



Old World Market brings crowd to Osthoff Resort each year

Imagine sipping hot, mulled wine and enjoying a Bavarian pretzel while leisurely shopping from vendors selling their unique wares from around the world. This can be your holiday shopping reality at the Old World Christmas Market at the Osthoff Resort in Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin, this December. The 10-day market is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. beginning Friday, Dec. 2 and ending Sunday, Dec. 11.

For those who have never been, this is Wisconsin's take on the centuriesold Christkindlesmarkt of Nüremberg, Germany, complete with freshly-cut balsam trees adorned with thousands of twinkling lights, more than 70 festive booths filled with the wares of artisans from around the world, a European-style food court, and an appearance by Father Christmas, all staged in a heated tent the length of a football field.

The Old World Christmas Market has something for everyone on your shopping list:

For mom, woolen capes from Estonia, fashionable fur accessories, amber jewelry, hand-painted wine glasses, alpaca sweaters, German straw ornaments, custom pastel drawings and acrylic paintings.

For dad, German cuckoo clocks, deerskin gloves, alpaca cashmere socks, gourmet chocolates, smoked salmon and trout.

For grandparents, ornaments from around the world, homemade jams and jellies, chocolates filled with liqueurs. New this year: old-fashioned German hard candies.

For children, woolen mittens, hats, and

Capture Christmas magic Revisit the traditions of mid-19th century at Old Wade House

Wade House historic site in Greenbush will host "A Wade House Christmas," a mid-19th-century Christmas celebration, on Saturdays and Sundays, Dec. 3-4 and 10-11, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Yankee and German holiday traditions, including period crafts and games for young and old, and horse-drawn wagon rides, will make for a memorable experience.

Guests to "A Wade House Christmas" will experience the sights and sounds of a 1860s Wisconsin Christmas celebration. The Wade House stagecoach hotel will be decorated in traditional Christmas splendor with fresh evergreen garlands and a candlelit Christmas tree as focal points.

Activities will abound on each level of the 27-room hotel. The experience will begin on the first floor. Costumed staff will greet visitors inside the historic taproom and shed light on the origins of Santa Claus and his gift-giving tradition. The ladies' parlor will be graced with a freshly cut Christmas tree adorned in 1860s fashion, and the space will resound with period music.

In the hotel's dining room, visitors will create holiday crafts once featured in "Godey's Lady's Book." In the third-floor ballroom, participants will have the opportunity to play parlor games.

The delightful aroma of mulled cider and plum pudding will waft out from the hotel's 19th-century kitchens and entice guests to these culinary spaces where they'll learn about the longstanding association of plum pudding with the Christmas season.

The festivities continue in the new Wade House Visitor Center and Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum, where seasonal décor, live music and children's activities will help to spread holiday cheer. On both days,

food and beverages will be available at the Butternut Café.

Visitors will begin the special experience at the new Wade House Visitor Center and Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum located at W7965 State Highway 23. Admission is adults \$11; students/seniors \$9.25; children 5-17 \$5.50; family up to two adults and two or more dependent children 5-17 - \$30.

Handel's Messiah on tap for Sheboygan Symphony

The Messiah will be performed by the Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra and Chorus on Dec. 10 at 7:30 p.m. at the Weill Center for the Performing Arts. Music Director and Conductor, Kevin McMahon, will lead the orchestra and chorus. The Sheboygan Symphony Chorus is under the direction of Fabian Qamar.

McMahon stated, "The Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra joins with another important part of its 'family,' the Sheboygan Symphony Chorus, to present Handel's Baroque masterwork Messiah, perhaps Handel's greatest oratorio. "For those who are connected to school choruses, enjoy choral performance, appreciate singers and singing, like old styles of music, or simply wish to get an infusion of Christmas spirit plus, this is a good program for you," continued McMahon. "Because Messiah is constructed from Bible verses, the work speaks to 'peoples of the book' and 'religions of the book,' embracing many types of believers and others of spiritual persuasion, as well as folks who simply enjoy music. Beyond aesthetic pleasures with fanfares from trumpets and drums, the oratorio Messiah and its spiritual message offer all comfort and encouragement."

The Messiah was composed in 1741, when Charles Jennens convinced Handel to create an oratorio based upon a compilation of Scriptures he had recently selected. Handel wrote the entire work in a 24-day spurt from Aug. 22 until Sept. 14. Consistent with the format of oratorios, Messiah is divided into three parts, which represent Christ's birth, death, and resurrection; each section containing a series of arias and choruses.

The audience will hear many of their favorite singers. Soloists will be drawn from members of the Symphony Chorus Family. This year our soloists include Jeff Britton, Kathleen Erdmann, Emily Rendall-Araujo, Stephanie Weeden, Shannon Meulbroek, Brittany Savaglio, Glynnis Shircel and Tim VanZeeland.

The Sheboygan Symphony Chorus is an ensemble, which represents the musically diverse population of the area. Professionals and amateurs, the young and seasoned musicians work side by side to present one of the most beloved Classical works.

Annual ACS walk/run sets records

A record-setting 3,200 participants turned out for the 38th annual Road America Walk/Run for the American Cancer Society on Oct. 29, raising \$185,000 for cancer research, patient programs, services and education.

The non-competitive four-mile walk included 2,704 participants, while nearly 500 individuals took part in the four-mile race, which was won by Dominic Maio, of West Allis, in 20:19.57, and Carissa Laack, of St. Joseph, Michigan, in 26:29.14. The top male finisher from the area was Chris Plummer, of Sheboygan, who placed sixth in 25:09.75, while Rebecca Wagner, of Sheboygan, finished in 28:05.35 to take second place for women.

"Participation was amazing this year on a beautiful morning at the track," said Kristen Herbes, American Cancer Society Community Manager of Special Events. "Not only did we set an attendance record, but the total funds raised is the highest in the history of the event, which supports research, programs and services for cancer patients in Wisconsin and beyond."

Of 93 fundraising teams, Team Kohler came out on top for the eighth straight year raising a total of nearly \$15,000 (\$18,943 with the company's matching fund). Nearly 120 kids participated in the kids' fun run at the event.



Restoring the past at Old Wade House

Now through March 2017, James Willaert, Wade House Curator of Interpretation, will offer a series of public programs titled "Restoring the Past," inviting visitors to participate in hands-on historic vehicle restoration activities. Change in nutrition helps boy diagnosed with ADHD

I recently had one of the most rewarding consultations of my career.

Caboose effort hampered by setbacks

Many of you have been wondering why it is taking so long to finish the caboose.

Remembering that the caboose is over 100 years old and has been sitting in the elements since it was built, we were guaranteed to have some issues, and we certainly did. When our restoration crew, headed by Fred Bauer, started work on the cupola it became apparent that he had a major issue to contend with. The cupola is the section that is on the very top of the caboose. As a result of this problem, he spent the entire summer trying to save the cupola.

It was completely rotted out and he had to do a major fix to stabilize that section. He said it was about to collapse. Fred also found major issues on the roof after the rubber was pulled off. In any event, the structure is now sound. Fred has stated the work is close to completion, and in spring the project will be finished. When work resumes, the new slats will be installed and a new Soo Line sign decal will be painted on the sides. When all is said and done we will have a caboose that will be fully restored and will last for years to come.

This unexpected delay did not come without a cost. The Elkhart Lake Historical Society is looking for donations to help defray the costs associated with the caboose restoration.


Volunteer Recognition Dinner



Every year the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah FFA Chapter sponsors a charity activity called the Giving Tree.


