

RETURN TO THE BATTLEFIELD

Tumbleweed Smith



Austin Steen of Crosbyton was a teenager when he parachuted into a barrage of German gunfire during World War Two. "We were shot at all the way down," says Austin. "We lost 65 percent of our division." Another enemy was the two feet of snow that covered the ground in 1945. Austin fought in the Battle of the Bulge, which had the highest casualties during the war. In March of this year, Bastogne, a city in Belgium where the battle was centered, staged a 70-year commemoration to honor veterans who fought there. Austin went over there with

his two daughters and five grandchildren.

At the Frankfurt airport where the group landed, when the customs agent learned that Austin was a veteran of World War Two, he shook his hand and said, "Thank you for saving the world." That set the stage for the rest of the trip. Everywhere the group went they were treated with respect and appreciation. "We didn't go anywhere that he wasn't treated like a king," says Vicki Cole of Big Spring, Austin's daughter. "A lot of people in Belgium called him a rock star."


The group thought the 90-year old Austin would like to get some rest occasionally because he's usually in bed by 6 PM. "But he wore us out wanting to go to all the places he remembered," says Dusty Cornelius, Austin's grandson. "When we would go into a café the manager would come over and visit with us." On the wall of one restaurant there was a picture of Austin taken during his war years. A tree was planted in his honor. Vicki says the people in Belgium and Luxembourg are extremely appreciative of Americans. "Everywhere we went they would say 'thank you, America. You saved our life. You've given our children their freedom."

Austin signed more than a hundred autographs a day. Lots of people brought him military helmets or articles of clothing to sign. Some would shake his hand and cry. Austin and three other veterans went to an elementary school where the students asked questions and listened intently to the answers. Austin told how he could dig a foxhole 3 feet deep in just a few minutes.

The eight members of the group all wore matching shirts with "team granddad" printed on them. They created quite a spectacle during the 12-day trip. Austin brought home a bag of souvenirs that people gave him, which he keeps on display in his living room along with his two purple hearts and bronze stars.

Austin suffered frostbite and was in the hospital a month. "It makes your feet turn black," says Austin. "If they turn black all the way to the heel, they take your feet off. Mine just reached halfway and finally healed." When he entered the Army he chose to be a paratrooper because it doubled his pay from 50 to 100 dollars a month. His landing in Germany on March 24, 1945 was the largest airborne operation in the war. It involved 10,000 paratroopers and thousands of aircraft. Germany surrendered on May 7, 1945. A few months later, Austin was on a troop ship headed for Japan when he learned the war had ended.




It's because of one man's passion that Sulphur Springs has an almost continuous link to Texas rodeo tradition. Though Mike Pribble passed from the scene many years ago, his local legacy is finally being publicly recognized for a new generation. That says something good about our community, the people who built this town, and their offspring who are working and raising families here now.

Mike Pribble was a stand-out all his life....college man, military man, family man and world-class trick roper and rider who used his skills to better his community. Mike was a horseback ambassador, as handsome as a movie star, a flashily-dressed talented promoter in the grand style, flying around the arena or skipping a big loop the length of the field, smiling for crowds and welcoming people with a handshake. However, something even more rare, a large handful of humility, made him stand out from other cowboy-clad stars of his era. Mike was not a self-promoter. In fact, he was sought by Will Rogers for a Hollywood career, but turned down attractive movie offers to stay right here at home with his wife Jewel and daughter Cathey, plan his annual rodeos and practice on Patches every day that he could. At the rodeos, Mike became the center of an orbit of capable friends who were eager to assist in the arena, ticket window and behind the scenes. He mentored an army of local youngsters, some mounted and some on foot, who became his "publicity staff" in the summer. And boy, did they promote "their" rodeo! Through circulation of posters and bumper stickers, by rodeo "caravans", parades and word of mo h, it was not unusual for more than 20,000 people to come to Sulphur Springs dur...g a 4-5 day rodeo on the Fourth of July holiday. Even the Grand Entry was grand, sometimes lasting as long as 45 minutes, and Mike's astounding roping and riding tricks dc'ighted audiences at every performance. No small town "out-did" Mike's rodeo on participation, and for four decades people flocked in for authentic rodeo action, professional entertainment and gracious home-town atmosphere. Although associated with RCA (Rodeo Cowboy Association) Mike always held an "open" show where card-carrying and non-cardcarrying riders could perform. It's a good thing that recognition has finally come.



The historic era of Mike Pribble Fourth of July Rodeo ended in the 1970's and today, no sign of his stands and arena is left except in the memories of attendees, but it's influence remains. Around the end of the Pribble years, the CRA (Central Rodeo Association) was gaining momentum in this part of the United States and soon began to schedule rodeos in Sulphur Springs. In later years, CRA merged with TPRA (Texas Professional Rodeo Association) to became what is today's UPRA (United Professional Rodeo Association). Sulphur Springs, with it's rodeo legacy, has enjoyed a favorable relationship as home of the UPRA Finals for 30-plus years.



Born in Denver Colorado on February 2, 1953, Duane Lee "Dog" Chapman is a bounty hunter and a former bail bondsman who is known for capturing Max Factor cosmetics company heir Andrew Luster, who was convicted for drugging and raping several women, in Mexico. This led to his enormous popularity and his reality TV series Dog the Bounty Hunter, which chronicles his job as a bounty hunter.

During Chapman's youth, he joined an outlaw motorcycle club called the Devils Diciples, and subsequently earned the nickname "Dog," which is "God" spelled backwards, due to his relationship with God. On the contrary, he got involved in some shady dealings, buying marijuana in particular, and got charged with murder and sentenced to prison for being an "accessory to the crime" when another gang member shot and killed a drug dealer. During his capture of Andrew Luster, Chapman was also charged by Mexican authorities for not handing Luster over to them, though the charges were eventually dropped.

Additionally, Chapman became the subject of controversy in 2007 after he used a racial slur while referring to his son's African American girlfriend during a taped conversation. This led to the cancellation of his reality series, though the show was eventually brought back on the air and continues production to this day.



Meanwhile, Chapman's personal life is just as colorful as his past. He first married LaFonda Sue Honeycutt in 1972 and had two children within the five-year marriage. After his divorce, he married Anne M. Tegnell and had four children within the three-year marriage. In 1982, he married Lyssa Rae Brittain Greene but the marriage ended in divorce after nine years. Their relationship, however, spawned three children. Chapman next tied the knot with Tawny Marie Chapman, whose marriage with Chapman lasted for 12 years. In 2006, Chapman married Beth Smith, who now has two children with him.

Duane "Dog" Chapman, reality star of the A&E show "Dog the Bounty Hunter" met with lawyers Oct. 26, 2007 in Honolulu. Chapman, who operates a bail bond business in Hawaii, styles himself a man once on the wrong side of the law who became a Christian family man, bail bondsman and bounty hunter who puts the bad guys away. His persona is larger-than-life and expressive, rough around the edges but golden at heart.

Chapman moved to Pampa, Texas, after he married his first wife, LaFonda Sue Honeycutt, in 1972. His time there, especially the hazy events of one crucial evening, set much of the stage for what came after.

"I'd like to say I became a man in Texas," Chapman said, "and always and forever carry that Texas star in my heart and always and forever I will make Texas proud."

While in Texas, officer Randy Stubblefield arrested Chapman. Stubblefield and another officer, Preston Bailey, waited in the alley behind Chapman's home at 501 Roberta St. as two officers approached the front door. Chapman barreled out the back door and Stubblefield tackled him. The other suspects, Ruben Garza, Cheryl Fisher and Kuykendall, were arrested the same day.

During the trial, Kuykendall testified the shooting was accidental and occurred while he and Oliver struggled.

Judge Grainger McIlhaney handed Kuykendall a 10-year sentence. Garza was given a 10-year probated sentence. Fisher pleaded guilty and was a witness for the state. She received eight years probation.

Chapman, who had two previous convictions, was sentenced to five years in prison. He began serving his time on Aug. 18, 1977 and was paroled Jan. 31, 1979. His parole was terminated on December 20, 1980.

Stubblefield, who later was elected Gray County Sheriff, heard from Chapman in the 1990s.

"One day when I was sheriff, I got a phone call and it was Chapman," Stubblefield said. "(He) told me he was doing the bounty hunter work, and he was gonna do a story about his life and he wanted to come to the old Gray County jail where he was incarcerated so he could get some get some pictures.

"I told him we had built a new jail and the old jail (was) abandoned and had been scrapped out. So he never did come to Pampa."

Harold Comer, the former district attorney who prosecuted the group, recalled Chapman as "just a skinny kid." Charged with murder

Chapman was involved in the Sept. 15, 1976, homicide of alleged pimp and drug dealer Jerry Oliver in Pampa. Chapman, 23 at the time, and three others were charged with acting together to kill Oliver.

Court records indicate the quartet went to Oliver's house because they heard he had marijuana. But an argument broke out and Donald Wayne Kuykendall, wielding a sawed-off shotgun, shot Oliver.

Comer said Chapman was "kind of a self-centered young man" and active in his defense. The late Bill Kolius of Amarillo defended him. Comer said the four's motive for attacking Oliver was inconsequential.

"I can just see them sitting in that car, and I think it started when Garza said I'm gonna kill him," Comer said. "I call it a melody of murder. They just orchestrated this out of this ego and machoism.

Charlie Love retired from the Pampa Police Department in 2001 and currently works for the Roberts County Sheriff's Office. He was one of the first officers to arrive after Oliver was shot at his 1072 Prairie Drive home. Love took Oliver's dying statement as he lay bleeding inside the modest one-story home. Oliver gave Love names. Officers pieced together the rest.

"I was very ashamed of what happened in Pampa, Texas, and he (Comer) was a very decent guy," Chapman said. "I wanted to call before he left office and say I wasn't all rotten to the core."

Most of the people Chapman knew in Pampa have died, he said. He mostly kept in touch with the late Sheriff Rufe Jordan.

"I know it sounds strange to say, he was like a stepfather to me," Chapman said.

In fact, he said, Comer and Jordan told him that he could do something better with his life.

Quotes; "I owe the rest of the people, whether they're black or not in America, an apology, because people looked up to me. I've learned a lesson. All my lessons I've learned in my life have been the hard way, or I guess I wouldn't learn them. This is one of the hardest lessons I've ever learned in my life, even facing death."
