## New City of Crosby Mayor worries library is in jeopardy



City of Crosby Council will soon decide if releasing Jessie F. Hallett Memorial Library, located on 101 - 1st St SE in Crosby, to Kitchigami Regional Library System is a good and prudent move.

The new City of Crosby Mayor Jim Hunter feels that there are many issues that the City of Crosby will be facing, but none as critical as the future of the Jesse F. Hallett Memorial Library (JFHML) in Crosby.

After meeting with the IFHML board, Hunter felt that he needed to let the public know what is going on, because JFHML needs the community's support.

According to Hunter, it seems the relationship between the City of Crosby Council and members of the Hallett Trust Board has soured after years of litigation between the City of Crosby and JFHML.

The City of Crosby was in litigation with JFHML, because of a dispute over who was in charge of the library. The city felt JFHML was under control of the City of Crosby Council and the JFHML Board felt that, because of its public library status, statute dictated that the library was to be run by

the JFHML Board.

During the litigation, the City of Crosby Council used JFHML funds of \$5,700 to pay for the city's legal representation against the library. In contrast, JFHML received legal representation pro bono (without charge) from Mark Severson and Kevin

In 2013, the court issued a writ of mandamus against the City of Crosby, compelling the City to stop removing funds from the JFHML account. To date, the \$5,700 has not been refunded.

Hunter said he spoke to Crow Wing County Commissioner Doug Houge about of IFHML.

Hunter said that Houge told him the Crow Wing County Board will not give any funds at all to JFHML. JFHML must join the Kitchigami Regional Library System (KRLS). KRLS is a consolidated regional

public library serving Beltrami, Cass, Crow Wing, Hubbard and Wadena counties.

As a public library, JFHML was allowed to apply for acceptance to the KRLS; and in 2016 the City of Crosby Council agreed to hand over JFHML to become a part of

"The problem with that is this, [the Crow Wing County Board], want[s] KRLS to be in complete control of the funds," said Hunter.

Hunter said that he was told that the \$500,000 that is set aside for library funding through the Crow Wing County Board would go to KRLS, which then would distribute the funds as they see fit.

Currently, Brainerd Public Library (BPL) is part of KRLS. Pequot Lakes Community

Library are affiliates under BPL branch control. Currently, Pequot Lakes Community Library and Crosslake Area Library each receive \$5,000 per year from BPL to buy books.

JFHML currently operates on a budget of approximately \$220,000 per year. Hunter is worried that if KRLS accepts JFHML into their system, JFHML will not have enough money to operate, at its current level of service, which includes story hours, summer reading programs, author talks, e-books and

"Having a library in Crosby is important to our community," said Hunter. "And it is more than having access to books. Over 400 people get their taxes done for free at the library."

If JFHML is accepted into KRLS, the building and land will still be owned by the City of Crosby. The books and inventory will be owned by KRLS. In addition to become part of the KRLS system, the barcoding of 43,000 volumes at JFHML must be changed for a one time cost of \$96,000.

"The Hallett Trust has done

the funding problem Library and Crosslake Area so much for our community," he said. "Thirty-nine years ago, Mr. Hallett built this library, as a living memorial to his wife, Jesse. He did this to preserve, for eternity, the memory of woman that he loved; and I don't want to see us lose it."

Hunter said he appreciates all the support the Hallett Foundation has given to the community of Crosby including funds for the library, community center and mountain bike trails.

He said that he has been told the Hallett Foundation will continue to support the JFHML, whether or not the KRLS Board approves the 2016 City of Crosby Council decision to become a member of KRLS. However, he is unsure, if giving up control of JFHML to a library system without any safeguards in place to protect JFHML or Crosby in the future, is a wise and prudent move.

Hunter said another option is to levy Crow Wing County for \$4,000 a year to access all of the books and services of KRLS at JFHML, without becoming a full member of KRLS.

# CWD found in two more deer; five-county feeding ban in southern MN

Two more deer suspected of being infected with chronic wasting disease have been found near Preston in Fillmore County, which is southeast of Rochester. Fillmore County is on the Minnesota/ Iowa border .

The DNR received preliminary results of the positive tests late on Friday, January 6. Final results confirming the two suspected cases are expected later this week. The two adult female deer were killed within a mile of the first two positive

This latest discovery will prompt the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to consider removing more deer to better assess the disease's prevalence.

"We won't make any final decisions until after January 15 when the special hunt concludes," said Lou Cornicelli, DNR wildlife research manager. "But with the discovery of an infected deer five miles north of Preston and these two new presumptive positive deer, it's prudent that we increase our original surveillance goal of sampling 900 adult deer."

A higher surveillance goal also results in more potentially infected deer being removed from the population, which helps to reduce CWD's spread.

Confirmation of the new cases would bring the total number of current CWD-positive deer to five. Until now, the only other wild deer with the disease found in Minnesota was harvested near Pine Island in 2010.

Through January 7, hunters killed about 575 deer in southeastern Minnesota's disease management zone. Test results have been received for 272 of 430 samples, which include

the two new discoveries.

Additional efforts to address CWD are in full swing in the 371-square mile disease management area centered around Preston.

The DNR began a series of meetings with landowners to issue deer shooting permits that become effective Monday, January 16; a five-county deer feeding ban is in place; and an aerial survey to determine deer population and density in the area now is complete.

"Our best chance at containing the spread of CWD and hopefully eliminating the disease is to take quick and aggressive action," Cornicelli said. "Asking landowners and hunters to reduce the deer population helps minimize the spread of disease. Fewer

deer means less deer-to-deer contact occurs, lowering the risk of sick deer transmitting CWD to healthy deer."

Results of the aerial deer population survey estimate that there are 11,600 deer in an area that includes the disease management zone and an area to the north where the third CWD-positive deer was discovered. Population estimates show a higher density of animals within a 12 square-mile radius of the site near Preston where the first CWD-positive deer was discovered.

"The aerial survey tells us where deer are as well as where they are more likely to congregate," Cornicelli said. "Knowing that helps us determine, if more deer need to be removed in certain areas to

better reduce potential spread of the disease."

So far, the DNR has issued about 115 landowner shooting permits. The permits become effective Monday, January 16, the day after the special hunt concludes. They allow landowners and their designees to shoot deer on their property so DNR hopefully can reach its disease sampling goal.

A ban prohibiting the feeding of wild deer in a larger area that includes all of Fillmore, Houston, Mower, Olmsted and Winona counties is in effect as part of the DNR's comprehensive long-term disease management strategy.

"The purpose of the ban is to reduce the potential for the disease to spread from deer-todeer by reducing the number

of deer concentration sites," Cornicelli said. "The disease can spread from one deer to another following nose-tonose contact, contact with saliva or other body fluids. By eliminating deer feeding sites where that easily can occur, we reduce potential for the disease to spread."

The deer feeding ban makes it illegal to place or have food capable of attracting wild deer. This includes salt/mineral blocks and deer attractants. People who feed birds or small mammals must do so in a manner that precludes access to deer or place the food at least six feet above ground level.

"We recognize that people enjoy feeding wildlife," Cornicelli said. "Those who do so must place the feed so deer can't access it."

Food placed as a result of normal agricultural practices is generally exempted from this rule. But cattle operators should take steps that minimize contact between deer and cattle.


CWD is a fatal brain disease to deer, elk and moose but is not known to affect human health. Prior to the five recent discoveries, the only other wild deer with the disease found in Minnesota was harvested near Pine Island in 2010.



**Library report** Jessie F. Hallett Memorial Library Head Librarian Peggi Beeres gave a report on the Library. Jingle Books raised over \$16,600 to help defray the book budget for 2017. Story Hour 2016 was held 38 times with a total attendance of 1,893. This popular early literacy program was recently awarded a \$500 grant from the Mille Lacs Energy Cooperative for programming to be offered in 2017. IU2U (It's Up to YOU!") will focus on tweens (ages 8-12) during 2017. A new make and do creative zone called JUNCTION 101 will open in March at the Library. Hot Reads began on January 3, 2017. In the first 2 days, over 20 adult readers signed up. And at the meeting it was indicated there were 40 so far. There is traditionally approx. 60+ participants. This popular program is sponsored by the JFHML Friends. Some stats for 2016 include 26,329 people walked through the doors of the Library. With over 36,774 books, e-books, audiobooks, DVDs and magazines checked out. 5,800 people used on of the nine computer lab PC's available in the Le Connection area. JFHML offers eight i-pads for in-house usage, two laptops and two DELL tablets for teens in the Curbside area and two Leap Pads for preschoolers. One thousand and eighty-five new materials were entered into the computer catalog system and 3,206 were deleted from that system.

Beeres said the library strives to keep current, up-to-date resources and provide the latest in fiction and non-fiction reading materials. Included in the collection are all genres for all ages. She said the JFHML houses 43,000 volumes in the library (this statistic includes all formats i.e. books. Large Print, CDs, DVDs, audiobooks, etc.)

2,600 e-book titles are now available for downloading through the Overdrive App. This collection is made possible with contributions from the \$36,750 Technology and Literacy grant from the Otto Bremer Foundation (received in 2012), a partnership with C-I School District #182, and continued support from the Friends Foundation and funds raised during the annual Jingle Books campaign. In 2016, 3,775 e-books were downloaded and enjoyed! Subscriptions to 108 periodicals are on hand and eight local, state and national newspapers are enjoyed by patrons daily. Over 400, were assisted with their taxes by on-site Tax Help provided by AARP and RSVP. This program will be offered again beginning February 1. She said appointments are required and those interested should call the library at 218-546-8005 to schedule. She said that this year starts the 39th year of service for the library. Resolution. Mayor Hunter asked the Lieutenant about the police car that was parked outside. Randolph explained the status of the 2003 Police car that self combusted this past summer. He said they were reviewing the best financial option between turning in an insurance

claim or just sell it "as is". **Public works** 

Mayor Hunter brought up the topic of the street sweeper needing major repairs. Hunter asked Sova to check with somebody at the city garage if they were going to fix it - what it would cost to fix it before summer comes.

Heglund indicated he was on the Public Works committee and he would go find out the status of the sweeper.

With the retirement of Steve Perpich as Public Works Foreman on Tuesday, January 10, Mayor Hunter asked Sova what the posting proceedure.

Sova said it would go the Personnel Committee for review of the job description. They would make changes that are appropriate. Then the description would be run by the Human Resources Attorney. The council would then be asked for permission to post the position. Hunter asked the Personnel Committee to get that done as soon as they can.

Council approved giving check signing authority to Mayor Hunter.

Sova reminded everyone that the city offices will be closed on Monday, January 16 for Martin Luther King Day. Perpich retirement party

There will be a celebration at City Hall council chambers for Steve Perpich retiring Public Works Foreman on Thursday, January 19 from 2-4 p.m.

Mayor Hunter brought up the topic of city insurance, if it should be up for bids every two years. Hunter asked Sova to check to see if it needed to be bid and let the council know by the next meeting.

#### Desk and cabinet for mayor Mayor Hunter requested a

work space to keep his paperwork organized in a locked file cabinet at City Hall. He estimated he would probably be there around five hours per week.

Heglund said he wasn't in favor of the new office at City Hall. According to Heglund,

he worked for Crosby for over 40 years and during that time, none of Crosby mayors needed an office. Heglund suggested, if Hunter would get an office, it could be in the License Center Building.

Crosby resident, John Radinovich, felt the Police Department or Cemetery private meeting area were a higher priority. Another option would be get a locking file cabinet and desk and put it in the council chambers.

Heglund said he felt having Mayor Hunter's office at City Hall was a conflict of interest.

"I am talking about keeping the material that I have confidential and in a place where it would easily accessible," said Hunter.

Hunter said he was not concerned about having a space or office that could accommodate confidential meetings.

"I can have a meeting basicly anywhere, with anybody at anytime," he said. "I am just more concerned about a place to keep things organized... and if something happens to me tomorrow, it would still be here in city hall, it wouldn't be at my house."

City of Tromald Mayor Jim Hiller said "I can remember when Joanne (former mayor) used to come in and she had her arms full of stuff at every meeting. I can see where you'd want something to keep your stuff here. I felt sorry for her..."

Former Crosby Mayor Lattery said, "I also have a locked file cabinet at home. I brought what I needed for that meeting."

After some discussion, Traylor motioned to allow Hunter to establish an open air office in the council chambers. The motion died due to a lack of a second.

Goshey indicated he would like to see a plan and agreement for use of the space before he would agree to it.

Lattery suggested Hunter get a couple of locked file cabinets and put them in the council chambers and use the table

Hunter would like permission from the council to conduct a study of all city departments. Hunter explained he would like to look at the departments staffing, then bring it to a professional firm for further review.

Traylor said, "Shouldn't the Mayor be able to talk to the Department Heads?"

Goshey said, "I don't think you need permission for that."

Hunter said, "Well, I've already got in trouble for talking, so [I thought] maybe I'd ask permission this time and the council would be okay with it."

Lattery said, "So you don't want to look at personnel files?"

Hunter responded, "No." Hunter indicated most people don't know how many actual man hours are involved in running the different departments of the city. Hunter was interested in cross-training programs for City Street Crew employees.

Former Councilman Dusty Paul asked about the Water Plant license training as a backup person. Heglund indicated he has been saying for two years they should have some backups trained for the water plant.

test are in March. Sova was instructed to contact the three employees that had signed up and remind them to take the test, if they are still interested.

Mayor of Tromald Jim Hiller indicated they were looking for someone to replace their licensed water person and would probably consider sharing somebody with Crosby.

Sova suggested she would look into a firm and do a study to review and recommend department improvements including cross training. Can you hear me now?

Again, John Radinovich indicated he would like to see the microphones get fixed, so the audience could hear better.

Hunter suggested they get wireless clip-on microphones and improve meeting enhancements for the hearing impaired.

Goshey (an electrician by trade) indicated he would look into it.
