Revival on the west side of Aitkin Journey North offers new way to worship in Aitkin

Excitement was in the air as The Journey North Aitkin Campus opened its new facility in the former Westside Church in west Aitkin on Hwy. 210.

Journey North, which also has a campus in Baxter, has extensively renovated the church and lots of work remained to be finished during Sneak Peak Sunday on Oct. 2.

Visitors were welcomed into a spacious lobby. The Journey North captures a more

modern aesthetic, with colorful decorating, neon signs and an enthusiastic young staff.

Worship Pastor Josh Pool led the music in the auditorium. The former space was reconfigured to face east with a large stage for the band. Also installed were two gigantic big-screen televisions and a highly technical sound and lighting system.

The congregation clapped and kept the beat and sang with enthusiasm to Pool's guitar and vocals. He said he

is new to the area, hailing from Southern California.

Pastor Lynfield Hines took the stage, dressed in an untucked black shirt, jeans and tennis shoes -- talking through a hands-free microphone.

His excitement was infectious as he talked about the changes and all the programs that will be offered. One congregation member called out "exhilarated" as Hines attempted to describe the level of his feelings.



Hines was especially drawn to his group of "Out for Lunch" that will meet for five weeks and have lunch at a different restaurant in Aitkin each week.

Hines noted that not everything is complete and that there is still much work to do before the grand opening. "We're still tweaking the sound system and tweaking things."

His "Life Verse" Isiah 43.19, says: "See, I am doing a new thing!

Now it springs up; do you

not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

"I believe God is stirring up something new and exciting in the Aitkin area," emphasized Hines. "The Journey North is not the church for perfect people. It's the church for broken people who need a savior to deliver them ... Maybe you are lonely. Maybe your marriage is hanging by a thread. Your loneliness can be healed. Your marriage can be healed. I've been there. You may be in a wasteland or dry wilderness but God's healing waters have come."

He said the five values of Journey North are honor, au-

thenticity, generosity, relevance and unity.

Following the abbreviated service folks were free to walk around and check out the new space and sign up for programs. The downsized gym was filled with construction equipment and many spaces were unfinished.

In addition to Hines and Pool, staff includes Pastor Dallas Smith who will lead the 9 a.m. worship and be the prayer minister for both campuses. EllieJoy Krautkremer is in charge of the children's programs and Mandolin Copa is the youth director. AWANA will be starting in November.

It seems to be a trend in Aitkin, with new or revived churches starting where previous ones existed. Journey North picks up where Westside left off, Heritage Assembly of God is now affiliated with the Brainerd Heritage campus and New Life Alliance took over the former Bethel Lutheran Church building, blending a congregation of long-time Lutherans and new members.





chief suggesting he created duplicative ICRs for Cuyuna that had originally been done by Crow Wing County. Because Cuyuna is not a 24/7 agency many of the calls they receive are responded to by Crow Wing County Sheriff's [Department]. Jesse would often duplicate the Crow Wing County Sheriff's ICRs for the Cuyuna call, so the Cuyuna officers would understand what happened in the city when they were off duty. Smith does not suggest in these duplicative ICRs that he was somehow responding to the call or he played a greater roll in it. In fact, he mentions that his roll was to type the ICR. He also cross references the original ICR for the police

officer to relate back to that. "Finally the police chief goes out of her way to complain that Jesse Smith isn't remorseful and can't be a good officer. The evidence will show there was no clear rule regarding a distinction between Facebook use over here and work, what Jesse was doing for Cuyuna over here. I would submit to you that then if a clear rule like that was published there is no reason why Jesse couldn't continue to be an excellent officer for the City of Crosby.

"We believe that proceeding with this very weak case is not fair to the taxpayers of the City of Crosby. Return to the city's first attempt to terminate Jesse Smith in 2012. Now six

months he's been on administrative leave. In the last four, years you have paid Jesse to sit home two full years. He's either been on administrative leave, or on back-pay awarded by an arbitrator. So we are not only talking salary, we're talking insurance, pension benefits, payroll taxes. I would estimate you probably paid or squandered \$130,000 to \$140,000 just in the payments that went to Jesse Smith for not working.

"Obviously you can proceed with this discharge and run the risk of again paying significant benefits to Jesse Smith. The Teamsters Union also request the attorneys fees be paid to the Law Firm of Abrams and Schmidt, since they were retained. We originally didn't get the full record but now we have. And since April of 2013, you paid that firm \$110,000 and although the bills are not split between Jesse Smith matters and all other matters. I think you can safely say an estimate \$30,000 to \$40,000 directly related to Jesse Smith discipline, perhaps higher.

"Now I mentioned before that Jesse Smith made a time keeping error. That can happen to anybody. In these bills I received from Abrams and Schmidt, there's a timekeeping entry on September 17, 2013 for an 18.9 hour phone call, at an hourly rate of \$145 per hour and a total payment of \$2740.50. I highly doubt

hour phone call. It was probably simply a billing error on her part. The billing error submitted by your attorney and then stamped approved and signed by your City Clerk Lisa Sova. I point this out for two reasons. People make mistakes sometimes. That's one of the big allegations by Chief Coughlin in supporting her discharge of Jesse Smith. Now I don't think the City Clerk should be fired for approving what appears to be an erroneous bill or some reason behind it not putting in an explanation. But [there is] a 19 hour phone call on one of your bills and people make mistakes. The other reason I point it out, because this underscores the risk that your taxpayers are at. Nobody's watching the cost to the taxpayers. Between what you paid Jesse Smith in back pay, what you've paid the attorney, what you've paid for Lieutenant Randolph to do this investigation, for the Chief to supervise this investigation. I'm going to guess your costs are well over \$200,000 in this already. We're heading down the same path for an equally weak case. Is that really fair to the tax payers of Crosby to move forward with this discharge? So for all those reasons we ask that you not follow Chief Coughlins recommendations. That you not terminate. We find some

reasonable solution to this.





Costs mount as Police Officer Jesse Smith is on paid administrative leave Attorney Andrew estimates cost to Crosby taxpayers of over \$200,000

On October 4, the City of Crosby Council met to discuss the possible termination of Police Officer Jesse Smith after being on paid administrative leave for over six months.

Following a closed door pre-meeting, which delayed the meeting over 30 minutes, Mayor Joanna Lattery then called the Crosby City Council meeting to order.

Following the pledge of allegiance, Mayor Lattery said, "We are now at an agenda item concerning a personal matter." She cited Minnesota statute 13D.05 subdivision 2b and closed the meeting.

Then public and media were dismissed and a closed session was conducted in excess of 45 minutes with the full council in attendance. Following the closed door meeting the public and media were allowed to return to the council chambers.

The meeting resumed with Attorney Tim Andrew of Andrew and Bransky PA representing Officer Jesse Smith and Teamsters Union Local #346. Andrew spoke about reasons not to follow Chief Kim Coughlin's attorney's recommendations to pursue charges of misconduct.

Andrew said, "If you follow that recommendation then Local #346 will grieve that termination and the matter will end up before a labor arbitrator. Before the arbitrator, the City of Crosby will have the burden of proof [to show] just cause to terminate a twenty year employee. And I submit to you the City of Crosby cannot meet that burden. I ask you look behind some of the bias language and hyperbole and speculation in Chief Coughlin's letter recommending discharge. And ask yourself exactly what is the conduct at issue here?

"As you know Jesse Smith has a part-time job as Police Chief in the City of Cuyuna. He was appoint Chief in Cuyuna in 2014. Prior to that time he worked as a part-time officer. Through an investigation it was discovered on three occasions officer Smith had incorrectly

reported his time in Cuyuna over a two year period. With one of those instances there was an hour overlap between Cuyuna and Crosby time. Once that was discovered and the criminal investigation of Jesse Smith had concluded, Jesse Smith repaid that hour to the City of Cuyuna. I would also submit to you, that what happens outside of Crosby employment is only relevant, if you can show a substantial nexus between that off-duty conduct and Jesse's employment as an officer. And what he does in the City of Cuyuna, unless it impacts the City of Crosby specifically and directly, does not get you to just cause.

"So he made a time keeping error. I would submit to you that anyone keeping track of their time the old fashioned way by writing it down, in this case at the end of the month, makes errors. That type of error is not a dischargeable offense.

"It was also was the impression in the chief's report that Jesse Smith was somehow

scamming the city or the City of Cuyuna or the City of Crosby or he was engaging in some kind of illegal conduct. The chief writes in her report and I'm quoting here, Lieutenant Thompson's report indicated there was enough evidence for a criminal complaint against Officer Smith, however due the complexity of the case among other reasons, it was decided to proceed with an internal investigation.

"I would like to also point out what Lieutenant Thompson from Cass County had to say about Jesse's so called illegal conduct. He was specifically looking when the ICRs were created and reported for both Cities of Crosby and Cuyuna. This is what Lieutenant Thompson writes, 'The dates and times created and reported ICRs when cross referenced with the Cuyuna payroll sheets and the Crosby payroll sheets to see if ICRs were created or reported to allow for payment by both Police Departments. There does not appear to be

any instances of this type of activity. And no evidence of Officer Smith creating ICRs in order to be paid from both the Citys of Crosby and Cuyuna.'

Mayor Lattery interrupted Andrew and said "Excuse me, may I just make a comment right here. What was talked about in closed session cannot be discussed at open session."

Andrew replied "Fair enough."

Then Andrew said "The main substance then what Chief Coughlin is complaining about is approximately once every two weeks or 13 days. Smith logged into the LATD system using his Cuyuna credentials while he was working for Crosby. That happened over a two year period, 56 times, if you do the math it is about once every 13 days. Keep in mind when he did that, the understanding in the Police Department that personal use of the computers to do such things as Facebook or comments responding to personal emails or putting your fantasy football online,

those are allowed, as long as they are not excessive and as long as the public does not view it.

"Also keep in mind during 12 hour shifts the officers, including Jesse, are always on duty, ready to respond to an emergency. Naturally, they have breaks or downtime or periods of multi-tasking in their police work doing something other than making an arrest, writing a report or some other direct police work like that.

"So what Officer Smith would do is he'd log in to the LATD using the Cuyuna credentials and he would use the computer instead of Facebook or what have you. He would write a Cuyuna ICR. Often times he would receive calls, when he wasn't working in Crosby, about a Cuyuna matter. And have it in his head, probably see a report needed to be done. Briefly type that up, while on private time, late at night, three in the morning. It was also and allegation by the
