Making The Grade: Getting High School Seniors Ready For College

(NAPS)-Nearly 17 million high school seniors graduate each year, the U.S. Department of Education estimates, and many plan to attend college. But are they all really college-ready?

Data suggests the answer is a resounding "no." According to the 2015 "Condition of College & Career Readiness' report from American College Testing (ACT), 31 percent of the ACT-tested graduating class is not meeting any of the four subject benchmarks: reading, English, science and mathematics.

These low-readiness test scores coincide with college dropout figures that top 29 million, making the number of Americans who have dropped out of college greater than the number of American adults who have not obtained their high school degrees.

While test scores provide a benchmark for high school seniors, college readiness is an important issue for everyone headed to college, whether they are a new high school graduate or an adult learner returning to the classroom," said Jennifer Fletcher, Ph.D., program dean for general education at University of Phoenix. "Being prepared for the challenge can help ensure stuen't forced to take remedial course work and are able to stay motivated and on top of their workloads, ultimately resulting in a successful collegiate experience."

The pressure to earn a college degree is higher than ever. The White House has set an ambitious goal of producing a higher share of college graduates than any other nation by 2020. The plan is to return the United States to the top-ranked nation after dropping into twelfth place.

"More and more, employers are seeking college graduates for jobs that previously required a high school diploma or other subbaccalaureate training," Dr. Fletcher said. "For the nearly twothirds of U.S. adults who do not have a bachelor's degree or higher, this can create barriers to career growth, unless they are able to pursue higher education."

She offers the following advice to high school seniors and adult learners heading off to college:

This jammy, mustard-seed-spiked condiment from chef and butcher Chris Eley is terrific served alongside everything from grilled sausage to roast turkey.

21/2 tablespoon yellow mustard seeds cup dry white wine

stick cinnamon slice fresh ginger

whole cloves

cup sugar

cup Champagne vinegar cup pure cranberry juice

tablespoon mustard powder

cup dried cranberries teaspoon orange zest Salt

1. In a small bowl, soak the mustard seeds in the wine at room temperature

overnight. 2. Wrap the cinnamon stick, ginger and cloves in a piece of cheesecloth and tie closed. In a saucepan, whisk the mustard seeds, wine, sugar, vinegar, cranberry juice and mustard powder and bring to a boil. Add the spice bundle and cook over moderate heat, without stirring, until the syrup coats the back of a spoon, 25 minutes

Discard the spice bundle. 3. Stir in the cranberries and orange zest, and let the mostarda cool completely. Season with salt and serve: stir in water by the tablespoon if it seems too thick. Makes 2 cups.

TIP: The mostarda can be refrigerated for up to 1 week.

When Disaster Strikes: Helping Kids In The Aftermath

(NAPS)—Hurricanes, tornadoes, wildfires, earthquakes, mass violence, or acts of terrorism-disasters can happen at any time, but you can help your kids deal with them. While adults focus on preparing for potential threats or trying to restore safety and resume a normal life in the aftermath, kids often try to make sense of what may seem utterly senseless. The trauma of a disaster or other type of emergency can bring up different feelings and emotions; it can also be a teachable moment for children and their families to come together to talk and support each other.

For adults, it's important to recognize the effect that traumatic events can have on mood, stress level, job attendance and performance, and routine. The disruption caused by natural and manmade disasters is common and often difficult to manage. Adults may try to cope with alcohol, by isolating themselves or by exhibiting outbursts of anger, which may be uncharacteristic. Because children often model adult behavior, self-care is especially important. Finding healthful ways to get through difficult, stressful experiences can set the stage for healthy dialogue and support for the whole family.

There are some key tips for parents, teachers and other adults on how to approach the conversation:

• Talk. It can be difficult to talk about what's happening but kids need to share what they're feeling, thinking, seeing and hearing. Children need to know there are no bad emotions and that it's normal to have a range of reactions. They may also bring up fears or concerns that are unrelated to the crisis. Staving connected with open communication will provide opportunity for deeper understanding and can help identify a need for extra reassurance and support.

• Be honest. While children look to adults for answers, during times of crisis it can be difficult to know what's happening and when. It's important to be honest and open, while being reassuring and speaking at a level that the child can understand.

 Balance with the positive. While focusing on the

loss, grief and distress experienced in times of crisis is normal in the aftermath, it will be beneficial to help children also identify and see the good that is happening around them. Emergency responders, volunteers and others in the community who mobilize are great examples of resilience and strength and can provide a sense of hope and healing.

• Return to routine. Getting back to a schedule, in which kids can engage with friends, teachers and other mentors, can be very helpful. People they interact with on a daily basis are a support network, so maintaining those connections and daily activities can keep children feeling connected and safe in familiar surroundings.

• Limit media exposure. It's normal to want lots of information during and after a disaster. Staying tuned in to the latest news can help to bring back a sense of control and awareness but it can also be a little overwhelming. For parents, it's especially important to limit exposure and to be present when kids are watching, listening or reading about an event. News coverage can often bring about new questions for children, so being there to discuss what's happening will be important.

• Reinforce peace and tolerance. Things can be chaotic during and after a crisis. While the news media or people interviewed may highlight or blame a particular ethnic or cultural group's actions, it is important to keep a peaceful and inclusive perspective with kids. Be sensitive to cultural, ethnic, religious or other experiences, as they can also influence how people respond differently in times of crisis. Make a crisis plan.

Times of disaster or emergency can highlight what people might do differently or better to stay connected, respond together and to feel prepared for the future. Developing a crisis plan for your family gives everyone something to do and participate in and will help you all feel on the same page about each person's role and responsibility. Kids should also be encouraged to discuss their safety concerns, including those they may have for

extended family, friends and

family pets. Because each stage of a child's development offers new opportunities to learn and process stressful events, it's important to know what's manageable for a child at a specific age. To help, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) offers agespecific information on how kids respond to trauma and tips on how to talk about what's happening during a crisis. Kids are resilient but some may need a little extra support to navigate through a difficult disaster or crisis. If kids are struggling to sleep, aren't connecting with friends, having a difficult time talking about what they're feeling or have a sudden shift with their grades at school, the trauma of what's happened may require more attention. Seeking assistance from a counselor or mental health professional may be helpful.

"Crises can take a heavy toll on people and communities, including on their emotional health and well-being," explained Kana Enomoto, SAMHSA's acting administrator. "Although most people bounce back, others may need extra assistance to cope and recover." This is true for children, just as it is for adults.



- 1 canned chipotle chile pepper in adobo sauce, minced

- 1 teaspoon paprika ½ teaspoon ground cayenne pepper

This is a fun way to use up

leftover barbecued chicken or turkey. Who doesn't love some cheesy, meaty nachos with smoky sour cream and fresh avocado? It's worth smoking some spice-rubbed chicken breasts just for this recipe. Using bone-in rather than boneless chicken breasts requires a longer cooking time, but there's a dividend: the meat has more time to absorb the flavorful smoke.

- 1. Soak the wood chips in water for at least 30 minutes.
- 2. Whisk the chipotle cream ingredients, including any juices remaining from mincing the chipotle chile. Refrigerate until ready to use.

3. Prepare the grill for indirect cooking over medium heat (350° to 450° F).

- 4. Mix the rub ingredients. Season the chicken breasts all over and between the skin and meat with the rub.
- 5. Drain and add the wood chips to the charcoal or to the smoker box of a gas grill, following manufacturer's instructions, and close the lid. When smoke appears, grill the chicken, skin side down first, over indirect medium heat, with the lid closed, until the juices run clear and the meat is no longer pink at the bone, 25 to 30 minutes, turning once when the skin releases easily from the cooking grates. Remove the chicken from the grill and, when cool enough to handle, shred into pieces, discarding the skin and

6. Increase the temperature of the grill to high heat (450° to 500° F).

bones.

7. Spread half of the tortilla chips into a large grill-proof pan. Distribute half each of the cheese, scallions, jalapeño, and chicken over the chips. Repeat with another layer.

8. Place the pan with the nachos over indirect high heat, close the lid, and cook until the cheese is melted and the chips are tinged golden brown, 7 to 9 minutes. Wearing insulated barbecue mitts or gloves, carefully transfer the pan to a heatproof surface. Top the nachos with the avocado and then drizzle with the chipotle cream and lime juice. Garnish with the cilantro. Serve hot with salsa, if desired.

HOLLYWOOD - In August, we told you not to believe those headlines in the tabloids claiming that Tom Hanks and Rita Wilson were having marital problems and getting a divorce. Learning Pet CPR

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: Several years ago, I lost one of my dogs, "Corny," to a sudden illness when he collapsed and stopped breathing. Not sure what to do, I rushed him to the nearby vet's office, but they were

the nearby vet's office, but they were unable to revive him. From that incident, I resolved never to feel so helpless if it should happen to one of my pets again. I learned the basics of pet CPR from that vet, and have since taken online courses to learn more and to stay up to date on changes in performing pet CPR. I urge every pet owner to become familiar with CPR for pets, whether their dog or cat or other pet is young or old. — Janine C., Chattanooga, Tennessee

DEAR JANINE: Thank you so much for sharing your experience. I know the loss of Corny must have been heart-wrenching ... it's incredibly difficult to lose a part of your family

Learning CPR is indeed a way to bring a little more assurance to pet bring a little more assurance to pet owners that they can do something when their pet falls ill. Performing CPR — breathing for your pet, per-forming chest compressions if the heart has stopped — during the rush to the emergency vet can make a big difference in the outcome.

CPR methods vary between of course, and between different sizes of pets. But there is good information to be found from places online like the AMVA (American Veterinary Medical Association), which offers a video tutorial. It's well worth your time to learn this lifesaving technique.







Sensational Holiday Sides

A beautifully browned turkey is typically the centerpiece of the Thanksgiving holiday table. The presentation and carving of the bird and the distribution of the crispy skin and white or dark meat is a central part of the meal. While I can appreciate turkey, it's the side dishes that I look forward to. The fall bounty of vegetables and the traditional recipes that my family enjoys during the holidays are worth waiting for all year.

Thanksgiving is one of the only times of the year that my sister, Sandra, makes her delicious fried corn. My mother's buttery cornbread dressing has been my "after-gluttonyday" breakfast for as long as I can remember. Here are the recipes for my family's sensational side dishes. Happy Thanksgiving!

FRIED CORN

- 1 stick butter, plus 2 table spoons
- cups fresh or frozen corn kernels, thawed
- cup sugar
- teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper

Melt the stick of butter in a large. heavy-bottomed skillet. Add the sugar and salt, stirring well until the sugar melts. Add the corn and black pepper. Dot with the remaining 2 tablespoons of the butter. Simmer over low heat for 15 minutes, stirring frequently until kernels are tender. Serves 8.

CORNBREAD DRESSING

- cups crumbled, day-old cornbread
- cups seasoned, dried bread-
- cups sauteed vegetables (see recipe below)
- cups seasoned broth (see recipe below)

- tablespoon poultry seasoning
- teaspoon salt
- teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- eggs, lightly beaten
- ounces unsalted butter, softened for greasing pan Cooked turkey neck meat, chopped gizzards and livers, optional (see recipe below)
- 1. Heat oven to 400 F. In a large mixing bowl, combine cornbread and
- cups onion, chopped, divided
- cups finely chopped celery, divided
- tablespoons poultry seasoning Turkey neck, gizzards and
- 1. In a saucepan over medium heat, melt the butter. Add onion, celery and poultry seasoning. Saute the vegetables in the butter until tender. Do not brown. Remove half of the vegetables from the pan and set aside to cool.



dried breadcrumbs. Combine sauteed vegetables with bread mixture. Stir in the cooled, seasoned broth and any vegetables, using enough to moisten the bread mixture, without making it too wet or soupy. Reserve the rest of the broth.

- 2. Mix in the poultry seasoning, salt, pepper and beaten eggs, blending well. Add in the diced turkey meat, livers and gizzards, if desired.
- 3. Lightly grease a large shallow baking or roasting pan measuring about 10-by-15 inches with the butter. Spread the dressing mixture in the pan. Bake for 20 to 30 minutes until the top is lightly browned and a crust has formed around the edges of the

- cups chicken broth
 - ounces unsalted butter

- 2. Add the chicken broth, turkey neck, gizzards and the liver to the pan. Bring the mixture to a boil and then reduce heat to simmer Simmer for 15 to 20 minutes until the meat is done and tender. Set the broth aside to cool.
- 3. Remove the neck, gizzards and liver from the broth. Pick the meat from the turkey neck and dice the turkey meat, the gizzards and livers. Use the cooled broth and the diced turkey mixture in the Cornbread Dressing recipe above.




