The third meeting in the broadband planning process, at stake are \$75,000 in possible in grants for community projects and \$25,000 for a broadband feasibility study for the county.

Wagner noted that only 27 percent of county residents have broadband access at the state standard of 25MB/3MB. The group agreed they'd like that increased to 100 percent.

What makes Aitkin County so attractive -- lakes and woods and trees -- stops signals. "Trees kinda eat the wireless signals," said Coleman, "especially pine trees. It's harder to serve hilly areas with lots of trees. God made the prairie for wireless and he made Aitkin County for hunting and fishing."

Aitkin County's income is

gional average and the closest colleges are in Brainerd and Grand Rapids. "We see lots of unemployed people from October to February," said Kari Paulsen of the Workforce Center. "Most job applications are online and workers need access to request benefits online. They have to be able to navigate a computer. We help lots of their men in their 50s to access benefits."

It was discussed that cooperatives such as Mille Lacs Energy and Consolidated Telecommunications Company may be better able to afford to make long-term investments in broadband infrastructure more than the for-profit carriers can.

After breaking into small groups and ranking ideas, the group came up with the following priorities:

Work with providers on a survey of the community.

Educate local officials and the public about the importance of broadband.

Expand broadband access and speed

Establish multiple video conferencing centers in the community and PCs for People, a program that provides refurbished computers for \$70 each.



Bald eagles migrating back Minnesota 1-2 weeks ahead of historical dates



Bald eagles are migrating back to Minnesota and may be seen in large numbers across parts of the state over the next few weeks, according to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

The spring eagle migration usually coincides with ice-out. A warm February melted much of the snow cover, and ice is breaking up along the rivers, said DNR regional Nongame Wildlife specialist Lisa Gelvin-Innvaer. "Because of that, this year's migration appears to be a couple weeks earlier, so folks in southern Minnesota will be seeing eagles soon, even with the last remnants of winter," she said. "We're already seeing small groups of eagles along the Minnesota River."

Only two states, Florida and Alaska, have greater nesting populations of bald eagles than Minnesota. In 2005, researchers estimated there are more than 1,300 ac-

tive nests in Minnesota. Fall migration typically occurs as lakes and rivers freeze over, since most eagles prefer a diet of fish. Bald eagle

grounds ideally contain open water, ample food, limited human disturbance and protected roosting sites. As their population increases, however, some eagles have become tolerant of some disturbance, particularly traffic, choosing to nest near busy highways or in very urban habitats. To supplement their diets in winter, eagles also prey on mammals and other birds, and will often be seen on roadsides eating carrion.

Not all bald eagles migrate southward in the fall, Gelvin-Innvaer said. In many areas in Minnesota, it's common for some eagle pairs to stay the winter, especially during milder winters and wherever there is open water.

"This year's winter was a bit milder," she said. "There were fewer subzero nights and not as much snow on the ground as some other years. That should have made for an easier winter for them to

find food."

Bald eagles that stay local may begin courting and nesting as early as December or January. Other bald eagles return to their breeding territories as soon as a food source is available.

"Eagles tend to vary their migration routes, so it's hard to say exactly where the eagles are right now," Gelvin-Innvaer said. In Minnesota, the biggest migrations tend to be along the Minnesota River corridor, the north shore of Lake Superior and around Lake Pepin in southeastern Minnesota.

Adult bald eagles are easily identified by a white head and tail contrasting with a dark brown body. Bald eagles attain full adult plumage in their fourth or fifth year. In flight, bald eagles are sometimes confused with turkey vultures. Bald eagles can be distinguished by their tendency to soar on flat, board-like wings, while turkey vultures fly with their wings in a V-shape.

The bald eagle's recovery is a success story and an example of how they and many other wildlife species benefit directly from donations made to the Nongame Wildlife checkoff on Minnesota tax forms. For the past forty years, checkoff dollars have been used to fund research, surveys and education for more

than 900 nongame wildlife were almost gone from our species. When the checkoff began, bald eagles, peregrine falcons and trumpeter swans

New Jack Pine Brewery facility to open in May, welcomes head brewer

What started with a small online Kickstarter campaign in 2012, has now become something much bigger. Patrick Sundberg never dreamed that his operation would grow this quickly, but thanks to loyal customers, a solid demand for wholesale, and the continued production of award-winning beer, Jack Pine Brewery is growing ahead of his projections.

"I'm just amazed at how this has grown over the years. When I started, I expected to be drinking beer with the same 12 people every Friday night in the taproom," said Sundberg, Jack Pine's owner, founder, and brewer. "I never thought my beer would be so widely accepted, but I'm ecstatic that it is."

Not only are his goals growing, but his team is as well. Kevin Clark will become Jack Pine Brewery's head brewer when the new location opens on Edgewood Drive in Baxter.

Clark first spent five years as head brewer at Peter B's Brewpub in Monterey, California. After moving to Minnesota with his wife and young son, he helped build Urban Lodge Brewery and Restaurant in Sauk Rapids, while living in Pequot Lakes. The shorter commute and opportunity to be part of the growing team at Jack Pine Brewery provided inspiration for Clark.

"I saw the vision Patrick has for the community and brewery and I'm thrilled to say that I will be part of his crew," said Clark. "My expertise is in Lagers, Belgian Ales and India Pale Ales, but I also love a good raspberry ale. I have started two successful barrel programs. One of my favorites was a barley wine aged in tequila barrels. I love

the production of beer and sense of community that it creates!"

Located just south of Arrowwood Lodge, the new 7,400 square foot facility will allow for an increase in annual production from 900 barrels to 2,000 - the equivalent of 27,600 cases of beer. When Jack Pine Brewery originally opened it had four taplines; the new taproom will have 26.

Food will not be provided by the brewery but Sundberg hasn't ruled out the possibility of having various food trucks in the parking lot. And customers will be invited to bring in their own food, not unlike the current taproom. The new building will also have outdoor seating and a meeting room - available for overflow or to rent. Nor-Son's local construction team broke ground last October.

"We are on schedule for a Spring opening," said Nor-Son's project manager Nathan Norton.

"The project has been a real success thanks to Patrick's involvement and personal commitment to the business."

"There are some very unique aspects to the building; things that will make it easier to see from Highway 371," said Jesse Hopkins, Nor-Son's lead architect for the project. "Our team is proud to be a part of the project and look forward to joining Patrick and his team at the grand opening."



On February 27, Mille Lacs Energy Cooperative (MLEC) testified at the Senate Committee Hearing on Jobs and Economic Growth Finance and Policy on broadband funding for rural Minnesota. Stacy Cluff of MLEC spoke in support of increasing funding for broadband grants available to rural areas; changing grant terms by reducing the required match; and determining funding amounts for a two year period.

During her testimony, Cluff stated "MLEC is committed to investing in our members and community; however we are unable to undertake the level of financial risk of extending fiber to all our rural members without financial assistance."

Without broadband, rural communities do not have the same access to educational tion Systems and Technolopportunities, health care options, and employment and economic development opportunities. Our communities need broadband to attract and retain people, grow businesses, educate our children and adequately care for our seniors.

For rural areas like Aitkin and Mille Lacs County, the grant program is extremely important.

Increasing the funding available and reducing the match would allow MLEC to plan and pursue additional projects. Cluff said "let's hope history can repeat itself by cooperatives connecting rural Minnesotan's to broadband, just as they connected them to electricity 75 years ago."

Stacy Cluff is the Informa-

ogy Administrator at Mille Lacs Energy Cooperative and serves on the Blandin Foundation Broadband Strategy Board.

About MLEC

MLEC is a not-for-profit, electric distribution cooperative owned by the members we serve. They provide service to over 13,000 members in parts of Aitkin, Crow Wing, and Mille Lacs counties.

Their headquarters is located at 36559 US Highway 169, one mile east of Aitkin, MN. MLEC and Consolidated Telecommunications Company (CTC) from Brainerd were the recipient of a 2076 Border-to-Border Broadband grant to extend fiber-to-thehome to approximately 850 members.
