

A round, scented fruit follows the coral flowers.

This time of year is often uncertain for weather. It's also uncertain as to one's outdoor work which in earlier generations in America, could affect an entire family's health, food supply and livelihood. Persons too ill or aged to get around were often victims of the cruel late-winter's cold and wet when pneumonia was (and still is) a killer of the infirm. Loneliness during the dark days and long nights added to their load. This poem by Robert Frost was included in his Mountain Interval, a collection of poems concerned with human tragedy and fear, and his reaction to the complexities of life and the ultimate acceptance of one's burdens. An Old Man's Winter Night was published in New York in 1920.

An Old Man's Winter Night

All out of doors looked darkly in at him Through the thin frost, almost in separate stars, That gathers on the pane in empty rooms. What kept his eyes from giving back the gaze Was the lamp tilted near them in his hand. What kept him from remembering what it was That brought him to that creaking room was age. He stood with barrels round him—at a loss. And having scared the cellar under him In clomping there, he scared it once again In clomping off, and scared the outer night, Which has its sounds, familiar, like the roar Of trees and crack of branches, common things, But nothing so like beating on a box. A light he was to no one but himself Where now he sat, concerned with he knew what, A quiet light, and then not even that. consigned to the moon,—such as she wa So late-arising, to the broken moon As better than the sun in any case For such a charge, his snow upon the roof, His icicles along the wall to keep; And slept. The log that shifted with a jolt Once in the stove, disturbed him and he shifted, And eased his heavy breathing, but still slept. One aged man—one man—can't fill a house, A farm, a countryside, or if he can, It's thus he does it of a winter night.



Dr. Paul Bennett of Sulphur Springs was an Army dentist in Viet Nam. Occasionally he worked on civilians. Just a few weeks before leaving Viet Nam, he had a Vietnamese civilian as a patient. Her name was Thuan.

"I met him in 1972," says Thuan. "It was at a hospital in Saigon. He worked on my teeth." Both found each other fascinating and they had a couple of meals to-

gether. They became friends. Paul left Viet Nam in 1972, but brought memories of Thuan home with him.

"I really couldn't get my mind off this lovely young lady I met just before I left Viet Nam," says Paul, who established a dental practice in Sulphur Springs after leaving the Army. "I dated, but couldn't get serious about anybody because I was thinking of Thuan."

Thuan had worked for some American companies in Viet Nam and came to the US in 1975. "When I stepped on American soil for the first time, that was the happiest day of my life," she says. She got a job with a bank in California.

"I couldn't get this man off my mind," says Thuan. "I thought about him all the time for years. I decided to try to find him and one of my friends told me that I could look him up through the American Dental Association. So that's what I did."

Paul said he had a call one day his office. "My receptionist told me there was a call from someone named Thuan. I never even knew that she got out alive. I talked to her and she said she would be flying to Phoenix. I told her that if she would go on and fly to Dallas I would take her out to dinner and we could get caught up on each other. So when she walked off the airplane I said 'I lost you one time I'm not going to lose you again."

They were married three months later and last year celebrated their 38th wedding anniversary.

"We had a connection," says Thuan. "I knew I was in love with him. He didn't know it because I didn't tell him. And he was in love with me and never told me. Then six years later we met and the feelings were still there. He could never forget about me and I could never forget about him."

Thuan thinks she's very fortunate. "When I moved here, the people were very kind to me. They immediately accepted me. I got my realtor's license and went to work selling real estate and helping Paul in his office. I got to know many people. When we retired, I got invited to join all sorts of clubs and organizations."

"We think we're very blessed," says Paul.


