and was immediately shut down.

On Feb. 25, all oil was removed from the underground tanks and put in above ground tanks. After that, oil stopped leaking into Lynch Cove. By Feb. 29, it was determined that all of the tanks would have to be removed from underground. The removal took place on March 10.

A month later, a report calling for additional testing was filed, and on Aug. 11 and 12, soil and water samples were taken from the area. According to Miller, a "couple borings did have elevated levels of petroleum, but the residual impact is still being addressed.

Miller told members of the ESCA that when the tanks were dug out, it was discovered that corroding pipes were leaking oil directly into a terracotta pipe which led to a storm drain which led directly into Lynch Cove.

"This was just the perfect storm of circumstances," said Miller.

A tracer dye test showed that it took just nine minutes for fluid to get from the terracotta pipe out to Lynch Cove.

At one point early in the process back in February,

a boom was placed on the drain that leads to Lynch Cove. The MDE thought that it was put in place by Baltimore County, but in actuality it was placed by a local resident who managed to get an absorbent sock, known as a sorbet boom from a fire station. But the boom didn't stretch across the length of the drain, so oil from the tanks was basically just flowing around it. Miller stated that Baltimore County had been ordered to maintain the boom, and that he believed that it was in place for a while as the leakage occurred. But residents claimed that just days after being installed, the sock washed up onshore.

Many in attendance questioned whether Baltimore County would face any type of punishment for the spill, and Ralston noted that the MDE is evaluating what punitive measures to take. One resident claimed that Baltimore County told her that the community was responsible for cleaning up garbage around Lynch Cove, at which point Ralston noted that if the garbage had been touched by oil, the onus was one Baltimore County to clean it up.

"Baltimore County is responsible for cleanup of everything the oil touches since the spill originated from their land," said Ralston.

The effects of the spill are still being determined, but Ralston and Miller remained optimistic that little damage was done.

"Usually with spills like this, it takes a long time to figure out that there's something going on," said Ralston. "But we think this was caught pretty early. But if you have any concerns in the future, you can call the 24-hour tip line at 1-866-633-4686."

A lot has changed in the 15 years since Renee Zellweger famously put on 30 lbs and adopted a British accent to play the title character in "Bridget Jones's Diary." The world has changed. Political leaders have changed. Zellweger's face has changed. But what she and director Sharon Maguire are trying to do with the new "Bridget Jones's Baby" is give the audience a sense of comfort and familiarity. On that level, the film works. On almost every other level? Like its title character, this sequel

Zellweger was nominated for an Oscar in 2001 for her delightful turn as the boozy, klutzy Bridget Jones, who stumbles into a love triangle involving stuffy attorney Mark Darcy (Colin Firth) and rakish playboy Daniel Cleaver (Hugh Grant). They were legitimately funny characters, and all three performers were the consummate rom-com actors. The sequel a few years later felt more contrived, putting Bridget in a Thai prison. But eventually she got out and agreed to marry Darcy, catching the bouquet at her parents' wedding vows renewal ceremony.

More than a decade later, Bridget is... eh, still single, still boozy, but now reeling from Darcy having married another and Daniel being out of the picture com-

pletely. But all is not entirely the same. Bridget now has her dream job of producing a daily TV program called "Hard News" and has finally gotten down to what she describes as her "ideal weight."

I have to say, I found it a bit disappointing that Bridget no longer has her curves. The look of Bridget Jones was one of the most endearing things about her I get it. The target audience comes to see a film like "Bridget Jones's Baby" for the wish-fulfillment fantasy. So, Bridget's now emaciated and the new man in her life can't be a divorced, fortysomething schlub with two kids he sees every other weekend. He's a hunky American billionaire played by McDreamy himself, Patrick Dempsey, who's never been married, has no kids and attends outdoor music festivals by himself.

Yes, in the 15 years since the original film hit, the U.K. has apparently been reorganized. There's England... Ireland... Scotland... and... oh, a new, little isle just off the coast called Fantasyland.

Dempsey is likable, but he's NO Hugh Grant. Even worse, the screenwriting team doesn't quite know whether to make Dempsey's Jack a nice-guy romantic or a calculating, formidable rival to Firth's Darcy who re-enters the picture and announces he and his wife are divorcing. Bridget ends up sleeping with both and becoming pregnant. While the film draws out the "Who's the Daddy?" dilemma until the very final scene, at least Bridget doesn't keep both men in the dark for very long that either one might be the proud papa.



Snowden finds Stone back in near-top conspiracy form

Every once in a while you realize something you've known for a long time, but just never really acknowledged. So here it goes: Joseph Gordon-Levitt is a REALLY good actor! Ah, this being a review of Oliver Stone's "Snowden," you thought I was gonna say something about the military-industrial complex run wild, right? About government's invasion of our privacies, Orwell's Big Brother future made real? Nah. I pretty much focus on writing and directing and acting. And that's what I noticed watching "Snowden." Gordon-Levitt's acting - he has become effortlessly good on screen.

He could easily have been one of those child actors who had his big TV series - in this case, "3rd Rock From the Sun" - and then faded into "Where are they now?" obscurity. But before that show, he had already proven his young acting chops in films like "Angels in the Outfield" and "A River Runs Through It." After the sitcom was over, he pursued work in independent films like "Brick" and "The Lookout" that grew him up in the eyes of casting directors and transitioned him into bigger-budget fare.

In "Snowden," Gordon-Levitt's innate likability smoothes over the "Is he a patriot/Is he a traitor?" debates among

audience members and makes the film extremely watchable for both sides of that divide. Does director/co-screenwriter Oliver Stone take a side? Of course he does! He's Oliver Stone. He loves Edward Snowden, the young CIA insider who blew the whistle on a massive intelligence gathering apparatus that had the capability of hacking into every cell phone, laptop, e-mail and social media account on the planet. If you're looking for "fair and balanced," you're not going to find it here. In fact, you're really not going to find it anywhere these days. Enjoy the downward spiral.

This flick doesn't have the outraged passion of Stone's "JFK" or "Born on the Fourth of July." There's really nothing to uncover here, because everything seemingly has been uncovered and out there for public consumption since London's The Guardian published its series of articles in early summer of 2013. Stone is more content to chronicle the chain of events, using Hollywood A-list actors to dramatize the historical record. On that level, his film is a success. It does a good job showing Snowden's transformation from a young idealist eager to serve his country to a jaded operative appalled at the overreach he finds once on "the inside."

I will say the film lacks a strong central

seduction dynamic a la Gordon Gekko/ Bud Fox in "Wall Street." It comes close in the form of CIA puppeteer Corbin O'Brian (Rhys Ifans), who recruits Snowden, gives him enough of the truth to make him believe he's getting the whole truth, then sends him out into the cold. Ifans is strong early in the film, but then is only a sporadic presence for the rest of it. And he's really missed when he's not on screen.

Stone is so good in the "insider" scenes, it eventually grates on the audience how much time he spends on Snowden's moribund relationship with his girlfriend, Lindsay (Shailene Woodley), who drifts between lovey-dovey support of her man and teary "We're not communicating!" melodrama. Imagine if half of "JFK" was devoted to Jim Garrison's (Kevin Costner) trying to keep his marriage

to Mrs. Garrison (Sissy Spacek) together at the expense of all the great shadowy conspiracy junk.

Overall, though, "Snowden" is solid. It tells a story that is still ongoing, and the screenplay by Stone and Kieran Fitzgerald is very adept at making computer jargon and hacker technobabble interesting and fairly easy to grasp.

Did I have an opinion of Snowden going in? Did I have a different one by the end? Honestly, when all this stuff came out in the press, I'd seen so many conspiracy movies that I just pretty much assumed the government was doing all that stuff already. To paraphrase Woody Allen, "I'd still rather live in this time than any other... mostly for the antibiotics."

Meanwhile, the subplots of the film never quite come together, like the one about Darcy defending some feminist punk-rock band and their free speech rights or Bridget and her staff facing possible age discrimination at the TV station when new, younger leadership takes over.

So, what does work? The chemistry between Zellweger and Firth. It's still there. It's still movie magic. Also, Emma Thompson (who co-wrote the screenplay) appears in a supporting role as Bridget's baby doctor, and her dry humor and comic timing are spot-on.

I just wish they had moved Bridget and Darcy into a more age-appropriate plot.

They were clearly headed to the altar at the end of the second film. Why not pick up the story a decade later, their 10-year marriage needing a spark, and a guy like Jack providing temptation. What WOULD Bridget be like as a mother? Why not put her in a smart workplace comedy in which she does find herself out-of-step with a younger demographic nipping at her heels and all of her insecurities come to the fore? Maybe there will be a fourth film that will pick up these strands. For now, the diehard fans of "Bridget Jones" have this film. But it's only for the diehards.

"Bridget Jones's Baby" is rated R for language, sex references and nudity.

Middle River man charged with hit-and-run

A Baltimore County man was charged last night in connection with a serious hit-and-run of a teen-age pedestrian following a two-week investigation by Troopers from the Maryland State Police – Bel Air Barrack.

Helder Geovany Nataren Perdomo, 20, of the 800 block of Maple Crest Drive in Middle River, was being held at the Harford County Detention Center pending an initial appearance before a District Court Commissioner. Perdomo faces the charge of failure to remain at the scene of personal injury collision and other traffic infractions stemming from the collision on Aug. 29.

As a result of the troopers' investigation, Perdomo was identified as the driver of a dark sedan that struck a teen-age girl in the 1100 block of Baldwin Mill Road in Jarrettsville. The teen, who was transported to Upper Chesapeake Medical Center in Bel Air, was treated and released for non-life-threatening injuries from the crash, which occurred shortly before 5 p.m. The hit-and-run crash involving the 15-year-old girl was particularly alarming since it occurred during the first week of school for students in Harford County.

Several witnesses tentatively identified the striking vehicle as a dark-colored, possibly navy blue, BMW four-door passenger vehicle. Witnesses told troopers the car was manufactured between 2000 and 2008; it also featured tinted windows. Witnesses advised the vehicle had one occupant, the operator, at the time of the crash. They told troopers the operator never slowed down after striking the teen and quickly fled.

Troopers conducted numerous interviews and an intense canvass, which led them to a business in the 3800 block of Norrisville Road in Jarrettsville. At the business, which was less than one mile from the crash scene, troopers found Perdomo and the striking vehicle. Troopers learned Perdomo worked for a business in the Jarrettsville area. Assistance from the community helped troopers locate Perdomo and his 2001 BMW 325i.




Battery

According to AAA's Automotive Research Center, at 32°F, the average battery loses 35 percent of its strength.

Newer batteries can be protected by starting the vehicle each day to warm up and recharge the battery. Let the car run for at least 10 minutes if you cannot take an extended drive.

Exterior maintenance

Keeping a car waxed and sealed can help maintain a durable exterior finish. This includes not only the paint, but the rubber and vinyl parts of the

Winter is a good time to switch to a heavy-duty synthetic wax that can shield against water and road salts. High-quality sealants can be used on bumpers, trim and rubber door seals as added protection. Speak with an automotive retailer or even the car dealership if you are unsure which products will make your car's parts most durable for winter weather.

Do not stop washing your car just because the weather is cold. Slushy, wet roads and snow-melting salts can speed up the formation of rust or other decay on the undercarriage of the vehicle. These materials will need to be periodically cleaned off. Flush the underside of the vehicle whenever possible, taking advantage of any dry, slightly warmer days.

Tire pressure

Drivers who notice that their cars are struggling to accelerate when stoplights turn green or on highways may need to replace their vehicles' air filters.

Choose the right tire for the season

Tires undergo a lot of wear and tear, which only highlights the importance of proper tire maintenance. But many drivers do not give tires a passing thought until there is a problem. - Lock your car. Keep your vehicle locked at all times, even when driving. Many cars are stolen while left unlocked, even though power locks now require just the push of a button to lock the entire vehicle. Similarly, close all windows and the sunroof when the car is parked.
- Keep the vehicle registration in your wallet. Geico notes that car thieves can escape arrest if they can produce the vehicle's registration upon being pulled over. Keep your registra-

tion out of the car and on your person.

- Keep track of your keys. Do not hide a car key outside of the vehicle in the event you get locked out of your car. Thieves are aware of this trick and can steal your car.
- Keep valuables out of sight. Do not leave money, jewelry, electronics, or any other valuable items in plain sight in the car. Remove them promptly, or keep them in a trunk or under a cargo bed so they're not visible to thieves.
- Park in well-lit, heavily trafficked areas. Parking in a well-lit area can deter criminals, but parking close to building entrances and near parking lot security cameras adds extra layers of protection. If you must park in a parking garage, try to park close to the attendant.
- Employ an anti-theft device. Antitheft devices include vehicle immobilizer systems and car alarms. Insurance companies may discount premiums for vehicles that are equipped with anti-theft devices.
- Use technological recovery tools. GPS technology can pinpoint your car if it is stolen and send that information to law enforcement officials. Some of these devices also can slow down vehicles or remotely block the car's ignition switch.

Last week's loss to Milford Mill put the Dundalk Owls in a bit of a tricky situation. Despite graduating a number of key players from last year's 3A state finalist team, the Owls looked very much like they'd be able to ride on the back of Darrius Sample

for a trip back to the postseason.

The next five games for Dundalk are games that they should win very handily, but the final two games of the season are tough competitions against Franklin and Perry Hall, respectively.

Those two games will be tough for the Owls for many different reasons. First and foremost, both teams are very strong, which comes as no surprise. But besides being good, they'll be playing with a chip on their shoulder. Dundalk played a big part in keeping Perry Hall out of the post season last year, beating the Gators 55 - 34. They followed that by losing the season finale to Franklin, but they got their revenge in a more meaningful postseason game. And you better believe Franklin hasn't forgotten. Finally, Dundalk had the advantage of hosting both Franklin and Perry Hall to end the season last year. This year, the Owls will have to travel for their final two contests.

Dundalk's loss to Milford Mill means that they can't slip up for the rest of the season. They have the coaching and the talent to pull it off, but things certainly aren't looking too great for the Owls, despite sitting at 2 - 1 and despite the fact that there's still a lot of football to be played.

Now, anything can happen between now and Oct. 28 when Dundalk is slated to take on Franklin. In the past we've seen injuries take their toll on teams; we've seen teams that lack depth start to get tired; we've even seen dynamic and important players suspended for violating team rules. So is it the end of the world for Dundalk? Not quite. But should Dundalk slip up in any of their upcoming contests, this season will be shorter than they hoped.



The Owls took on Lansdowne on Friday evening, and they looked sharp on both sides of the ball against the lowly Vikings, walking away with a big 39 - 0 victory.

Sample led the way for Dundalk, throwing for 172 yards and adding 76 more on the ground. He also put up two touchdowns through the air and added two more on the ground. Running back Isaiah Antol continued to have a strong season behind the offensive line, racking up 69 yards on just 11 carries and adding two touchdowns.

While he did well to lead the team to a victory, Sample also had quite a few wayward passes that ended up in the arms of the Vikings. And while his four interceptions may seem like not much was going on in the passing game, Sample actually looked pretty solid throwing the ball. Granted, there was only a small number of shots taken downfield.

But what was good news for the Owls was that they were able to get their running backs involved on a variety of plays - screens, little dump offs, wheel routes, etc. - instead of just the usual pounding. Having backs with the ability to receive is key, and Dundalk has that in spades. No matter who they rotate in, they always have that safety valve.

The defensive line was fierce all game, racking up multiple sacks and quarterback pressures. They also did well finding holes in the offensive line to plug up the run, picking up quite a few tackles for loss.

The linebacking unit did well in underneath coverage and also did well to clean up anything that happened to make its way past the line.

But the real accolades have to go to the defensive backs, who pulled down interception after interception. Not only that but their tight coverage of Lansdowne receivers provided a lot of time for the defensive line to be disruptive up front.

The Owls have a mountain to climb the rest of the season, but they certainly have the ability to get back to the postseason despite their loss to Milford. Long Beach Oyster House rebrands, looks forward to winter months

Long Beach Oyster House (formerly Long Beach Restaurant and Tavern) has a new owner who has already given the restaurant's menu a makeover, and is working on some physical upgrades as well.

Manager Jason Slemp, who, with his wife, purchased Long Beach back in February, has a lot of experience in the restaurant and bar industry and wanted to create a unique identity for the establishment.

A coworker and I decided to visit Long Beach for lunch recently to check out the new menu and we could not have been happier with our choice.

Now, being an oyster house, oysters will be a big part of the restaurant's menu and brand going forward. Slemp even revealed that he is considering converting the back of the upstairs bar to an oyster raw bar and display case. So naturally, we had to sample some of their offerings.

My coworker was not much for oysters, so I slurped them all down myself, trying out four of their varieties. All were delicious, especially when garnished with Long Beach's spicy cocktail sauce. But being a bigger fan of the saltier varieties, the locals (being somewhat salty from our brackish water) and the Salt Points (extra salty) really stuck in my mind.

The menu offers several varieties ranging from somewhat sweet to salty for all the oyster connoisseurs out there. And if you're not big on them, you'll still find something to love on Long Beach's excellent menu.

Following the oysters, we started off with the Fire-

cracker Shrimp and the Ahi Tuna Salad, as well as some Crab Avocado Dip.

As you might guess from the name, the Firecracker Shrimp had a kick of spicy heat as the breaded, fried and glazed shrimp were served with fresh jalapeños in a lettuce bowl. But if you can get past the heat (or even enjoy it, like me), there is a honey-like sweetness to the glaze as well which gives it great balance.

The Crab Avocado Dip was a great starter as well with its fresh, light flavors of avocado, crab and corn salsa to wake up the taste buds and get the digestion started.

And although it was still the beginning of the meal, the Ahi Tuna Salad was off to an early lead as my favorite

dish. It began as a standard garden salad, but added in artichoke hearts, roasted red peppers and seared sushi-grade ahi tuna and finished with a cucumber wasabi dressing. The fresh, cool tastes of the vegetables combined with the savory tuna flavors make it a great dish for the summer and fall seasons.

The next dish turned out to be my coworker's favorite with its conventional style and local flair. I'm speaking, of course, of the Maryland Melt, which is Long Beach's take on a traditional grilled cheese sandwich. The difference, though, is that this one adds in tomatoes, crab meat and bacon, which flowed out the sides with each spectacular bite.

Next up were the fabulous Mahi Tacos, consisting of blackened mahi mahi on mini tortillas, with a mango salsa and a creamy sauce drizzled on top. Warm and fresh, they were the perfect mix of sweet and savory - great if you're looking for a beachy meal at home.

And finally, the Chicken Monte Blanco capped off our meal. Although somewhat uncharacteristic of the rest of the meal, it seemed to me more the type of dish you might find in an upscale restaurant. The white wine sauce with the pasta, the chicken and the crab with artichoke hearts gave it a lighter feel while still working as a delicious, filling dinner dish.

Overall, it was truly and wonderful dining experience. Slemp noted that he got his start in the industry at a fairly young age after his uncles bought a bar in 1992. He worked in and around that and future establishments they owned, learning all about it. They now own the nearby Sunset Cove as well, along with two other establishments in Harford County.

But Long Beach is his first attempt at breaking out on his own while taking what he has learned and applying it there. Although the dining has been revamped, much of Long Beach's social character which made it popular in the past has been retained, specifically the live music on weekends.

And more upgrades are coming as well. Slemp has already improved access to the deck outside and plans to install a large tent to be able to keep it open yearround, regardless of the weather. He plans to make the establishment a Ravens Roost as well.

Being an oyster house, Slemp is looking forward to the winter months too, since oysters are traditionally on the menu in months with an "r" in them, of which there are plenty left to come.

He said business has picked up since he has owned Long Beach, but "Winter is when we believe will be the busy season here, not summer."

Post-Labor Day school start now official

- By Delegate Eric Bromwell (D-8) -

On Aug. 31, Governor Hogan signed an executive order altering the start date of Maryland's public schools to after the Labor Day holiday, beginning with the 2017-2018 school year.

The 180-day school year will have to be completed by June 15. The idea is that all children will receive the same amount of instructional hours with the late school start. In addition, the executive order allows for a waiver to the Maryland State Department of Education to be exempt from the post-Labor Day start date. The waiver must be submitted annually and be based on compelling justification.

Supporters of the later school start claim it is a positive change for the economy and for Maryland families. A 2013 economic impact study by the Bureau of Revenue Estimates documented that the later start could generate an additional \$74.3 million in economic activity. Included in that figure is \$3.7 million in new wages and \$7.7 million in additional state and local tax revenue. The longer summer break gives families more time together. According to a poll conducted by Goucher College, 72 percent of Marylanders strongly support a post-Labor Day school start. In addition, 25,000 Marylanders signed a petition urging the state legislature to adopt a post-Labor Day school start date.

A nonpartisan task force to determine the later start's impact on education, including teachers, school board members, PTA members and chaired by the Maryland State Department of Education, concluded by a 12-3 vote that the post-Labor Day start inflicted no adverse effect on education. Supporters like to remind us that most of the state's current population attended school at a time when the school year began after Labor Day.

During the 2016 General Assembly session, I was the lead sponsor of HB 1349, which would have changed the start of Maryland's public schools to after Labor Day. That bill was defeated when the Senate voted down the cross-filed bill.

While I obviously agree with the policy that Gov. Hogan announced, I am left wondering if it is within the authority for the governor to issue such an order. An attorney general's opinion should be here soon to clarify; nevertheless, it is rare for a governor to announce an executive order with this type of broad

reach. Decisions like these have always been up to each local school system. Other questions remain, like what is considered criteria for applying for a waiver? Can each jurisdiction handle the change before the next school year? Will this change cause students to miss traditional holidays to make up time?

Having said that, I hope my fears are unwarranted, and I hope that this drastic change in the school starting date goes off without a hitch. Either way, however, I have a feeling that the legislature will be taking a closer look at this policy in 2017. Between now and then, I hope you will let me know your thoughts on this or any other issue that's important to you.


