





We've taken a few train trips and loved them all. We rode the rails from Los Angeles to Oakland, from Savannah to Charles ton, from Dallas to Texarkana. We've taken some excursion trains in Texas and Colorado. We've taken the Chihuahua al Pacifico railroad in Mexico and the Chunnel train beneath the English Channel. Train travel is wonderful. It is the refined way to go someplace.

My wife Susan and I took Amtrak's Texas Eagle from Dallas to Chicago recently. It left the cavernous Union Station just before 4 PM and within an hour we were sitting in the observation car sipping margarita cocktails. Life is sweet on a train.

We bought round-trip tickets and had a compartment, which we thought was pretty upscale. It has comfortable seating for two. The seats face each other. We spent a good portion of the trip in our compartment, watching the view from our picture window. We found out later that there is a deluxe room that has a bathroom, shower and a bed that can sleep two. If I'm going to spend another night on a train, I'm going to make sure I get a deluxe room. But they are hard to get. We kept trying to upgrade, but they were all sold out. In fact, the whole train was sold out coming and going. Our compartment has a bunk bed that has about a foot of space between the mattress and the ceiling. I had the upper. Susan had the lower, made from the two chairs. Each mattress is 28 inches wide. Didn't sleep much.

The cost of our round trip ticket was around \$750, total for both of us. That includes meals. Going we had dinner, breakfast and lunch. Coming back we had dinner and breakfast. The food was excellent. People riding in regular seats usually bring their own food. Apparently you can bring anything on the train. There is no x-ray, no examination of luggage. We passed thru Longview, Marshall, Texarkana, Little Rock, Saint Louis and some smaller cities.

The return trip got interesting. Since we had a compartment, we could wait for the train in Chicago's first class waiting room. It's just like an airline club, with free snacks and drinks. Not anything at all like the train station in Dallas. We were escorted to the train and shown to our compartment. We made ourselves comfortable and settled in for the trip home. We had supper and called it a day. This time we decided not to use the upper bunk but to sleep together on the lower bed. Forget it. No sleep at all.

At 4 AM the train stopped for a long time at the Little Rock station. We were told that two Union Pacific engines had collided head on just west of Texarkana and the tracks were damaged. No trains could pass over them. We had breakfast at 6 and finally got on a bus just before 8 AM. We got back to Dallas about 4 hours late. Train travel is not only fun. It's exciting. Next time we'll take the train one way and fly back (only if we can get a deluxe room).

Family pride is important to most of us. I've got two family members I want to brag on this week, if I may. Seems as we edge closer and closer to the holidays, planning time with family takes center stage. Yes, I'm ready to plan Thanksgiving and Christmas gatherings. I'm looking at recipes and gathering ingredients already. Trouble is, when the kids live a distance away, the challenges multiply in getting everyone at the same table! Here's an early wish for leisurely, problem-free holidays and wonderful memories for you and yours.

Sgt Clayton Bounds is an Army Ranger Instructor stationed at Ft. Benning, Ga. He is the son of Enola Gay Mathews of SS. This summer, Bounds and other members of his Airborne Brigade were invited to join a "jump" during the anniversary commemoration of Operation Market Garden in Holland.

To give a bit of background, the historic Market Garden operation took place in September 1944 during World War Two. It was a large, swift land and air offensive launched by American and Allied units from the border of Belguim. They were to land and assist British forces in recovering territory held by Germans. In particular, this territory involved the supply routes to villages which included a road and a bridge across the River Waal. According to one who was there, the aircraft involved in the massive daylight jump was so numerous that the sky was thick with planes circling in formation. They met intense anti-aircraft fire from German troops who were on the ground there. In a tribute to bravery, a reporter said that our Allied pilots maintained their places in formation while paratroopers made their exits from the planes, even with some craft catching on fire. In a short time, some 6,769 men were in their correct drop zones with less than 20% casualties. The promising part of the operation seemed to end there, however. As troops on the ground moved along the 20-mile stretch of road known as "Hell's Highway", it proved more difficult to capture than Allied Forces anticipated, casualties were high, and the operation failed. The Netherlands were not liberated before Christmas 1944, and thousands of civilians and soldiers lived, and died, under miserable besieged conditions until liberation in May 1945. The largest military airborne operation in military history, code name Market Garden, was a "gallant

failure", and later inspired the making of the movie "A Bridge Too Far". Bounds said that for the re-enactment, a select number of French, Dutch, Belgian, Polish, American and other airborne soldiers representing the 1944 Allied troops took part. Weather limited the number of commemorative jumps that were completed. Today, the town of Nym-jin on the Waal canal has lights along the Nym-jin Bridge that light up one at a time each evening at dark in memory of those who died there during the historic operation.

Today's Army's Airborne division is a partnership with the US Air Force. Ft. Benning is known as the "Maneuver Center of Excellence" which is home to the Ranger and Airborne Training Brigade, or ARTB.







Chill Wills



Actor - Singer



Chill Theodore Wills (July 18, 1902 – December 15, 1978) was an American film and television actor and a singer in the Avalon Boys Quartet.

Wills was born in 1902 in Seagoville near Mesquite in Dallas County, Texas. He was a performer from early childhood, forming and leading the Avalon Boys singing group in the 1930s. After appearing in a few westerns, he disbanded the group in 1938 and struck out on a solo acting career.

One of his more memorable roles was that of the distinctive voice of Francis the Mule in a series of popular films. Wills' deep, rough voice and Western twang were matched to the personality of the cynical, sardonic mule. As was customary at the time, Wills was given no billing for his vocal work, though he was featured prominently on-screen as blustery General Ben Kaye in the fourth entry, Francis Joins the WACS. He provided the deep voice for Stan Laurel's performance of "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine" in Way Out West (1937), in which the Avalon Boys Quartet appeared.

Wills was cast in numerous serious film roles, including that of Uncle Bawley in Giant (1956), which also features Rock Hudson, Elizabeth Taylor and James Dean. Wills was nominated for the Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor in 1960 for his role as Davy Crockett's companion "Beekeeper" in the film The Alamo. However, his aggressive campaign for the award was considered tasteless by many, including the film's star/director/producer, John Wayne, who publicly apologized for Wills. Wills' publicity agent, W.S. "Bow-Wow" Wojciechowicz, accepted blame for the ill-advised effort, claiming that Wills had known nothing about it. The Oscar was instead won by Peter Ustinov for his role as Lentulus Batiatus in Spartacus.

Wills was a poker player and a close friend of Benny Binion, the founder of the World Series of Poker and former owner of Binion's Horse-shoe Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada. Wills participated in the first World Series, held in 1970, and is seated in the center of the famous picture with a number of legendary players.

In 1960, Wills appeared on Rory Calhoun's CBS western series, The Texan in the lead in the episode entitled "The Eyes of Captain Wylie". Lane Bradford was cast as Spike Taylor.

From 1961 to 1962, Wills starred in the short-run series Frontier Circus which aired for only one season on CBS. In 1966, Wills was cast in the role of a shady Texas rancher, Jim Ed Love, in the short-lived ABC comedy/western series The Rounders (reprising his role in the 1965 film

The Rounders), with co-stars Ron Hayes, Patrick Wayne and Walker Edm-

iston.

In 1963 and 1964, Wills joined fellow actors William Lundigan, Walter Brennan and Efrem Zimbalist, Jr., in making appearances on behalf of U.S. Senator Barry M. Goldwater, the Republican nominee in the campaign against U.S. President Lyndon B. Johnson.

In 1968 Wills refused to support Richard M. Nixon for the presidency and served as master of ceremonies for George C. Wallace, former governor of Alabama, for the California campaign stops in Wallace's presidential campaign. With Walter Brennan, Wills was among the few Hollywood celebrities to endorse Wallace's bid against Nixon and Hubert H. Humphrey.

In 1968, he starred in Gunsmoke episode "A Noose for Dobie Price" where he played Elihu Gorman, a former outlaw who joins forces with Marshal Matt Dillon, played by James Arness, to track down a member of his former gang who has escaped jail.

His last role was in 1978 as a janitor in Stubby Pringle's Christmas.

Wills died in 1978 of cancer in Encino, California, aged 76. He is interred in the Grand View Memorial Park Cemetery in Glendale.


