Elkhart's Top Chef packs the ballroom

A capacity crowd turned out Sunday, March 13 at The Osthoff Resort's Grand Libelle Ballroom for an afternoon of culinary treats and great tastes—all in the name of raising funds to assist children with disabilities.

For the seventh straight year Top Chef Elkhart Lake brought people together to help support the Midwest Council for Children with Disabilities, while honoring Elkhart Lake's top culinary artists.

"The food prepared by these fantastic chefs is a treat," Lynn Shovan said. Shovan, owner of Lake Street Cafe, serves as the event coordinator, and is a member of the MCCD Board of Directors.

"But guests tell us it's the cause that makes the difference in their participation at Top Chef Elkhart Lake."

Shovan said Top Chef Elkhart Lake generates critical funds to help change the lives of Sheboygan County area children dealing with disabilities. "Top Chef has sold out all seven years the event has been held. Due to its success, we continue to grow and expand the amount of support we can give to our local families."

Top Chef winners

Each of six chefs competed for top honors for the year in two categories, the Judge's Competition and the People's Choice.

Chad Kornetzke, of The Osthoff Resort, earned the People's choice honors, being selected in balloting for his appetizer—braised pork cheek verde with jicama and pineapple slaw.

In the Judge's competition, Chris Gebert of the Paddock Club took top honors. Gebert was picked from the six chefs who had to prepare an entree under timed circumstances.

The other chefs competing for Top Chef recognition were Emily Hein, Brown Baer; Victor Littig, Lake Street Cafe; Brent Bunting, Lincoln Street Sports Bar & Grill and Andrew Goch, Quit Qui Oc Golf Club.

Not competing, but contributing in a significant way was the Off the Rail Cafe, who created all the dessert offerings at the Top Chef event.

Judges for the event were Ulrich Kobertstein, Director of Culinary for Sargento;



Culver's celebrates 15 years at Plymouth site

Combine a great team with an awesome menu, and you will find the reasons to celebrate 15 years of success at the Plymouth Culver's restaurant.

Owned and operated by Scott Clark and his team, the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce member restaurant is excited about the successful pathway it has carved.

The Plymouth location has earned the Culver's Pride Award for the fourth year in a row, celebrating its growth. The Plymouth Culver's has also earned the Commitment to Excellence Award numerous times, including the past four year.

"We have the right recipe for doing things here," Clark said. "We are fortunate to have a good team."

Clark is joined by general manager Joy Allison, first assistant manager Robin Pingel and first assistant Nick Gundrum.

Together with a team of 50 year-round employes the crew continues to take care of customers the Culver's way.

Executive chef background

Not many hamburger franchises can claim an owner's background as rich in food service as Clark's. He served as an executive chef in his earlier career, working at Marriott hotels around the United States, including a stint at the Brookfield Sheraton for 10 years.

Originally from Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, Clark first became acquainted with Culver's in 1991.

"When I saw my first Culver's 25 years ago, I was introduced to the franchise and I was impressed by it," Clark said.

He eventually got to meet Craig and Lee Culver, and his decision to pursue a Culver's franchise was solidified.

Then, the opportunity in Plymouth opened up, and Clark took advantage of the chance.

"Back in 1999, when I was looking

around to take on a Culver's franchise I knew I couldn't pass up on the Plymouth location," Clark added. Clark gravitated to the overall quality of the Culver's theme, quality of food, quality of service, and a great owner-operator franchise agreement to work under.

Variety of menu

Clark emphasized that Culver's uniqueness comes from the variety of its menu. "We offer a lot of things and hit a lot of different tastes with the menu," he said.

Though the staples of the menu are the Butter burgers and frozen custard, Culvers also offers roast beef, fried chicken, great salads and an impressive daily soup menu.

Any day of the week, the Plymouth Culvers offers 4-5 soups. Chili is available every day, even in the summer time. The remaining choices are great local favorites.

Of course, most restaurant fans love Culver's the infamous Butter burgers. "The crown of the bun is buttered before it's toasted," Clark said. "And, we use fresh, never frozen meat for our made-to-order burgers."

Custard is also made fresh throughout the day. Culvers offers vanilla, chocolate and a fresh made flavor of the day each day.

Each day a new menu special is offered. Wednesday, the Plymouth Culver's offers taco salads, while Thursday is sloppy Joes day—both very popular special items.

Fridays are fish fry days at Culver's. The north Atlantic cod is the most popular item, hand battered to order. During the lenten season, the walleye and butterfly shrimp were among the top Fish Fry Friday menu items.

Strong on community

Clark and the team at the Plymouth Culver's are strong believers in community.

Supporting the hometown values, the Culver's restaurant maintains close ties

with local schools, FFA and other groups.

"We have a great community here. Business is solid year around, with a little boost in the summer from the Elkhart Lake resort traffic and Road America. But, mostly we see the great core business that is part of the Plymouth shopping community," he said.

Clark said, in turn, he has kept a commitment to supporting the community. "We do a lot to take care of organizations, groups, fundraising efforts, youth teams and churches," he said. "You have to give back to the community and be a good steward of your resources that come from the community."

The Plymouth Culver's is located at 2318 Eastern Avenue.

Daily hours are 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. - with drive through service available.

In addition to indoor dining, the Plymouth Culver's also offers outdoor patio seating during warm weather times.







Fab Lab grant helps school

The Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School Board approved the District's grant application to create a Fabrication Laboratory (Fab Lab) through funding available through the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation. A Fab Lab is defined by WEDC as a "medium-scale high-technology workshop equipped with computer-controlled additive and subtractive manufacturing components including three-dimensional (3-D) printers, laser engravers, computer numeric control (CNC) routers or plasma cutters. The district's technical education teach-

er, John Ostermann, presented the grant proposal for a Tormach PCNC, which is an automated tool designed to machine metal such as aluminum, steel, titanium, and pre-hardened tool steel.

As ELG currently has in their technical education department a 3D scanner and printer, CNC router, and laser engraver/cutter for woodworking production and design and engineering, this purchase, if approved, will bring Computer Numerical Controlled (CNC) equipment into the metals and machining program.

As to the district's matching portion

of the grant, ELGS would purchase the welding equipment to complement the CNC Mill. As a result of the combined equipment proposed in the grant, students would be able to better process a variety of materials, and the upgraded welding equipment would allow the assembly of

machined parts with better quality and accuracy. These additions would greatly enhance the hands on opportunities and experiences available to the students, making them better prepared to go onto technical school, apprenticeships, or directly into the work force.



Primary election set for April 5

The Presidential Preference & Spring Election will be held on Tuesday, April 5, 2016. The polls are open from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm. The Presidential Preference contest is on the ballot. Remember that you can only vote for one candidate in only one party for the presidential preference. The other contests on the ballot include, a State Supreme Court race, a court of appeals judge contest, a county supervisor contest, the village trustees contest, and the school board contest.

Spring Election & Photo ID Required

Photo ID will be required at the Spring election and all other elections. The following are some frequently asked questions about the photo ID law:

Do I have the right photo ID?

Below are the acceptable IDs for voting purposes and can be unexpired or expired after the date of the most recent general election (currently, Nov. 4, 2014):

- Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license
- Wisconsin DOT-issued identification card
- Military ID card
- U.S. passport

There may be other acceptable forms of photo ID, but please contact the Clerk's office at 920-876-2122 for more information. The address on your ID does not have to be current. Election officials will only look at your ID type, name, picture, and expiration date.

What if I don't have a photo ID?

If you are eligible to vote but do not have a photo ID, you may obtain a free ID from the Department of Motor Vehicles. Apply for the ID as soon as possible. You'll need some documents to get the ID. Some records satisfy more than one requirement. For a complete list visit wisconsin.gov or call (608) 264-7447.

Annual Reports

The Village Board has been having the annual reports for each department presented at their meetings in February and March.

Tourism – From the Desk of Tourism Director, Kathleen Eickhoff

Tourism had a successful year. Room tax collected in 2015 grew by over seven percent from 2014 to over \$560,000. The year started off with a new website design and the content was updated. The updated website provides more mapping and business information. The entire website is now mobile ready.

Tourism conducts cooperative marketing and buying of advertisements to facilitate efficient use of time and money. Tourism is striving to fill the summer midweek stays. This has been improving but we would like to fill the mid-week summer bookings to capacity. Due to the Osthoff Conference Center expansion, Tourism has had the opportunity to grow the meeting market. This allows us to attract more overnight room space than the Osthoff can provide. There has been spillover to the other properties. Another area we are concentrating on is promoting Elkhart Lake as a wedding destination. We are striving to reach brides through social media.

Three media tours were held in 2015; a summer, fall, and holiday tour. Elkhart Lake welcomed 215 journalists during these tours. These media tours provide vacation experiences for the journalists. The audience that has been reached through these tours is over 22 million.

Finally, we've been working on growing our image and video libraries. This has allowed commercials and advertising pieces for Elkhart Lake to be created. There are three long videos, each three minutes in length and there are three short (30 second) videos available as well.

Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer – From the Desk of Administrator Jessica Reilly

The Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer's office completed many tasks in 2015. The staff spent a create deal of time on tax incremental districts (TIDs) in 2015. TID #4 was created in the fall of 2015. This TID was created for Wolf Motorsports and Villas. The Planning Commission meets regularly to review the TID plans and proposals and recommend creation to the Village Board and Joint Review Board. TIDs #2 & #3 also are flourishing. TID #2 allowed for the continued expansion of Sargento. The Village vacated West Street and work was completed on the N. Lake Street extension. TID #2 also saw commercial development occur on the Victory

land. The Village also began construction on the road, sewer, and water along Victory Lane. This will be completed in 2016.

The office had a variety of projects in 2015. The office took the lead on adding the Tourism Department to the Village's phone and internet systems. Katie worked with an intern on a tree identification project. This intern gathered information on every Village-owned tree and that information will be compiled and put in a tree maintenance plan for the Tree Commission. Kim compiled and had bound resolution books from the 1990's through present.

The office also worked on the caboose project, the appreciation dinner, the Arbor Day program, CPR Training, and wireless microphones for the Board meetings. Jessica was elected to serve as co-director of District 6 of the Wisconsin Municipal Clerks Association and also sits on the organization's Board of Directors.

Over 20 percent of all water & sewer accounts are now on automatic payments. This office also handles all dog, liquor, beer, operator, picnic, and peddler licensing. In 2015 the office licensed 129 dogs and 153 alcohol operators. The office also collects taxes in December and January and files many annual reports throughout the year.

Library – From the Desk of Betty McCartney, Library Director

The Elkhart Lake Public Library had another great year. The circulation of library materials increased just over one percent in 2015. There has been a tremendous growth of electronic materials.

Financially the library is in an excellent position. We are funded by the Village (\$94,706), by Sheboygan County (reimbursement for 2014 use \$69,162) and reimbursements from neighboring counties (\$1,077), grants (\$730) and donations.

Items received from other libraries to fulfill our patron's requests increased in 2014 and the number of items loaned by us to other libraries increased too. The Library loans more items to other libraries than we request. In 2015 11,019 items were loaned to other libraries and Elkhart Lake Library patrons requested 7,812 items from other libraries.

The Library added 1,307 books, 111 audio materials and 294 videos to the collection. We have over 137,000 electronic books, 35,000 electronic audio materials and 1,000 electronic video materials available to our patrons to download. Zinio, our online magazine database, is very popular. The Library also added an Ancestry database that was funded through the Friends of the Library. This service has been very popular.

Faster bandwidth was upgraded last year for the library. This will allow for greater use of the Wi-Fi for patrons who use laptops, tablets, and smartphones. There has been a decrease in the use of our Internet computers since last year. The Library also offers wireless printing capabilities.

Programs are very popular. One 138 programs were held and 2,182 patrons

Book club, Story Time, LEGO & more, weekly coffee hour, Summer Library programs, and movies are some of our most popular programs.

Donations and gifts have allowed us to purchase additional copies of highly requested items (Lucky Day collection), selected purchases of books and audiobooks. The Friends of the Library paid for two major programs and most of the prizes for the Summer Library Program. They also funded Ancestry Library Edition database.

The library also runs programs throughout the year. For more information on the library and its services or programs contact Betty McCartney at 920-876-2554.

First Responders – From the Desk of Captain Lisa Holzmann

There were 136 calls for Emergency Service in 2015, with 81 of them being in the Village, 51 in the Town of Rhine, and four were mutual aid calls. The greatest volume of calls happened in June & December.

There are 16 active members in the First Responders and six people have just completed their Emergency Medical Responder training and are in the process of being licensed. This will help provide more people available to take calls during the day.

Some members of the First Responders have become members of the Sheboygan County Rescue Task Force. This group is available so that in the event of an active shooter situation they would go in with a police escort and treat and evacuate the wounded. This group trains together, so



The Road to Wellness

A right time for everything and everything in its time

"To every (thing there is) a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven." — Book of Ecclesiastes, King James Bible

The same thing is true when it comes to your body's own rhythms throughout the day. You're probably not aware of it most of the time, but your body has an internal "master clock" that synchronizes all of its systems. Even more interestingly, recent studies suggest that you may actually have several different clocks in different parts of your body. But what exactly does this mean for you? According to researchers in an emerging field called "circadian science," it means that there are certain times of the day that are best (and worst) for some types of activities.

While it is nearly impossible for most of us to schedule our day-to-day activities (jobs, family time, housework, childcare, errands and so on) to accommodate our body clock, we can still make small changes that will help us be healthier, happier and more productive. Here are a few examples.

Work. Different kinds of work each have an optimal time of day. If you want to be sharp in your analytical thinking, late morning is usually best, peaking at around 10 a.m. Your body temperature is lowest at about 5 a.m. and gradually rises as the morning progresses, along with alertness and cognitive ability. To jump-start this process, taking a warm shower first thing in the morning can help you become more alert earlier in the day. Just be sure that these sorts of tasks are finished by noon, when alertness begins to drop off. And if you want to be in top form for an important meeting with a new client, it's probably best not to arrange it for 2 in the afternoon.

But what if you're working to solve a problem that requires a creative, outside-the-box solution? The best time for this kind of creative thinking is in the evening when we begin to tire, according to a study published in the journal *Thinking and Reasoning*. The study found that subjects did a far better job of solving problems that required creativity when they were operating on the edge of fatigue rather than at their peak time for analytical reasoning.

Exercise. Physical performance is most enhanced and the risk of injury minimized between about 3 p.m.-6 p.m. Muscle strength is six percent higher between 2 p.m.-6 p.m. than at other times

of day and joints and muscles are as much as 20 percent more flexible in the evening. Plus, the lungs perform at 17.6 percent greater efficiency at 5 p.m. than they do at midday.

Naps. Many cultures in Europe have followed the tradition of the afternoon "siesta" for centuries, and for good reason. We are naturally sleepy around 2 p.m., so if you are able to take a short power nap around that time, it could help you be more alert for the rest of the day. Studies have shown that a one-hour nap can boost alertness for the following 10 hours. And a study performed on pilots found that a nap of about half an hour boosted performance by 34 percent and enhanced general alertness by 54 percent. However, try to keep naps to 45 minutes or less, since longer naps may cause you to enter into slow-wave sleep, which can leave you feeling groggy and disoriented for up to half an hour after you wake.

Studying. While it may be tempting to study late at night when it seems you have the most time, learning is best accomplished in the morning when cognitive activity is at its peak. However, reviewing material you have already learned is done best just before going to bed. Research has shown that recall actually improves when you sleep after performing a task like this.

Eating. Limiting your eating times to hours when you feel most alert and active can help reduce the risk of unwanted weight gain. In a study involving two groups of mice that were all given the same diet and amount of food, researchers found that mice who were allowed to eat at all times of day became obese, contracted diabetes and liver disease, and had cholesterol levels twice as high as mice who only ate during an eight-hour period when they were most active. So from the point of view of circadian rhythms, it may be best to eat your largest meal at midday and have a lighter supper early in the evening.

Unfortunately, our modern 24/7 lifestyle often conflicts with the natural rhythms wired into our biology. But research is demonstrating that we really do feel better and perform better when we don't try to live against the clock. When the body's master clock is allowed to synchronize metabolic, cardiovascular and behavioral rhythms in response to light and other natural stimuli, our bodies and our lives can function more efficiently.

they are prepared if the need ever arises.

The First Responders are continuing to replace the defibrillators for each member, the two at the school, and the ones carried by the police department. The cost of each unit is \$2,000. In 2015 the First Responders replaced five of the units. These units will continue to need replacement, as the old ones are no longer being serviced.

Police – From the Desk of Chief Michael Meeusen

The Elkhart Lake Police Department handled a total of 1171 calls for service and 458 traffic related complaints in 2015. The busiest time of the day for calls is between 4-6 p.m. Saturday is the day in which the Police Department received the greatest amount of calls. The greatest number of citations was issued between 4-7 p.m.

There were also six operating while intoxicated arrests with three being first offense, one being third offense, and two being third offense. Ordinance arrests in 2015 included 16 for the possession of THC and paraphernalia, 14 for underage drinking, and 10 for disorderly conduct. There were also some criminal drug arrests in 2015, including two for possessing paraphernalia, one for possessing THC, one for possessing a controlled substance, one for possessing narcotic drugs, and one for possessing with intent to deliver THC. Over the last several years the police department has seen a steady increase in drug offenses in the Village and has also referred more offenses to the District Attorney for charging as a result.

The Village continued to have community service officers (CSOs). In 2015, two of the former CSOs were hired by local law enforcement agencies.

The Police Department received Wisconsin Law Enforcement Association Group Accreditation in 2015. The Elkhart Lake Police Department is the only police department in the County to hold this accreditation. The accreditation process began with the review and revision of all police department policies. This accreditation also was comprised of a core standards verification program, which provided independent verification that the

agency is meeting expectations in essential areas of operation and management.

The Police Department has also increased its social media presence in 2015. We have increased our social media outreach. In 2015 social media was used to help locate dogs, inform residents and guests of the suspension of winter parking regulations, provide information on vintage weekend parking, and receive tips on criminal activity. We have nearly 450 twitter followers.

The Police Department continued to participate in multiple community related events and remains dedicated to providing high quality policing services to the residents of Elkhart Lake into the future. We were able to do all this while staying under budget in 2015. We would like to thank each resident for helping us keep Elkhart Lake a safe and enjoyable place to live.

Public Works & Water – From the Desk of Superintendent Richard Solek

The Water Department had a busy in 2015. We had no water main breaks in 2015. The main project was the painting of the water sphere on Arbor Drive. The water sphere has a different look, due to the color and the writing. We are working on the cross connection inspection of homes. Finally, Pat Zorn and Rich Solek had their water licenses renewed for another three years.

The Public Works Department worked on a variety of road projects in 2015. The N. Lake Street extension was completed, work began on Victory Lane, Lakeshore Drive was chip sealed, the end of Osthoff Avenue at Chicago Street and the alley across from the school were paved. Public Works staff also did work at Vollrath Park for the replacement of 125 feet of blacktop on the path. The Department also helped with vintage weekend and the weekly farmer's market road closures. The bucket truck was purchased in 2015. This truck allows staff to trim trees and change the banners and holiday decorations. The Public Works Department also helps other departments such as the police and administrator when necessary.

Arts come alive at Weill Center

Performing arts may have several homes in Sheboygan County, but none is more majestic than the Stephanie H. Weill Center, located in downtown Sheboygan.

Stage productions, concerts and shows are part of an annual program schedule, which is enhanced by the presence of a pair of renters—the Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra and the Sheboygan Concert Association.

“We are fortunate during the season to have shows going on at the Weill Center almost every weekend,” Kimberly Meller, events and operations manager for the Stephanie H. Weill Center said.

“They range from local talent to world renown performers.”

Renovated in 2001, the Stephanie H. Weill Center will celebrate 15 years of performances this October 13, with The Art Of Time Ensemble’s presentation of Sgt. Pepper’s Lonely Hearts Club. A trio of singers including a founding member of Bare Naked Ladies, the group is backed by a full orchestral ensemble.

the state register of historic places.

“The whole idea,” Meller said, “was to preserve this historic theater to provide and sustain a majestic venue for the community and to serve the people of Sheboygan County and surrounding communities.

Working with other groups

Meller said the Stephanie H. Weill Center is careful to work with other Sheboygan County groups supporting the performing arts.

“We take care not to step on the toes of the John Michael Kohler Arts Center and their Distinguished Guest Series, for example,” she noted.

Together, all the entities help offer greater “quality of life” opportunities for the surrounding Sheboygan County residents.

Meller said having a facility like the Weill Center is even important to employers. “As we face employee shortages in the years to come, having perks like this is important to keeping employees here and luring new ones to the county,” she said. “We can be one of those positive perks for individuals and families alike.”

As a member of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce, the Weill Center sees a beneficial reciprocal relationship.

“We have always been open to partnering with the resorts, and all local businesses. And, maybe there is something a business is thinking of, and we might be able to work together to make something great happen for the county,” Meller said.

“Bring us an idea, and we’ll try to make it go!”



Restored history

The Stephanie H. Weill Center dates its origins back to 1928 when it started as a small vaudeville and movie house. Over the years, it was purchased by the Marcus Corporation, reshaped into twin movie theaters, and eventually left with a grim future.

Several attempts to form the Weill Foundation finally took root in 2001. Once the foundation took a foothold, the Weill Center reconstruction project forged full steam ahead.

Beginning that year, plans took shape to totally reconstruct the Stephanie H. Weill center to its original historical status.

The only significant difference is in the seating. Originally a 1,600 seat theater, the Weill Center now seats 1153, due to a commitment to use larger seats for patron comfort.

“We used thoughtful reproductions of the original chairs, but they are slightly larger,” Meller said.

The firm of Conrad Schmidt, known internationally for restoration work, performed the painstaking task of bring the Weill Center back to life, not only as a center for performing arts, but also a jewel on


