

Are you ready to "Do the Stew"? Well, you'd better get ready because it's almost time to enjoy this unique taste of Hopkins County! United once again, the Hopkins County Fall Festival and the Hopkins County Chamber of Commerce's World Champion Stew Contest will join their monster events together on the weekend of Friday and Saturday, October 21 and 22, 2016. Over 150 different pots of stew will be prepared over open wood fires (well, some cooks use small propane burners) but in general, the aroma of wood smoke can actually lead you to Buford Park (our "city park") in Sulphur Springs to the stew site area.

Fact: there's just a few simple ingredients required to call yours a true Hopkins County Stew...chicken, tomatoes, potatoes, corn and onion. Beyond that, some people add other ingredients, and that's OK to suit your own taste. But, like in party politics, the majority of stew enthusiasts are VERY SPECIFIC about what is right and what is wrong to put in the mix. Once you've paid your \$5 and gotten your stew bowl, you are free to roam and enjoy stew from any of the stew sites that you would like to visit. Don't be late!!...serving starts at 10:30 am Saturday, and all the stew is gone (all 150 pots) by noon! Amazing!!

I thought you might like to have an authentic stew recipe, so here's one that comes down to us from a musician/hunter/fisherman/local celebrity, the late Clovis "Peavine" Pinion. Whether in the kitchen or the deer camp, Peavine was a great guy with a million friends. It is unknown if he ever won the Stew contest!

Friends, it was a privilege knowing and working with Peavine Pinion. He was truly a country gentleman, usually dressed in Wellington boots and a straw hat, well-worn. He gave me this home-size recipe in 1990. I've made my own variations over the years as you also can, but this is his original. It can be cooked on the kitchen stove or outdoors in stew pot, and it yields about 4 gallons.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE FLUENCY IS A MUST FOR DENTISTS

Some of my best friends are dentists. No wonder. I have spent a good portion of my life and income with them. It all started with I was about eight or nine years old and was out chasing my dog Patsy. It was a bad day in several ways. I had been chunking rocks at telephone poles all day and kept missing them. My throws were no good. Finally, frustrated about having to find my dog and my poor rock-throwing average, I got about a foot

away from a pole, picked up a round rock about half the size of my fist, took a windup and let 'er go. That rock bounced back and hit me right in my mouth, breaking one of my front teeth. Sensing that the person who feeds her was in trouble, Patsy showed up to give me comfort.

My parents took me to the dentist who said the tooth couldn't be repaired until I was 18. Now this was a long time ago. Today it wouldn't be much of a problem. All my school pictures from the third grade on show me with a broken front tooth. I sort of got it repaired when I was high school. I didn't think it was a good job. The work was sloppy and the repaired tooth was uncomfortable.

When I was in the Army I got a new pair of front teeth. They were huge. Years later I got some good dental work from a dentist friend. He told me I was a special case because of all the work he did on me. Growing up in my dad's grocery store I drank plenty of root beers and ate many peanut butter logs. So I was a good dental client. I've had everything from fillings to implants. I've had jewelry made from some of the platinum and gold in my mouth. One piece is a belt buckle.

Another dentist friend works with the American Dental Association. Over lunch recently he told me the Americans With Disabilities Act requires information in dental offices to be available in the fifteen most common languages other than English spoken in Texas. My friend said if no one in the office is able to provide the necessary information to a patient who speaks another language, the office can call the American Dental Association and for one dollar and forty-seven cents a minute, the information will be provided to the patient.

I was curious about the fifteen most common languages spoken in Texas besides English, according to the Americans With Disabilities Act, so I looked up the list. Some might surprise you. Toping the list is Spanish, which is spoken by nearly forty percent of the state's twenty-eight million population. Then come Vietnamese, Chinese, Korean, Arabic, Urdu (the national language of Pakistan), Tagalog (Philippines), French, Hindi, Farsi, German, Gujarati, Russian, Japanese and Laotian.

You say you've never heard of Gujarati? According to the list, ten thousand Texans speak it. It is from the Indian state of Gujurat. The CIA says some 5 percent of India, or fifty-five million people, speak that language. Mahatma Gandhi spoke Gujarati.

No wonder my friend near Houston sold his AM radio station to a man who wanted to program it in oriental languages.

Peavine's Recipe for Real Hopkins County Stew

1 fat chicken hen 4-5 lbs. 6 medium-size red potatoes, diced 4 medium white onions, diced 3 cans (14-15 oz) whole peeled tomatoes 2 cans (14-15 oz) cream style corn 1 stick butter 1 Tablespoon sugar, or to suit taste 1-2 Tablespoons Chili powder, or to taste 1-2 Tablespoons salt, or to taste 1/8 teaspoon red pepper (a big dash) 1/4 teaspoon black pepper (3 big dashes) 1 teaspoon paprika, to add color

Stew (boil) the chicken in a half-gallon water, half the butter and half the salt. Cook till meat comes off the bones. Remove bones, skin and all unwanted parts. Place meat back in the liquid, add potatoes, onions and tomatoes. Cook slowly for about 1 and 1/2 hours, adding seasoning a little at a time, tasting after each addition and stirring regularly. When potatoes and onions are well done, add corn and keep stirring so the corn will not stick and burn. Start adding the rest of the seasonings and taste. Stew is just about ready. If it looks too thick, add a little hot water or tomato juice. Let simmer for another 10 minutes.

Annette O'Toole

Actress, Dancer and Singer-Songwriter

Annette O'Toole (born April 1, 1952) is an American actress, dancer, and singer-songwriter. She is best known for portraying Lana Lang in Superman 3 and most recently for portraying Martha Kent, the mother of Clark Kent, on the television series Smallville.

Early life and career

O'Toole was born Annette Toole in Houston, Texas, the daughter of Dorothy Geraldine (née Niland) and William West Toole, Jr. Her mother taught dance, something O'Toole learned at the age of 3. She started taking acting lessons after family moved to Los Angeles when she was 13. Her first television appearance was

in 1967 on The Danny Kaye Show, followed over the next few years with guest appearances in shows such as My Three Sons, The Virginian, Gunsmoke, Hawaii Five-O, and The Partridge Family.

1970s-1980s

O'Toole's first major film role was as a jaded beauty pageant contestant in the 1975 satire Smile; she got the role after doing an impression of a "dead cockroach" at the audition. She also appeared as Robby Benson's character's tutor/girlfriend in the college basketball story One on One in 1977. She co-starred opposite Gary Busey in the 1980 film Foolin' Around. In 1981, she starred in the HBO onstage production of Vanities, as well as in the TV movie Stand By Your Man, which detailed the life of country music legend Tammy Wynette. Later on in 1982, she appeared briefly as Nick Nolte's girlfriend in 48 Hours. That same year, she played Alice Perrin in Cat People, and then in 1983 she played Lana Lang (love interest to Clark Kent/Superman), and single mother of Ricky in Superman III. In 1985, she co-starred with Barry Manilow in the CBS television movie Copacabana playing Lola La Mar to Manilow's Tony Starr. Also in 1985, she had a starring role as Ms. Edmunds in the original Bridge to Terabithia, and appeared in the TV adaptation of Strong Medicine the following year. In 1987's Cross My Heart, a romantic comedy, O'Toole had a leading role opposite Martin Short.

1990s-2000s

In 1990, O'Toole had roles in two ABC television miniseries. She played the adult Beverly Marsh in the miniseries adaptation of the Stephen King novel It, and also portrayed Rose Fitzgerald Kennedy in The Kennedys of Massachusetts, a role that earned her an Emmy nomination for Outstanding Lead Actress. She next starred in the 1992 NBC miniseries Jewels, based on the Danielle Steel novel of the same name.

In 1993, O'Toole starred in Desperate Justice as Ellen Wells. However, in 1995, she starred as Cheryl Keeton in the 1995 Lifetime television film based on Ann Rule's true crime novel Dead by Sunset. She had a recurring role on the television show Nash Bridges (1996) and starred in her own series The Huntress (2000) as a female bounty hunter. In 1997 O'Toole starred in the TV movie Keeping the Promise.

In October 2001, 18 years after portraying Lana Lang in Superman III, O'Toole returned to the Superman mythos in the role of Martha Kent, Superman's adoptive mother, in the television series Smallville. She remained part of the show's main cast, though at times in the background, until the end of its sixth season. On January 19, 2010, it was announced that O'Toole would be returning to Smallville for at least one episode.

On November 22, 2010, O'Toole played the role of Veronica, a middle aged woman suffering from a severe case of Alzheimer's, in season 3 episode 7 of the TV series Lie to Me. In March 2013 she appeared in Grey's Anatomy as a school teacher who finds out after surgery she will die from cancer. **2010s**

In 2015 O'Toole returned to the Stephen King realm as boarding house owner Edna Price in 'The Kill Floor' episode of the King mini-series 11.22.6 Musical career

In retrospect, O'Toole can date the beginning of her songwriting career to events during a car ride after the September 11 attacks; as her husband Michael McKean describes it, "On September 11, 2001, Annette found herself without an airline to carry her back down to Los Angeles from Vancouver, where she films Smallville. So she drove a rental car down. The two of us drove it back up together, and on the long drive up there, somewhere between Portland and Seattle, she told me she had a tune in her head." The "tune in her head" became "Potato's in the Paddy Wagon", one of three songs the couple wrote for A Mighty Wind, including the Oscar-nominated song "A Kiss at the End of the Rainbow."

O'Toole sang "What Could Be Better?" — a song she and her husband co-wrote — for the 2004 Disney children's album A World of Happiness. In May–June 2005, the couple did a cabaret act for "Feinstein's at the Regency" in New York City.

On July 7, 2007, O'Toole appeared as a backing singer for her husband's fictional band Spinal Tap at the London leg of the Live Earth concerts. She has also performed on the band's 2009 Unwigged and Unplugged tour, and contributed lyrics to "Short and Sweet" on the 2009 Spinal Tap album Back from the Dead.

In 2011 she starred in CAP21's production of the new musical Southern Comfort, based on the Sundance award-winning documentary, by Dan Collins and Julianne Wick Davis.

O'Toole married actor Bill Geisslinger on April 8, 1983; the couple had two daughters, Nell and Anna.


O'Toole first met Michael McKean, the man who would later become her second husband, when McKean was working on Laverne & Shirley. After both were divorced, O'Toole and McKean became friends in 1997 while starring together on Final Justice, a Lifetime movie. They were married in March 1999.

O'Toole and McKean guest-starred together in "Mega", a 10th season episode of Law & Order as a wealthy married couple accused of murder. The couple also guest starred on Boy Meets World as Topanga Lawrence's parents. McKean also played Perry White, the reporter, and later boyfriend, of O'Toole's character Martha Kent on Smallville.
