Christmas brings familiar traditions near, like old family friends. These are often comforting notions, even nourishing companions for our soul and spirit, brought out during the cold and dark period of the year. For some reason this season, I began to think about Mrs. Claus. You know, Santa's wife whom we know so little about? Why is she so reclusive? Is she shy? Or simply overworked and thus short on opportunities for social interchange? Really, how often have we heard any 'news' about Mrs. Claus? Surely she can't be that much of a shrinking violet, and be married to the most popular man in the known world! So, I googled her.

According to an 1854 account of a holiday musicale, Mrs. Santa Claus made an appearance with a baby in arms, and danced to a holiday song. In an 1862 comic novel in Harper's Magazine, she appeared in a woman's dream dressed in high Hessian boots, a dozen short red petticoats and a large straw bonnet. In the dream, she brought the woman a wide selection of finery to wear. In Boston in 1878, she appeared in a children's story, sitting at a golden desk and writing in a large book. Santa Claus was nearby, looking through a great telescope and from time to time placing his ear to a large speaking tube. Presently he said to the lady (his wife) "Put down a good mark for Sarah Buttermilk. I see she is trying to conquer her quick

temper".

Good Housekeeping magazine in 1887 gave a more detailed description of Mrs. Claus' appearance in stating that 'she was dressed for cold weather, her hood large and rounded...rather like a beehive. A broad white ruffle of a lace cap waved back and forth as she nodded. Her outer garment was a brightly colored plaid cloak, quite voluminous. Her right arm protruded through a vertical slit in the side of the cloak. Her hand held a piece of paper covered with figures, and her countenance was keen and nervous, but benignant'. (during this visit, she also instructed an architect on a design for the ideal modern kitchen).

Santa's bride made her most active appearance in a Katherine Lee Bates work published in 1889. In poetic terms, Mrs. Claus wheedles a sleigh ride from Santa, since she had tended their toy and bonbon-laden Christmas trees, the Thanksgiving turkeys and their 'rainbow chickens" that lay colored Easter eggs. Once away, she steadies the reindeer while Santa goes about his work descending chimneys to deliver gifts. She begs Santa to permit her too, and then descends a chimney to mend a child's tattered stocking and to fill it with gifts. Once the tasks are completed, the Clauses return to their Arctic home. At the end of the poem, the good wife remarks that she is the "gladdest of the glad" because she has had her "own sweet will" that Christmas.







A more modern Mrs. Claus appeared in Sulphur Springs on the night of the Lions Club Lighted Parade. Clad in a stylish red velvet dress with white fur trim, she strode about the downtown square greeting children, and even hearing their wishes for Christmas toys. She was observed asking several if they'd "been good" all year! Like the lady in the poem, she gladly set about with helpful tasks and cheerful pleasantries. I watched her sipping cocoa and gaily laughing with children that gathered at her knee. Since I never even saw Santa that evening, I must assume that his bride (who resembles Meryl Streep!) is now quite comfortable carrying out their holiday work independently of him, and has been liberated from her former behind-the-scenes role as elf-and-reindeer tender in the far-away frozen north. I think we should expect to see her make more and more public appearances.

Readers, please pass along any Mrs. Santa sightings that you have or hear about. I'll wager she is a far more interesting and charming person than we previously thought! Til then, I'll await Santa's annual stop at the corral gate because for the cowhands, he typically leaves new riding clothes and "working gear we'll use all year"!





MCKITTRICK CANYON IS AN EASY HIKE

I hadn't hiked McKittrick Canyon in a while, so when I scheduled some interviews around Dell City I decided to call my friend Drew Stuart and ask him when the leaves were at peak. "In a couple of days," he said. So in a couple of days Susan and I left home for the three and a half hour drive to McKittrick Canyon, which is a part of Guadalupe Mountains National Park.

McKittrick is famous for its fall color. Big tooth maples have the same flaming red leaves like you see during a New England autumn. Other trees provide the golds, oranges and yellows that shine in the mid-November sun. There was no wind at all and the temperature was perfect. When we left the park to head to Dell City after the hike, the temperature was 83 degrees.

The parking lot at the entrance to McKittrick had just a few cars, which was surprising. I expected to see more because of the ideal conditions. We did see one man from New York who had just retired and as a gift to himself was traveling to several national parks. "It's my way of celebrating the 100th anniversary of the national parks system," he told us. "I'm having trouble remembering which parks I visited. They all kind of run together."

We left the parking lot just before ten A.M. with backpacks full of bottled water, snacks and a lunch. We were anxious about what we might encounter. We hadn't gone a hundred yards before we saw a tree with red leaves. The sky was a deep blue against the mountains and made a dramatic backdrop for the colorful

Drew has hiked all over the Guadalupes and has been on obscure trails that only the park rangers know about. While he was editor of the Hudspeth County Herald he published beautiful lyrical prose about his hikes. "Every time I start out on a hike, it's a soul journey," he says. "It's like a spiritual quest." He has camped overnight on some of his meanderings.

A couple of miles into the canyon you encounter the Pratt cabin, built by the head of Standard Oil a long time ago. He called the location of his cabin the most beautiful spot in Texas. We stopped there for a drink of water and brief rest in rocking chairs. We hiked another couple of miles and stopped for lunch at a place with a cavernous overhang complete with stalagmites and stalactites called the

There are no steep climbs in McKittrick from the entrance to the grotto. Hikers walk most of the way on level ground. Serious climbers go past the grotto and the trail becomes more difficult.

After lunch we started back. Even though we went back the same way we came in, we were amazed at how the place had changed. The sun was lower and the light was intriguing. A stream reflected golden sunlight. The hike lasted less than six hours and covered about six miles. It's an easy one-day trip from Midland-Odessa.
