





New Regulations to Mandate Lead Testing in New York Schools

On September 6, 2016, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo signed landmark legislation (S.8158/A.10740) mandating that schools across the state test drinking water for lead contamination. Lead is a toxic material that is extremely harmful to young children and can result in lowered IQ, behavioral problems and brain damage. The state Department of Health also issued emergency regulations pursuant to the new legislation, requiring that school districts test their water for lead contamination and report results to parents, the state Department of Health and local government officials. For schools serving children in pre-kindergarten through grade 5, sampling must be completed by September 30, 2016; schools grade 6 through grade 12 must complete sampling by October 31, 2016. These new regulations will reduce the risk for exposure to this dangerous substance and ensure all New York's students have access to clean, drinkable water.

The Livingston County Department of Health is working to support local schools with this new regulation. Several school districts have already tested their drinking water for lead contamination and those that encountered elevated lead levels are implementing a lead remediation plan.

"The Livingston County Department of Health applauds the Governor's efforts to ensure safe and clean water for schoolchildren throughout New York State", stated Jennifer Rodriguez, Public Health Director.



The Livingston County Suicide Prevention Task Force, a sub-committee of the Genesee Valley Health Partnership, held their 2nd Annual Vigil for Suicide Prevention on September 8th at Livingston County Mental Health Services in Geneseo. The event coincided with World Suicide Prevention Day, which is observed annually. This year's theme was Connect, Communicate, and Care.

As the rain came down on the close to 70 attendees, members of the community rejoiced in the "Tears from Heaven" and came together to support each other, remember those lost to suicide, and most importantly, to make it known that stigma will no longer silence our community. Stigma is what keeps those in need quiet, and afraid to seek help.

The event included members of our community who were willing to share their personal stories conveying the importance for people to understand that mental health issues are treatable and that suicide is preventable. For one speaker, it was her own struggle with addiction, suicidality and hospitalizations. Another, who is a father, husband, and respected community member, shared the heartache of losing a family member to suicide. A single mom shared what it was like for her to be struggling with a mental illness. A high school student reminded us in song that "What the World Needs Now is Love." Each presenter underlined the need for compassion, understanding, and hope. As the evening drew to a close, individuals embraced each other as candles were lit sending a light (or even just a spark) of hope, compassion, and understanding home with them.



MMFD Greetings Fire Prevention

October brings many great things: Pumpkins, apples, colors, cool crisp air and Fire Prevention Week! Since 1922, Fire Prevention Week has been commemorated on the Sunday thru Saturday that October 8th-9th falls within. This is in remembrance of the Great Chicago Fire, which we will talk about more in next weeks column. This year it is Sunday October 9 thru Saturday October 15. This year's theme is "Don't Wait–Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms every 10 Years." To find out how old your smoke alarm is, just turn it over and check the date it was manufactured. It should be replaced every 10 years. Let's refresh our memories of other Fire Prevention tips:

- Have a meeting place outside the home for everyone to meet in case of fire.
- If you awaken to the sound of your smoke detector or the smell of smoke: Get out and call for help from the outside meeting place or another location OUTSIDE the house.
- Practice E.D.I.T.H Exit Drills In The Home with your family. Really practice! Rehearse leaving the house - Where is the closest exit? What if that's blocked? Where is the secondary exit?

Meet at your pre-planned location, call for help - don't try to put the fire out yourself.
