## Salem WEST ministry building in Deerwood lost to fire Arson suspected — those with information should contact arson hotline 1-800-723-2020

Salem WEST, a ministry of Deerwood's Salem Lutheran Church, was lost in a fire on March 1. The building, about a block west of Hwy. 6 in downtown Deerwood, was used to house donated household goods that were given to needy families and used to stock the Mustard Seed Thrift and Gift.

The fire was reported by the next door neighbor about midnight on March 1.

Deerwood Fire Chief Mike Bodle said that the investigation of the fire was determined to be arson by the State Fire Marshalls Office, the Deerwood Police Deparment and Deerwood Fire Department.

Fire Chief Bodle said, "We are continuing to investigate. We have some leads. We encourage the public to call into the arson hotline 1-800-723-2020, if they have information. There is up to a \$5,000 reward for information leading to the identification of the people responsible."

Fire Chief Bodle said if the public remembers seeing anyone hanging around in the evening Tuesday, Feb 28, especially someone that didn't belong there, they should call the hotline.

"Anything from descriptions, to names, to number

## Crosby garbage rates lower and billing will come from the city

Citing cost savings to residents, the City of Crosby Council, at its February 27 meeting, reversed its previous decision to have Range Disposal direct bill residents, following a year and a half of discussion and legal fees. Instead the City of Crosby will continue to bill residents along with their water usage.

Mayor Jim Hunter was the tie breaker in favor of the motion along with Councilmen Jim Goshey and Jim Traylor Councilmen. Paul Heglund and Ron Prushek voted against the motion.

The City of Crosby will return to the old 2011 contract rates and agreement. With this decision, Crosby residents will benefit for five years with the lower 2011 base rate structure. In addition, self hauling will not be allowed. The administrative fee would likely be increased from \$1 per household per month, because according to Clerk/Treasurer Lisa Sova the city was losing money.

## 3rd Street SW project bond-

Bond and local bank financing options for the 3rd Street SW project were discussed by Rusty Fifield, Northland Securities and Mayor Hunter. Fifield indi-

cated the city's bond rating expense would probably be more than offset by their interest rate savings by attracting additional investors. Hunter asked, if on \$1.44 million the interest rate would be at 2.23 percent. It was verified that the bond rate would be 2.23 percent from Northland Securities. An estimated fee cost for bonding from Northland Securities would be a total of \$37,750.

Mayor Hunter indicated he checked with a local bank and got preliminary approval to finance the project at a 2.23 percent on a 10 or 12 year term without all the fees.

Fifield said typically the local banks rates are usually a little higher, but would save about 66 percent on the fees. Northland Securities can provide the council with a cost comparison between the Northland Securities bonding and the local bank financing. Fifled said waiting to make comparison would still meet the June funding requirements. The council and Mayor agreed to have Northland provide a comparison on a 10 and 12 year term at the next council meeting.

The fee for the first quarter of the year will be a lower price that the last three quarters. The reason for the increase was due to the City of Tromald and Wolford Township discontinuing service from Crosby, after the first quarter of 2017. Council approved the 2017 fire protection fee. Promotion

It was decided to table the issue of 4th of July parade and fireworks advertising donation until Chief DeCent could be at the meeting.

Jessica Holmvig Cuyuna Lakes Chamber Director presented information about four events and visitors guide ad for 2017, asking the city for advertising donations of \$10,500. Council approved the donation from with \$1,500 coming from economic development budget and \$9,000 from advertising

#### budget. **City Attorney Chosen**

Mayor Hunter introduced the topic of appointing a city attorney. Each councilman talked about their own ideas of criteria for submitting firms. Included ideas is the firm local, does the firm have municipal law experience and cost breakdown. The minimum specifications issued by the City of Crosby did list that firms should have municipal law experience. There was a desire to hire the local attorney of Severson Porter Law other than their lack of their municipal law experience. As a result, the council voted unanimously to hire Joseph Langel of Ratwik, Roszak & Maloney, P.A. That firm is also attorney for both Deerwood and Ironton.

#### **Planning and Zoning**

Planning and Zoning Specialist Justin Burslie presented the eight changes included in Ordinance 2017-01 revising chapter 13 of the City of Crosby Code of Ordinances. Council approved these ordinance revisions. Burslie then asked the council for input into the recommendation for the council member representation. Currently, there are four members and one alternate on the Planning and Zoning Board with two council liaisons. The main questions was whether the council members should have a vote on both the

Planning and Zoning Board and the Council. It was decided that ultimately the two council members should only vote once at the City Council and not vote on the Planning and Zoning Board. Other

City Engineer Phil Martin indicated the bids came in about 15 percent under what was anticipated for the 3rd Street SW project. Which was

good news. Clerk/Treasurer Sova indicated the Quit Claim Deed conveying real property to the Serpent Lake Sewer District had two problems that need to be resolved. First, was the City of Crosby was referred to as the Village and there was a problem with the utility easement language. Once both of those issues are resolved then the resolution could move forward.

Andrew Hooks gave a report on the economic development workshop meeting. He indicated the four areas being addressed were the Hwy 210 project, business incubators and what could be done to attract manufacturing, what to do to fill empty buildings, developing a revolving loan fund and developing a marketing plan for Crosby.

Mayor Hunter presented an idea he learned of at some training he and councilman Traylor were at. The idea of having a workshop before the council meeting to discuss issues. If this was implemented, the council meetings could be reduced to once per month. It was decided to continue with two council meetings per month and workshops, as needed like they have been doing.

## Caution on rapidly deteriorating ice

As unseasonably warm weather quickly deteriorates ice conditions on lakes across much of the state, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources urges lake recreationists to take

caution. "The freeze-thaw cycle produces extremely weak ice that is dangerously deceptive in its appearance and how thick it measures," said Lisa Dugan, recreation safety outreach coordinator with the DNR's boat and water program. "Considering the continuous number of days with above freezing temperatures the ice is rapidly melting, even clearing in many parts of the state."

The mandatory date for ice shelter removal is March 6 for the southern part of Minnesota and March 20 for the northern part of the state. However, county sheriffs may prohibit or restrict the use of motorized vehicles if dangerous ice conditions are present. The DNR recommends no vehicle traffic and the removal of ice shelters on lakes that are being affected by the thaw.

"We've had reports of anglers falling through ice that was just fine an hour earlier. That's how fast things

can change," Dugan said. "If you do choose to venture onto unsafe ice, use extreme caution. Use a chisel to check the strength of the ice frequently and be sure to wear a life jacket or float

As the sun gains strength with the onset of spring, ice conditions can change dramatically within a matter of hours even when the air temperature may remain cold.

Dugan also emphasized doubling the DNR's ice thickness recommendations for ice that has thawed and refrozen. Old ice is only half as strong as new, clear ice.

of people [with unknown] names," he said, "we encourage the public to call in with any kind of information.

According to Bodle, the fire started between Salem WEST and the neighbor's garage in a temporary structure that was not owned by Salem WEST. The fire then quickly spread to the Salem WEST building.

According to Greg Meyer, Deacon at Salem Lutheran Church in Deerwood, because of smoke, fire and water damage the building and contents at Salem WEST (primarily household items, bedspreads, pillows, clothing, lamps as well as office items) are a total loss.

## Lake and River Friendly Awards for shoreland stewardship and protection

Brainerd Lakes area and statewide environmental organizations are joining together to publicly recognize those that have chosen to implement practices or efforts to protect this region's most important resources, our lakes and rivers.

To nominate a lake or river friendly protection effort worthy of recognition, either submit a completed application, or simply complete the first part of the application, and the nominee will be contacted to see if they wish to be entered into the contest. Nominations should be received by March 15, full applications are due by March 31, 2017. Contact Tasha Laurer, tasha. lauer@crowwingswcd.org or call 218-828-6197 for more information or application.

Categories for consideration of the Lake and River Friendly Awards include Home or Business Construction for a homeowner, business owner, or a contractor who has undertaken new home construction or major reconstruction while preserving the environmental integrity of the natural lakeshore or river shore setting.

Shoreland Stewardship is awarded for the use of native vegetation and mostly natural materials to landscape their riparian property in a manner that not only complies with local shoreland regulations, but goes even further to protect the shoreline's environmental integrity in a way that can potentially improve water


Protection Strategy is awarded to an organization

or a local unit of government that has created an ordinance, or regulatory code, or other initiative that officially seeks to preserve the environmental integrity of our lake and river systems.

Stewardship is awarded to recognize a riparian property owner who protects water quality by simply leaving their shoreline in a non-disturbed natural state, which can include maintaining shoreland and aquatic vegetation, tree canopy, screening of structures for aesthetics, and non-removal of woody debris from the water. This award could also be used to recognize the use of a conservation easement to permanently protect a significant piece of shoreline.

Eligibile are lake and river friendly protection efforts within the following counties: Cass, Crow Wing, Aitkin, Morrison, Todd, northern Mille Lacs, or southeastern Wadena counties.


