Can An Aspirin A Day Keep The Doctor Away?

(NAPS)-Aspirin is a familiar over-the-counter medicine that reduces pain. Taking a low-dose or "baby" aspirin every day has long been recommended to people who have had a heart attack or stroke, so they can prevent another one. Evidence now shows that for people aged 50 to 69 at increased risk of cardiovascular disease, aspirin can help prevent a heart attack or stroke from happening in the first place and, if taken for five to 10 years, can also help prevent colorectal cancer. This is great news because

cardiovascular disease and cancer are major causes of death in the United States. Heart attacks and strokes are responsible for 30 percent of all deaths, and colorectal cancer is the third most common type of cancercausing 8.3 percent of all cancer deaths.

But just because aspirin is available over the counter doesn't mean it is safe for everyone to take on a daily basis. Aspirin can cause serious side effects, such as bleeding in the stomach and intestines, and strokes caused by bleeding in the brain. So daily aspirin is only recommended for people who are at increased risk of cardiovascular disease and who are not at increased risk for bleeding. You should not begin to take aspirin daily without speaking with your primary care clinician first. Who Should Take Aspirin for Primary Prevention?

The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (Task Force) found that how much a person can benefit from taking aspirin depends on his or her age and risk of cardiovascular disease. Daily use of lowdose aspirin is the most beneficial for people 50 to 59 years old who have at least a 10 percent chance of having a heart attack or stroke in the next 10 years. The



Daily aspirin can help some people prevent cardiovascular disease and colorectal cancer.

Task Force recommends that people in this group start taking aspirin after talking with their primary care clinician. People 60 to 69 years old

with increased cardiovascular disease risk can also benefit from taking aspirin, but because the risk of bleeding goes up with age, the overall benefit is smaller. Therefore, people in this group should make a decision with their primary care clinician about whether or not to take aspirin.

It is not clear whether taking aspirin is beneficial for people with increased risk of cardiovascular disease who are younger than 50 or older than 69. More research in this area is needed.

A number of factors go into determining a person's risk of cardiovascular disease, including age, sex, race, blood pressure level, total cholesterol level, and high-density lipoprotein (HDL) cholesterol level-also known as "good cholesterol." Whether a person has diabetes, smokes, or takes blood pressure medication can also affect his or her risk of cardiovascular disease. Talk to your primary care clinician if you are between 50 and 69 years old to determine your risk for cardiovascular disease and for bleeding, and to determine if taking a daily aspirin is right for you.

Other Ways to Reduce Your Risk

Everyone can reduce his or her risk of cardiovascular disease and colorectal cancer by quitting smoking, eating a healthy diet and being physically active. Keeping blood pressure and cholesterol under control can also help prevent cardiovascular disease. Regular screening remains an important part of preventing colorectal cancer. The Task Force currently recommends colorectal cancer screening for people 50 to 75 years old, and for some individuals between 76 and 85 years old.

Does Aspirin Prevent Other Cancers, Too?

There is growing evidence that aspirin may also help to prevent cancers other than colorectal cancer, such as cancers of the esophagus and stomach. However, the evidence on aspirin to prevent these cancers is still new and not yet strong enough to be part of a recommendation.

No group currently recommends that people take aspirin for the prevention of cancer only, even for people who are at increased risk of cancer. In order for the potential benefits of taking aspirin to outweigh the potential risks, a person must have increased risk of cardiovascular disease.

Recommendations to Protect Your Health

The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force is an independent group of national experts in primary care, prevention, and evidence-based medicine. The aim of the Task Force's work is to evaluate and identify critical preventive health services that a primary care clinician can perform.





Dinner Under Pressure

As a child, I remember coming into the kitchen and hearing my mother's pressure cooker rattling away. It sounded like a runaway steam engine had taken over the kitchen stove. I'd heard stories about pressure cookers blowing up and leaving what was supposed to be dinner all over the ceiling.

So I must admit, I was afraid to use the Fagor pressure cooker I received

as a gift, until I realized that modern pressure cookers have been completely redesigned. For example, my Fagor pressure cooker has three safety valves that allow any possible excess pressure to escape, so the cooking experience is completely secure.

The pressure cooker was created by French inventor Denis Papin in a normal pot. This speeds up the cooking process considerably. The intense pressure also reduces cooking time by one-third, which saves energy too. It also keeps your kitchen cool, retains more than 50 percent of the vitamins and minerals in your foods - as well as the natural colors — and can cook without oil to reduce fat and calories. The steam pressure breaks down the fibers in food in a very short time, leaving food moist and succulent, with an intense intermingling of flavors.

The beauty of using a pressure cooker is that you can quickly and easily turn almost any type of produce, grain or cut of meat into a fantastic meal. And don't forget about desserts, which can be made in half the time.

If you haven't used a pressure cooker before, my recipe for Pressure Cooker Quinoa Salad is a simple and tasty introduction to this wonderful piece of kitchen equipment.



cup black quinoa, rinsed well 1 teaspoon olive oil plus more 1 for drizzling (about 2 table spoons)

- teaspoon salt
- teaspoon ground black 1 pepper
- 1/2teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups of water or broth 1 large lime or lemon, zested
- and juiced $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups of chopped, raw vegetables (bell pepper, purple onion, celery, avocado, cucumbers, tomatoes, etc.)

1. Measure 1 cup of quinoa and place into a fine-mesh strainer. Rinse thoroughly with cool water for about 2 minutes, rubbing and swishing the quinoa with your hand. Drain.

2. Heat the olive oil in the pressure cooker pot (without the lid) over medium-high heat. Add the drained quinoa, salt, pepper, garlic powder and cayenne pepper. Cook, stirring, for about 1 minute to let the water evaporate and to toast the quinoa and the spices. Add the water or broth, mixing well.

3. Close and lock the lid according to manufacturer's instructions. Turn heat to high; when pressure is reached, lower the heat and cook for 1 minute at high pressure (or 2 minutes at low pressure). To release the pressure, turn off heat and wait 10 minutes for steam to release naturally. Then release the remaining pressure by carefully opening the valve. (Even if you hear the pressure releasing completely before the 10 minutes are up, do not remove the lid.)

1680. The clunky heavy metal pressure regulator of old that made so

much noise was the updated version of his original "marmite de Papin" or Papin Digestor. Fagor has created a sleek, easy-to-use pressure cooker with a temperature device built into the tight-fitting lid with a locking handle. When the lid is properly locked into place, an air- and steam-tight seal is created.

As the cooking liquid in the pressure cooker is heated to the boiling point (212 F), steam is created. Since the steam cannot escape from the sealed pot, intense pressure is created. The internal cooking temperature will vary depending on the different levels of pressure created by the trapped steam.

Foods cooked under high pressure reach a temperature of 250 F, which is 38 F hotter than when food is boiled in

PRESSURE COOKER QUINOA SALAD (Serves 6)

Quinoa is a complete protein source that also is high in iron, magnesium and fiber. It has a delicate, slightly sweet and nutty flavor, and easily can be used in any recipe that calls for rice or pasta.


Quinoa has a natural coating, called saponin. Saponin can make the cooked grain taste bitter if it isn't rinsed thoroughly just before cooking. Boxed quinoa is often pre-rinsed, but it's best to rinse it again. Toasting quinoa after it has been rinsed improves the texture of the grain. You can change this recipe to incorporate your favorite herbs, spices, vegetables and flavorings as desired.

4. When the time is up, remove the lid and fluff the quinoa gently with a fork. Toss quinoa with the zest, juice, vegetables and a drizzle of olive oil.





Keep Safety In Mind When Using Your Snow Thrower

(NAPS)—When snowflakes pile up, knowing how to use your snow thrower safely is an important responsibility.

"A snow thrower is indispensable during the winter for home and business owners," said Kris Kiser, the president and CEO of the Outdoor Power Equipment Institute (OPEI). "But remember, never put your hand in the auger or chute of a snow thrower to clear a blockage. You should always use a clean-out tool to remove snow or debris that gets stuck in your snow thrower."



er throw snow toward people or cars. Don't let anyone stand in front of your snow thrower.

Know your energy level. Excessive vibration, noise, emissions and uncomfortable positions may cause fatigue. Take frequent rests.

Know how to operate controls. Review safe handling procedures for equipment, including how to stop the snow thrower quickly and immediately. If you need to remove debris or unclog the chute, always turn off your snow thrower first.

Look over the owner's manual. Remember to review your owner's manual for safe handling procedures. Most manuals can be found online, too.

Clear pathways and driveways ahead of a storm. Heavy snowfall can hide objects that could clog the chute or damage your equipment. When snow is forecast, clear the area of doormats, sleds, boards, wires and other debris before flakes fall.

Have the right fuel on hand. Use the correct fuel recommended by your equipment's manufacturer. Buy fuel ahead

of a storm. And remember, it is illegal to use any fuel containing more than 10 percent ethanol in any outdoor power equipment, including snow throwers, unless specified for that equipment. For more on fueling properly, see www.LookBeforeYou Pump. com.

Store and use fuel properly.

Always store fuel in authorized containers. Avoid spills by using containers with spouts. Fill up the fuel tank outside and before you start the engine and while the engine is cold. Never add fuel to a running or hot engine.

Set up a safe work zone. Do not operate your snow thrower close to people and pets. Keep bystanders, children and animals out of your work area. NevEnsure safety guards are functioning. Never remove safety guards and always keep your equipment in good working order.

Never operate your snow thrower without good visibility or light. Keep a strong footing and firm hold on the handles. Wear safety glasses, warm clothing, and heavy footwear that can handle slippery surfaces. Eye, hearing or head protection gear may be needed.

Use extreme caution on slopes and hills. Do not attempt to clear steep slopes. Use caution when changing directions on slopes with your snow thrower.



Lights, Wipers: Keys To Seeing And Being Seen

(NAPS)—When the days get shorter, lights and wipers play a major role in safe driving, as the chance of an accident increases if you can't see or be seen.

"It's important to make sure your vehicle's lights and wipers are working properly so your visibility is not compromised and you can be seen by others," explained automotive expert Rich White. "From the driver's seat, you may not notice a light that isn't working, so inspect all of your car's lights and replace those that are out. Also, inspect and replace wiper blades so you can see clearly when wet weather hits."

Learn About Lights

Lights are normal-wear items that require periodic inspection and replacement. The lighting system provides nighttime visibility; signals and alerts other drivers; and supplies light for viewing instruments and the vehicle's interior. You should replace dimming, rapidly blinking and non-functioning lights. In addition, here are four tips that can help keep you safe.

• Keep headlights, taillights and signal lights clean. External dirt and debris can dim operational lights and keep them from being seen easily.

• Make sure your headlights are properly aimed. Misaimed headlights blind other drivers and reduce your ability to see the road.

• If there's any doubt about whether your headlights should be on, turn them on. They not only help you see better in dim light, they make it easier for other drivers to see you.

• Don't overdrive your headlights. You should be able to stop inside the illuminated area; otherwise, you're creating a blind crash area in front of your vehicle.

See & Be Seen

For safety's sake, it's a bright idea to regularly check your car's lights and windshield wipers so you can see and be seen.

What To Know About Wipers

The wiper system keeps excessive water, snow and dirt from building up on the windshield, maintaining clear visibility. Many factors can accelerate the replacement interval of wipers, including operating conditions, frequency of use, material and type of wipers, and sunshine. Wiper blades can deteriorate faster and need more frequent replacement if you drive a lot in dry places. Remember to check the rear window wiper blade, too.

Added White, who's executive director, Car Care Council, "Keeping your vehicle's lights properly cared for and replacing wiper blades periodically will help ensure a safer ride, keeping the road ahead well lit and giving you a clear view."

If you've done a little studying in your life, you know that there are abstract concepts you can ponder (think Descartes) and cold, hard facts (I was told there would be no math. however). It almost looks like the equivalent of Ali knocking out Sonny Liston without laying a glove on him.

Either way, Brady is the greatest of all time. This cannot be disputed any longer. Five Super Bowl rings will tend to work in your legacy's favor. It's a matter of record that I called for a Falcons-Patriots Super Bowl, and I have the texts to prove that I believed the smart money was on the Patriots to win and cover the spread, beating the over. But like anyone who grew up a Giants fan and can't stand seeing Ben Affleck any more than I absolutely must, I was pulling for the Falcons. It's a great franchise, headed up by a great owner, led by Matt Ryan, the rightful MVP. The people and fans of Atlanta are championship starved, and on any other Sunday, against any other team, they would be coming home with the hardware.

But how could you not root for Brady in the final minutes of the fourth quarter? In overtime? After his 60th passing attempt? And how could you not smirk along with him as Roger Goodell — possibly the worst commissioner in organized sports history, the guy that stupidly suspended the league's only real marquee star over a few ounces of missing air — had to hand the Lombardi Trophy to him? If your life depended on it, could you imagine starting any other quarterback?

Baby Boomers and subsequent generations have witnessed some of the greatest players and athletes of all-time. 




