The POWER of Parents...

Talking with children about sex does not encourage them to be sexually active. - 6. Take a strong stand against your daughter dating a boy significantly older that she is. And do not allow your son to develop an intense relationship with a girl much younger than he is.
- 7. Help your teenager to have options for the future that are more attractive than early pregnancy and parenthood.
- 8. Let your kids know that you value education highly.
- 9. Know what your kids are watching, reading and listening to.
- 10. These first nine tips for helping your children avoid teen pregnancy work best when they occur as part of strong, close relationships with your children that are built from an early age.

Kircher - A Family Legacy



The George Kircher and Sons, Inc. Construction Company was started in 1904 by George Kircher and his two sons Emil and Joseph. In 1958, two of their loyal employees, David Wurster Sr. and John Ward, bought the company and continued bidding and negotiating work throughout the Rochester area. Following the sudden illness of David Wurster Sr. in 1970, his two sons David Jr. and Erich, who were already working with the company, bought the company over the next five years. After several years of thought, David Jr. and Erich Wurster decided it was time to retire. Together in 1998, David and Erich Wurster slowed construction activities and, with careful planning, had all construction projects completed. They closed their doors on December 31, 1998.

In February of 1999, the two contacted James F. Olverd (Jim), who was a friendly competitor for over 15 years. Jim was a graduate of Mount Morris Central School, Alfred sate College, and Rochester Institute of Technology in Civil Engineering. To pay his way through college, at age 18 he started working as a laborer for Pike Construction Company. Nineteen years later, Jim had worked for his way up in the company to the position of vice president. The Wursters knew Jim had the experience and would continue the honesty and quality service that was maintained throughout the company's history. They were confident Jim would be the perfect successor for their company. David and Erich wanted to keep the name, George Kircher and Sons, Inc., for sentimental reasons and have it still exist as a holding company. The agreement was made between the two parties and the name Kircher Construction Inc. was formed and approved by the State of New York in June of 1999.

James F. Olverd made the decision to move the company from 23 Clifford Avenue in Rochester to 28 Mill Street in Mount Morris. With constant growth, the company quickly outgrew the Mill Street location so a new office complex was built along side their warehouses at 3090 Mount Morris Geneseo Road in Mount Morris. Over the last 17 years, they have added site work, paving, equipment rental, and trucking to their long resume of commercial construction building projects. They employ, depending on season, anywhere from a low of 20 to over 50 employees.

They currently perform work within a 3 hour radius of Mount Morris. Some of the more notable projects in Mount Morris that Jim has been in charge of are: Village of Mount Morris Water Treatment Plant (\$3 million), Country Inn and Suites Hotel (\$4 million), Mount Morris Central School (\$26 million), and Livingston County Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation (\$38 million). There are many more projects throughout Livingston County and surrounding counties. Jim has even completed some hotels out of state.

Kircher is currently doing work in 4 colleges, 3 prisons, 2 schools, 4 group homes, and many other private projects. They are in their third year of a state contract worth \$2 million/year. Jim hopes the economy gets even better, providing steady growth of the company into the next generation. Jim's son Mike now works for the company and he has other people in mind to keep the company going strong.

Kircher is a commercial General Contractor and Construction Manager but the company also serves area residents with rental equipment, rental tools, and screened topsoil, as well as residential asphalt paving. Livingston County Department of Health and SUNY Geneseo Respond to Mumps Outbreak

Mount Morris, NY (November 23, 2016) - The Livingston County Department of Health continues to work closely with the New York State Department of Health and SUNY Geneseo to ensure the health and safety of our residents through active surveillance and investigation regarding the Mump outbreak. As of November 22, 2016, there have been four confirmed Mumps cases among SUNY Geneseo students in Livingston County. According to the New York State Department of Health, "Mumps is becoming increasingly more common on college campuses in the United States. The disease has been reported on multiple college campuses in 2016".

Mumps is a highly contagious viral disease characterized by fever, headache and swelling of the salivary glands. Other symptoms associated with the mumps include low-grade fever, fatigue, muscle aches and loss of appetite. After a person is exposed to mumps, symptoms usually appear 16 to 18 days after infection, but this period can range from 12-25 days after infection. Mumps cannot be treated.

While the mumps vaccine is not 100 percent effective, two doses of the vaccine provide the best protection against the disease. Individuals who have not previously been diagnosed with mumps or who are unsure of their vaccine history should contact their health care provider or local health department to inquire about receiving the measles, mumps and rubella vaccine, known as the MMR.

Here are some everyday preventive actions that can stop the spread of mumps:

• Do not share food, drinks, utensils or other personal items that may contain saliva.

• Wash your hands frequently with soap and water, or use an alcohol-based hand rub if soap and water are not available.

• Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue if you sneeze or cough, and discard the tissue after you use it. If a tissue is not available, sneeze or cough into your upper sleeve or elbow, not your hands.


· Clean and disinfect objects and surfaces that may be contaminated with germs.

• People with the mumps should stay home, and away from public places for five days after the onset of symptoms and limit contact with others in their household.

If you have questions or concerns about your level of vaccination, please contact your primary care provider. If you think you may have mumps, see a physician to be examined and tested. SUNY Geneseo students can schedule an appointment with Health and Counseling. Outside of Health and Counseling hours, students can go to an urgent care facility or call the FoneMed after-hours nurse advice line.



WISDOM TEETH

Wisdom teeth, also known as "third molars," are the last teeth to develop and erupt into the mouth. Unfortunately, they are the most common teeth to be 'impacted' or unable to fully erupt between the ages of 15-20, but can be seen earlier or appear much later in life. Impacted teeth are not able to erupt through the gum tissue fully or at all. This can be due to many reasons, including lack of room for the teeth (jaw growth), malposition of teeth or pathology. Nearly everyone has at least 1 impacted wisdom tooth.

Why are wisdom teeth removed?

There are many reasons wisdom teeth require removal; These include pain, swelling, infection, orthodontic treatment, periodontal disease, cavities, shifting of teeth, age and pathology (such as cyst development). If not removed, impacted wisdom teeth could lead to damage of adjacent teeth or cause infection, which is a very common reason that they are removed. Pain-free does not mean problem-free or pathology-free. If the wisdom teeth erupt fully, are hygienic and without pathology, proper follow up is in order with periodic exam and x-rays.

What is the best age to remove wisdom teeth?

Studies have consistently shown that removing wisdom teeth in the teen years is by far easier for patients. This is due to bone being softer, roots not being fully developed, better healing process, and an essentially uncomplicated or benign medical history.




