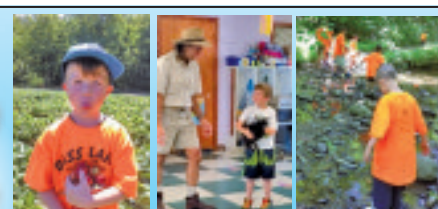

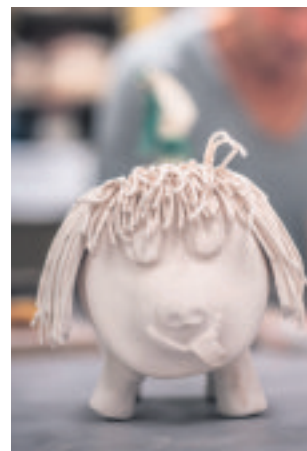

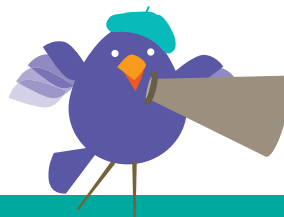

Graham Lane was named as a Regeneron Science Talent Search Scholar for his original scientific research over the last three years. Graham was one of 300 students nationwide to receive the semifinalist award, one of the highest honors a high school student can receive in science.

Graham's scientific research is on how chemotherapies initiate the immune response. His research was done under the guidance of Dr. George Dubyak at Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine, and is part of University School's Strnad Fellowship and Anderson Science Scholars programs.

"The opportunity to work in a lab setting through the Anderson Scholars program has prepared and inspired me for a research career," Graham said. "It has also made clear to me that through research I can make a positive impact on society."

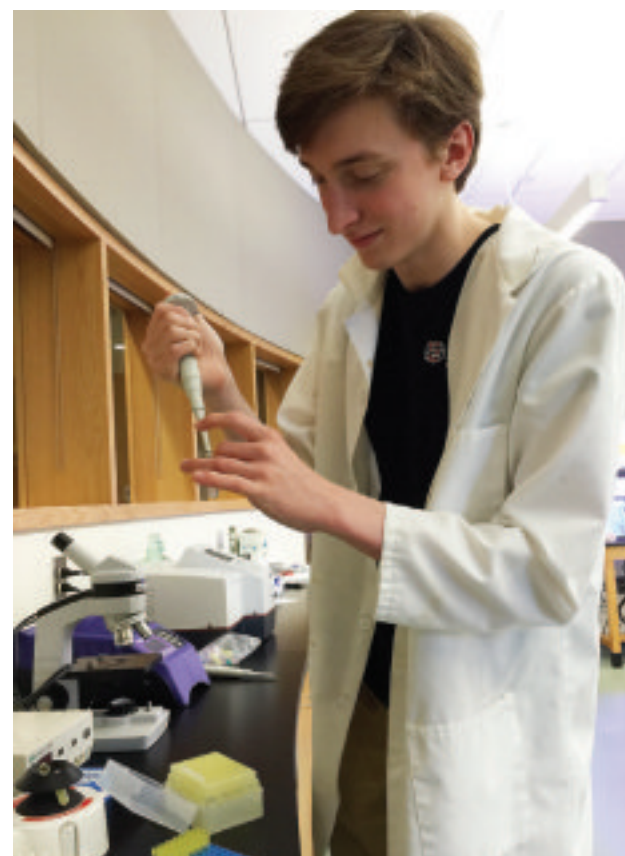
The Regeneron Science Talent Search, formerly known as the Intel and Westinghouse science talent searches, is a program of the Society for Science & the Public, which recognizes and empowers the most promising young scientists in the U.S. who are creating the ideas and solutions that solve the country's most urgent challenges.

"I am so incredibly proud of Graham for his

dedication to his research and his unwavering devotion to science," said his advisor Dr. Sara Laux, director of Science Research at US. "This is a well-deserved award!"

Graham has received additional awards for his research. Last April, he won the Ohio Junior Science & Humanities Symposium and joined 98 finalists from around the country at the National Junior Science & Humanities Symposium to compete for military-sponsored scholarships. This past fall Graham presented his research at the Ohio Academy of Science's annual meeting and was named a Melvin Scholar. He will represent Ohio, along with two other US students, at the National American Junior Academy of Science to be held in Boston in the spring.

Each Regeneron scholar receives a \$2,000 award with an additional \$2,000 going to his school, resulting in \$1.2 million in total semifinalist awards aimed at inspiring more young people to engage in science. The competition overall awards \$3.1 million to provide the opportunities and resources that students need to become the next generation of inventors, entrepreneurs, and STEM leaders. Forty finalists will be announced on Jan. 24.
