

Preakthrough Silicon Valley has a dual mission: to help high-potential students from underserved communities attend four-year universities and to train high school and college students to become educators of the future.

"It's a window into a world beyond the four corners of their neighborhood," says Breakthrough Silicon Valley board member and Almaden resident Sherice Torres. "When you're the first one in your family to go to college, there's a big risk. You're walking down a path nobody you know walked down, so you don't have role models to help you navigate. Breakthrough makes that difference."

Torres believes that for parents, Breakthrough Silicon Valley opens doors for a better future for their children. "It gives them an opportunity to give their children more and to connect them with a group that may have more information or resources than they do," she says. "We can advocate for the students and teach them to be advocates for themselves."

Breakthrough Silicon Valley first invests in students in middle school, providing more than six years of assistance. "When you think about what's needed to get into a university, middle school is the absolute latest you should be getting to these kids, because they need to have the prerequisite classes to get into Advanced Placement courses in high school," says Torres. "It's a long-term investment in terms of time and resources, starting right when it's needed."

Some of the students attending Bret Harte and Castillero Middle Schools and Leland and Pioneer High Schools are served by Breakthrough Silicon Valley. "If the student is the first in their family to attend college, receives a

Almaden Lake has a toxic algae problem

ore than 40 lakes in California, including Almaden Lake, have a toxic algae problem.

It's called cyanobacteria, a naturally occurring substance blossoms like a weed. The algae can cause gastrointestinal upsets, skin rashes and allergic reactions in people, and sickness or death among dogs, livestock, and wildlife

California's ongoing drought has contributed to the toxic levels of the bacteria, which multiplies rapidly in hot temperatures, low water flows and stagnant water.

Due to these elevated levels, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services has announced the Almaden Lake is closed to all water activities until further notice. The park will remain open, however.

Lake Cunningham

Almaden's sister publication, Evergreen Times, reports that Lake Cunningham is now closed to boating and fishing for the first time earlier this month because of the toxic algae. This is disappointing to kayakers, paddle boaters and a local outrigger canoe club that may impact Family Festival: Day in the Park scheduled for Oct. 1.

The city of San José will continue testing water quality at both lakes at least twice weekly, and water areas will not reopen until two weeks after results show that the lake have returned to safe readings.

'Battle of the Big Bands'with GLEE star set to perform Oct. 1

Relive the music of the 1940's when two big bands comprised of 30 musicians play a musical tribute to the 1940s big band kings of swing, Tommy Dorsey and Glen Miller, on Saturday, Oct. 1 at the Heritage Theater in Campbell.

Battle of the Big Bands, a Las Vegas production, will feature vocalist Bill A. Jones (also known to millions as 'Rod Remington' on FOX TV's "GLEE"). Bill, who sings songs made famous by Frank Sinatra and others, toured with The Glenn Miller Orchestra

In the tradition of the Big Band battles from the '30s and '40s, the two bands take the stage in a back-and-forth competition that showcases jazz, swing and favorite standards from the glory years.

The live musical performance will run non-stop for two hours plus a 15 minute intermission. The audience will vote at the end of the evening for their favorite Big Band; but the clear winner is always the audience.

Tommy Dorsey was an American jazz trombonist, composer, conductor and bandleader of the Big Band era. He was known as the "Sentimental Gentleman of Swing," because of his smooth-toned trombone playing. Although he was not known for being a notable soloist, his technical skill on the trombone gave him renown

amongst other musicians. He was the younger brother of bandleader Jimmy Dorsey. After Dorsey broke with his brother in the mid-1930s, he led an extremely popular and highly successful band from the late 1930s into the 1950s. He is best remembered for standards such as "Opus One", "Song of India", "Marie", "On Treasure Island," and his biggest hit single "I'll Never Smile Again." Dorsey passed away in his sleep on Nov. 26, 1956 at the age of 51 in his Greenwich, Connecticut, home.

Glenn Miller was an American big band musician, arranger, composer, and bandleader in the swing era. Glenn Miller made his first movie appearance in the 1935 Paramount Pictures release The Big Broadcast of 1936 as a member of

the Ray Noble Orchestra performing "Why Stars Come Out at Night." He was the best-selling recording artist from 1939 to 1943, leading one of the best known big bands. Miller's recordings include "In the Mood," "Moonlight Serenade", "Pennsylvania 6-5000", "Chattanooga Choo Choo", "A String of Pearls", "At Last". "(I've Got a Gal In) Kalamazoo", "American Patrol", "Tuxedo Junction", "Elmer's Tune," and "Little Brown Jug." While he was traveling to entertain U.S. troops in France during World War II, Glenn Miller's aircraft disappeared in bad weather over the English Channel on December 15, 1944.



reduced or free lunch, or if English is a second language in their home, all of these are challenges that can make it harder to gain admission to, or graduate from a four-year college or university," says Torres. "Regardless of where you live, there are people with different stories and socioeconomic backgrounds throughout Silicon Valley and Almaden."

Breakthrough Silicon Valley works with highly-motivated students with immense potential, but due to risk factors would likely be unable to attend a four-year university without intervention, says Executive Director Melissa Johns. "They might come from a low-income family, a single-parent home, or live in a neighborhood impacted by gang activity. They're kids who like school and want some extra enrichment to soar beyond the wildest expectations anybody has for them. They come to Breakthrough and have a new standard set for their academic excellence. We ensure they'll have college readiness and college counseling so they can attend a four-year university."

Through Breakthrough Silicon Valley, students learn creative problem solving with collaboration and a growth mindset, which Torres believes are critical skills for future careers. "The students are highly motivated to learn," she says. "It takes a lot to give up a few days each week for six summers (the program is year-round) rather than hanging out with your friends. The program rounds out not only students' educational skills, but also the confidence and growth mindset that makes all the difference in their current and future success."

Former teaching fellow Ankit Mukherjee agrees. "Breakthrough Silicon Valley serves as an indispensable player in closing the inequality gap of the future by closing the inequity gap of the present," he says. "It ensures that every student who participates in the program has access to the same education and inclusive communities they are so often excluded from. The program bolsters education and a work ethic, but also grants students a unique environment to explore their identity, talents and aspirations."

Breakthrough Silicon Valley not only paves the way for students to attend college, but also trains high school and college students to serve as teachers and role models for younger students. "It creates dedicated, passionate instructors who see the impact they can make in the lives of the students," says Torres. "The 'students-teaching-students' model is at the core of our success, because the students have role models showing it's cool to be smart," says Johns.

Mukherjee says that being an instructor for Breakthrough Silicon Valley was the most gratifying and impactful experience of his life. "I have never had a more rewarding summer nor experienced a community of so many loving, mature, caring and amazing people as the one I found at Breakthrough," he says.

On the last day of the summer program, the teachers sat in a circle with their eyes closed with their students lined up behind them. An administrator instructed the students to tap a teacher on the shoulder who taught them something this summer...who changed their life...who made them laugh. "With every tap," says Mukherjee, "I was truly able to realize the impact the program had, and that I had on the students."

Breakthrough Silicon Valley is modeled after 'Summer Bridge,' a program that started in San Francisco in 1978 to provide lower income students with an academically rigorous curriculum in preparation of attending college prep high schools followed by four-year colleges. In the early 1990s a team replicated the program throughout the country calling it 'Breakthrough.' In 2002, Breakthrough Silicon Valley was formed when Applied Materials

wanted to bring educational opportunities to students falling through the cracks in the San Jose Unified School District. In 2010, the program extended from middle schools to high schools, making it a six-year program. In 2016, Breakthrough Silicon Valley became its own independent non-profit in partnership with the school district.

Providing an accelerated teaching level for motivated students is what Breakthrough Silicon Valley's all about, says Johns. "In 12th grade, our students have to compete with all the kids applying to college at the same time, and we want them to have a new level of expectations set for their academic success," she says. "By their freshman year, we want all of our students to be on the honors and advanced placement track so we're very careful about helping them choose their classes. By their senior year, we make sure they've created a very competitive college applicant resume."

The process to apply to college starts the summer before a student's senior year. Breakthrough Silicon Valley provides an overnight retreat for the whole class where they review the students' personal statements. A college counselor works with the students and their families to review their list of potential universities and work on applications and financial aid forms. In Jan. of their senior year, the students have access to Breakthrough Silicon Valley's scholarship database, which includes some scholarships solely offered to Breakthrough students.

Some Breakthrough Silicon Valley student's families have income levels that are so low, that their family contribution is small. For example,

Agustin was accepted into the University of Pennsylvania and his mother, a single mom who worked in food service, had saved up \$2000 for tuition. For that school, the annual tuition, room and board tops \$65,000. But, after a Penn grant and work/study program, the requested family contribution was only \$50. His mom couldn't believe it. "This is what your son's been working so hard for," the Breakthrough Silicon Valley staff told her. "We don't just want to help them apply to colleges," says Johns, "we want them to be competitive applicants for the schools that are the best match for them."

Johns believes that Breakthrough Silicon Valley offers students not only a brighter future, but also a source of trusted information and guidance specific to what best applies to their families and their situation. "It's the trust that's built up over six years with our staff and knowing we have their best interest in mind," says Johns, "and that we'll be here for all the ups and downs. It's what makes this place feel like a second family for our students. The program is completely free for families but we ask for a really big commitment. We don't give up on them and they can't give up on themselves."

Each fall, Breakthrough Silicon Valley hosts an academic trivia contest *Are You Smarter than a Breakthrough Student?* which raises money to support existing Breakthrough Silicon Valley programs and fuel their expansion. This year's event takes place at the Computer History Museum on Oct. 6 at 6p.m. Past teams of competitors have included local business executives from Applied Materials, Silicon Valley Bank, Google, eBay, Ooyala, and PwC. They invite

individuals and corporate teams to join in the fun and compete against the best and brightest of Silicon Valley.

"I've never seen a fundraising event like this," says Johns. "People are bummed they can't make it." In addition to dinner and drinks, participants have the chance to meet students, learn more about the program and compete in the game with the help of student lifelines. "The audience leaves having a much greater understanding of why this organization's important," says Johns, "and the impact it has on the community."

"I am certain someone was cutting raw onions underneath our table when those students took the podium," says previous attendee Casey Robertson. "Their struggles are real, but their futures are so incredibly bright. Just thinking about it brought me to tears. Although we didn't make it to the finals...the real winners had already been determined years ago, when these students walked through Breakthrough's doors."

Torres and Johns greatly appreciate the financial assistance Breakthrough Silicon Valley receives. "Every time we receive a check from a corporation," says Johns, "I see it as validation for my staff's hard work and the company's recognition of the potential of the students they're investing in."

"The support of corporations, philanthropic organizations and individuals is critical for Breakthrough," says Torres. "Without it Breakthrough wouldn't be able to do the incredible work it does. I hope more people learn about the mission and want to support what we're doing."

Silicon Valley Cares is one such organization; it chose Breakthrough Silicon Valley as one of its recipients for its annual Broomstick Ball fundraiser on Oct. 15. "We love Breakthrough Silicon Valley," says Silicon Valley Cares founder Kelly Dippel. "What an incredible organization. There are so many children struggling to get into college and even finish high school, facing poverty and other issues that take away their focus. When Breakthrough Silicon Valley spoke to our group about what they do, they had us in tears. They're amazing."

Breakthrough Silicon Valley staff provide students with hope for the future and a personalized program to help them reach their goals says Torres. "The Breakthrough staff are some of the most dedicated educational professionals I have ever met; they know each child personally. They know their story and their family. This isn't just about giving them a set of tools; it's about understanding the psychological or economic barriers they might face in getting through all the courses needed for college, applying for financial aid, or their concerns around leaving friends and family. It's knowing which university will be the best fit for them so they'll succeed. There's no way these students can have the level of success they have without being so deeply known and understood by the staff. The support and personal attention each student receives is extraordinary."

According to Torres, nearly 100 percent of the students in their program gain acceptance into a four-year college and a percentage in the high 90s completes college. "The students are given the skills to succeed," she says. Breakthrough Silicon Valley also provides networking opportunities and ensures its students are striving. "A recent graduate told me she was looking for a job and was interested in marketing, so I connected her with a recruiter in Google's marketing department," says Torres. "That's the power of Breakthrough. I know the training these students received and how serious they are about their future, so I feel confident recommending them. It's not just about helping them get into college, but beyond."

How to find out basic information about attorneys before hiring them

THIS WEEK'S QUESTION:

I need to find an attorney to help me with a divorce case. A name was recommended to me by a good friend. How can I find out some basic information before I employ an attorney?

Dear Jason:

You emailed in a very good question, Jason. Let me see if I can provide a little guidance for you.

One way of finding out some good information is for you to go onto the State Bar of California website. This website is maintained by the State Bar of California and all of us attorneys need to be members of that group. No exceptions.

I would go into my computer search box and enter "State Bar of California". Under the various options, you would enter "Attorney Search" and then "Quick Search".

You would then enter the attorney's name and/or state bar number, if you happen to know it, in the box provided. Most of the time you would just have the name, which is OK. When the name pops us, double-click on the name and the attorney's "profile information" will appear on your screen.

When the profile information appears, you can see the full name and state bar number for that person. If you do this for my name, you will see that my current status is "active", and that I may practice law in the

State of California.

You will also see that my office address is 6475 Camden Avenue, Suite 200, San Jose, CA 95120. My telephone number and fax numbers are also shown. My email address

is also listed as well as my undergraduate school, the University of Iowa. My law school is provided as well, Santa Clara University School of Law in Santa Clara CA. This same basic information is required of all lawyers who are admitted to practice law in the State of California.

"Status History" is also provided, which for me is "active" status since I was admitted to the State Bar of California on June 26, 1970. Any status change is also noted, such as any periods of suspension. (You would want to look into any periods of suspension, etc., in greater detail.)

Another area is "Actions Affecting Eligibility to Practice Law", such as disciplinary and related actions. Fortunately in my case, "this member has no public record of discipline." As with any change in status mentioned above, you would want to check further into any record of discipline as well as the next category, "administrative actions". These are possible warning flags in your search for information.

While on the State Bar website, you might want to review other information available,

such as the "Overview" area. There are more than 250,000 members of the California State Bar now, the largest in the country. Of that number, 185,500 of us may actively practice law. We need to have passed

the California State Bar Exam prior to being admitted to practice and we need to pay our annual dues each year, and maintain "continuing education" so that it is up to date.

You mentioned that you need help with a divorce case. When you enter the website, you can see if that attorney is a "certified specialist" in family law, one of 11 fields that the Board of Legal Specialization certifies.

You might also be interested in one or more of the 18 consumer pamphlets that are published by the State Bar, such as "Finding the Right Lawyer", "Do I Need Estate Planning", "Do I Need a Will", and many

others. I have read several of these pamphlets and they are excellent.

Parents might especially be interested in "Kids and the Law", described as addressing a host of issues of interest to parents and kids, from curfews to safety on the Internet.

Other consumer pamphlets and legal guides focus on "Seniors and the Law—A Guide for Maturing Californians", and "When you Turn 18—A Survival Guide for Teenagers".

I hope that the words above have been helpful, Jason. Finding the right lawyer is not an easy job. You will want to take your time and do the best job that you can. Best wishes in your effort and with your case.





Car shooter arrested

The San Jose Police Department has arrested Michael James Lee Lewis (inset), accused of randomly shooting at occupied vehicles on Blossom Hill Road.

Lewis allegedly shot at ten vehicles during a period of three months. Thanks to the alertness of Officer Mel Dunn his initial contact with the suspect led to a search warrant and the information needed for SJPD's Covert Response Team.



Lewis is booked into the Santa Clara County Jail on four counts of attempted murder and an outstanding felony warrant for felon in possession of a firearm.

Banned Books Week Sept 25 – Oct 1, 2016



Nearly 1.6 million juniors in more than 22,000 high schools entered the 2017 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2015 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test.

One percent of the 1.6 million contestants are named as semifinalists (16,000). Of these about 15,000 will become finalists next February, with half of the students winning scholarships from the National Merit organization or from cooperating corporations or colleges and universities.

To become a finalists, semifinalists must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by a high school official, write an essay, and earn SAT scores that confirm the student's earlier performance on the qualifying test.

Merit Scholar designees are selected on the basis of their

skills, accomplishments, and potential for success in rigorous college studies, without regard to gender, race, ethnic origin, or religious preference.





Saint Anthony's Catholic Church on McKean Road in south Almaden will conduct Mass on Oct 2 at 5:30 pm. under the oak tree.






