Imagine a playground where ALL students can play together...

A place where individual disabilities do not limit where, with what or with whom a student can interact and play...

A play area where children who have a disability are not limited to one small section, with their "own" playground equipment, and with only a friend or two with whom to play...

An area that can be used for both enjoyment and therapy...

An area where parents and grandparents with mobility issues can play alongside their children/grandchildren...

Imagine a playground that is INCLU-SIVE FOR ALL....

Construction of just such a playground is the goal of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District. But to do so, we need the support and assistance of others.

#### District background, mission

The mission of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District is to challenge, inspire, and empower in a caring and innovative learning environment. Over the past years, we have done much as a district to challenge and prepare our students to be college and career-ready. Increasing our college credits available on-site to 60+; developing certification programs in the areas of culinary arts, customer service, technical education; promoting continual growth in our participation in the Youth Apprenticeship program; constructing a new greenhouse/classroom laboratory and aquaponics center; and renovating/ adding a "Maker Space" lab area in the elementary/middle school to allow students to explore concepts such as coding, robotics, engineering, etc. are just a few of the examples of how ELG School District is continually working to meet its mission.

## Facing loneliness

Loneliness is not a good feeling. It usually engulfs us when we are all alone, although it can also sneak up on us in the middle of a party or in the midst of life-long friends and relatives. Loneliness may grab us at almost any time of day or night—and it doesn't seem to want to let us go. More often than not, we think of it as an attribute of the sickly and elderly, but it may also occasionally strike at the young at heart. It's the sort of feeling we really don't want to talk about.

As fairly healthy residents of an active retirement community, my husband and I seldom experience loneliness, but if one of us is gone for any length of time, we may admit to a touch of being just a little bit lonely. Those passing feelings of being lonely are usually just short term in nature, and we can always alleviate such temporary loneliness by reading a good book, watching TV, phoning a good friend, or taking a long walk. It's surprising what that fresh air can do.

Probably one of the most difficult kinds of loneliness arises from the loss of a spouse, close relative, or special friend. Those of you who have experienced this can easily relate to the emptiness that consumes us when our loved one is not only the cause of our alone-ness, but also is not there to console us. We can hear ourselves saying, "I never realized how many things we did together." Or, "If I had only told him/her how much I cared."

Sometimes it is our work or other commitments that contribute to our loneliness. Though work can provide the contacts with others that may prevent our feeling "outside" the fun activities of our friends at work, we don't always recognize or benefit from that ordinary work-related interaction with others. We sometimes miss the office get-togethers or social celebrations because we feel that they are not as important as some routine job or task arising from our work agenda.

Perhaps the saddest cases of loneliness arise from our own reluctance to take that extra step, extend a helping hand, or smile an understanding smile. It's truly surprising how a simple smile or an extra friendly hello can not only provoke a friendly smile in return, but also lift your own spirits to a new level of warmth and happiness. But before this turns into an over-long sermon on how to be happy in a lonely world, let's close with some practical advice, "Loneliness is a state of mind and feelings. Change your mind and control your feelings.' You may occasionally still succumb to loneliness, but only when you don't make the effort to change.

## **EL Tourism receives Trailblazer Award at WACVB** conference

The Wisconsin Association of Convention and Visitors Bureaus (WACVB) has presented a 2016 Wisconsin Tourism Trailblazer award to Elkhart Lake Tourism, for outstanding marketing and partnership efforts.

Elkhart Lake Tourism received the Trailblazer Award in the \$25,000-\$50,000 Marketing Campaign category for the Vacationing Elkhart Lake Style Video Series. "Using the insight of tourism industry partners we were able to share the story of what compels visitors to return to our lakeside resort village for generations with family and friends," says Kathleen Eickhoff, Executive Director of Elkhart Lake Tourism.

This project was over a year in the making with interviews encompassing a broad base of tourism related businesses. This interview-style format gives viewers the opportunity to see and hear directly from those who are on the front lines of their businesses. "We felt this approach had a more genuine appeal and made for a richer and more compelling story. It also shares the many faces and connections that our customers seek; they really value the personal relationships they've established in Elkhart Lake."

A series of three stand-alone videos was created. Vacationing Elkhart Lake Style tells the story of what makes Elkhart Lake such a beloved vacation destination bringing visitors back year after year. Dine Around speaks to Elkhart Lake's growing reputation as a culinary destination boasting 20 plus restaurants and pubs, great farms to table cuisine, extensive wine lists and an upscale and lively atmosphere. Lastly, Breathe Easy celebrates the great array of recreation options available set amid a beautiful natural setting.

"We were so pleased to have such a

great team collaborating on this effort. JJ Burkart of SilverWater Productions from Plymouth was the videographer. His team was very responsive to our interview, video and editing schedule. Carla Minsky of Armadillo Marketing out of Fond du Lac directed the productions. Minsky has much experience with the tourism industry and was integral in obtaining genuine interviews and crafting the story we wanted to share. It was also helpful that both Burkart and Minsky are very familiar with vacationing and hosting family weddings in Elkhart Lake. These personal experiences provided great insight to this project. " says Eickhoff.

Once the videos were complete they were shared through a variety of video channels. They were very well received and viewed over 33,254 times from mid-March through July on www.Elkhartlake. com. The Dine Around video was shared on Facebook as part of a culinary-specific effort in May and was viewed organically over 54,000 times. Additional video clips were shared on Facebook generating a 45percent increase in Facebook fans in addition to great social media engagement.

"We were very pleased with the response to our video series and felt this project went a long way in extending our Elkhart Lake brand, and one that is not yet complete. Weddings Elkhart Lake Style is still in production and due to be completed in January. It promises to be yet another great Elkhart Lake story," Eickhoff said.

increased. This has led us to make changes in our instructional program within the school building, but it is also requiring us to analyze and plan for modifications that need to happen outside our building. For this reason, a plan for renovating the elementary/middle school playground into an "inclusive playground/therapy extension center" has been developed.

A team consisting of members of the administrative team, a playground designer, special education staff, an area construction firm, and a local organization that focuses on providing assistance to students with disabilities met several times to share ideas and explore various options until a final design was reached that will best meet our desired outcome.

#### Overview of the Inclusive Playground/Therapy Extension Center:

When the playground was renovated and moved to its expanded location on the north side of the school nine years ago, an area was included in the plans that allowed access for our handicapped students. This included several pieces of equipment that allowed them to play with one or two students in a limited area. While it provided some activity, the options were few, the ability to play with others limited, and accessibility to other equipment or areas extremely restricted. Due to water issues in the elementary building last year, new piping needed to be installed which ran under the playground and took away the paved access that had existed. While very unfortunate, this provided an opportunity for us to look at the playground and see how better we, as a District, could meet the needs of all our students. Over time, the number of students with disabilities and the spectrum of these disabilities have increased. A design was created that would renovate approximately the eastern fourth of the existing playground (right alongside the basketball hoops)-much of which is currently not in use. Construction of this area is not cheap. To do this planned construction (Phase I), the estimated cost is approximately \$150,000. This total would include the new playground equipment, the installation of rubber surfacing which would allow accessibility to all students (and adults) to the play structure, and the removal of the pea gravel on the entire area with replacement of wood fiber surfacing (this is necessary as the pea gravel could/would cause damage to the rubber surfacing).

#### Playground goals

The goals of the playground are many. Completing this phase of the playground renovation would allow:

An area where ALL children can play together, including children with emotional impairments as well as cognitive impairments and physical disabilities—from moderate to severe.

An area where students with limited mobility (wheelchair bound, walkers, etc.) can have access to playground equipment with their peers, as well as using the various equipment pieces as part of their therapy plan. The double-wide ramp provides accessibility to everyone, while connecting the various playground components.

Areas that will provide sensory experiences from which all our students will benefit, but especially those who have sensory/motor and emotional/social needs.

Physical therapy teaching tools are in-



corporated into the equipment design, as well as providing a recreational structure. The design includes playground equipment pieces that can work on both fine and gross motor skills. For example, students can work on stepping, climbing, and traversing on uneven surfaces; developing their sensory systems, etc.

An area where able-bodied and disabled children learn to play together. When kids are able to play together, differences become less. Kids just become kids!

Where people of all abilities (and ages parents and grandparents too) can come together, play, and learn. This playground renovation would provide equitable access for children and grown-up companions of all ages and address a need of the community. While we do have several village parks, none are Inclusive Playgrounds--allowing access to all. This playground would make that environment available.

An area that complies with ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) guidelines. A resilient surfacing is supplied underneath the equipment, including and around the auxiliary ground level equipment. In addition, an access pathway is provided. If/when the District would have additional funds available (beyond the \$150,000) we would explore the option of expanding handicapped access to the entire playground in the future. However, we feel at this time Phase I will be a fantastic start to meet our current needs.

While all our students would benefit from this playground, comments that give a glimpse into the impact it could have for our students with disabilities are shared on the adjacent page by Rayner, an ELGS third-grader, and the staff who work with our students who have occupational and physical therapy needs.

#### Therapy program support

The Occupational and Physical Therapy programs at ELGS support the Inclusive Playground so all students can participate and engage in play at recess.

The ramps and decks would accommodate multiple users including wheelchairs and encourage movement throughout the structure. The igloo would provide a cozy spot where children can seek sensory relief. Most importantly, the soft surface will provide safe and accessible routes of travel throughout the playground for all abilities. No one will be left out in this new playground, making ELGS a leader in inclusion among the school districts in the area. This playground will enable therapists to address IEP goals in a functional school setting.

#### **Current Financial Situation**

Due to numerous factors outside of the District's control (state legislation, declining enrollment, etc.), our ability to raise revenue was severely reduced in 2010. We were faced with decreasing our operational budget by almost \$500,000out of a total operational budget of \$5.5 million. Added to this was the necessity to replace most of the roofs on our buildings. To address our financial situation, in April 2012, the community passed a three-year referendum that would provide the much needed funds for maintenance and operational expenses. However, in response to the economic climate at the time, the amount which was requested in the referendum was need-based to cover the District's costs to maintain programming and complete the roof project. The referendum brought the District back to a flat budget level, which the District has worked hard to maintain. At the end of the referendum timeline, the loan taken out for the roof project was paid in full and we were once again a debt-free District.

However, as was brought up when discussing the referendum in 2012, another major project existed in our District-replacing the HVAC systems in the elementary and high school buildings, most of which was outdated and no longer effectively and/or efficiently heating our buildings. Again, the community stepped up in April 2015 to support a four-year referendum which would address this maintenance issue and support revenue flexibility that brought us back to a flat level for operational expenses. Upon the end of this period, the plans are for ELGS to again be a debt-free District-one of very few in the state.

Although the District has received community support through referenda

approval and as a result, has managed to address several major building needs and expand our programming to better meet our students' and community's needs, we are still not able to financially support all the projects that would be beneficial to our District and the students within it. We have been fortunate that in those times, others from in the community have stepped up and generously provided support. Examples would include the raising of approximately \$250,000 to support the building of our new greenhouse/aquaponics/classroom laboratory building; the donation of a new football/soccer scoreboard; the installation of a fully-equipped, restaurant-style culinary arts kitchen; upgrades to the technology infrastructure and student/staff technology access. All this has been possible, in large part, due to the generosity of supportive donors.

#### Similar avenue

As we have had such success with these partnerships and sponsorships, it is this same avenue which we are pursuing to obtain funding for the renovation/addition of the ALL INCLUSIVE play area to the elementary/middle school playground.

The "official" fundraising campaign received several very generous donations to "kick start" this project. These include \$40,000 from an area charitable organization: \$10,000 from the ELG Education Foundation (which they hope to raise matching funds); and approximately \$1,000 from the Ladies of the Lakes.

This is a great start. However, almost \$100,000 still needs to be raised. Our goal is to purchase the equipment before year end (to guarantee the 2016 pricing) with installation to occur in the spring—as soon as Mother Nature allows us to do so.

Ideally we want this in place so our students can realize the benefit yet this school

year, and it also becomes available to our community members and guests.

With the support given to the District in the past, we feel very optimistic about reaching our fundraising goal and thus, being able to meet the timeline outlined above.

Any assistance you could give would be greatly appreciated—financially, in-kind, or leads to other possible donors.

The District is working cooperatively with the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Education Foundation (ELGEF) to raise funds for this project.

# Lake turnover phenomenon explained

#### By the Elkhart Lake **Improvement Association**

We are very fortunate in Elkhart Lake to have a beautiful lake, one that is available for all varieties of recreational activities.

Keeping the lake in good shape is a major part of what the Elkhart Lake Improvement Association is dedicated to doing. Each year, ELIA works with the staff at the DNR, professional marine biologists, and with volunteers to help make "Keep Elkhart Blue" a reality for all to enjoy. Check us out at www.KeepElkhartBlue. org.

The lake also helps take care of itself. Elkhart Lake, with a maximum depth of 119 ft., 286 acres, goes through a change of life twice a year. The process, which takes place in both spring and fall is called Turnover. Here is what is happening when you think the lake is just there.

What is meant by "lake turnover"? How and why do lakes do this in autumn and spring?

• The key to this question is how water density varies with water temperature. Water is most dense (heaviest) at 39 degrees F (four degrees C) and as temperature increases or decreases from 39 de-

grees F, it becomes increasingly less dense (lighter). In summer and winter, lakes are maintained by climate in what is called a stratified condition. Less dense water is at the surface and more dense water is near the bottom.

• During late summer and autumn, air temperatures cool the surface water causing its density to increase. The heavier water sinks, forcing the lighter, less dense water to the surface. This continues until the water temperature at all depths reaches approximately 39 degrees F. Because there is very little difference in density at this stage, the waters are easily mixed by the wind. The sinking action and mixing of the water by the wind results in the exchange of surface and bottom waters, which is called turnover.

• During spring, the process reverses itself. This time ice melts, and surface waters warm and sink until the water temperature at all depths reaches approximately 39 degrees F. The sinking combined with wind mixing causes spring "turnover."

• This describes the general principle; however, other factors (including climate and lake depth variations) can cause certain lakes to act differently.

### Lake Turnover



During summer and winter, the lake is fully stratified: · Epilimnion - the upper layer is where the warm

water resides. • Thermocline/Metilimnion - mild temp but great to

iump in summer and cool down. Hypolimnion - the lower strata where the heavier colder water hangs out.

This turnover cycle helps the lake renew itself. So,

enjoy thinking about this process as you watch the seasons' change, and, when you go from swimming to snowshoeing on wonderful Elkhart Lake.

With 7,597 used cars sold last year, the Van Horn Automotive group has grown to become the largest used car dealer in the state based on volume.

Mr. Van Horn said he hopes the ESOP will give him a competitive edge in recruiting and retaining good employees.

'I know some dealers who don't even offer health coverage," he said. "I'm in a business that's notorious for high turnover. If I can create a culture where employees feel safe and secure at the end of their career, it would help."

Winter Rules begin Nov. 15

All Night Parking Regulated. 6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street or the parking lot on North East Street between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A.M. and 6:00 o'clock A.M. commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

#### **Snow Removal**

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

#### **Garbage Collection Change**

Starting in January, 2017, garbage pickup will take place on Mondays. Advanced Disposal changed all of their routes in the county making it more efficient for them.

The first January pickup will be on Monday, Jan. 2. Regular pickup will be on Monday except when a holiday falls on that day. Pickup will then take place on Tuesday. The same rules apply.
