Aitkin City Council enters into an agreement with MNDOT to construct roundabout this summer

Highway 169 Roundabout in Aitkin

City of Aitkin to pay about \$20,000 of \$1.3 million roundabout project

By ANN SCHWARTZ

The Aitkin City Council entered into a construction agreement with MnDOT for the roundabout to be constructed this summer on Highway 169 near Shopko and Paulbeck's County Market.

MnDOT and federal funding will pay the lion's share of the \$1.3-\$1.5 million project. The city's cost, spelled out in the agreement, is \$20,105 for relocation of the utilities.

Eric Schiller, project manager from MnDOT, attended the Feb. 21 Aitkin City Council meeting held at the Aitkin Public Library.

Concerns expressed include that the city will have four new sidewalks to maintain there, as well as a crosswalk to paint and vegetation maintenance.

It was discussed that the businesses impacted with new sidewalks will have to shovel their own sidewalks as spelled out in the city sidewalk ordinance. Also, since Southgate Drive that accesses all the business on the east side of the highway is a private road and the city won't be maintaining that road.

Schiller stressed that he wants everyone to work to-

gether and the city and Mn-DOT have had a great past working relationship. They also have other agreements with the city concerning state highway intersections, such as the stoplight intersection. This agreement is similar to other municipal/state agreements and spells out who plows where and other issues

that may come up. Schiller explained there will be a place for pedestrians to cross in two stages, where they can stop in the middle. There will be a marked crosswalk. Street Commissioner Bob Nicko was concerned about how to stop traffic to paint the crosswalk there. Schiller suggested using tape instead of paint which costs much more but lasts much

"We want to work together. We won't be walking away from this infrastructure," stressed Schiller. He said there is a unique opportunity to install the roundabout to alleviate safety issues at this intersection. The roundabout will slow traffic to 20 miles an hour, making it safer for pedestrians. This would connect Aitkin trails to the Cuyuna Lakes and Tank Trails. The grants run from \$5,000 to \$150,000 and Aitkin has set aside \$58,000 in matching funds. A different grant request for the park was recently turned down in that it competed with much larger projects that won the grant money.

Development


Terry Betley, the developer, requested and got a hearing to vacate Westwood Court, Red Oak Court and Whitetail Drive in a new housing development he proposes off Red Oak Drive near Paulbeck's. If approved after the March 20th hearing, the city would retain easements for utilities but the roads could not be returned back as city streets.

Paul Fisher paid \$3,000 into an escrow account to cover city staff costs in relation to Aitkin Woods, a new housing development located by Garrison Disposal. "They have one spec house up," noted Tibbitts.

Riverwood Healthcare Center shared preliminary plans to expand the hospital infusion center to allow for dialysis treatment. Parking and waste disposal issues still need to be worked out.



Minnesota House approves Sunday Sales Bill in historic vote

The Minnesota House passed legislation Monday, Feb. 20 that would legalize the sale of liquor, beer, and wine on Sundays, the first time in state history that standalone legislation on this issue has been voted on or approved.

The bill passed on a bipartisan 85-45 vote, and now heads to the Senate for consideration.

If approved by the Senate, the legislation would permit liquor stores to be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sundays, starting July 1. Sunday's prohibition on product deliveries would remain.

Sunday Liquor Sales has been a perennial issue at the legislature, but has gained momentum in recent years. In 2013, the provision earned just 21 "yes" votes, increasing

"Passing Sunday Sales out of the House would not have been possible without Rep. Loon's persistence and the groundswell of grassroots support from consumers demanding a change from their legislators,"said House Speaker Kurt Daudt, R-Crown. 
