This meaning implies that "contentment" has to do with the state of mind.


Biblical usage of the word in Philippians 4:11 "content" means: (1) Sufficient for one's self, strong enough or possessing enough to need no aid or support. (2) Independent of external circumstances (3) Contented with one's lot, with one's means, though the slenderest. Often times our views of not having material possessions robs peace, joy and contentment. We tell ourselves "If I could just get a new car, a bigger house, a better job, money, certain type of relationships, relocate to a different place to live, then I'll be happy." We tend to view happiness as a commodity attainable by wealth. However, as the old saying goes, "money cannot buy happiness."

Most times it is not our circumstances that are robbing us, but our attitude during our circumstances. Paul said, in Philippians 4:11-12, "I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want."

Paul is saying that he could be content—that is, have joy—regardless of his circumstances. Joy should not be dependent on circumstances; it should be present regardless of them. In 2 Corinthians 11:24-27 you can read about some really tough times in Paul's life. Even in all these things, Paul had "learned to be content." Clearly, it's not our circumstances that steal our joy.

So my friends, don't postpone joy, thinking that you need material things to be happy. If you're not content with what you have, you won't be content with what you want.

Psalm 16:11 reads," You will show me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; In Your right hand there are pleasures forevermore."



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



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
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ne day a professor entered his classroom, and asked his students to prepare for a surprise test. They all waited anxiously at their desk for the exam to begin.

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
