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Chronic Urticaria: The Non-Stop Itch

DEAR DR. ROACH: For the past year, I have had hives on and off again, with the hives being more prominent in the morning than in the evening. I have been told by a dermatologist that it is a viral infection and that topical creams, antihistamines and/or steroids would only mask the virus — it would still be in my bloodstream.

be in my bloodstream. Are there other causes of hives that could be causing or exacerbating the problem? I do not know the exact cause of the hives, and they really don't itch too much — they are just unsightly. How long can a viral infection with hives take to clear up? Is there anything I can do to help speed along recovery? Can it be heat-related, as in the warmer months they tend to come out more than in the winter?

I get differing diagnoses from various doctors, some saying I shouldn't go swimming or go outside in the sun, and others saying to go about my normal routines. I just wish I knew the exact cause. I would be grateful for any advice or insight on the topic of hives. —*Anon.*

ANSWER: "Chronic urticaria" is the medical term for what you are describing, if you have hives most days of the week for six or more weeks. The rash is raised, usually round or ringshaped, and can vary in size. They tend to be very itchy (you are lucky that way), and each lesion comes and goes within 24 hours. Chronic urticaria is common, occurs more often in women, and can appear on any part of the body. Sunlight and heat can be triggers for some people, whereas cold is a trigger for others. Diet usually is not a factor in chronic urticaria. There are many theories, but nobody

There are many theories, but nobody is sure, so I can't tell you the exact cause. It probably is not due to viruses, but hepatiis A and hepatiis C have been suggested, though there is conflicting data. We don't know what causes it, but since the itchiness can be very uncomfortable, even severe in some cases, I think treatment, even though it may "mask" the underlying cause, is still helpful, and antihistamines are the mainstay of treatment. I tend to prefer cetirizine (Zyrtec), since it is effective (both for itchiness and in helping clear the hives), usually doesn't cause sedation and is very inexpensive as a generic. It may take two to five years, but chronic urticaria usually does go away eventually.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I haven't had to shave my legs for a few years, because I never get growth anymore. My doctor said it may be from hormones. I'm 78. Could that be the reason? — C.K.

ANSWER: Lack of hair can result from several reasons, including hormonal changes, but also from "poor circulation" — specifically, peripheral artery disease. Unrecognized peripheral artery disease is important, since it predicts increased risk of heart disease and stroke. A physical exam is sometimes enough to make the diagnosis however, if your doctor's suspicion is high, he or she might order a Doppler ultrasound to evaluate the blood flow. ***

Sully (PG-13) - With both engines disabled and 155 passengers on board, Capt. Chesley "Sully" Sullenberger steered his aircraft into a safe water landing on the Hudson River, saving the lives of everyone on board. Clint Eastwood directs this dramatization

of the events, from the morning of the crisis through to the investigation where Sully (Tom Hanks) and co-pilot Jeff Skiles (Aaron Eckhart) have to defend their emergency maneuvers. It was 2009, and the media

seized the story with gusto, so most of us still remember it pretty well. There's not a lot of room for surprise or reinterpretation of the major facts. Still, Eastwood has a steady hand as he directs this story chronicling the noble virtues of an everyman-type: the right man at the right time. Few people play the virtuous everyman with more virtue than Tom Hanks. The Magnificent Seven (PG-13) A motley group of Wild West misfits with lethal talents and little to lose sling their guns defending a small town from a large band of marauders. A sly bounty hunter (Denzel Washington) is inspired to take up the near-hopeless cause by a woman (Haley Bennet) whose husband was murdered by the chief baddie, Bogue (Peter Saarsgard). Against an army stands Washington's bounty hunter, a wisecracking gambler (Chris Pratt), a deadeye (Ethan Hawke), a Chinese knife expert (Byung-hun Lee), a rogue Comanche (Martin Sensmeier), a big 'ol frontiersman (Vincent D'Onofrio) and an outlaw from south of the border (Manuel Garcia-Rulfo). Director Antoine Fuqua knows how to make chaos look really cool - even the stuffier viewer will have to admit that there are some neat things going on here. What's missing is the kind of character depth its predecessors had. Yes, it's hard to do in a short time with seven heroes, but some of these guys

don't get any deeper than the brief description listed above.

Storks (PG) - Storks used to deliver babies, but nowadays they're mostly delivering stuff for a sky-based kind of Amazon called Cornerstore.com. Junior (voiced by Andy Samberg) is a dutiful stork who, through wacky circumstances, must deliver One Last Baby to its intended family with the help of Tulip (voiced by Katie Crown), an orphan who was raised by the storks. Even wackier circumstances lead to them being chased by a wolf pack with superb teamwork skills. The plot's not really worth it, but the movie is fast and funny, and plenty capable of keeping you entertained most of the

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

To glaze the ham: Place the ham in a roasting pan lined with enough foil overlapping the edges to wrap it completely. Mix together the honey, brown sugar, orange juice, ginger and dry mustard in a small bowl. Pour the mixture all over the pork and rub the glaze evenly over the ham. Stick the cloves in the diamond-shaped slits on the top of the ham. Wrap tightly with the foil. After glazing, it's best to allow the ham to sit at room temperature for 1-2 hours before cooking. To bake the ham: Heat oven to 200 F. Bake the ham for 6 to 7 hours or until done, occasionally unwrapping and basting the ham with the glaze and any liquids that may have accumulated in the foil. For a slightly crisper skin, unwrap the ham and bake at 450 F, about 15 minutes.



Ham for the Holidays

My mother and were talking recently about our plans for the holidays. The women of the family usually prepare dinner for about 25 to 30 people. We take turns each year hosting the celebration at a different family member's house.



It's a recipe that everyone loves. Prepackaged hams that are brined, glazed with brown sugar and honey, spiral cut and baked are expensive. For a ham that's much more budget-friendly, I suggest that you try this delicious recipe that uses the shank or picnic portion of the ham.

And, if your family has a difficult time gathering together during the "designated" holidays this season, select your own time to celebrate. It's liberating and lots of fun!

To brine the ham: Cut crosswise slits all around the ham, about 1/2inch apart, halfway through ham to where knife touches bone, if any. Place the water in a deep bowl, a large pot or a large, re-sealable food-safe plastic bag. Stir in the sugar. Soak the ham in the brining liquid for at least 2 days in the refrigerator, turning the ham once or twice each day. Drain off the brining liquid.

We've decided from now on to celebrate the holidays on a day that works best for all of us. I'm bringing my special Sugar and Spice Ham to our family gathering.

SUGAR AND SPICE HAM

- (7 pound) smoked ham, halfcut, shank end, picnic or shoulder portion (bone in or out)
- 2 quarts cold water
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup honey
- 1/2 cup brown sugar, packed
- 1 (6 ounce) can frozen orange *juice concentrate, thawed*
- 2 teaspoons ginger
- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 2 tablespoons whole cloves

To prepare the ham: Trim off some of the fat, leaving a 1/4-inch layer. Score the remaining layer of fat into a diamond pattern by cutting 1/4- to ***
