PETS & PEOPLE **Creating A Disaster Plan For Your Pet**

(NAPSA)—When it comes to caring for a family pet in a disaster, a little bit of planning can

make a big difference.

Here are some tips from a national association of veterinari-ans on how to create an effective

pet disaster plan:
• When a disaster strikes, it's best to evacuate with your pet. Leaving pets behind—even in a safe place—puts them in greater danger, but you must find a refuge or shelter that will accept ani mals. Emergency shelters don't accept pets. Contact friends, hotels, boarding facilities and animal shelters in advance to find an

emergency refuge for your pet.
• If possible, make sure your pet always wears current identifi-cation tags or has an implanted

identification chip.
• If you know ahead of time that a disaster or extreme weather is coming, bring a pet inside long before the disaster

• Assemble a pet evacuation kit in advance, including the following: medications and food (including any required package openers) to last at least three days, leashes, harnesses, a sturdy pet carrier if necessary, portable water, cat litter, a current photo to help find a lost pet.

Plus, it's wise to include newspapers or paper towels, care instructions for your pet in case you have to board the animal, and list of the property of the pr a list of emergency boarding facilities and veterinarians, along with 24-hour telephone numbers

• If you absolutely must leave a pet at home during an evacua-



lf possible, make sure your pet always wears current identifica tion tags or has an implanted identification chip.

and cats separate; put pets in a secure room away from windows; keep any tanks and cages away from walls and windows; consider putting your pet in a room with tiled floors that can easily be cleaned in the case of floods.

Also, make sure that the animal is in a place or can get to a place that will be above floodwaters. Leave the pet some food to eat, but try to pick an unappetiz-ing food to prevent overeating and no treats or vitamin supplements. For birds, use an automatic feeder; and leave water for pets in a nonspill container or in a bathtub if it is accessible.

• After a disaster, be careful

about letting your pet outside. The sights and smells of your neighborhood may have changed, so your pet could become disoriented.

Turkey Soup "Bowls' Are One of a Kind

I once produced and hosted an Internet cooking show called "The Kitchen Diva!" After we finished one of the shows, I had a large amount of leftover turkey pieces, an abundance of acorn squash and several small containers of cooked vegetables. I didn't want anything to go to waste, so I decided to turn the turkey and vegetables into a soup and use the acorn squash as "bowls." No matter what leftover vegetables you use or how you decide to serve this soup, the results are spectacular.

TURKEY SOUP IN ACORN SQUASH TUREENS

- acorn squash, each about 1 to 1 1/2 pounds
- tablespoons olive oil, plus extra for oiling squash
- cup finely chopped onion
- cloves garlic, minced
- cup diced celery
- cup diced red bell pepper
- teaspoon poultry seasoning
- teaspoon salt teaspoon black pepper
- pound cooked turkey meat, diced into bite-size pieces
- cups cooked orzo or other
- small pasta, such as riso cups turkey or chicken broth cups cooked vegetables (corn,
- peas, carrots, potatoes, etc.) cup shredded Parmesan
- 1. Heat oven to 375 F.

2. Cut a small amount off the bottom tip to allow squash to stand upright, but don't cut a hole in the bottom. Cut a lid off the top of each squash and scoop out the seeds and fibers. Scrape away some of the flesh, especially around the top, to form a large, smooth inner cavity. Make sure to leave the shell at least 1-inch thick all around, without piercing it. Oil the squash inside and out, and season the

(about 6 inches wide) round inside with salt and pepper. Replace the lid.

3. Place the squash on a baking sheet and bake until mostly cooked, but still firm enough to stand and act as the soup container, about 30 minutes. Do not over-bake. If a good deal of liquid gathers in the bottom, spoon it out and discard. Set the shells aside; they will stay warm on their own for a good while.

4. Heat 2 tablespoons of the olive oil in a large pot over medium-high heat. Add the onion and cook for 2 to 3 minutes. Add the garlic, celery, bell pepper, poultry seasoning, salt and pepper. Stir in the turkey, cooked orzo, broth and cooked vegetables.

5. Place the reserved acorn squash shells on a saucer or in a small bowl and fill them with the soup. Sprinkle with cheese and replace the lids. Serve immediately. Makes 6 servings.

SOURDOUGH BREAD BOWLS

- If you don't have any acorn squash on hand, a bread bowl made from a freshly baked, round loaf of sourdough bread is a wonderful substitute.
 - loaves of sourdough bread cup olive oil
 - teaspoon minced garlic or garlic powder

 - teaspoon minced parsley

1. Heat oven to 400 F. Using a ser-

rated bread knife, slice off the top of the bread loaves. Using your fingers, pull the soft center of each loaf away from the shells. Leave a 1-inch thickness of soft the inside of the crusts. Reserve the bread dough centers and freeze to use for breadcrumbs or croutons.

2. Mix together the olive oil, garlic or garlic powder and parsley. Brush the inside of the bread bowls and the dough sides of the lids with olive oil mixture.

Place bread bowls and lids on a baking sheet. Bake for 5 to 10 minutes until golden brown.

3. Let bread bowls cool, and fill with the soup. Sprinkle with cheese and top with lids. Serve immediately.

Four Tips For Protecting Your Family From Fire

(NAPS)—According to the National Fire Protection Association, more than 350,000 home fires occur each year—but you can help your family stay safe.

Fire Safety Suggestions

Keep your family safe by:

1. Having at least one fire alarm on each floor of the house and in each bedroom.

2. Checking the batteries monthly and replacing them at least once a year, more often if necessary.
3. Helping kids identify what

items are safe to play with in the house. "Many children who play with fire do so out of curiosity or a desire to emulate their parents, explains Dr. Robert Cole, President of Fireproof Children and spokesperson for BIC's play safe! be safe! fire safety education program. "Eliminate temptation by keeping lighters and matches out of sight and reach and by supervising playtime.'

4. Helping your youngsters understand fire safety. Children learn best when they feel comfortable. The play safe! be safe! program (www.playsafebesafe.com) provides teachers, parents and those who care for young children with the tools they need to teach kids about fire safety and prevention by sharing basic facts, playing games and visual storytelling. Consider this: Parents know

that birthday candles, when left unattended, can quickly start a roaring fire. Young children, however, cannot understand what could happen if they play with an unattended candle.

The first step to keep families

safe is teaching children how to react to a fire emergency. Adds Dr. Cole, "Many young children are scared of strangers and loud noises. When a siren goes off and unfamiliar firemen in 'scary' masks enter their house to rescue those inside, a child's first instinct will be to hide. Little Golden Books

• When I was a youngster in the 1940s, almost every birthday and Christmas would include at least two or three "Little Golden Books." My earliest one was "Baby's Book" published in 1942, Others are "Nursery Tales," "The Lively Little Rabbit," "Hansel and Gretel," "The Shy Little Kitten," "The Saggy Baggy Elephant" and "A Year in the City." . It is interesting to note that the Western Publishing, the parent company of Little Golden Books, started in a Racine, Wisconsin, basement. Edward Henry Wadewitz, a 30-year-old bookkeeper, purchased a small printing company in 1907 for \$2,504, some of which he had borrowed from a brother. Throughout the 1920s and '30s, the company continued to prosper and grow.

According to "Collecting Little Golden Books," by Steve Santi and published by Krause Books, the first Little Golden Books were published during the autumn of 1942. The first 10 titles are "Three Little Kittens," 'Bedtime Stories," "The Alphabet A-Z," "Mother Goose," "Prayers for Children," "The Little Red Hen," "Nursery Songs," "The Pokey Little Puppy," "The Golden Book of Fairy Tales" and "Baby's Book."

Values vary, but most of the early editions of the Little Golden Books from the 1940s seem to be valued in the \$25-\$100 range depending on both title and condition.

These perfect special-occasion cookies are very delicate and elegant. If you like, they can be given a graceful shape by quickly molding them, while still warm, over a rolling pin. Store, layered between waxed paper, in a large shallow container. They're heavenly with ice cream or sorbet.

1/4 cup packed brown sugar

- 1/4 cup light corn syrup
 3 tablespoons butter, cut into

- Heat oven to 375 F. Grease large cookie sheet.

3. Drop batter by level teaspoons, 3 inches apart, on prepared cookie sheet to make 6 to 8 cookies (depending on size of cookie sheet). Bake until lightly browned, 5 to 7 minutes. Cool on cookie sheet on wire rack about 1 minute to set slightly; with wide spatula, quickly transfer cookies to wire racks to cool completely.

- 4. Repeat with remaining batter. Makes about 36 cookies.



Counterfeit Software Can Cost Businesses In Many Ways

(NAPSA)—Even the most ethical companies face the threat of counterfeit software entering their business environment. In times when resources are tight, business owners may run a quick search online and find a sealed copy of the required software selling at a bargain-basement price—or perhaps even just a few dollars lower than the actual retail price. In most cases, they end up unintentionally

Explains Hartje, "The best way to protect your business network s purchase from reliable sources, stay away from deals that look too good to be true and remain vigilant about what's entering your computing environment."

How Can You Tell?

Pirated software can look like the real thing. Microsoft provides several free, easy-to-use tools for customers to identify if their software is genuine, as well as monitor their software inventory. Microsoft customers can run a free genuine validation check for an installed copy of Microsoft Windows or Office at the Genuine Microsoft Software Web site microsoft.com/genuine.

To manage existing software assets, customers can use a simple, free tool designed for networks that have up to 250 computers: The Microsoft Software Inventory Analyzer at microsoft.com/resources/ sam/msia.mspx. The data is not sent to Microsoft and remains completely confidential.

Duped? Take Charge

For businesses that discover they are a victim of counterfeiting. it is important to immediately remedy the situation. Resources to support customers duped by counterfeit software are at microsoft.com/piracy.





• On Nov. 6, 1558, Thomas Kyd is baptized in London. Kyd created the "revenge play," which gave rise to tragedies like William Shakespeare's "Hamlet." Kyd's "The Spanish Trage-die," or "Hieronomo Is Mad Again," became the most popular play in England during its day.

• On Nov. 1, 1800, John Adams moves into White House in the final year of his only term as president. Although Adams was initially enthusiastic about the presidential mansion, he and Abigail soon found it to be cold and damp during the winter.

• On Nov. 2, 1912, the XIT Ranch of Texas, once among the largest ranches in the world, sells its last head of cattle. At its peak, the XIT, owned by Chicago capitalists, had more than 160,000 head of cattle, employed 150 cowboys and encompassed nearly 3 million acres.

· On Oct. 31, 1926, Harry Houdini, the most celebrated magician and escape artist of the 20th century, dies of peritonitis in a Detroit hospital. Twelve days earlier, Houdini had been punched twice in the stomach, ruptur-

ing his appendix. · On Nov. 4, 1990, "Dances With Wolves," a film about a Civil War-era soldier and a group of Sioux Indians, premieres in Los Angeles. The film, starring Kevin Costner, was a sur-prise box-office success and earned 12 Academy Award nominations.



Three Ways Air Quality Affects Your Ability To Think

(NAPSA)—Scientific evidence shows that breathing polluted air can impair memory and reasoning, reduce academic performance and even result in lower intelligence-but you don't have to put up with it.

Here are three important ways air quality directly affects your ability to think:

1. Standardized tests

Standardized tests have become increasingly important in education. Parents and educators already debate the potential effect of family income, cultural background, gender and other influences on test results. Now, researchers also look closely at the effect of air quality on standardized test scores-and conclude that it's significant.

One study of schoolchildren in Southern California found that exposure to higher levels of fine particulate air pollution (known as PM2.5) is linked to consistently lower scores on standardized tests in math and reading. A separate study of fifth-grade schoolchildren concluded that every increase of 2.1 cubic feet per minute (cfm) in ven tilation was associated with a 2.9 percent increase in students pass ing a standardized math test.

2. Getting older

Evidence is growing that cognitive decline associated with aging is at least partially related to breathing air pollution. In one study, scientists administered math and memory tests to 780 people age 55 or older, then correlated scores with pollution levels where the participants lived. After adjusting the results for educa-tion, employment and other factors, the researchers still found significant differences in scores based on air quality. Participants in areas with high pollution levels had error scores that were 150 percent higher than those living in areas with low pollution.

3. Memory

Neuroscience researchers exposed mice to high levels of particulate air pollution (similar to vels in Beijing or Mexico City for 10 months. They observed that the mice exposed to high pollution levels took longer to navigate through a maze and made more



Researchers are discovering that air quality has a direct impact on a person's ability to think

Examining the brains of the mice xposed to pollution, the researchers found physical changes in the tips of neurons in the part of the brain responsible for memory. The researchers also found that the mice exposed to high levels of pollution showed increased levels of proinflammatory chemicals in the brain.

What You Can Do
Each person can help reduce the sources of pollution, better ventilate indoor environments and support air filtration for schools and other places as needed. Here

are a few examples of positive

steps that can clean the air

Get involved: Schools with better indoor air quality have better attendance rates and test scores. You can ask the school principal, school board members or the American Lung Association what you can do to get involved in improving classroom air quality.

Avoid unnecessary expo-sure: Avoid unnecessary exposure to outdoor air pollution and use a high-performance air purifier such as the IQAir HealthPro Plus to keep the air clean at home. 

13. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT **PROJECTS-APPROVAL**

Shall Coventry Home Rule Charter section 8.19 be amended as follows:

Section 8.19 Amendments after adoption

(f) Limitations: Referendum a Approval by Electors. Capital improvement programs or projects not subject to the provisions of Section-8.55, with an anticipated total cost for such program or project in excess of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) shall not-be initiated before referendum approval by the electors. Nothing in this section shall prevent the making of contracts or spending of money for capital improvement projects or other projects, provided that any payments from the Town's general funds or property taxes must be approved annually by the electors at an annual or special financial town meeting. This section shall not apply to projects which have been approved by the electors in accordance with Section 8.55 of this Charter.

Explanation: This amendment would eliminate the need for an all-day referendum for capital improvement programs, if the program(s) has already been approved by the voters at the annual financial town meeting.


