

Racing To Bed For Better Performance World-Class Triathletes Incorporate Sleep In Daily Training Regime

In addition to prioritizing eight hours of shut-eye at night, Jorgensen schedules naps into her triathlon training plan to ensure her body is recovering properly. "I nap 30 minutes or less, six times a week," she explained.

Jorgensen also loves the biometric sleep data provided by SleepIQ® technology, which is integrated into her Sleep Number bed. "I am so intrigued that my bed can track my sleep; not only do I know my bio-

Cooking Corner

Time-Saving Slow Cooking

(NAPSA)-On those busy days when you don't have much time, a slow cooker can be the solution to getting a hot, wholesome meal on the table. Simply add all the ingredients in the morning, turn on the device, and you get to come home to a wholesome, hot meal, especially good on chilly days.

So many recipes, especially ones for slow cookers, soups, stews, and roasts call for an onion. That is because onions stand up to slow cooking and enhance the flavor of everything cooked with them.

Onions are one of the most versatile vegetables. Use these tips for buying and storing them.

Choose onions with dry outer skins, free of spots or blemishes. They should be firm and have no scent. Avoid bulbs that have begun to sprout. Not sure what color to use?

Really, you can use all three any way you like, but these guidelines

Yellow onions are all-purpose, great raw or cooked. Most wellknown sweet onions are yellow. Red onions are best for roasting or grilling. White onions are commonly used in Mexican and Italian cuisine, prepared salads, and

Whole, unpeeled, onions should be stored in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place, out of direct sunlight. Lack of air circulation will reduce their storage life. Do not store with potatoes. Cut onions should be refriger-

ated and can be stored in a sealed container for up to 7 days. Here's a recipe that will appeal

to both children and adults: It's a fresh take on classic onion soup that combines onions with apples

Slow Cooker French Onion Country Apple Soup with Cinnamon Cheese Toast Serves 4–6

¼ cup olive oil 4 large yellow onions, thinly

- sliced into rings
- 3 apples, peeled and diced 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose
- flour 5 cups low-sodium beef
- broth



try Apple Soup with Cinnamon Cheese Toast can make for a great hot meal on a cold night when vou don't have time to cook.

- ½ cup apple cider 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon brown sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt ¼ teaspoon dried thyme ½ teaspoon black pepper,
- freshly ground 6 slices French bread, cut
- ½–¾-inch thick
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1½ cups hickory-smoked Gruyère cheese, shredded 6 slices turkey bacon,

cooked and crumbled (optional)

Heat oil in a large skillet.

Add onion slices and cook on medium heat until transparent, stirring frequently to avoid sticking. Add apples and garlic; stir until warmed through. Transfer the onionapple mixture to a slow cooker and add in beef broth, apple cider, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar, salt, thyme and black pepper. Cook on low for 6-8 hours. Before serving, place French bread slices on a baking sheet. Top each with ¼ cup Gruyère cheese, sprinkle lightly with cinnamon and broil for 1-2 minutes, until just browned. Garnish soup with turkey bacon crumbles and apple slices. Serve bread alongside each bowl of soup.

How To Pick A Tax Professional

(NAPSA)—If you're like most taxpayers, according to the IRS, you hire a professional to help you file your tax return—after all, a mistake could mean fines, penalties, even prison. If you do hire one, you should know that no matter who prepares the form, you are legally responsible for what's on it.

Eight Hints On Tax Help Here are eight tips to keep in mind when choosing a tax preparer:

1. Check to be sure the preparer has an IRS Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN). Anyone with a valid 2015 PTIN is authorized to prepare federal tax returns.

2. Find out the fees up front.

Avoid preparers who base theirs on a percentage of your refund or who say they can get larger refunds than others can.

3.Always make sure any refund due is sent to you or deposited into your bank account, not the preparer's.

4. Be sure your preparer offers IRS e-file and ask that your return be submitted to the IRS electronically. Any tax professional who gets paid to prepare and file more than 10 returns generally must file the returns electronically. It's the safest and most accurate way to file a return, whether you do it alone or pay someone to prepare and file for you.

5. Make sure the preparer will be available. You should be able to contact the tax preparer after you file your return—even after the April 18 due date. This may be helpful in the event questions come up about your tax return.

6.Good preparers will ask to see your records and receipts. They'll ask you questions to determine your total income, deductions, tax credits and other items. Don't rely on a preparer who's willing to e-file your return using your last pay stub instead of your

7. Don't use a tax preparer who asks you to sign an incomplete or blank tax form.

8. Ask the tax preparer if he or

she is an enrolled agent (EA), belongs to a professional organization or attends continuing education classes. A number of tax law changes can be complex. A competent tax professional needs to be up-to-date in these matters. EAs are the only federally licensed tax practitioners who specialize in taxes and have unlimited rights to represent taxpayers before the IRS. Individuals who obtain this elite status must adhere to ethical

standards and complete 72 hours

of continuing education every

the National Association of En-

rolled Agents (NAEA).





New Ways to Use Grapefruit

It's grapefruit season, and my home state of Texas has a bountiful crop of the bittersweet fruit featuring white, pink and red varieties. Pink and red grapefruit get their rosy blush from lycopene, the same antioxidant found in tomatoes. The numerous varieties

available include Ruby Red, Flame, Thompson, Pink. White Marsh, Star Ruby, Duncan and Pummelo HB.

Grapefruits are one of the only citrus strains that came from the West Indies, not Southeast Asia. Grapefruit is a hybrid of a pummelo (citrus grandis) and the sweet orange (citrus sinensis). In 1823, grapefruit made its way to the United States in the form of seeds brought by either Spanish or French settlers to Florida. It is believed that grapefruit were brought to South Texas by visiting

Spanish missionaries. Grapefruit gets its name because the fruit grows in bunches, like grapes.

Grapefruit-growing season lasts from October through May; however, since they keep so well in cold storage, you can find grapefruit in stores year-round. With good air circulation, grapefruit will keep at room temperature for a week when stored in a bowl or basket. If you place grapefruit in an airtight bag in the refrigerator's crisper drawer, it can be stored for up to two months. For the juiciest grapefruit, choose one that has a red blushed skin and feels heavy for its size, with smooth, rather than bumpy,

Besides being a delicious treat, eating grapefruit has numerous health benefits. Grapefruit is an excellent source of vitamins A and C, is low

in calories and does not significantly affect blood sugar and insulin levels. Grapefruit also is a power-packed combination of fiber, potassium, lycopene, vitamin C and choline, all of which help to maintain a healthy heart and prevent against developing

Since grapefruits are made up of 91 percent water and electrolytes, it is a delicious way to prevent dehydration. Drinking grapefruit juice mixed with warm water and honey is a good way to soothe a sore throat and reduce fits of coughing.

Grapefruit can be used in place of oranges or lemons in most dishes that use citrus. My recipes for Texas Grapefruit Tea, and Spicy Shrimp with Grapefruit and Fennel Sauce are two tasty ways to incorporate grapefruit into your daily diet!

¹/₈ − ¹/₄ teaspoon red pepper flakes small head fennel, sliced thin, reserve top green fronds teaspoon salt teaspoon freshly ground pep-1/2 small sweet onion, finely minced

> cup chicken or vegetable stock cup fresh squeezed grapefruit juice

tablespoons chopped herbs (flat-leaf parsley, chives, tarragon) or green onions

clove garlic, minced

tablespoon capers

pound medium shrimp,

peeled and deveined with

cup extra-virgin olive oil,

plus 2 tablespoons for shrimp

1. Peel the grapefruit, remove segments and set them aside. Squeeze remaining juice out of the grapefruit into a cup or a bowl and set aside for the sauce

2. Combine shrimp, the 2 tablespoons of olive oil and the red pepper flakes in a small bowl and set aside.

3. In a 12- to 14-inch saute pan, heat olive oil over medium heat until just smoking. Add shrimp, fennel, salt and pepper, and cook until fennel is tender, about 2 minutes. Add the onion, garlic, and capers, and stir for 1 minute.

4. Add in the broth and grapefruit juice, scraping the bottom of the pan to incorporate any of the brown bits on the bottom. Add the grapefruit segments, herbs or green onion mixture. Cook until shrimp is opaque and slightly white and turns slightly pink near the tail. Garnish with fennel fronds. Serves 4.

Statins Can Cause Loss of Memory

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have been taking Lipitor for high cholesterol. Lately, my pharmacist said that all statins can cause memory loss. I hesitate to stop taking Lipitor, but I don't want this side effect. Please

ANSWER: Your pharmacist is quite right that some users of statins can have the unwanted side effect of memory loss. This is quite variable: Some people never get this effect, and it can be quite severe in a few. It appears to be reversible in the majority of people who get it. I wouldn't recommend stopping unless you are having the

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have chronic constipation, and have had it most of my life. I have used most of the bulking (husk) things that are out there. Nothing works. Years ago, I went to my doctor, and he said that I could take MiraLAX and use it for the rest of my life. It has worked! Now my new doctor wants me off of it, and wants me to incorporate fiber into my diet. I already do this. Plus I drink a lot of water. I start my day with a 24 ounces of water every morning before anything else. Is there anything wrong with taking MiraLAX every day? I do not take the full dose. - V.B.

ANSWER: While I recommend nondrug treatments, such as increased water intake, high-fiber diet and exercise as treatment for constipation, that doesn't work for everybody. In that case, using a medication as recom-

fortably hard.

DEAR DR. ROACH: Have you ever heard of someone with sleep apnea outgrowing the need of a breathing aid, such as CPAP? —

ANSWER: Most cases of sleep apnea are due to obstruction of the airway, caused by the relaxation of muscles in the back of the throat. Excess weight and obesity are the major risk factors for sleep apnea, but it can happen in normal-weight people. It is more common in older people, and men are at higher risk than women.

Almost any condition can go away by itself, but in nearly every case of obstructive sleep apnea getting better without a specific treatment that I have seen, it has been associated with significant weight loss. It doesn't have to be extreme weight loss. Since alcohol can make sleep apnea worse, stopping alcohol occasionally is enough to get it under control.

I also recently mentioned singing exercises as a therapy for OSA, in addition to oral devices, CPAP or BiPAP devices, and surgery.





Low-Calorie Sweeteners **And Weight Loss** $by\ Robyn\ Flipse,\ MS,\ MA,\ RDN$

(NAPSA)—Here's good news for many people who fear they have a slim chance of getting and staying trim: Research by Adam Drewnowski and Colin Rehm at the University of Washington found regular users of low-calorie sweeteners have better diets than nonusers.

Since other research reported an association between low-calorie sweeteners and obesity, Drewnowski and Rehm wanted to know "What came first, the weight gain or the use of low-calo-



Researchers found that people who are trying to lose or maintain weight are much more likely to use low-calorie sweeteners.

They went back 10 years to see

people's weight histories and their intent, or motivation, to lose weight. They found the use of lowcalorie sweeteners was common among people who experienced weight fluctuations and were trying to return to a lower weight. In fact, nearly a third of adults trying to lose or maintain weight used low-calorie sweetened products. As anyone who's lost weight

knows, it's easy to regain. When that starts to happen, there's a tendency to resume the strategies that helped before, such as using lowcalorie sweeteners. The low-calorie sweetener is selected after the problem, not the other way around. This suggests low-calorie sweet-

eners don't cause weight gain but are chosen to help reduce it. Since we now know low-calorie

sweeteners are deliberately chosen by individuals as a weight management strategy, as the experts at the Calorie Control Council point out, using low-calorie sweeteners in place of sugar is a simple step anyone can take to help reduce his or her caloric intake as part of a healthy lifestyle.

Getting Real About the Bathroom: Tips and Resources for Managing IBS-D

3. Open Up to Your Inner Circle: Although IBS-D can be difficult to talk about, it can be helpful to let your closest family members, friends and colleagues know what you're going through. In addition to relieving the burden and stress of keeping your diagnosis a secret, you'll be able to rely on them for support.

Charles Barkley has a big mouth, which is appropriate considering he also has a very large head. He used to get paid for bouncing a ball, but for the past 10 years he's gotten paid to break them as a game-day analyst for TNT.

Respected the game. Print that."

And that's exactly what we'll do. There's James' take on Barkley. James had every right to pursue championships in Miami. He has professional pride; he may become the all-time leading scorer, winner of championships ... who knows? He's certainly in the top 10. He has represented the NBA the right way. He was great with Amy Schumer in "Trainwreck." And why shouldn't he be concerned with Golden State returning with a vengeance - this

time with Kevin Durant in tow? Problem is, Barkley said nothing wrong. "The Decision" was a punk move. LeBron James isn't on the NBA's Mount Rushmore plus one, at least not yet. And Barkley was right, complimentary even, when he called him the "best player in the world."

James asked why Barkley is even relevant in today's game. The answer is because James, the King, deigned to get into a mudfight with a lowly "Sir," so quit your whining!
