



Gottsch said, "The council has total decision making on hiring and firing. What ever the decision is, I will live with it.

Leonard made a motion to hire Damien Stalker, as full -time officer for Deerwood and Ironton Police Departments. Council Member Eric Ostrowski seconded and the motion was passed with Taylor voting against it. Council Member Jeremy Millsop was absent and Mayor Aulie voted in favor of the hiring. So the vote was three to one.

Other matters

The council set the final levy at \$537,374.38. The levy is set be the city and comes from the county through real estate taxes. A reduction in the increase of the preliminary levy from 5.39% to 4.6%. The council approved the final budget at \$582,767.38. An approximate increase of 5% from 2016.

The Council of Catholic Women at St. Joseph's Catholic Church requested to add two handicapped parking spaces in front of the church. The council approved designating two handicapped parking and a no parking area in front of St. Joseph's Catholic Church.

Leonard made a motion to accept the resignation of Amy Vukelich Deputy Clerk with "thanks". Vukelich has been a part-time employee of Deerwood and also for the City of Garrison. Garrison had offered her more hours so she submitted her resignation to Deerwood.

Mayor Aulie said, "He has asked Jeff to come with some options." Turk indicated he would have several options for the council in January. The council approved the resignation with regret and thanks.

After some discussion about earning interest on a large CD until they needed the funds to pay for a big equipment purchase, Turk indicated they still had available funds in the general fund to help pay for the purchase.

Leonard made a motion to allow Clerk Turk to keep the money in the CD as long as he deems responsible. There was some concern about the CD interfering with qualifying for rural development funds. Turk indicated that shouldn't be a problem. The council approved this action.

The next Deerwood Council meeting will be held on Wednesday January 4 at 6 p.m., because of the New Years Holiday.

Mayor Mike Aulie indicated they would be moving to a closed session of the council for an unstated reason. He also indicated no action would be taken at this meeting.

In a follow-up emailed inqury to Clerk Jeff Turk concerning the closed meeting, Turk responded, "The meeting was closed pursuant to Minnesota Statute Section 13d.05 Subdivison 3 to evaluate performance of Police Chief Harry Gottsch."




