Helping individuals with disabilities work successfully ...

Tammy Johnson is the new director of DAC and DAC-Mart

Whether doing piece-work manufacturing in McGregor or waiting on customers at the DAC-Mart thrift store in Aitkin, adults with disabilities in Aitkin County can find meaningful work and have financial success.

Tammy Johnson, 48, Aitkin, is the new director of the DAC in McGregor and the DAC-Mart thrift store in Aitkin. She oversees 55 employed clients and 17 staff members. Johnson took over the reins from Paul Kellerman, before he retired, was the DAC's only director for over 40 years.

"Our mission is to provide dedicated, exceptional support to empower individuals with disabilities to achieve success," said Johnson in a recent interview. "Our programs are person-centered. We work with what the person chooses

to do, along with their needs and abilities. If they choose to work in the community, we will assign them a job coach to assist in the job searching, application and training process. If they need ongoing support, the job coach will remain in place to provide one-to one-assistance -- encouraging meaningful and enjoyable employment for that individual," Johnson continued. "If they are challenged to work or elderly, we offer a life enrichment program that provides purposeful art and in-house projects that we will be preparing to sell at the DAC-Mart. We also have a weaving program that produces rag rugs and are exploring crafting placemats, table runners and coasters."

Northern roots

Johnson is a native of Bagley, Minnesota. She graduated from high school in 1986 and went on to study at the University of Minnesota-St. Paul, graduating with a degree in genetics and cell biology.

She started working parttime as a dietary aide in a senior community and the woman who owned it asked her to start an activity program for the residents. She went back to school for therapeutic recreation and got certified as an activity director. After stints in group homes in Bagley and the Twin Cities, she and husband Jason decided to settle in the Aitkin area – a place where the family had a cabin and they were equal distance from both sets of parents. She started as an activity assistant at Aicota nursing home in Aitkin and was later promoted to activity director and spent 13 years there.

She got the opportunity to be the marketing counselor for the Heartwood housing project in Crosby before it opened. She did marketing and pre-leasing and once the building opened she was the resident services director for 10 years.

Husband Jason works fulltime at Our Wine House in Crosby -- the family business. Tammy loves to garden, camp and fish. Their daughter Kelsey, 20, attends college in Madison, Wisconsin, and son Jaren is an eleventh grader at Aitkin High School.

The DAC has people working throughout the community -- at multiple businesses with job coaches -- at the DAC-Mart and at the home base in McGregor where they assemble parts for Floe's docks and trailers and carry out the life enrichment program. Besides businesses, workers clean at church camps and Long Lake Conservation Center. They can be hired by homeowners to do cleaning, lawn mowing and shoveling.

The DAC's main building, built in 1981, is soon to undergo a strategic remodel and the DAC-Mart in Aitkin, celebrating 20 years in 2017, will have a facelift. "We're bringing our building in McGregor into more modern times," summed up Johnson. "We still have some of the original carpet there. We plan to install new




