Later (after she stopped crying from laughing so hard) my wife said, "Now you know why they call that mustard 'Poupon.'"

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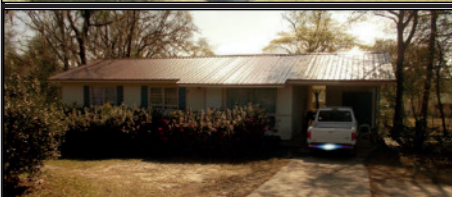
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BUBBA AND EARL

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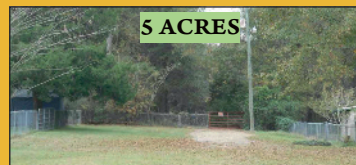

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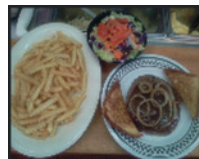

SOUTHWEST CHICKEN PIE

Ingredients

2 unbaked pie crusts
1/4 (8 ounce) package shredded Cheddar cheese
1/2 pound cubed cooked chicken breast meat
1/2 cup uncooked instant rice
1 (15 ounce) can black beans, drained
1 cup cooked corn
1 (2.25 ounce) can sliced black olives, drained
1 cup sour cream
3/4 cup prepared salsa
3/4 (8 ounce) package shredded (Mexican Blend) cheese
1 teaspoon garlic powder
1 teaspoon ground cumin
salt and pepper to taste



Directions

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Place a pie crust into a pie dish, and bake in the preheated oven for 5 minutes. Sprinkle 1/4 of an 8-ounce package of Cheddar cheese onto the crust, and set aside. In a bowl, combine the chicken, instant rice, black beans, corn, black olives, sour cream, salsa, 3/4 of 8-ounce package of cheese, garlic powder, and cumin. Season to taste with salt and pepper, and pour the mixture into the partially-baked crust. Top the pie with the remaining crust, seal the edges of the pie, and cut slits into the top crust. Bake for 25 minutes, and check to see if the crust is becoming too brown. If it is, wrap a strip of aluminum foil around the edge of the crust. Bake until the pie is golden brown and bubbling, 15 to 20 more minutes. Allow the pie to sit for 10 minutes before serving.

CHICKEN SHEPHERD'S PIE

Ingredients

1 tablespoon olive oil
2/3 cup diced onion
1 clove garlic, minced
1 pound cooked, shredded chicken

1 (6 ounce) can chopped green chilies
1 1/2 teaspoons chopped rosemary leaves
1/2 teaspoon ground thyme
1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed cream of chicken soup
3/4 cup evaporated milk
2 cups canned green beans
4 cups mashed potatoes
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1 teaspoon dried basil

Directions

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Heat olive oil in a skillet over medium-high heat. Sauté onion and garlic in hot oil until onion is soft and translucent, 5 to 7 minutes. Stir chicken, chiles, rosemary, and thyme into onion mixture. Cook and stir until chicken is heated through, about 5 minutes. Stir cream of chicken soup and evaporated milk together in a saucepan over medium-high heat until mixture is warm, 3 to 5 minutes. Spread green beans into the bottom of an 8-inch square baking dish and pour chicken mixture over the beans. Top chicken layer with cream of chicken soup mixture and spoon mashed potatoes over the top. Sprinkle Parmesan cheese and basil over the mashed potatoes. Bake in the preheated oven until potatoes are lightly golden and casserole is heated through, about 20 minutes.

CHICKEN PARMESAN PIE

Ingredients

1 teaspoon olive oil
2 onions, diced
3 cloves garlic, chopped
1 teaspoon chopped fresh oregano
1 teaspoon chopped fresh basil
4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves, cubed
1 (28 ounce) can diced tomatoes
1 (6 ounce) can tomato paste
1 (15 ounce) can black beans, rinsed & drained (optional)

CHICKEN PIES

1 (8ounce) package fresh mozzarella cheese, cubed
1 cup all-purpose baking mix (such as Bisquick(R))
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1/2 cup almond milk
1/2 cup butter, softened
1 egg

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease a large casserole dish.
Heat olive oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat; cook and stir onions, garlic, oregano, and basil in the hot oil until onions are soft, 5 to 8 minutes. Stir chicken into onion mixture and cook, stirring often, until chicken is no longer pink on the outside, about 5 more minutes. Add diced tomatoes, tomato paste, and black beans. Bring mixture to a simmer, reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer for 30 minutes, stirring often.
Stir mozzarella cheese into chicken mixture and pour into prepared casserole dish.
Combine baking mix with Parmesan cheese, almond milk, butter, and egg in a bowl to make a batter. Pour batter over chicken mixture.
Bake in the preheated oven until casserole is bubbling and crust has browned, 30 to 40 minutes.

CORNBREAD CHICKEN POT PIE

Ingredients

1 (10.75 ounce) can Condensed Cream of Chicken Soup (Regular or 98% Fat Free)
1 (8 ounce) can whole kernel corn, drained
2 cups cubed cooked chicken or turkey
1 (8 ounce) package corn muffin mix
3/4 cup milk
1 egg
1/2 cup shredded Cheddar cheese



Directions

Heat the oven to 400 degrees F. Stir the soup, corn and chicken in a 9-inch pie plate.
Stir the muffin mix, milk and egg in a small bowl just until blended. Spread the batter over the chicken mixture.
Bake for 30 minutes or until the topping is golden brown. Sprinkle with the cheese. Let stand until the cheese is melted.

EASY CHICKEN POT PIE

Ingredients

1 (15 ounce) box Pillsbury(R) refrigerated pie crusts, softened as directed on box
1 (9 ounce) pouch Progresso(TM) Recipe Starters(TM) creamy roasted garlic with chicken stock cooking sauce
1/4 cup all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon poultry seasoning
1 (12 ounce) bag Green Giant(R) Valley Fresh Steamers(TM) frozen mixed vegetables, thawed and drained
1 1/2 cups chopped deli rotisserie chicken



Directions

Heat oven to 425 degrees F. Make pie crusts as directed on box for Two-Crust Pie, using 9-inch glass pie plate.
In medium bowl, stir together cooking sauce, poultry seasoning, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper until smooth. Stir in vegetables and chicken. Spoon into crust-lined pie plate. Top with second crust; seal edge and flute. Cut slits in several places in top crust.
Bake 30 to 35 minutes or until crust is golden brown. After 15 minutes of baking, cover edge of crust with strips of foil to prevent excessive browning. Let stand 10 minutes before serving. Cut into wedges

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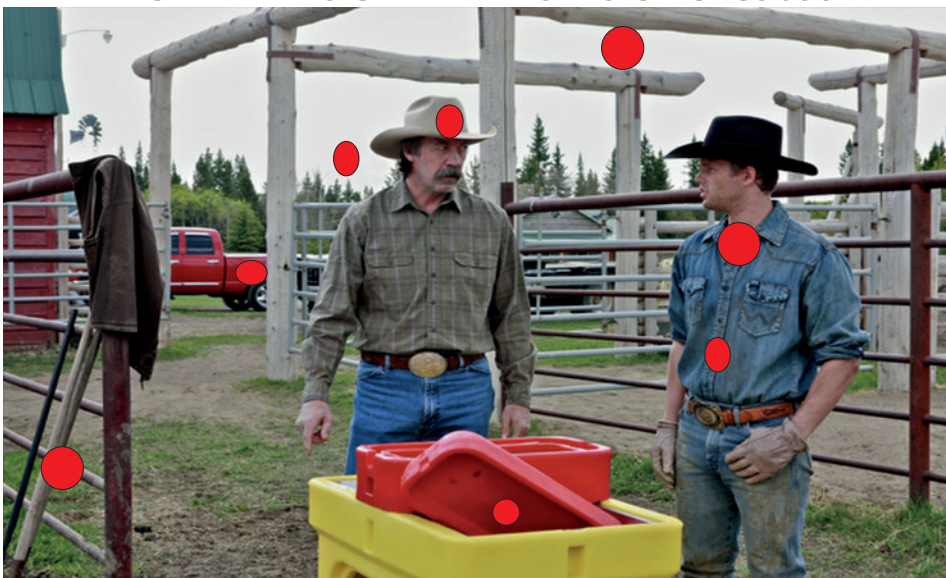

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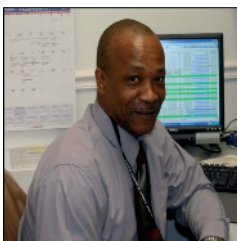
