Vet clinic opens in February

Furry, four-legged friends and their owners can rest easy knowing that Elkhart Lake will soon have its own brand new veterinary care clinic.

After years of dreaming, Dr. John Prellwitz and his staff will open a spanking new veterinary clinic on Victory Lane in February. Compassionate Care Animal Clinic will extend its welcome arms to small animals as a new community option for animal health care.

Compassionate Care Animal Clinic is planning to host a community open house on Saturday, February 27 from 1-3 p.m. The new clinic is located on Victory Lane, immediately west of Cedar Landing, on Elkhart Lake's north side.

The official opening for the clinic will actually be Monday, February 29. From that date on, Dr. Prellwitz and his staff will operate under normal business hours, open weekdays and Saturdays at 8 a.m.

On Mondays and Thursdays, the clinic's hours will extend to 6 p.m. Other days of the week will see a 5 p.m. closure. Saturday, the Compassionate Care Animal Clinic will close at noon as long as Prellwitz is the lone practicing vet at the site.

Small animal care focus

Compassionate Animal Care Clinic will focus its care services on small animals, with dogs and cats making up the bulk of the patient list.

"I have done some work with pocket pets," Prellwitz said, "but committing to pets other than dogs and cats will be on a 'we'll see' basis."

For Prellwitz, the opening an Elkhart Lake veterinary clinic is the culmination of dream that began four years ago.

Prior to coming to Elkhart Lake, Prellwitz was a veterinarian at the St. Anna Veterinary Clinic for 13 years, 11 of those as an owner.

The new Elkhart Lake veterinarian earned his degree at Auburn University, in

1999, after a 12 year stint in the US Army as a paratrooper and Ranger.

His first clinical work was with the Burr Oak Veterinary Service in Fremont, WI, then as a dairy vet for three years.

In 2002, Prellwitz moved to the St. Anna Clinic, where he split duties between dairy and small animal veterinary services.

"I fell in love with the small animal part of the practice," he said.

As his years mounted at the St. Anna Clinic, it became evident to Prellwitz that the dairy portion of his practice was no longer his interest. "Trying to deliver a calf at 2 a.m. while lying on frozen ground reminded me too much of the Army. It was time for me to look to do something else," he said. "But I truly enjoyed working with the farmer and their families."

Focus on small animals

Moving to his own clinic has allowed Prellwitz to focus his practice on small animals.

The dream became reality after pursuing several options, including purchasing a couple of existing restaurant facilities. Following many discussions with the village of Elkhart Lake and developers, Victory Elkhart Lake LLC stepped forward to assist.

The location on Victory Lane became available, and the concept for the Compassionate Care Animal Clinic began to take shape.

"The community has been great," Prellwitz said. He touted the embracing attitude of other chamber of commerce members.



Sadiqs enjoy being Off The Rail by name and by nature

A few days before Valentine's Day, Daniel and Kelley Sadiq will be celebrating a special anniversary.

February 11 will mark their fifth anniversary—as business partners in Elkhart Lake's eclectic cafe known as Off The Rail.

For the Sadiq's, Off The Rail is more than just a name, it's their nature—as evidenced by the quirky signage inside the cafe that speaks of good-natured humor and fun.

Those trappings throughout the cafe add to an atmosphere that rings of European accents. The tables are close. The food is unique. The hospitality is warm and flowing.

In the summer, the dining area expands to the open air patio fronting on the village square, but the fun atmosphere remains.

"We like to take any pretense out of what we are," Daniel Sadiq said. "We take what we do seriously, but we have a lot of fun doing it, and we want our customers to have fun, too."

As owners, the Sadiqs are wrapped deeply in their business—showing their passion for serving their guests.

"It helps set the culture and the climate for the entire staff to offer that welcoming atmosphere. We want people to feel comfortable here whether they are here for the first time, or whether they come in every day," he added.

A great and diverse staff, a fun music vibe and endless bulletin board postings give Off The Rail its unique character.

Full kitchen underneath

Off The Rail customers might easily be fooled by the quaintness of the cafe's serving area.

What lurks beneath the surface is the full kitchen located under the cafe in the lower level.

The kitchen allows Off The Rail the luxury of preparing food one step at a time from fresh, made-from-scratch ingredients.

Everything is made in-house, using local produce. Desserts are also produced in Off The Rail's kitchen.

Breakfast and lunch

Off The Rail specializes in breakfast and lunch menus, and is open every day but Wednesdays. Sunday hours are 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., while all other days are 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the off season. In the summer season, from Memorial Day to Labor Day, Off The Rail is open daily from 7-3.

Breakfast is served until 11:15 a.m., and that's when the lunch menu takes over.

Breakfasts offerings ring out with sounds of railroad lore—Breakfast Commuter, Trolley, McRail, Conductor and Express Bagel.

At lunch, locomotive names like Freight Train, Caboose, Silver Streak BLT, Ghost Train, Boxcar, The Underground refer to sandwiches that feature turkey, roast beef, veggies, tuna or other great combinations. A Thomas the Train menu is offered

for children.

On Saturdays, Off The Rail provides breakfast burritos. Sundays feature a breakfast strata.

Off The Rail also offers specialty coffee and tea drinks, blended fruit drinks, iced coffee and espresso drinks, wine, beer, deli items and homemade baked goods.

Free wireless helps guests stay connected with the world while sipping a cup of coffee or enjoying lunch.

Off The Rail features a static menu for a reason. It helps customers know what to expect. "We have a lot of people who may only come once or twice a year as visitors to Elkhart Lake. When they look up at the menu and see the Freight Train sandwich, they know what they are getting," Daniel said.

Off The Rail also switches up specials for the repeat clientele who appreciate a change of pace.

Catering services continue to expand for Off The Rail. Catering services are available for both breakfast and lunch.

Off The Rail can also provide desserts, baked goods for private parties and special occasions.

A dream come true

Off The Rail was born of a dream based on Kelley's baking hobby.

Daniel and Kelley actually met while working together in England. After being married and moving to Elkhart Lake later in 2006, Kelley found herself parlaying her love of cooking and baking into a homebased business that literally produced thousands of cupcakes for various parties and community celebrations.

Daniel and Kelley Sadiq are celebrating the fifth anniversary of their Elkhart Lake business-Off The Rail Cafe,

"When we started to get orders for 400-500 cupcakes, we thought, 'There is an opportunity here," Daniel said.

The stars seemed to align in favor of Kelley's dream of owning a coffee and sandwich shoppe.

A growing baking business re-ignited the cafe concept. At the same time, the perfect location popped up as the Sadiqs began working with Steve and Julia Suttcliffe, who revitalized the Feed Mill Shops.

They had children of similar ages, that spurred conversation and interest in the sandwich shop concept at a great community location.

"It's just a priceless location," Daniel said. "It wouldn't work anywhere else."

Sadiq said the opening of Off The Rail was originally scheduled for Halloween time. But other holidays passed as well. Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years all whisked by, but the couple finally got their Mike Mathes photo



business up and running the day before Valentine's Day five years ago.

"We had a lot of help from all the other businesses in town. Their support was huge," he noted.

For the first three months, they didn't even have a menu firmed up. The Sadiqs kept checking with their customers to make sure the food was to their liking.

"Everyone gave us advice. And we took that to heart-solicited and unsolicited," he said. "All the support they received makes the Sadiqs feel they want to be available to help others succeed as well.

Fitting into Elkhart Lake

A five-year anniversary means the Off The Rail hospitality mantra fits in well with Elkhart Lake, Sadiq said.

"We have all had to learn how to fit in with Elkhart Lake. It's a place where everyone is here for each other. We are all friends. We all eat at each other's places of business and we all promote the community for the good of everyone," he said.

The bottom line is that the Sadiqs continue to enjoy being part of the Elkhart Lake atmosphere.

Brand new facility

Compassionate Care Animal Clinic is a brand new facility from the ground up, designed with Dr. Prellwitz's imprint and the support of Quasius Construction. The new facility will include 3,500 square feet of space.

"Qausius has exceeded every expectation. The building is exceptional. It's gorgeous inside and out," Prellwitz said.

The building was designed by architect Gary Kegler, the same person who designed Elkhart Lake's veterans monument.

Paperless office

The clinic is set up to host a completely paperless office.

Another efficiency will come from the use of digital X-ray technology, enabling the staff of animal care professionals to call up the results immediately for diagnosis.

Compassionate Animal Care Clinic will also offer endoscopy procedures for diagnostic testing. "We will be one of the few clinics in the state to offer this. It involves a less invasive procedure for




many diagnoses, allowing the staff to get cultures and find out what is affecting the animal," he said.

Endoscopy helps rule out procedures that may be unnecessary in many cases.

Staff takes shape

Dr. Prellwitz has assembled a staff to serve the needs of pet owners.

His wife, Susie, will handle purchasing and finances for the clinic. Jody Tveit and Stephanie Rortvedt will serve as veterinary technicians. Jennifer Zak will be a receptionist and accounts receivable specialist. Mary Johnston will serve as a part-time receptionist.



Road America set for exciting season

Road America President and General Manager, George Bruggenthies, has announced the official Road America 2016 season schedule, including the return of an Indy Car race to America's Park of Speed.

"Road America is known for having the most active schedule of any road race circuit in the U.S., and we look forward to hosting the MotoAmerica Series, Verizon IndyCar Series, Pirelli World Challenge Series, NASCAR XFINITY Series, IMSA WeatherTech[®] SportsCar Championship and three separate vintage events in 2016," said Bruggenthies.

"The 2015 season was incredible and included many new facility improvements designed to enhance the overall fan experience. Make no mistake about it, 2016 is going to be a great season full of activities and we are already in the planning process of improving the facility yet again. We encourage all our fans to get their season tickets early, so they can enjoy another season of great racing and fond memories at Road America. Event tickets for the 2016 season are available and camping reservations became available in November."



Planning Commission Update

Work continues on the Wolf Motorsports project and the Victory North Project. The Wolf Project located on Badger Road and HWY 67 is moving forward. The Planning Commission is pretty well finished with this project. The Village is still working on some documents that are needed to keep the project moving forward.

Victory Elkhart Lake has submitted a revised plan for the north end of their property. They have reconfigured the apartment buildings as well as the single and two family dwellings. Planning Commission meetings in January and February will determine the viability of the project.

Winter Parking

After temporarily rescinding the winter parking ordinance over the New Year weekend, it is back in force. Little did we know that we would get hit with 8.5 inches of snow. It all worked out with few problems. If you want up to the minute information on Village conditions you can go to the Village website or the facebook page for the Elkhart Lake Police Department.

Winter Parking Regulations

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street or the parking lot on North East Street between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A.M. and 6:00 o'clock A.M. commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

Snow Removal

Chapter 10.03 - Residents have 14 hours after a winter storm to remove ice and snow from their sidewalks. Snow cannot



be blown or plowed onto Village streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home. You will not receive prior notification, if sidewalks are not cleared on a timely basis; the village will shovel your walk and bill you.

Election-Photo ID Required

The first election of the year will be held on Feb. 16, 2015. Photo ID will be required at this election and all other elections. The following are some frequently asked questions about the photo ID law:

Do I have the right photo ID?

Below are the acceptable IDs for voting purposes and can be unexpired or expired after the date of the most recent general election (currently, Nov. 4, 2014):

 Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license Wisconsin DOT-issued identification card

• Military ID card

• U.S. passport

There may be other acceptable forms of photo ID, but please contact the Clerk's office at 920-876-2122 for more information. The address on your ID does not have to be current. Election officials will only look at your ID type, name, picture, and expiration date.

What if I don't have a photo ID?

If you are eligible to vote but do not have a photo ID, you may obtain a free ID from the Department of Motor Vehicles. Apply for the ID as soon as possible. You'll need some documents to get the ID. Some records satisfy more than one requirement. For a complete list visit wisconsindot.gov or call (608) 264-7447.

Do I need a photo ID to absentee vote?

Absentee Ballot Requests

Requests for ballots sent by mail or email must be accompanied by a photocopy of an acceptable form of voter ID. You will not need to do this with future requests, as long as you have not changed your name or address.

In-person Absentee Voting

If you are casting an absentee ballot in the municipal clerk's office, you must present a photo ID, just as you would at the polls.

Exemptions for absentee voting

Photo ID is not required for the following absentee voters:

- Military voters
- Voters who are permanently overseas • Confidential voters
- Indefinitely confined voters Nursing home residents whose ballots
- are delivered by special voting deputies

• Residents of care facilities who are not visited by special voting deputies

What can I expect at the polling place?

Now that voters are bringing their IDs, voting at your polling place will be a little different. Please be prepared & patient. State It

As always, you'll need to state your full name and address for the election official who checks you in. They'll check your information in the poll book. Understandably, some people are uneasy about announcing their name in public, but it is the law, and it helps ensure openness in elections.

Show It

Next, it's time to show your photo ID. That way, poll workers can compare your face to your photo and confirm that you really are you.

Sign It

Finally, you'll sign the poll book (unless a physical disability prevents it). Your signature or mark should go right next to your name and address.



Five tips to better push-ups

Two of my favorite exercises are simple push-ups and squats. They're extremely effective, biomechanically challenging, and very helpful for individuals with low back and/or midback/shoulder pain. They're also the kind of exercise that you should aim to be able to do relatively easily...no matter how old you are. Today, let's talk about push-ups.

About two or three times a year I decide it's a good idea to see if I can do 100 straight push-ups. I heard about this particular challenge and found a training plan on www.hundredpushups.com and went to work. I even won \$100 off a poor fella who didn't think I could do it this past August. Little did he know that I had just finished the training and accomplished the goal of 100 consecutive push-ups just the previous week. I guess I could have shared that little bit of information with him.

Now, I'm not saying you need to set your goal at 100 pushups. But why not aim for 50, or 25, 10, or just 1? Basically, I think it's a great idea to every now and then push your limits a bit. Set a goal and accomplish something you didn't think you were capable of accomplishing.

Push-ups are great exercise for the whole body and research has shown that being able to perform push-ups is a good indicator of your ability to maintain fitness into older age. Scientists have also noted that push-ups can provide seniors with the strength and muscle memory necessary to break a fall. But did you know that push-ups are particularly good for building your core strength? And that building your core strength is one of the keys to preventing low back pain?

However, it's also very easy to do pushups incorrectly, which can actually lead to pain in your shoulders and back.

So here are five great tips to doing better push-ups.

— Be sure your hips don't sag. Your head, shoulders and hips should all be in a straight line as you perform your pushups. If your hips droop, it could cause lower back pain and you will not gain as much core strength as you would if you kept head, shoulders and hips aligned. To help keep this from happening, tighten your gluteal muscles (the buttocks) and your abdominals as you perform your push-ups. (It should also be noted that your hips should not be sticking up, creating an inverted "v" shape).

Keep your elbows close to your

sides. If you look like a "t" from above, with your elbows splayed out like wings, you could be causing damage to the rotator cuff of your shoulder. Although this is how many of us were taught to do push-ups in school, it's not correct. If you have trouble keeping your elbows close to your torso, try doing push-ups on your fists, with the back of your hands facing out. This helps to keep your elbows from splaying.

— Go as low as possible. Your elbows should ideally be at somewhat less than a 90-degree angle when you are at your lowest point. If you have trouble doing this initially, put a block or similar object beneath your chest for a reference. Then gradually reduce the size of the object as you develop the strength to go lower. Personally, I aim to touch my nose to the ground.

 Start off easy. Many people do not yet have the strength to do even a single push-up on the floor and resort to socalled "knee push-ups". Unfortunately, this will not help you gain the strength you need for regular push-ups and your body will not benefit as much from the effort. Instead, you can begin by doing push-ups against a wall, countertop or staircase and then gradually work your way to progressively lower (more horizontal) positions until you're able to do a push-up on the floor. This is a great milestone! As I mentioned earlier...you don't need to do 100 pushups. A single pushup with great form is an excellent accomplishment! Then, work forward from there.

— Stretch your wrists. Putting all your upper body weight on your wrists can hurt after a while, since most of us are not accustomed to it. Give your wrists some relief by stretching them. While on your knees, place your hands palmdownwards, with your fingers pointed back toward your knees, lightly putting pressure on them to help stretch in the opposite direction to the way they are positioned during a push-up. This will allow them to support more weight for your next set.

As I mentioned earlier, the ability to do a push-up has been shown to be a good indicator of core stability and prevention of low back pain. The first part of the hundredpushups.com training plan is a "test" to see how many goodformed push-ups you can do right now. So, put the paper down for just a second and try it out yourself. Set a goal, and get pushing!

Tow Trucks for Tots has impact on Elkhart Lake area

Each year Elkhart Lake Chamber Member, John Meyers, owner of Gross Pointe Towing as been a major player in the annual Tow Trucks for Tots collection effort.

Tow Trucks for Tots, a Chicagoland area promotion run by tow trucks drivers, is designed to collect toys for needy children.

Annually, the parade runs from Hollywood Casino in Joliet to Toyota Park in Bridgeview, a total of 45 miles. The parade is held the second Saturday each November since 2008. The event holds the Guinness World Record for longest tow truck parade at 324.

In 2015 Meyers collected 7 boxes of toys by the parade date, but he decided to leave his collection boxes out and filled 4 more boxes.

Meyers has been part of the Recovery Team at Road America for 7 years and had a desire to donate the 4 boxes of toys to Elkhart Lake so he contacted Carson Wilkinson who manages the Recovery & Rescue Team at Road America. Carson then contacted Elkhart Lake Fire Chief, Pat Zorn.

Zorn expressed his gratitude for the toys that were donated to Elkhart Lake and indicated that many were kept at the fire department for first responders to use as part of their care to children at times of emergencies.

Meyers shared that following Hurricane Sandy, the Tow Trucks for Tots organization delivered 3,000 toys to Queensboro, NY, traveling for three days and over 1,900 miles.
