New paddock shop, return of Indy cars stir track excitement

Road America is gearing up for another great season of road racing at America's Park of Speed.

A huge wall display of over two dozen posters and photographs offers many rolled and framed pieces, plus custom framing and shipping options. A substantial inventory of stock décor items is enhanced by unique, one-of-a-kind pieces obtained from regional artists and others whose



works capture the essence of the automotive, motorcycle and motorsports community. The man-cave, dream-garage theme is embodied in the north end of the shop, where one can find chairs, tables, rugs, lamps, signs, wall-hangings and more. That spirit carries into small lines including wallets, handbags, jewelry, barware and home goods.

Special retail events will be held throughout the year including book signings, product demonstrations and holiday sales.

The shop is open year-round with hours dependent on the season and facility use.



Eating out?

Our article's question this month is not really that difficult to answer.

However, it does require the answers to a few additional questions: What is your budget and how much do you want to spend? What are you hungry for? What's wrong with the leftovers from last night? And, maybe most important: What restaurant should you choose? Choices range in price and atmosphere from fast food delis to fairly nice supper

Assuming that you are not financially destitute, that you can't fry fish the way they do at the restaurant, and that you HATE leftovers, the crucial question remains: Where should you go?

You might like to start out by eliminating the definitely "no" category: Not the restaurant that over-cooked your fish the last time you went out for a fish fry and poured the tartar sauce on so heavily that you couldn't taste the fish. Also, with all the Friday fish fries available, you eliminate those costing more than \$15 each. There are plenty available in the under \$15 category—and, of course, eating at home is cheapest of all.

Other easy eliminations are those foods that neither you nor your dining partner are particularly fond of. Anything tinged with coconut is an immediate turn-off for me, and my husband just can't take anything spicy or with garlic. (That cuts down choices by quite a number, but drives the waitress crazy to check on what has a little garlic and

what doesn't!) Neither of us is particularly adventuresome as far as strange cuisine is concerned, so we can easily delete the frog legs and tastes of snake and octopus.


Now we're getting down to serious business. I am sometimes undecided between some kind of seafood or anything with lobster, while my spouse will often opt for a beef entree, even though I point out that fish is really a Friday night Wisconsin favorite. "So what?" he responds, "you know I don't like fish."

We often end up with a somewhat bland compromise, fried shrimp for me and a cheeseburger special for him.


Eating out may result in a kind of bland menu, as described above, but it really is so much more than the food one eats. The choices of menu, the relative relaxation enjoyed by being served, and the ambiance of clinking glasses and popping corks are part of the "eating out" experience. On the other hand (you knew this was coming, didn't you?), it faces a competitor in the loud background music of the restaurant, the need to transport yourselves back home, and the piled up dishes in the kitchen sink.

Dining at home may not have the luxury of a waitress served meal, but it does allow the casual attire of old clothes or (occasionally) your jammies.

Boating Regulations

- A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.
- A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 p.m. -10 a.m. each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.
- Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.
- No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.
- All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must

have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).

- NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the second Sunday of June and ending the third Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.
- There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 MPH on the water.
- A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc., and during the times of high-volume boat activity.

My Lyme Disease story

The month of May is Lyme Disease Awareness Month, and here in Wisconsin, we ALL need to become much more vigilant about this disease. It's on a dramatic rise, and it is not anything you want to take lightly. Having experienced Lyme Disease personally, and having seen it multiple times in the office in the last several years, I can attest that it is a terrible condition. You need to do all you can to protect yourself, your pets, and most especially your children.

In June of 2008, while I was working in Plymouth, I attended a nutrition seminar in Stevens Point. (Oddly enough, it was at this seminar that Dr. Mike Schleicher first asked me if I was interested in taking over the chiropractic office he owned in Kiel!) Being an avid trail runner, I stopped just outside of Waupaca to go running on a segment of the Ice Age Trail.

That trail was not very well kept and was very overgrown. For most of the run, I had to duck under tree branches and my legs were constantly brushing up against the long grass along the sides of the trail. The 'trail' was barely a trail.

After about a two-hour run, I was back at my car and continuing my drive to Stevens Point. Upon arrival at my friend's house, where I was staying, I took a shower. In the shower I found four wood ticks on me. By the end of the day, I had found three more. It was absolutely disgusting.

That night, I was sitting on my bed and texting Ellie about my day. While doing that, I noticed a little black bug crawling along my thumb. This one wasn't a wood tick. It was a deer tick, which is much smaller, but much more likely to carry Lyme Disease.

Needless to say, I didn't sleep well that night. I had a nonstop sensation of bugs crawling on me. Imagine that!

Fast forward three weeks, and I was feeling really run down. I remember finishing up a normal Friday at work and being exhausted. I had a headache that made my face hurt when I would move my head in any direction. Although I rarely get headaches, I just assumed it was no big deal, and went out for dinner that night. During dinner with my parents at an Irish restaurant, the headache subsided with a pint of Guinness.

Saturday morning I woke up with the same headache. And a low backache. I'm a chiropractor, and was only 27 years old at the time. I had never experienced low back pain until then! Unfortunately, things continued to go downhill, and my temperature continued to climb, all the way to 102 at one point. The worst part? Ellie was gone that weekend, so I didn't have anyone at home to complain to.

In bed Saturday night I alternated between sweating fevers in only my underwear and shivering chills in sweatpants and a sweatshirt. Three times during the night I woke up and changed clothes

Sunday morning, same old story. Headache. Stiff neck. Sore low back. No energy. Swollen and painful lymph node in my right armpit. Something's

not right. Then, it 'clicked.' It's probably Lyme Disease, but its hallmark symptom is erythema migrans, or a bulls-eye rash, which I didn't have. Nonetheless, I knew I needed blood work and scheduled an appointment with a doctor for Monday

Sunday night I drenched the sheets in sweat. I was an absolute mess, and this was the sickest I have ever been in my

Monday morning I still felt like crap. Headache. Stiff back. Chills. But the icing on the cake was provided by a glance in the mirror as I dried myself off from the shower. There, right over my left shoulder blade, was a big old "Bullseye

The last part of the diagnosis was now present. By the afternoon the rash had become even more distinct, to the point that the doctor told me he could take a picture of it for a textbook.

Because I try to be healthy, my immune system reacted very strongly to the infection, and that allowed me to be able to identify that something was seriously wrong very quickly. That made treatment much more likely to work quickly. I was in early "Stage One" which is best described in all the symptoms I had for those three days. Stage Two is when it gets more serious and can start affecting one's heart, liver, and nervous system. I was very fortunate to be able to "tell" that something was wrong. Lyme Disease is known as the "Great Imitator" because the symptoms can mimic other illnesses and can vary in severity. That's why it's important to stay vigilant and

As I mentioned, that was the sickest I've ever been. It was terrible. I'm thankful to be better and not have to manage the terrible symptoms of chronic Lymes. I want to do everything I can to make sure YOU or your kids don't have to deal with it either, so remember these common 'first symptoms:

- "Bulls-Eye" or erythema migrans (EM) rash. The rash may appear on any area of the body and does not always take on the typical bulls-eye form.
 - Fever
 - Chills
 - Muscle and joint aches
 - Tiredness
 - Headache
 - Swollen lymph nodes

Also, when it comes to my kids, after bath time, I perform a "full body scan." They're used to it. I check them over everywhere, and do it every bath time, but am especially vigilant if they've been out in the woods or if we've been camping, etc. I can tell you every birthmark they have as those little ticks can sometimes look a lot like a little mole.

As you probably know, I'm a very big proponent of getting outside. It's unhealthy to be inside constantly, and we can't live in fear. Just be aware—May is Lyme Disease Awareness Month—and be vigilant for the tick.

SFC (R) Steward (Stu) Kuehl will be the featured speaker. Stu grew up in Glenbeulah and graduated from Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School in 1979. He enlisted in the U.S. Army as a combat engineer in January of 1980.

In 1991 Stu's unit, the 2nd Armed Cavalry Unit was mobilized oi Saudi Arabia in support of Desert Storm/Desert Shield. This unit was the lead element into Iraq for Gen. Schwatzkopf's End Around maneuver, which resulted in decisive victories against two of Sadam Hussein's Republican Guard Regiments.

In July of 2006, while executing a reconnaissance mission on a road project in Eastern Afghanistan, Stu was injured when the armored vehicle he was in was hit by two roadside bombs. Stu received extensive care for the next 18 months at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, D.C. and at the Minneapolis V.A. Hospital Traumatic Brain Injury

For his actions in Afghanistan, Stu was awarded the Combat Action Badge, the Purple Heart, and the Bronze Star.

Stu now lives in the Kiel area, enjoying his favorite pastimes of hunting, fishing, and spending time with family and friends.

The program will feature Sara Schoenborn playing Taps, the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah chorus under the direction of Holly Hellmer singing the National Anthem, the EL-GHS band under the direction of Jodi Voss playing patriotic songs, the Sheboygan County squadron of Civil Air Patrol cadets performing the raising of the flag ceremony, the American Legion Post 261 performing the ceremonial rifle volley and Rev.
