Saving Hearts suicide prevention walk/run set for October 29 in Crosby

"We have had other deaths in our family but this is a whole nother experience horrible. If we can just prevent other families from going through this pain maybe his death won't be in vain."

So says Ann Raph, co-founder of the Saving Hearts Walk/Run, about her nephew Shane Heyn, who took his own life in December 2012 at age 35.

"Shane loved the outdoors and he loved it up here," said Raph in an interview. He was very close to her and her husband and loved to spend time in the Emily area. "He was a great fisherman and a hard worker. We had no idea that he was suffering and about to take his own life."

Shane was the oldest of the family's four grandchildren and Raph's daughter said "Why don't we just have a little walk?" to remember her cousin and prevent suicide.

The third such event is set for Sat., Oct. 29, at the Cuyuna Range Elementary

begins at 9 a.m. with the walk and run, 5K and 1 mile, set for 10 a.m.

The event moved to the elementary school from the Hallett Center as its numbers have grown. They are also adding a silent auction and hope to triple their donations this year.

"Once our family started working on the preparation of this event in 2014, the outpouring of support and volunteers was incredible," Ann outlined in a press release. "In 2014, we welcomed 90 participants and raised \$2,400

"In 2015, the Saving Hearts team was astounded by 192 participants and raised \$5,500 for the Crisis Line and Referral Service of Brainerd.

"We are hoping to surpass those numbers again this year for the third annual event on October 29. All proceeds from the event will go to the Crisis Line and Referral Service Center of Brainerd, serving Crow Wing, Aitkin, Cass, Todd, Morrison and Wadena counties."

"We want the Crisis Line to use this money to try to prevent even one person from taking their own life" continued Raph. "This is such a good organization where they go around to the schools every year and try to educate our young people that there are resources out there — if you are feeling lonely, angry,



Last year they raised \$16,600 with the match grant to help purchase books for the coming year. Council approved accepting donations to the library.

Crosby Police Department

The Police Chief's report was given by Lieutenant Kevin Randolph. Randolph indicated there was only one item in his report, about a pile of dirt on the sidewalk and the boulevard. The property owner that also owns the three to four yards of black dirt has been repeatedly informed this past summer to remove it. It was decided to draft a formal letter with a time limit of before Nov. 1 to remove the dirt. If the owner does not remove the dirt by that time, the dirt will be removed and there will be a \$100 fee charged to the resident. The council approved this action.

Public Works

Public Works Working Foreman Steve Perpich spoke about the water tower inspection by submarine showing no ice damage. He said the stacks looked good and there is very little sediment in it. He said the parts have been ordered for the First Street lift station; and the bathrooms in the campground will need to be shut down for the year next week. The Heritage square bike wash has already been winterized. He said the new skidsteer trailer, replacing the one that was stolen, was being delivered on Tues., Oct. 11. Some ways of securing the trailers better to prevent future theft were discussed.

City Attorney Tom Pearson talked about cemetery lot approval to allow for cremains be placed at a burial site.

Garbage Collection

The next matter discussed was revisions to the ordinance for organized sold waste collection to allow for the self hauling of refuse. After some discussion by Range Disposal Attorney Kurt Porter spoke about Minnesota Statute Law. Porter relayed that organized collection self hauling issue and indicated the matter was up to the council if it was allowed in the city. Porter suggested it should be taken on a case by case basis instead of allowing anyone to self haul. Mayor Joanna Lattery suggested she had read in Porter's memo that multiple parties could share one trash cart. Lattery said she didn't think people should be required to have garbage service from Range and couldn't self haul.

City Attorney Pearson said "The statute says if you have an organized collection and you know your residents must subscribe to that or have a way to dispose their refuse in an environmentally sound

Then the self hauling issue was discussed amongst all the councilmen they all were in support of allowing it. The council decided unanimously to allow self hauling in the ordinance. Lattery said the waste collection billing is still on schedule to be taken over by Range Disposal by

City Clerk/Treasurer Lisa Sova presented delinquent utility account list to pay by the end of the month or Crow Wing County will add the bills to their property taxes. The council approved the resolution to allow.

Sova said the Serpent Lake Sanitary Sewer District rate increase was to be put in effect on January 1, 2017.

Lattery said that she felt that Crosby flows were too high. There was some discussion with Councilman Jim Goshey who serves on the Board representing Crosby. Goshey explained they are going with an average flat rate billed monthly. It was decided to talk to City Engineer about his findings on the flow meter he had installed to meter Crosby's sewage flow.

Goshey indicated the Sewer District had losing money for the past three years and the rates needed to be increased. The matter was decided to be tabled until next meeting so they could check with City Engineer Phil Martin.

Other

Crow Wing County reclassification of two properties to Non-Conservation lands with permission of the city. The council approved the reclassification.

The council approved the partial payment of \$326,065.37 to Pratt's Affordable Excavating.

Lattery indicated that the owners of the old Community Center on Hwy. 6 had not found another nonprofit to take it over. So they want to deed it to the city. Lattery wanted to wait to have the City Building Inspector Scott Sadusky give a report of what he thought.

Rain Gardens

Melissa Barrick, Crow Wing County Soil and Water Conservation District talked about revised rain garden plans to allow for the expansion of the Police Department. The plans would be to remake the two rain gardens outside City Hall. The price for this would be \$38,000 to be paid out of the grant proceeds.

The council approved the two rain gardens including maintenance of them.

Blue lights to honor Deputy Sandberg

As the one-year anniversary approaches of the death of Aitkin County Sheriff's Deputy Steven Sandberg, who died while on duty Oct. 18, 2015, members of the Aitkin community are asking residents to display a blue lights Oct.

17-24. The hope is to get 1,000 blue lights distributed.




