Rasberry named EDA Board Chair

During the Jones County Economic Development Authority's annual fiscal year-end banquet, Jim Rasberry with Rasberry Financial was named the new EDA Board Chairman, succeeding Billy Browning, who served three years as chairman.

Two members, Stan Burton and Tom Canizaro, retired from the board and were recognized for their service with a gift of appreciation. Courtney Hill, owner of Hill's Jewelry, was named "Ambassador of the Year," and George Bassi, Lauren Rogers Museum of Art director, was named "Volunteer of the Year."

EDA President Ross Tucker addressed the crowd, giving an overview of the EDA's year. Tucker said there is a focus on developing tourism in the area, and a tourism

committee was established that meets on a monthly basis. "We've created literature to get as much information out there about Jones County as we can," said Tucker. He said a new KIOSK created by Howard Industries will be strategically placed throughout the county to distribute the informational material being developed about Jones County.

"We did a big push, coupled with the Mississippi Development Authority, to promote Ben and Erin's pilot show of "Home Town" for HGTV," said Tucker. "We're very glad for their success and we're anticipating that success to shine on all of us."

Tucker said that in 1983 the duties associated with the Jones County Chamber of Commerce were brought under the EDA. This coming year, the Chamber will sepa-

rate from the EDA (in duties only) and will have its own board of directors, and tourism will slide under the Chamber. There are actually three Jones County entities working together for the betterment of our community - the Jones County Chamber of Commerce, the Jones County Foundation, and the Jones County EDA.

When Billy Browning introduced Rasberry as the new Chairman, he described him as being a "bright and creative person with a lot of energy." From the moment Rasberry took the microphone, one could

feel the level of energy rise in the room. Speaking to the more than 300 people in attendance, Rasberry said, "I want to tell you why I'm really excited about what's going on. I feel like we're on a plane that's about to take off. There are so many good things going on right now. We have an economy and community that supports each other and we support small business. And this is creating the quality of life in Jones County that we want to be a part of."

To represent what can happen when a community comes together to support one another, Rasberry invited the owners of two successful businesses from Tupelo to talk with the crowd about how they've been able to succeed. Mitch McCarney and Seth Copeland are the owners and founders of The Neon Pig, which was voted "Best Burger in America" by readers of the popular food, drink, and travel site, Thrillist.com. Nick Weaver and Josh West are the owners and founders of Blue Delta Jean Company which offers premium custom fitted denim jeans made from scratch to a customer's specification. Customers choose their own fabric, thread color, and hardware, and the jeans are made to the customer's specific measurements.

All four men stressed the importance of keeping things local. Blue Delta Denim Company utilized the top seamstresses in the area from the closed denim factories. The Neon Pig use local farmers for their beef, pork, and lamb meat as well as for their produce items. The men added that they started their businesses because they wanted to return to their home town!

"If there is ever a time to believe in your

How to prevent car theft

Few motorists think much about preventing vehicle theft ... until their cars are stolen. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, a vehicle is stolen every 44 seconds in the United States. Many of those are recovered, but being victimized by car thieves can be a nervewracking and unsettling experience for car owners.

While car thefts are unpredictable, they can be prevented. While even the most proactive anti-theft car owner can be victimized by car thieves, there are ways to reduce that risk.

- Avoid the most stolen vehicle makes. The 2016 "Hot Wheels" report from the National Insurance Crime Bureau lists the most frequently stolen vehicles from 2015, the most recent year for reporting. These include: the 1997, 1996 & 1997 Honda Accord; 1998 & 2000 Honda Civic; 2005 & 2006 Ford F-Series pickup truck; 2004 & 2005 Chevrolet full-size pickup; and the 2014 Toyota Camry.

- Lock your car. Keep your vehicle locked at all times, even when driving. Many cars are stolen while left unlocked, even though power locks now require just the push of a button to lock the entire vehicle. Similarly, close all windows and the sunroof when the car is parked.

- Keep the vehicle registration in your wallet. Geico notes that car thieves can escape arrest if they can produce the vehicle's registration upon being pulled over. Keep your registration out of the car and on your person.

- Keep track of your keys. Do not hide a car key outside of the vehicle in the event you get locked out of your car. Thieves are aware of this trick and can steal your car.

- Keep valuables out of sight. Do not leave money, jewelry, electronics, or any other valuable items in plain sight in the car. Remove them promptly, or keep them in a trunk or under a cargo bed so they're not visible to potential thieves.

- Park in well-lit, heavily trafficked areas. Parking in a well-lit area can deter criminals, but parking close to building entrances and near parking lot security cameras adds extra layers of protection. If you must park in a parking garage, try to park close to the attendant.

- Employ an anti-theft device. Anti-theft devices include vehicle immobilizer systems and car alarms. Insurance companies may discount premiums for vehicles that are equipped with anti-theft devices.

- Use technological recovery tools. GPS technology can pinpoint your car if it is stolen and send that information to law enforcement officials. Some of these devices also can slow down vehicles or remotely block the car's ignition switch.

- Use VIN window etching. Have each window etched with the vehicle identification number. This will make the car less attractive to thieves looking to sell car parts or the entire vehicle.

Motorists can take an active role in preventing car theft and safeguarding their automotive investments.

Pumpkin sightings mean fall is here

Have you noticed the pretty pumpkins for sale all over Jones County? Their bright orange color tells us that fall is really here. Did you know that Mitchell Farms in Collins has a corn maze and pumpkin patch? Check it out. I've been researching pumpkin carving on the internet and have come up with some helpful information.

Choose a pumpkin with no soft spots; check the bottom for rot. Use a water based marker to draw your design on the pumpkin. For carving, a paring knife or non-serrated steak knife should work well. Check out the gadget drawer, a melon scoop might make cool eye sockets. Enjoy your creation while it lasts. Pumpkins are 90 percent water and only last a week or so after carving. The heat from a burning candle can cook your creation and drastically shorten its life. This year, try an LED votive or tea light – your pumpkin will last longer and it's much safer. For a bright, shiny finish, spray Armor All on the pumpkin and rub it in. Paint will not preserve a pumpkin.

The cooler mornings have brought me out from summer hibernation. We have been cutting back seemingly everything in the yard. Husband cuts and I drag it out of the way. So far, we have cut back eleagnus . . . that stuff can cover a house. We also trimmed cleyera and sweet olive. I had a radical thought to cut a very large garde-

nia in the front yard almost to the ground. Haven't decided whether to dig it up or attempt a low, rounded hedge. Either way, it really opened up the yard and you can now see the front of our house from the street.

Now is the time to start planning for next year's garden. Since the economic news is still gloomy, here are a few tips that might help you to save a little money, but still have a lovely landscape.

*Take cuttings. If you love the coleus you already have, there's no need to buy more. Simply take cuttings in the fall, pot up the new plants, keep them indoors by a window for the winter, and you'll have plenty of instant color for the garden next spring. For more varieties, exchange cuttings with friends, neighbors or garden-club members.

*Take softwood and hardwood stem cuttings to propagate some of your favorite shrubs. The method and timing for woody-shrub cuttings depends on the variety. Softwood cuttings, dipped in rooting hormone, are usually successful. If you want specific information, the Jones County Extension Office in Laurel has pamphlets that explain how to grow just about anything.

*Choose bulbs that multiply: some bulbs just keep going, replicating themselves with no effort from the gardener. Plant a few dozen daffodils, and in a few years you're likely to have many more.

*Invest in self-seeding plants. Cleome, cosmos, forget-me-nots and shasta daisies sow themselves but aren't invasive.

October is Housing America Month

Laurel Mayor Johnny Magee was joined by residents, staff, and members of the Board of Commissioners of the Laurel Housing Authority Tuesday, October 11, as he signed a proclamation recognizing October as Housing America Month. In signing the proclamation, the City of Laurel endorses the Housing America Campaign, its goals, objectives and purposes, and re-commits itself to meeting the affordable housing and community development needs of the community.

"I am thankful to how the mayor and the city of Laurel continues to work with us to make things better for our citizens," exclaimed Laurel Housing Authority Executive Director Ailrick Young.

According to the proclamation, Housing America Month is part of a year-long, national campaign to inform the public and decision makers of the critical need to address the nation's housing and community development concerns. For more than 70 years, it has been the policy of the nation, under

the US Housing Act, to promote the general welfare of the nation by employing its funds and credit to assist the several states and their political subdivisions to remedy the unsafe and unsanitary housing conditions and the acute shortage of decent, safe, and sanitary dwellings for families of lower income.

According to members of the Board of Commissioners, the Laurel Housing Authority is the oldest housing development authority in the state of Mississippi. It fully manages five separate developments (four developments in the City of Laurel, and one development in Jones County) from leasing to building and property maintenance.

The proclamation states that according to the State of the Nation's Housing report, nearly 41 million households now pay more than half of their income for housing. According to current estimates, on any given night, there are nearly 650,000 homeless nationwide, and up to 3.5 million persons experience homelessness at some point throughout the year. The National Low-Income Housing Coalition's 2016 "Out of

Reach" report stated that in no state can a full-time minimum wage earner afford either a one or two-bedroom rental unit at Fair Market Rate.

Young added, "Four out of every ten

families who need affordable housing can't afford it. One of the statistics that I think is very important is that when kids live in a place that they feel is safe for them, they tend to do a lot better in school."
