





Pointers For Parents

Sleep Is Key To Helping Teens Recharge For Success In School

(NAPS)—Here's eye-opening news: For most teens, one of the best ways to find success in school is to get enough sleep.

When well rested, teens are more likely to be healthy, energetic and have a positive attitude toward life in general—helping them be their best and do their best in school and at home.

To help, the National Healthy Sleep Awareness Project launched the "Sleep Recharges You" campaign, urging teens to get eight to 10 hours of sleep per night to promote optimal health.

"It's important to make sleep a priority," said Dr. Ronald Chervin, president of the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) and spokesperson \mathbf{for} National Healthy Sleep Awareness Project. "Setting and sticking to a routine to get as much sleep as possible is one of the best things teens can do for their health, academic achievement and athletic performance."

Lack of Sleep Jeopardizes Teens' Grades, Health and Safety

More than two-thirds of high school students in the U.S. are failing to get enough sleep on school nights, according to a 2016 study published by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Results show that 69 percent of surveyed students in grades 9 to 12 reported sleeping less than eight hours on an average school night. Insufficient sleep in teens can impact everything from grades to safety.

Sleepy teens may fare worse in school than their well-rested peers. Studies



Most teens, research suggests, lack sufficient sleep, putting them at risk for health and behavioral problems.

easily distracted and recall information more slowly. Sleeping fewer than the recommended hours is also associated with attention, behavior and learning problems.

Lack of sleep may also affect teens' athletic performance. When teens sleep, hormones are released that help them grow taller and develop muscles. Sleep helps restore energy to the brain and body.

Studies show that teens who sleep less than the recommended hours are more likely to be overweight and develop hypertension and diabetes. Additionally, insufficient sleep in teenagers has been found to increase the risk of depression and is associated with increased risk of self-harm, suicidal thoughts and suicide attempts.

Insufficient sleep also significantly increases teens' risk for drowsy-driving accidents. A 2014 study found that teen drivers who start class earlier in the morning are involved in significantly more motor vehicle accidents than those with later start times. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for teens in the U.S., according to the CDC.

Parents, Caregivers Play Crucial Role

Teens should be encouraged to get enough sleep caregivers to help by model ing healthy sleep habits, pro moting a consistent slee] schedule and creating a quie sleep environment for their teens.

Additionally, setting re strictions on screen time before bed is key to helping teens get to sleep on time Teens may be tempted to keep using their laptops smartphones and game con soles late into the nigh rather than going to sleep.

"Teens are still growing and developing and sleep i a crucial part of these processes," said Dr. Chervin "One of the best things par ents and caregivers can de for their children's healtl and well-being is to encour age routines that will help them get enough sleep."

According to the AASM, natural shift in the timing of the body's internal "circa dian" clock occurs during puberty, causing most teens to have a biological prefer ence for a late-night bedtime

It is also important that parents and local school boards work together to implement high school start times that allow teens to get the healthy sleep they need to meet their full potential.

Official Consensus

The AASM recommends that teens sleep eight to 10 hours per night on a regular basis to promote optima health.

Parents concerned that their teen is sleeping too little or too much should consult a board-certified sleer medicine physician or visit www.sleepeducation.org to find an accredited sleep center nearby.







Brunch At Home With Friends

(NAPS)—Brunch, that delicious combination of breakfast and lunch, has long been a favorite weekend pastime. Instead of going out, try switching it up by inviting some friends and making it at home.

berries and raspberries, or a platter of different cut melons like honeydew, cantaloupe and watermelon—it looks beautiful and tastes delicious, and what could be easier?

The Table

A beautiful table or buffet makes everything taste even better and you can set it up the night before.

- Fresh flowers are always lovely. No need for elaborate bouquets. Simply select one type of flower, cut the stems short and place in juice glasses for a low arrangement. If you are serving a buffet, be sure to put some flowers on the buffet table, too.
- Choose neutral tones for place mats, tablecloths and napkins-let the colors of the flowers, food and juice pop on your table.
- Use your everyday china, flatware and glassware—no need to break out the fancy stuff.

The Finishing Touches

Ambience is important. There's something about daytime entertaining that allows for a casual elegance, so go with it.

- Good music in the background helps set the mood. Stick with one genre and keep the volume low so it doesn't interfere with conversation.
- Open the shades or curtains and let the daylight pour in.

Easy Spanish Tortilla

10 minutes prep; 15 minutes cook 4-6 servings

Ingredients 6 large eggs

½ teaspoon smoked paprika (optional)

1 (5-oz.) bag high-end potato chips (such as Kettle), slightly crushed

1 large tomato, seeded and finely chopped ½ cup Lindsay®

Preheat oven to 475° F.

- 1. In a large bowl, beat the eggs until whites and yolks are well blended. Add the paprika (if using) and mix until combined. Add the chips, tomatoes and olives. Let the mixture rest for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the chips have softened.
- 2. Pour the oil into a 10to 12-inch nonstick skillet over medium heat. Add the onions and cook, stirring frequently, until softened and just beginning to turn golden, about 5 minutes.
- 3. Using tongs or a slotted spoon, remove the softened onions from the skillet, leaving the oil in the pan; add the onions to the bowl, stirring to combine.
- 4. Add the chip mixture to the pan and let it cook slowly until the edges are cooked just enough to be pulled away from the side of the pan, about 4 to 6 minutes. Place the skillet in the oven and cook until the eggs are set and lightly browned, about 3 to 4 minutes. (The tortilla should be slightly jiggly in the center; don't overcook or it will be rubbery.)
- 5. Remove the tortilla from the oven and cover the pan handle with a towel. Run a heatproof plastic spatula around the edge to loosen up the tortilla. Let it rest for a few minutes before inverting onto a cutting board or serving platter. The dish can be made several hours in advance and served at room temperature.



Rotisserie Chicken to the Rescue!

I love using rotisserie chickens in my recipes when I'm pressed for time. Rotisserie chickens are reasonably priced, convenient, come seasoned in a variety of ways and can be transformed into a multitude of quick and easy main-dish meals. Best of all, if you purchase a plain, roasted chicken, you can use the bones to make a rich, homemade chicken stock or enhance the flavors of pre-packaged stocks or broths, so nothing goes to waste.

Most rotisserie chickens are large enough to serve at least four people as a main course. Or, you can pull the meat from the bones and use it in recipes that call for precooked chicken. Shredded chicken can be used in recipes from salads, sandwiches and soups to enchiladas or chicken pot pies.

Using a pre-cooked chicken gives you the opportunity to explore new and unusual recipes that would ordinarily take a lot of time to prepare. This recipe for Speedy Mediterranean Chicken is ready in just 30 minutes and imparts all the exotic spices and flavors of the traditional recipe. A rotisserie chicken seasoned with lemon pepper is perfect for this dish.

The flavors used are reminiscent of an exotic Moroccan tagine, which typically combine lamb, chicken or beef with a variety of ingredients and seasonings, including citrus fruits, nuts, honey and pungent spices. This recipe blends spicy salsa and curry powder and adds a hint of sweetness cooked couscous or rice to make the most of the savory sauce that envelops the chicken.

SPEEDY MEDITERRANEAN **CHICKEN**

- tablespoon olive or vegetable
- teaspoons curry powder 1 jar (16 ounces) chunky salsa
- 1/2 cup sliced green olives
- 1/4 cup golden raisins
- 1/4 cup honey
- deli rotisserie chicken (2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ pounds), cut into 6 to 8 pieces, skin removed if desired
- 1. In 12-inch nonstick skillet, heat oil over medium heat. Stir in curry powder. Cook over medium heat 1 minute, stirring constantly.
- 2. Stir in remaining ingredients except chicken. Add chicken; turn to coat.
- 3. Cover; cook over medium-high heat 5 to 6 minutes, turning chicken occasionally, until sauce is bubbly and chicken is thoroughly heated. Makes 4 servings.

Because preventative maintenance helps avoid the hassle and cost of an emergency breakdown, the Car Care Council recommends the following steps:

 Check the battery and charging system for optimum performance. Cold weather is hard on batteries.

 Check the antifreeze. As a general rule of thumb. clean, flush and put new antifreeze in the cooling system every two years.

· Check that heaters, defrosters and wipers ork properly. Consider winter wiper blades and use cold weather washer fluid. As a general rule, wiper blades should be replaced every six months.

• Check the tire tread depth and tire pressure. If snow and ice are a problem where you plan on driving, consider special tires designed to grip slick roads. During winter, tire pressure should be checked weekly.

 Check the oil and filter and be diligent about changing them at recommended intervals. Dirty oil can spell trouble in winter. Consider changing to "winter weight" oil if you drive in cold places. Have your technician check the fuel, air and transmission filters at the same time.

 Check engine performance. Winter magnifies existing problems such as

hard starts, sluggish performance and rough idling.

• Check the brakes. The

braking system is the vehicle's most important safety item. · Check the exhaust

system for carbon monoxide leaks, which can be especially dangerous during cold weather driving when windows are closed. Check to see that exte-

rior and interior lights work and headlights are properly aimed.

During winter, drivers should keep their vehicle's gas tank at least half full to ture forming in the gas lines and possibly freezing. Motorists should also check the tire pressure of the spare in the trunk and stock an emergency kit with an ice scraper and snow brush, jumper cables, flashlight, blanket, extra clothes, bottled water. dry food snacks and any needed medication.

- On Dec. 12, 1989, Leona Helmsley, nicknamed the "Queen of Mean" by the press, receives a four-year prison sentence, 750 hours of community service and a \$7.1 million tax-fraud fine in New York. Helmsley had once quipped that "only the little people pay
- On Dec. 15, 1998, after nearly 14 hours of debate, the House of Representatives approves two articles of impeachment against President Bill Clinton. The charges of lying under oath and obstructing justice stemmed from testimony about his affair with former White House intern Monica Lewinsky. The Senate later acquitted him of both charges.


