City of Deerwood and Police Chief, of over 20 years, Harry Gottsch. Aulie indicated that Gottsch's vacation pay, calculated based on the date of the separation, was about \$2,100. He said there was about \$17,600 sick pay and four months health insurance benefits (February, March, April and May) that would be paid by the city or about \$4,800. The total amount would be about \$24,500.

The separation agreement would allow 100 percent of the sick pay, instead of the usual 50 percent; and the agreement allowed for four months of health insurance premiums paid for by the City of Deerwood. Gottsch's contract would have expired end of December 2017, before this agreement.

Rick Stirewalt, a resident, asked, how many days of sick leave did Harry have? According to Sgt. Mark Taylor it accumulates at eight hours per month with a maximum of 960 accumulated hours.

Aulie indicated, if the City of Deerwood Council agreed to the terms of the Gottsch's separation agreement, there would be an estimated cost savings to the city due to the reduction in salary amount for the interim police chief compared to Gottsch's salary. This cost savings allowed this agreement to be approved. Council Member Millsop made the motion to accept Gottsch's separation agreement with Leonard seconding. Council unanimously approved this motion.

Sgt. Mark Taylor was recommended to succeed Gottsch by Mayor Aulie.

Sgt. Mark Taylor said, "Harry and I had been in discussion for a week or so. He said that he was thinking of retiring, so I kind of knew it was coming.
