Seductive Salmon an Affair of the Heart

for Valentine's Day. Cooking is one of the ways I show my love for my sweet husband, Michael. We've been married for over 40 years, so I've had plenty of opportunities to create romantic meals, from breakfast in bed to late-night fireside suppers. What better time to prepare a heart-healthy meal than on the one day of the year that celebrates matters of the heart -Valentine's Day?

Roasted Salmon With Pomegranate Butter Sauce is a delicious way to make a special day even more memorable while providing the gift of good health. Salmon is low in mercury and high in omega-3 fatty acids. While 80 percent of all of the salmon sold is farm-raised, wild salmon is the best option. Eating two to three servings per week of foods rich in omega-3 is a healthy choice.

If you've never roasted salmon, get ready for a treat, as the heat from the oven seals in the flavor of the salmon much better than moist-heat methods like poaching or steaming. The pomegranate butter sauce is what makes this dish so deliciously unique, as the flavor of the pomegranate juice marries beautifully with the salmon. I've adapted this recipe from author Rick Rodgers' cookbook, "Autumn Gatherings: Casual Food to Enjoy With Family and Friends" (Morrow Cookbooks)

ROASTED SALMON WITH POMEGRANATE BUTTER SAUCE

The pomegranate butter sauce is a red variation of the classic French "beurre blanc," which literally trans-lated means "white butter." One important tip: Slowly incorporate the butter over very low heat so it softens into a creamy emulsion with the acidic base. If the heat is too high, the butter will simply melt.

- 1. Heat oven to 400 F. Lightly oil a large, rimmed baking sheet.
 - Run your fingers over the cut side of the salmon, feeling for any pin bones. If necessary, pull out bones with sterilized tweezers. Season salmon on both sides with the salt and pepper. Place the salmon on baking sheet, flesh side up. Cut the salmon vertically into 6 equal portions, but do not separate the pieces. (This makes the salmon easier to serve after cooking.)
 - 3. Roast until the salmon shows just a hint of bright pink when prodded in the center of the fillet at one of the cuts with the tip of a knife, 12 to 15
 - 4. Meanwhile, make the butter sauce. Bring the pomegranate juice, balsamic vinegar, orange juice, honey, shallots, rosemary, salt and pepper to a boil in a non-reactive medium saucepan over high heat. Cook until liquid is reduced to 1/4 cup, about 8 minutes. Reduce heat to very low.
 - 5. Remove pan from heat and whisk in the tablespoon of butter. Whisk until the butter softens into a creamy texture, occasionally returning pan to the heat to keep it warm, but not hot. Repeat with the remaining butter, one tablespoon at a time. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Don't bother to try to keep the sauce piping hot; it will be heated by the warmth of the
 - 6. Remove skin and any fat from the salmon and discard. Serve the salmon on individual dinner plates, and spoon the sauce on top. Serve immediately. Makes 6 servings.







 $\operatorname{HOLLYWOOD} \longrightarrow \operatorname{\textbf{J.K. Simmons}}$ is the busiest supporting actor in Hollywood. At 62, he's made 80 films and starred in four TV series: "Oz" (1997-2003), "Law & Order" (1997-2010), "The Closer" (2005-2012) and his own NBC series, "Growing Up Fisher" (2014), playing a blind man. He's also the TV spokesman for Farmers Insurance. Then along came "Whiplash," for which he won the best-sup-porting actor Oscar. Now, in addition to Farmers Insur-

ance commercials and the current releases of "La La Land" and "Patriot's Day," Simmons has seven films awaiting release in 2017: "Renegades," with **Sullivan Stapleton** (of "Blindspot") and Charlie Bewley (vampire Demetri in "The Twilight" saga), out Feb. 3; "All Nighter" (top billed), with Emile Hirsch, opening March 17; "The Snowman," with Michael Fassbender, out Oct. 13; "The Justice League,' coming Nov. 17; and "The Bachelors' (top-billed), as well as "Bastards," with **Owen Wilson** and **Glenn Close**; and "I'm Not Here" (top-billed), with **Sebastian Stan** ("Captain America") and Mandy Moore. Simmons has been married for 20 years to Michelle Schumacher and has two children.

Debbie Reynolds (who died Dec. 28) was one of the last stars of The Golden Age of MGM musicals. "That's Entertainment" (1974) and the sequels "2" (1976) and "3" (1994) paid tribute to the glorious musicals of MGM. I knew her very well, and she was a handful, always wanting to run the show, but worth the trouble because she knew her stuff.

Debbie was only 19 when she starred with Gene Kelly and Donald O'Conmer in the 1952 classic "Singin' in the Rain." Some of her other great films were: "The Tender Trap" (1955), with Frank Sinatra; "Tammy and the Bachelor" (1957); "The Rat Race" (1960), with Tony Curtis; and "The Unsinkable, Molly Brown" which Unsinkable Molly Brown," which

earned her a best-actress Oscar nomi-"The Singing Nun" (1966) and nation. "In and Out" (1997), with **Tom Sell-eck**, were two of her best later films. Her last film was playing Liberace's mother with **Michael Douglas** in HBO's "Behind the Candelabra."





Bake Valentine's Sugar Cookies

Make a special memory with preschoolers this winter ... bake cookies! If you didn't get around to cookie baking and decorating over the December holidays, Valentine's Day — with its hearts in all shapes and sizes — might be the perfect (and a more relaxing) time of year to get your hands in the dough.

dough.

This easy sugar cookie recipe uses powdered sugar rather than granulated sugar in the dough, producing a meltin-your-mouth cookie. It's a family favorite whether we eat them plain or decorated with a few swirls of icing.

VALENTINE SUGAR COOKIES

- (Makes 5 dozen cookies)
 cup unsalted butter, room temperature
- cup powdered sugar, plus more for rolling
- 1 large egg 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract 1 teaspoon almond extract
- 2½ cups all-purpose flour 1/2 teaspoon salt Granulated sugar (optional)
- Granulated sugar (optional, Assorted candies, sprinkles or icing for decorating (optional)

1. Cream the butter in the bowl of an electric mixer. Add the powdered sugar and start the machine slowly; when the sugar has been incorporated, turn up speed and beat until light and fluffy. Blend in egg, vanilla and almond extract.

2. In another bowl, sift together the flour and salt; add it gradually to the batter. Mix on low until dough comes

together. Divide the dough in half, shape into flat disks, cover and chill at least 1 hour.

least 1 hour.

3. Heat oven to 375 F. Line baking sheets with parchment. Remove one dough disk from the refrigerator, roll out 1/8 inch thick on a board dusted with powdered sugar, and cut with a 2-1/2-inch heart-shaped cookie cutter. (If dough sticks to it, dip in flour, shake off excess, then cut dough). Place the hearts on prepared baking sheets. Repeat with second disk.

4. Sprinkle hearts with granulated sugar, if you wish.5. Bake 8-10 minutes or until very

light brown on edges. Cool on wire racks before serving or decorating.



Makes 5 dozen 2-1/2-inch heart-shaped cookies.

Tip for young bakers: Collect vintage cookie cutters with small handles on top to make it easier to cut dough.



When Should Your Child Visit The Orthodontist?

(NAPS)-While there's no "exact age" for a child to begin orthodontic treatment, there are a few things to consider.

Suggests Dr. DeWayne B. Church Sale Treasure

• I purchased a vase at a church • sale that is signed "Geo E Ohr, Biloxi, Miss." It has a glossy blue-ish glaze and a twisted design. I can't find the pottery maker in any of the reference books I have and hope you'll be able to help me. I paid \$75 for it. — Roslyn, Memphis, Tennes-

George E. Orr opened his pot-• tery studio in Biloxi during the late 1870s. In 1884, he exhibited 600 pieces of his work and attracted a great deal of attention, due in no small part to his unusual glazes and designs.

His techniques included twisting, folding and crinkling small pieces of thin-walled clay into odd and often innovative forms. In 1906, he closed his studio and stored several thousand pieces, which were re-discovered in 1972. Needless to say, his work is both rare and collectible. I contacted several experts and they seem to agree that your vase could be worth as much as \$2,000, perhaps much more. Your \$75 investment was a good one.

• Although I don't collect, I read your column frequently. I am fascinated by the variety of questions you answer, and I wonder if you ever get ones you can't. -Will, Palm Springs, California





• On Feb. 16, 1894, gunslinger John Wesley Hardin is pardoned after spending 15 years in a Texas prison for murder. Hardin was reputed to have shot and killed a man just for snoring and had probably killed at least 40 people.

• On Feb. 17, 1904, Giacomo Puccini's opera "Madame Butterfly" premieres in Milan, Italy. The audience responded with hissing and yelling. Four months later, a reworked "Madame Butterfly" opened to applause, repeated encores and 10 curtain calls.

• On Feb. 15, 1965, a new Canadian national flag is raised in the capital of Ottawa. In 1964, the Canadian Parliament had voted to adopt a new design, a white background with a stylized 11-point red maple leaf in its center.

• On Feb. 18, 2001, NASCAR driver Dale Earnhardt Sr. dies at age of 49 in a last-lap crash at the Daytona 500. While vying for third place in his famous black No. 3 Chevrolet, Earnhardt collided with another car, then crashed into a wall.
