Mayor proclaims November Diabetes Awareness Month

Several members of the staff of South Central Regional Medical Center's diabetes education program and South Central Wound Care and Hyperbaric Medicine joined Mayor Johnny Magee in the City Hall rotunda on Wednesday, October 26, for the signing of a proclamation designating November as Diabetes Awareness Month in Laurel.

In signing the proclamation Mayor Magee encourages all citizens to join in helping to fight the disease of diabetes by learning more about the risk factors and the importance of making healthy lifestyle choices.

According to the proclamation "nearly twenty-nine million American children and adults have diabetes, a serious disease

that has no cure and is the fifth-leading cause of death by disease in the United States. Another seventy-nine million Americans have pre-diabetes, a condition that puts them at the highest risk for developing type 2 diabetes. More than one third of people with diabetes (6.2 million) do not know that they have the disease. Millions of Americans lack access to the care, treatment, and education needed to manage the disease and prevent its serious and costly complications including heart disease, stroke, kidney failure, blindness and lower-limb amputation. An increase in community awareness of risk factors and symptoms related to diabetes will improve the likelihood that people with

New Look celebrates five years in Laurel

New Look Vintage Boutique and Salon will celebrate five years in business in Laurel on November 5. Located at the corner of Short 7th Street and Sawmill Road, the boutique is filled with the creations of owner/cosmetologist Suzanne Williams who, among many talents, is a master of the technique of chalk painting in repurposing furniture.

Williams has been a licensed cosmetologist for almost 30 years. She said she wanted to "fix hair" all her life, growing up she would "fix" all the neighborhood kids' hair. So it was no surprise that she enrolled in cosmetology school immediately after graduating from high school.

Her passion for repurposing furniture began to evolve nine years ago when she decided to add a gift shop to her salon in Soso. Although she had always found things and repurposed them growing up, she became serious about the art in 2007. In 2011, Williams began looking for a place in Laurel to move her salon and gift shop. Her friend, Tiffany Schrimpshire, owner of the former Tiffany's Emporium, told her about the building on Short 7th.

"I purchased the place the first of October, and I was bound and determined to have it opened by Black Friday," declared Williams. She said it was a group effort between her father, David Williams; her husband, Ed Williams; mother, Glenda Williams; sister, Sandy Hanna; brother, Glenn Williams; and her church family to get the boutique opened. "This is a dream come true for me," exclaimed Williams.

In repurposing furniture Williams said, "I use Miss Lillian's No-Wax Chock Paints." She said the creator and owner of Miss Lillian's No-Wax Chock Paints came to her shop a few years back to teach her the techniques of using the paints, but Williams ended up teaching her the techniques she had mastered.

"The owner and maker of Miss Lillian's No-Wax Chock Paint will be here this week-end for the anniversary celebration and will demonstrate the ease and use of the paints," said Williams.

Although there are several pieces available in the boutique, Williams said she will do custom pieces, too. Williams' passion for design and decorating has also evolved over the last few years. She credits her mother, Glenda Williams, with her creativity and passion. Referring to both the furniture and other hand crafted items, Williams said, "Each item is unique and one-of-a-kind." In addition to her own creations, the boutique is filled with unique jewelry, purses, and other clothing accessory items that cannot be found in other shops around town.

She also carries Bullet Jewelry made in Amory, Miss., which she has creatively displayed using her own mounted deer head. In addition to the beautiful handmade jewelry collections, Williams carries the Kindred Spirits Style unique handmade handbags that are made in Tennessee.

Williams said her mother's creative talents can also be seen in the boutique. Pointing to an arrangement and a couple of Christmas Wreaths, Williams said, "She finished these last night."

As you wander through the shop you will notice how Williams' unique style of decorating has evolved into an elegant vintage style. Whether fixing hair, repurposing furniture, or recreating something she's seen on Pinterest, Williams is determined to get the job done with heartfelt passion.

"I give God all the credit for everything that I am able to do," exclaimed Williams. "No matter how I feel, I want to make others feel better!"



A Shepherd's Heart – There Stands a Cross

"And as Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the twelve disciples aside, and on the way he said to them, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem. And the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death and



deliver him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified, and he will be raised on the third day." (Matthew 20:17-19 ESV)

In his book, "On a Hill Too Far Away," John Fischer tells of a cross that is found in a church in Old Greenwich, Connecticut. As he describes this cross he states that the cross is a sturdy wooden cross, standing some ten feet tall and made of raw untreated wood. As he continues his description, the most unusual thing about this cross is where it is positioned in the church. Most of us are accustomed to seeing crosses merely as decorations in churches. They are usually positioned on the walls behind the pulpit, over the baptistery, embedded in the stained glass windows, or on the tops of our steeples.

This was certainly the case for Fischer as well until he

saw The Old Greenwich Cross. This cross was positioned right in the center of the floor in front of the pulpit, right in everyone's line of sight. Fischer states, "The minute I walked into the church in Old Greenwich and encountered this startling placement of the cross, I felt as if I had discovered something truly significant. For just as the cross has been placed squarely in the center of this church, so it has always stood in the center of history and in the center of any life that has truly embraced it. And just as the placement of this cross seems so uncomfortable, so it is . . . and should be. There is nothing comfortable about the cross." (Fischer p. 16)

As Jesus walked the roads with his disciples, he was instructing them each step of the way. He was always seizing the opportunity to prepare them for His death, burial and resurrection. Matthew records at least three occasions where Jesus basically said to his disciples, "Hey guys, listen closely, there stand a Cross, and I'm headed there!" (My rendering)

Jesus was fully aware of the work of reconciliation that God the Father had sent him to earth to accomplish. John the Baptist had proclaimed at the baptism of Jesus that He (Jesus) was the Lamb of God who would take away the sins of the world. (John 1:29). Yes, Jesus knew the path

that He must trod in order to accomplish God's plan for the redemption of mankind. That path led to a cross on a hill called Calvary.

Back to the placement of the cross in Old Greenwich. Connecticut; its placement seems odd indeed. However, if we could but learn the lesson that John Fischer shares about this particular cross, we too may be led to move the cross of Calvary out of the past tense and into the present tense as we live our lives daily. It should cause us discomfort to the degree that we never forget the price that was paid to purchase our pardon. The cross demands a

"When I survey the wondrous cross, on which the Prince of Glory died, My richest gain I count but loss, and pour contempt on all my pride. Forbid it, Lord, that I should boast, save in the death of Christ, my God; All the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to His blood. See, from His head, His hands, His feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down; Did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown. 

South Jones High School's "Band of Braves" competition marching band, "War Path" placed second in the 5A Mississippi High School Association's Marching Band competition Saturday, October 22, in Pearl, MS, for their show, "Electric Express." This is the first time in the high school band's 50-year history to ever reach this high of a ranking. Everyone in the 120-member band, directors and staff earned silver medals for their accomplishments. Senior drum major Mallory Rigdon said this show has been a lot of hard work with a lot of long hours put in to make it come together. She said she is glad to see the efforts of all the students and staff has

"It's been great to be a part of this band program for the past seven years. I can't wait to see what happens in the future. We knew we were up against the best in the state, and it's really gratifying to know that you are now classified as, 'one of the best in the state," said Rigdon.

The South Jones High School Band placed first overall in Music Caption, second in the Visual Caption and third overall in the General Effect Caption at the State competition.

"I'm very proud of the students and their hard work that has brought them

to this success. Without hard working students who are dedicated to one another, this band wouldn't be nearly as successful as it is!" said South Jones High School marching band director Brian Joyce. "We weren't sure how we would stack up against other programs from around the state that have a history of high levels of success! We were particularly proud of winning the Music Caption, because of how well all the other groups played."

South Jones High School's marching band has also had a tradition of excellence under the direction of Artie Adams. He has pushed the band students to pursue excellence in every aspect of their performance. The band's marching practice schedule is rigorous in hopes of achieving great things. Since July, the band has been practicing on two shows: one for the half-time performance at football games and one for competition. The summer practices consisted of eight-hour days for three weeks. A lot of time is invested in perfecting the marching technique, music and deciding how to integrate all the moving parts to look visually impressive. The color guard and the four dancers also have to choreograph their part of the show to compliment the musician's movements and music.

"For several years, South Jones

placed 4th or 5th at the state championships. In 2014 and 2015, we decided to restructure our approach and we competed outside the state, where we gained some success by winning the USBands Class 5 Southern States Championship. However, the desire to place in the top three in Mississippi never went away, thus leading to the competitive push for success that we experienced this year," said Adams.

Before the state championships, all 32 of the 5A bands from around Mississippi had to first earn high enough scores at the regional competition on October 15 to earn the right to compete at the state level. Of the original 32 bands, 16 qualified for the state championships. At the regional competition in Scooba, Miss., the South Jones High School Band earned first place in every category: music, marching, visual effects, dance line and percussion.

"Our goal is to be the best we can when we perform," said Joyce. "Even though we didn't get first place overall, we feel like we won gold because the students performed to the best of their abilities based on the product we gave them; there's not much more you can ask for than that. The fact that the students made memories, learned some life skills, and achieved a goal they've been after for years, really is 'gold' to us."





Don't forget the small things Lowe's teams up with CTC

November is here! As we prepare for winter, it's time to give some thought to our small-feathered Except for a friends. few stragglers, the hummingbirds appear to have



left the area. We left the feeder up, just in case a hungry little hummer needs a snack. The cardinals are putting on quite a show at the platform feeders for us right now, and a small brown wren is still hanging out on

Keep your feeders stocked with a variety of foods and you can attract many different species of birds that will stay around until spring. Most people have good luck attracting birds by putting out feeders full of sunflower seeds, cracked corn and millet, or by hanging mesh bags of suet. Birds also need water, so keep your birdbaths full of clean water. Yes, even when it's freezing outside; just break through the ice, the birds can do

Nuthatches, woodpeckers, wrens, chickadees, cardinals, and most insect-eating birds love suet. To make your own, use almost any seed or grain mixed with bacon fat, lard or peanut butter. Basic suet combines equal parts of bacon fat and assorted birdseed.

Mix all ingredients together and cook for a few minutes. Pour into small containers (tuna fish cans are good), and refrigerate or freeze until needed. When you're ready to hang the suet, put it in a wire suet cage or sturdy mesh bag and fasten securely to a feeder or sturdy branch. Better wait until we have consistently cooler weather to hang this. Birds like dried fruits, so consider adding raisins, cranberries or other dried fruit to your suet mix.

We are enjoying turnip greens and mustard from our garden; the collards will soon be ready to pick. The cabbage, swiss chard and lettuce are thriving. The squash is trying to set fruit, if the worms will leave it alone! Thanks to a generous Master Gardener, we have lots of multiplying onions.

Before you get too comfortable thinking there are no garden chores to take care of during November...think again! Now is the time to:

*Plant shrubs and trees after soil cools.

*Plant summer blooming perennials: Iris, Daylily, and Daisies.

*Plant winter and spring annuals: Pansy, Pinks, Ornamental Cabbage and Kale.

*Root Rose cuttings.

*Remove dead limbs and prune evergreen shrubs.

*Cut off brown tops of perennials. Leave roots in the soil. Do not prune spring flowering shrubs



Health Department educates Mississippians on the benefits of smoke-free multi-unit housing

Approximately 58 million nonsmokers in the U.S. are still exposed to secondhand smoke, and some of this exposure occurs in homes.

"Exposure to secondhand smoke is much more than a nuisance," said Amy Winter, Director of the Office of Tobacco Control at the Mississippi State Department of Health (MSDH). "In Mississippi, exposure to secondhand smoke remains an alarming public health hazard."

The MSDH is currently leading Smokefree Air Mississippi, a public health initiative that educates Mississippians on the dangers of secondhand smoke and the benefits of smokefree air. In addition to this initiative, MSDH is working to educate Mississippians on the benefits of smokefree multiunit housing. Even if you are not a smoker or don't live with one, secondhand smoke can seep into multi-unit homes from many different places, including vents and cracks in walls or floors. When inhaling secondhand cigarette smoke, individuals are exposed to more than 7,000 chemicals. Hundreds of the chemicals found in secondhand smoke are hazardous, and 69 are known to cause cancer.

"Far too many Mississippians are exposed to secondhand smoke in their homes every day," said Wendy Magee, director of the Tobacco-Free Coalition of Forrest, Jones and Perry County. "Tenants should not have to face exposure to the tox ic chemicals found in secondhand cigarette smoke or have to choose between their health and their living arrangements."

Young children are especially vulnerable to secondhand smoke because their bodies are developing so quickly. Children also take in more secondhand smoke because they breathe more rapidly than adults and often cannot remove themselves from areas where secondhand smoke is present. Eliminating exposure to secondhand smoke is the simplest solution.

"Research shows that simply eliminating smoking in public, indoor spaces fully protects non-smokers from exposure to secondhand smoke," said Magee. "Separating smokers from non-smokers, cleaning the air, and ventilating buildings does not eliminate exposure to secondhand smoke."


