



Dear Speak Out,

December 7th, 1941 - "a date which will live in infamy!" Early on that beautiful Sunday morning Japanese war planes descended in a surprise attack on Pearl Harbor; leaving mass destruction, chaos, disbelief, pain and death in their path: 1247 American Military were wounded; 35 American civilians - wounded; 57 American civilians - dead; 2402 American Military - killed.

The American Naval Pacific Fleet caught at anchor. A naval base without any gunners on duty on land or on the ships anchored in the harbor: a fleet moved to that location under President Roosevelt's command in fear of a conflict with Japan; one he did not wish to be fought off the coast of California should the day come we were part of the War raging across the seas. In spite of this concern there were no orders for patrolling submarines, planes or blimps flying in the harbor with netting anchored at sea to deter such an attack.

How did such a powerful country allow such a military failure to occur? The blame is shared by military leaders and the lack of detailed Washington communications.

But this matters not: the men and women who gave their all; who suffered injury; all who suffered loss are what matters - is the story we must remember. For this was the day we entered WWII - 75 years have passed. Many more in the years to follow this horrific attack also did not come home. Or came home maimed.

I was once asked by a younger friend, "Why are you so patriotic?" He almost made it sound like being so was a bad thing. I, in turn, asked him, "How could I not be?" I continued, "It used to be the way all Americans felt, even knowing our country was not perfect. But would you want to live anywhere else? We have freedoms and choices and many advantages many have never known." I went on in what I am afraid became a rant, "And many men and women since our fight for Independence have laid down their lives to insure we have such freedoms!"

I finished with. "Now you tell me why you aren't patriotic.. proud to honor our history and what our flag stands for? I am sure your own family has had many who went to serve.. no doubt some did not come home! How can you not honor them? How can you not stand proud to be an American?" Ponder those thoughts. And while doing so please remember FREEDOM IS NOT FREE. Walk down to the end of our Main Street to honor our local heroes who served to keep our flag flying. And PLEASE on this December 7th - 75 years after the date that has lived in infamy - fly your flag. And be proud.



- Individual departments make donations to various causes throughout the holiday season.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

The Village of Mount Morris Public Water System Did Not Meet Treatment Requirements

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor your water for turbidity (cloudiness). This tells us whether we are effectively filtering the water supply. Water samples for October, 2016 showed that **eighteen percent** of turbidity measurements were over 0.3 turbidity units – the standard is that no more than 5 percent of samples may exceed 0.3 turbidity units per month. The turbidity levels are relatively low. However, their persistence is a concern.

What should I do?

You do not need to boil your water or take other actions. We do not know of any contamination, and none of our testing has shown disease-causing organisms in the drinking water. People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1 (800) 426-4791.

What does this mean?

Turbidity has no health effects. However, turbidity can interfere with disinfection and provide a medium for microbial growth. Turbidity may indicate the presence of disease causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites which can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches. These symptoms are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.

What happened? What was done?

A problem occurred with the treatment system at the water plant. Treatment and monitoring processes were adjusted in the month of October, 2016. As a result, turbidity levels increased slightly until adjustments were made to lower levels.


