



Crosby City Council talks trash again

There were two residents that spoke during the public comments section at the Crosby City Council meeing on October 24.

The first resident was Gina Hanson. She commented on the Comprehensive Zoning plan. Hanson had concerns about the land use designations in the area of her home. Later, Hanson spoke about a reoccurring issue relating to Cuyuna Regional Medical Center with respect to an agreement for fence color and tree specifications.

Justin Burslie, Planning and Zoning, said he was going to review the agreement details.

The second resident was John Radinovich. Radinovich said he came before the council in June about the garbage issue and the rental agreement

"And at that time mayor," said Radinovich, "you said you would have the rental agreement done prior to the garbage and in fact you said it would be done in July. It's now the end of October."

Radinovich said that when he came in front of the council in June, he told them not to $vote \, on \, the \, garbage \, ordinance \,$ until they had the ordinance for the rentals approved.

"Right now you have no safegards, none," said Radinovich. "In fact, I believe it was at the last council meeting when Range stood up and said you really don't want to [allow] self haul. Somebody... said that Range was in the business of hauling garbage so they really shouldn't have the input. I look at it as... Range is more concerned about the citizens than other people in

this room. "If you're going to have self haul garbage, then what are the safegards of that self haul garbage? Back when, three quarters of the people had burn barrels. Now, you can say you can't have burn barrels. What are the safegards? You can't pass that ordinance and until that ordinance says your going to stop it at that time... "

The issue is enforcement for rentals and who gets fined. Building inspector Scott Sadusky stated that the property owner would be fined. Sadusky indicated there were over 90 garbage violations this

year and a majority of them have been cleaned up. If self haul garbage was allowed, Radinovich indicated he could deal with three vehicles in the yard, but not sacks of garbage, especially in the summer. He said there is a big difference between trash and garbage. There are health concerns and rodents associated with piles of garbage.

Sadusky indicated he didn't know anything about the self hauling. The self hauling of garbage was discussed at the last council meeting and approved to be added to the language in the city ordiance.

Since the city will be transferring the billing to Range Disposal, Radinovich indicated there wasn't anything the city could do to renters that piled up garbage. In the past, the city could shut off water service, if payment was delinquent.

The solid waste ordinance was tabled due to the problems with self hauling considerations.

Alan Woods owner of Range Disposal asked for and extension for taking over the refuse billing from the city until January 2017, because of file size limitations a new software was installed and needed to be tested before they could begin. The council approved this extension.

The council approved the hiring of three part-time substitute library aids.

Council approved the election judges.

The council approved the use of the Crosby Memorial Park for 10th Annual Christmas in the Park.

The Cuyuna Community Center update was provided by Kurt Porter, Severson Porter Law. Porter indicated that the Cuyuna Community Center had closed and hey needed to find a suitable organization to donate the building to. Porter said they may have found that organization.

Building inspector Scott Sadusky said he had inspected the Cuyuna Community Center building. Depending on the intended use it could have problems with meeting code, since it was an old building.

Police Lieutenant Kevin Randolph spoke about a survalence in the park and by the

city garage.

The finance committee had met about the invoicing error from the Abrams and Schmidt Law Firm. There was an entry on September 17, 2013 for an 18.9 hour phone call, at an hourly rate of \$145 per hour and a total payment of \$2740.50. Mayor Lattery read aloud the contents of a letter from Abrams and Schmidt Law Firm explaining the billing that was made by the attorney. The amount was correct, but the time period it encompassed was several days instead of one day. The letter closed with "... but we accept the responsiblity that we should have been more complete and detailed with our invoice. We appologize for any inconvenience. Tiffany Smith."

Councilman Paul Heglund said, "We terminated a police officer not to long ago. And it got turned around where it was all about Lisa Sova. And I was uptown the other day and everybody's throwing Lisa Sova under the bus. And that's pretty unfair."

The council agreed with Heglund's statement.

After Mr. Laughlin went before the zoning board, a land use proposal was brought before the council for future consideration. Building inspector Sadusky advised him about code requirements for a single family dwelling vs. a garage.

Planning and Zoning Justin Burslie spoke about the comprehensive plan. Council approved the plan.

City Engineer Phil Martin talked about suspending operations on the utility project in North East Crosby. There is some issues with funding of the Third Street utility project because of a suspension of business at the State Legis-

After considering and approving filling a coal bin under the sidewalk on First Avenue SW, the coucil reversed their decision and ultimately decided to fence around the opening on the sidewalk. The council approved the chain link fence installation to lessen the potential liability. City Attorney Tom Pearson they could negotiate with the property owner and start the abatement process.


