




Who are the heroes in your hometown? Do you know them? I am proud of the Como-Pickton CISD Junior class for the "Hometown Heroes" project about the quality of courage that they have undertaken. I was invited to the school to see what the project was about and talked with students Briley Adcock, Jorge Solis and Maria Rodriguez.



Mrs. Wilder, an English teacher, is on the Hometown Heroes Task Force along with a dozen other community leaders from school, politics, law enforcement and media. Mrs. Wilder is allowing her students exposure to the different types of courage at work in the community by interviewing individuals. Some of these individuals have made news already. Other stories are life experiences of everyday people which will probably never make the news. All the interviews have value in this study about courage. Following the interview process, video, photos and audio will be combined to create Public Service Announcements about the individuals. This unusual class project will honor local heroes who act with courage. I wish to say Thank You to Mrs. Wilder and Como-Pickton CISD for your sincere efforts to point out the good things in our community, a great place to learn, live and work!

DEBORAH JUST CAN'T STOP WRITING Tumbleweed Smith



I met Debra Burkett a few years ago when she had just retired from a 21-year career of teaching medical doctors (she has a PhD in the field of medical education) and moved onto some family land near Mixon in Cherokee County. Although she grew up in Florida, she spent summers with her grandparents who lived on that East Texas land.

Deborah is an adventurous sort. In the 1970's she took a teaching job in Alaska. "They were paying big salaries for teachers back then," she says, "a lot more than I was making as a teacher in Houston. I went to Alaska on a whim and stayed there eight years. My parents had recently died and I was getting away, trying to explore a new life." Her house in the woods has artifacts from her time in Alaska.

Deborah became interested in local and area history and got involved with historical groups. She put her research skills to work and collaborating with other kindred souls started producing books. One is about veterans; another is the history of the community of Troup, where she had an antique store for a number of years. It was while she had the store that she almost got completely consumed by quilts. She had an annual quilt show at her store and met many quilters. She produced a handsome coffee-table book about quilts that has become sort of the encyclopedia of quilting. It is full of pictures and stories from the quilt makers. In fact the title is Quilts and Their Stories. It's 357 pages and is documented like a dissertation.

Deborah can't get away from her time spent doing diligent research. She loves digging through old newspapers, magazines, personal letters, archives and interviewing the people who appear in her books. She took an oral history seminar from Baylor University to learn how to conduct interviews and what to do with them. She uses a video camera on her interviewing trips. "I know it sounds hokey, but doing this interviewing, researching and writing has really changed my life because after I work on a project for a long time, the people I talk to (or listen to) become like family."

Deborah makes speeches about some of the women whose stories she has discovered. In one of her presentations she mentioned four women who hiked from Colorado to Texas in 1914 to protest women not being allowed to vote. Someone told her those women had spunk. That triggered something in Deborah's mind and she set out to find stories about spunky women in East Texas. After about three years that effort resulted in a book titled East Texas Piney Woods Spunky Women 1830s-1950s. It is 240 pages and is full of photos and stories. It is her latest book and is just now available. The book is dedicated to Angelina, an Indian woman who served as a translator and guide to Spanish and French explorers in the early 1700s. Angelina County is named for her. It's the only county in Texas named for a woman.

As Deborah was putting away her equipment after interviewing a woman in her 90's who had worked in a bra factory in Jacksonville, the woman said in addition to her duties at a sewing machine, she was also a model. "I was a perfect 36," she said.
