





Growing up, I guess I liked dolls ok but I preferred ponies. L ittle girls (and some little boys) play with dolls along their path of development into adults. I certainly know some women (my mom included) who still hold a lasting affection for dolls. That group also includes Janie Godfrey, owner of Janie's Doll Museum, situated in the northern Hopkins County community of Old Tarrant.

When I visited Janie, she explained the history of almost every doll which has a permanent place there. The oldest of Janie's dolls (Antique, 100 years or older) are quite fragile. Some of the vintage (50 years or older) can be handled, and with others she can demonstrate the silky life-like hair, tiny hand-painted teeth or jointed limbs which allow some dolls to actually walk. Here is a pair of dolls from Poland and Germany that are over a century old. Also pictured are some Presidential character dolls including members of the JFK family.







Here are three examples of dolls with hard heads, hands and feet and cloth bodies. The two ladies are china head dolls, dressed in the most elegant costume of their day. Their hair, though painted on, is elaborately styled, in contrast to earlier dolls with flat, plain hair styles. The doll wearing the straw hat has a tin head and bears a "Minerva mark".







Some fairy tale characters became popular dolls. This elaborate Little Black

Sambo with tigers and tree in 1930's era. More modern are these Raggedy Ann and Andy Valentine dolls made by a doll artist. Other character dolls in Janie's collection include Dorothy from The Wizard of Oz, Barbie, Super-



rizard of Oz, Barbie, Superman, Batman and Babe Ruth. Here you see Scarlett O'Hara in her picnic dress, Rhett Butler and his mistress Belle Whatley from Gone with the Wind.



Janie's Novelty collection includes a game of cards between ventriloquist dolls Charlie McCarthy and Mortimer Snerd. Mr. Peanut, an advertising model, looks on. Howdy Doody is expected to take a seat in the New Year. This top-hinged miniature stage once belonged in a WWII-era classroom. The teacher changed the set for each scene and her voice for each character. It was a cultural classroom tool that fascinated children and adults alike.

You can spend hours in this little "gem" and never know everything about the dolls in Janie's Doll Museum. Open Thursdays thru Saturdays 10am til 4pm, it's only \$3.50 each for the personal guided tour. Ask about group tours and the meeting/tearoom you can book. Find it on Highway 19 North just 9 miles from the Sulphur Springs post office or phone 903-885-3956. Plan a visit very soon!

Til next week, I'll watch for you AND Santa at the corral gate!



A WEEKEND IN MOUNTAIN COUNTRY

I spent a day in Terlingua, the Temple of Chilidom. Got to visit with John Holroyd, the new owner of La Kiva, the well-known watering hole just above Terlingua Creek. He has made some grand improvements to the place, which once used a black pot for a urinal. John hails from Yorkshire, England originally and migrated to Oklahoma 30 or so years ago. He is retired now and has been a frequent visitor to the desert country. He was a friend of the previous owner of La Kiva, Glen Felts, who died last year.

La Kiva stayed closed for 6 months and John didn't want to see it turn to dust, so he bought it. He stayed closed another year to do the refurbishing. The bar is open now and the restaurant will open soon with gourmet pizzas, brisket and other menu items. He has a barbeque cooker than can handle 1,000 pounds of meat. All the kitchen equipment is state of the art.

I also interviewed Lauren Stedman who has Menagerie Press in Terlingua. She makes exquisite invitations, business cards and other printed items using old-fashioned letterpress equipment and high-grade papers. She is a graphic design artist and her creations go all over the country.

I also met a genuine DIVA. Diane Wysocki is a member of Women Outdoors Worldwide, a group of women who shoot guns, slingshots and bows and arrows. They also do fly-fishing. All members are called DIVAs. They promote shooting safety and have worldwide shooting competitions. The organization's headquarters is in Dallas.

The next day I went to Alpine and visited with Dr. Paul Will, chair of the Meat Science department at Sul Ross who teaches a course called Sausage Manufacturing. It's a two-week course beginning January 4. Students of all disciplines flock to the course, where they can earn 4 semester hours credit. "I give them 25 pounds of meat and some seasoning and teach them how to make sausage," he says. "Then they make their own sausage using family recipes or whatever. At the end of the course we have a contest to see who has the best sausage according to a panel of judges."

I visited my friend Jim Glendenning who had just returned from a month long 26,000 mile trip around the world. He knows how to travel. His entire transportation bill was \$1,800. He walked to the train station in Alpine, took an overnight train to Los Angeles where he boarded a plane for London. On his circle of the globe he made five stops along the way, then took the train back to Alpine and walked home.

The new managers at the Holland Hotel are Marcus and Nicole Van Winden, who met on a Holland-America cruise ship. He was a chef; she was cruise director. He is from Holland. It was only natural that they end up managing the Holland Hotel. I went to Marfa and visited with Mayor Dan Dunlap. He told me about the new 4-story hotel being built downtown and a new 5 million dollar art installation due next year at Chinati. Lots of stuff going on in the mountain country along the border. 

Norah Morahan O'Donnell

American print and television journalist.



Norah Morahan O'Donnell (born January 23, 1974) is an American print and television journalist, currently serving as the co-anchor of CBS This Morning, a position she has held since July 2012, when she replaced Erica Hill. Before that, she spent one year as Chief White House Correspondent for CBS News in Washington, D.C., after moving to the network from NBC. She is also the substitute host for CBS' Sunday morning show, Face the Nation.

Early life:

O'Donnell was born in Washington, D.C., the daughter of Francis O'Donnell, a doctor. Her parents are both of Irish descent. When Norah was 3, her family moved to San Antonio, Texas, where she graduated from Douglas MacArthur High School. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in philosophy and a master's degree in liberal studies from Georgetown University.

Career:

O'Donnell initially served as staff writer for Roll Call, where she covered Congress.

A commentator for the NBC News Today Show, Chief Washington Correspondent for MSNBC, and from September 2003 to May 2005, the White House correspondent for NBC News, O'Donnell was also a contributing anchor for MSNBC Live, and a rotating news anchor on Weekend Today. O'Donnell has done reports that have appeared on numerous NBC News broadcasts, including NBC Nightly News, The Today Show, Dateline NBC, and MSNBC. O'Donnell has also filled in for Chris Matthews as host of Hardball with Chris Matthews and was a regular pundit for The Chris Matthews Show. She also co-hosted the New York City St. Patrick's Day Parade on WNBC since 2007.

Since joining CBS, she has filled in for Scott Pelley on the CBS Evening News multiple times, the first being October 10, 2011.

Washingtonian Magazine has named O'Donnell as one of Washington's 100 most powerful women. O'Donnell has also been named to Irish American Magazine's 2000 "Top 100 Irish Americans" list.

O'Donnell became a co-anchor on CBS This Morning in fall 2012, replacing Erica Hill.

Personal life:

O'Donnell lives in Washington, D.C. with her husband, restaurateur Geoff Tracy (owner of D.C. restaurant, Chef Geoff's), whom she married in June 2001. On May 20, 2007, Norah and Geoff became the parents of twins, whom they named Grace and Henry. Their third child, daughter Riley Norah Tracy, was born on July 5, 2008; O'Donnell noted that her daughter's first name had been suggested by Tim Russert, who died three weeks prior to Riley's birth. O'Donnell and her husband Geoff Tracy made a cookbook for parents titled Baby Love: Healthy, Easy, Delicious Meals for Your Baby and Toddler, released on August 31, 2010.

Awards:

O'Donnell won the Sigma Delta Chi Award for Breaking News Coverage for the Dateline NBC story "DC In Crisis," which aired on the night of September 11, 2001.

She also won an Emmy for NBC News' Election Night coverage in 2008.

Criticism:

O'Donnell was heavily criticized by conservatives for her interview of a Sarah Palin supporter attending a book signing. While speaking with people in the line, O'Donnell pointed out the obvious inconsistency of Palin supporter Jackie Seal's wearing a shirt against the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008, which Palin supported. Several conservative hosts and bloggers, most notably Glenn Beck, criticized O'Donnell for the interview.

In April 2010, O'Donnell implied that Newt Gingrich made racist comments at the Southern Republican Leadership Conference when he criticized Barack Obama with a basketball reference. Gingrich said: "What we need is a president, not an athlete. Shooting three-point shots may be clever, but it doesn't put anybody to work." In response to the criticism, Gingrich said, "The left is becoming a parody of itself ... she immediately said that must be a racist comment. It's relatively hard to go from 'we need somebody who is a good president more than somebody who shoots three-point shots' to 'that must have been racist.


