The company will staff a 24-hour ambulance in both locations and will staff an additional 12-hour ambulance in Russellville during peak hours. A second ambulance will be stationed in Red Bay and can quickly be brought into service with an on-call crew.

Keller EMS provides medical transport between hospitals and special care units for patients who require advanced monitoring. The Advanced Life Support Ambulances are equipped with modern, life-saving technology for patients with complex medical situations. Being locally owned and not-for profit means that revenues stay in the community to provide advanced medical care and employment for the residents in and around the Shoals. "We are excited about this new venture," said **Bruce Carson**, Director of Keller EMS. "We look forward to working with the citizens of Franklin County and helping them in every way we can.












TORT LAW

The value of a car and how mIncluded under the law of tort are miscellaneous civil wrongs, ranging from simple, direct interferences with the person such as assault, battery, false imprisonment, or injury in an accident. Tort law also involves damage to property, as in the case of trespass or conversion, and includes intangible interests such as reputation as thought of with libel or slander (written or spoken) and commercial interests such as patent or intellectual property law.

Criminal law is different than tort law in that criminal law typically requires a direct intent to commit a wrong. One major difference is that insurance covers non-intentional acts that cause harm or damage but insurance will not cover an intentional act. If you decide to run over your ex, your insurance will not pay for it.

The idea of tort law is that you should have known better but did it

anyway. Sometimes people run stop signs that they don't know are there. In almost every case of tort law, people are careless in that they either didn't see the other driver or they didn't see the stop sign but they certainly did not intend to cause harm. Tort law is the law of carelessness and negligence. It's creating a danger that could have and should have been avoided.

When lawyers think about the idea of this kind of law we think about the law of England that was handed down to us that is known as "Common Law". Common Law is really the law of what a reasonable person under the same circumstances would do. If a person acts differently than a jury finds a reasonable person would have acted then in those instances where harm is caused the person who didn't act reasonably is responsibly monetarily for the harm they caused. In criminal cases the penalties include fines, imprisonment and even death. In civil tort cases a jury assesses the harms and losses and balances the scales of justice with money damages.

I think that as we become more diverse in society, the reasonable person standard may be more difficult to agree upon and people charged with assessing damages on a jury are a little more comfortable with a specific rule that has been broken. This type of law dealing with specific codes and laws is based on the Napoleonic or French idea of law which we still find prevalent in the State of Louisiana. More often than not, we see a combination of someone being careless and a rule being broken. For example, they didn't see the stop sign which is carelessness and they ran it which is breaking a rule. In either or both cases, that person is responsible for the harm they cause.





Medicare Minute

"Medicare vs Medicaid"

So often we have people who confuse Medicare and Medicaid. This is easy to do because both are in the news and both can be related to a person's health insurance. Although they coordinate in many ways they are two distinctive programs.

Medicare is a federal health insurance program. There are three ways to qualify for Medicare. The first way is to be 65 years of age or older. The second way is to have been on Social Security disability for at least 24 months. The third way to qualify for Medicare is be any age and have either end-stage renal disease or ALS. Medicare is not income based as far as qualifying. As long as you meet one of the three requirements above you will qualify for Medicare. Your income, however, can affect the amount you pay for your Part B premium.

Medicaid is a state health insurance program. Medicaid is income and resource based, meaning you will qualify or not according to how much money you make and/or how much money you have saved. In 2016 if you made less than \$1,010 as an individual or \$1,355 as a couple you could qualify for Medicaid. Whereas Medicare has deductibles and coinsurance, Medicaid will take care of most of your healthcare cost. A person on Medicaid can also get a break on how much they pay on their prescription drugs.

Medicare and Medicaid will coordinate in a couple of ways. In some counties in north Alabama there is a Medicare plan that will coordinate with Medicaid. To qualify for this plan you must be on Medicare and Medicaid. This is referred to as "dual eligible". Also, if you make more than the Medicaid limits but are under \$1,471 as an individual or \$1,991 as a couple you may qualify for "extra help". This would help you on your prescription drug cost.



ast week's Guest Op-Ed from Pete Rheim touched on the phenomenon of "Fake" news through a lens of patience. His patience should be commended. I have less of it. Fake news

is everywhere. Much of it is rumor and halftruths that often take on a life and angle of their own as social media moves information forward. That's now the case with all news.

Chances are good you never heard the term "Fake News" before September of this year as the Presidential campaign was ramping up. alleging that the Russians left evidence they hacked the 2016 election. However, there are no specifics or details.

Immediately after the Facebook was election of tilting the election because of all the fake right-leaning rumors it supposedly allowed as posts in the weeks leading up to the election. The partisan allegation itself was blatantly erroneous since misinformation from those on the left permeated the platform with at least an equal level of zealotry

during the campaign.
A site created to look like CNN ran a news piece that the Pope endorsed Donald Trump for president. A news piece touted Trump as saying in 1998 that if he ever ran for President he would do so as a Republican, because they're the dumbest group of voters in the country. They believe anything on Fox News... Both of those were later discovered to be hoaxes.

Regardless, in response to the relentless storm of criticism, Facebook CEO Mark Zuckerberg has announced that a team of Facebook researchers will forward suspect websites and stories to a group of third-party fact-checkers - get this - from Snopes, Factcheck.org, ABC News, PolitiFact, and the Associated Press to check for accuracy. Please forgive me if I am not reassured. I'm not sure they could conjure up a more leftleaning group of arbiters unless the Huffington Post or Salon.com were added.

What is amazing is how the mainstream media considers itself as the dulyappointed filter of Truth vs. Fake prior to any public digestion.

The media established the term, the definition, and now offers the solution.

Meanwhile, history media's major inability to discern the fake from the real. examples are countless.

We can go back to the 70's when Newsweek's article on how the earth was cooling at a life-threatening clip was taken as gospel and furthered through every possible avenue at the time. 





The Lighted Path

Palmer Hartsough is credited with writing the words to the lovely song, "I Am Resolved." The resolutions set forth in this simple hymn are worthy of our consideration as we begin a new calendar year. "I am resolved no longer to linger, charmed by the world's delight. Things that are higher, things that are nobler, these have allured my sight. I will hasten to Him, hasten so glad and free. Jesus, greatest, highest, I will come to Thee." Other verses begin, "I am resolved to go to the Savior, leaving my sin and strife," and "I am resolved to follow the Savior, faithful and true each day," and, "I am resolved to enter the kingdom, leaving the paths of sin. Friends may oppose me. Foes my beset me. Still will I enter in."

What is your new year's resolution? I've known some who simply refuse to make resolutions, saying they always fail to keep them. Still others valiantly resolve to lose weight, save money, free themselves of debt, etc. Some succeed. Others fail. And yet each new year somewhat begs our conscience to be resolute regarding important things and to renew our commitment to things we may have faltered at in years gone by. Why not resolve this year to read the Bible daily, to pray to the Lord daily, and to set as a goal of first importance the kingdom of God?

The Bible teaches us two things in this regard. First, compared to the reward God offers the faithful - the walk with Him in Christ is easy. Jesus said, "Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30). And second, leaving worldliness and reaching unto Godliness is not to be taken lightly. It is difficult to overcome the world, so Jesus also taught, "Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it" (Matthew 7:13-14).

There is no contradiction in these words of Jesus. God made us and His will for us makes for an easy yoke and a light burden. It is a yoke that fits well, and what is asked of us is not a heavy load unless we make it so. Yet sadly, there are those who have just enough faith to make themselves miserable in this world. The pleasures of sin (Hebrews 11:25) provide many alluring distractions. Most people follow in that way of life, which is a broad and easy road on which there is much company. Christians must choose subjection to Jesus Christ and His law (Matthew 7:21, Galatians 6:2). We must obey the gospel (1 Peter 4:17) or else we will be lost. And so, the way is strait, narrow, and few find it, but it is also an easy yoke we wear and a light burden that is well suited for mankind, for it is put upon us



Healthy, Happy **New Year**

Happy New Year! Did you make any resolutions? If you're the resolution-making type, chances are high that you made one about health. Whether it is to lost weight, eat healthier, start exercising (or do a better job of all that), health-related New Year's resolutions are common. We want to live long lives and have high quality of life during those years.

A study was conducted a few years ago about pocket areas of people around the globe who experience unusually high longevity. They call these areas Blue Zones, and they have some interesting common factors. I highly recommend that you go to ted.com and watch Dan Buettner's talk on longevity. It is fascinating, and less than 20 minutes long. Here's what they found in a nutshell:

- Longevity is affected by relationships. All of those Blue Zones share a similar high level of respect for the elderly in their community, as well as a focus on children. Families are close-knit, and friendships are nurtured.
- Longevity is tied to a physically active lifestyle. Not active in the way that Americans typically think of exercise, but active as a way of life. Buettner says that walking is the only thing that has been proven to deter cognitive decline. Of particular benefit is walking in nature.
- Longevity goes hand-in-hand with spirituality and sense of purpose. All of the cultures exhibited in Blue Zones place high emphasis on faith. They also seem to recognize sense of purpose as being vital to a person's well-being.
- Longevity is tied to dietary restraint. While there is no set diet for longer living, all of the diets in these zones were high in plant and legume intake and lower in meats. They also exercised restraint in eating, recognizing overeating as unhealthy.
- Longevity requires down time. This is something Americans seem to struggle with, especially in the holiday season we just came through. Buettner discusses the inflammatory nature of rushing around and being stressed out, and says that stress contributes to many illnesses including Alzheimer's and heart disease. All of the Blue Zone cultures place importance on having some quiet time each day.

The interesting thing is, none of these things alone are a revelation. Taken together, though, they form a picture of what I think we're all striving for. A happy, healthy, less-stressful life in which we take time to nurture friendships and spend quality time with our families.
