





Remember that for a \$25.00 donation to American Legion Post 31 to support their effort to buy a van for their color guard to attend military funerals, we will write you a simple Will.

Joel and I practice accident and injury law and as part of that type of practice we handle cases involving death. A question came up this week about the effect of a Will on proceeds arising from a lawsuit where a person was killed or died.

In this particular case the person who passed away had left a Will leaving everything to his wife, who in this case survived him, but he

named the children to receive his property if she died first. In this case, the person who died had Mesothelomia which is a disease that only arises from the exposure to asbestos. Joel and I handle Mesothelomia and asbestosis cases and have for years.

There is about to be money distributed as a result of this lawsuit and the children are upset because their mother was left everything in the Will.

Wills have no effect upon wrongful death proceeds. Wrongful death proceeds from a lawsuit (or mass tort actions like asbestosis) are distributed to the natural heirs at law according to the laws of descent and distribution without regard to any existing Will. This means that children, spouses, and other natural heirs have to be identified so that their share of the money can be distributed according to law. We do this fairly frequently and an issue that occasionally arises is where there is a known but unrecognized illegitimate child. This invariably creates a problem.






Kidney Transplantation – Part 1

Dialysis and kidney transplantation are the current treatment options for severe kidney failure, also called chronic kidney disease stage 5, and end-stage renal disease (ESRD). There are different artificial kidney models that are being evaluated but none of these are quite ready for primetime.

Essentially, there are two modalities of dialysis: hemodialysis and peritoneal dialysis. When the kidneys are no longer functioning effectively, waste products, electrolytes, and fluid build up in the blood. Patients often also become anemic. Dialysis can take over a large part of the function of the failing kidneys to remove the excess fluid and waste products. However, Kidney transplantation can more effectively take over the function of the failing kidneys.

Kidney transplantation is the organ transplant of a kidney into a patient with end-stage renal disease. A kidney transplant is classified either as deceased-donor (previously referred to as cadaveric) or living donor transplantation depending on the source of the donor organ. Living-donor kidney transplants are further categorized as genetically related (living-related) or nonrelated (living-unrelated) transplants, depending on whether a biological relationship exists between the donor and recipient.

A successfully transplanted kidney can often function as a patient's own healthy, native, kidneys would. As a result, a kidney transplant recipient would no longer need dialysis. They would not have such strict dietary and fluid intake restrictions. They often would not require several medications which they needed while on dialysis. However, they would need to take certain medications, referred to as immunosuppressants, for the life of the transplanted kidney.



Although patients with ESRD of all ages can get a kidney transplant, not everyone is a suitable candidate for a transplant. Any individual being considered for a transplant requires a complete medical and psychosocial evaluation. Kidney transplant recipients must be healthy enough to undergo the operation. They must also be free from cancer and active infection. For many people, getting a kidney transplant can be an excellent treatment choice.

He is from St. George's Grenada where he completed his Doctorate of Medicine in June 2003 before coming to the United States to complete his Nephrology training.

Dr. Matthew is board certified in Nephrology and Internal Medicine from the American Board of Internal Medicine and recognized as a Specialist in Clinical Hypertension by the American Society of Hypertension. He also completed a mini-fellowship program in Renal Ultrasonography at Emory University.

Dr. Matthew has active privileges at Helen Keller, ECM & Shoals Hospitals as well as DaVita Dialysis. He is a member of the American Society of Hypertension, American Society of Transplantation, American Society of Nephrology, National Kidney Foundation and others. He has been active with research and has been published in several medical journals.



Medicare Minute

"Part B Deductible Problems"

As we have stated in previous articles, Medicare Part B has an annual deductible of \$183. This deductible begins on January 1 of each year or, if you go on Medicare in the middle of the year, it begins the month your Medicare starts. If you have Original Medicare only, you will pay the first \$183 of Part B claims you have and then 20% of the claims after that. If you have a Medicare supplement that does not cover the Part B deductible, you pay the first \$183 of Part B claims and your supplement should take care of the 20% Medicare doesn't pay.

However, the Part B deductible can cause confusion for both the patient and the provider. Let's say, hypothetically, that you have not had any Part B charges in 2017. Let's also assume that you have a Plan G supplement that pays the 20% Medicare doesn't pay, after the deductible is met. On April 27th you go to your primary care doctor and the visit costs \$200. Because you had not previously met your Part B deductible, you would be responsible for paying the first \$183 to satisfy your deductible. Your supplement would then pick up the rest. On April 29th you have an appointment with a specialist and they also charge \$200 for the visit. Because you satisfied your deductible on your primary care doctor visit you shouldn't owe anything at your specialist.

The problem is this; because the two appointments are so close together Medicare's system may not show that you had paid anything toward your deductible on your visit to the primary care doctor. Therefore, when you go to your specialist two days later, they will also try to collect the deductible. The solution is to politely ask your specialist to re-file the claim in a couple of weeks. This should give Medicare's system time to reflect that you had met your deductible and you shouldn't owe any money to your





Don't Say 'Yes' When You Receive a Robocall

Don't get caught by the latest robocall scam. First off, you might ask, "What is a Robocall?" A Robocall is a phone call that uses a computer ded message as to deliver a pre-recorded message, as if from a robot. Robocalls are often associated with political and telemarketing phone campaigns, but can also be used for public-service or emergency announcements. Basically if you answer the phone and hear a recorded message instead of a live person, it's a robocall. If the recording is a sales message and you have not given your written permission to get calls from the company on the other end, the call is illegal.

As part of the latest scam, the computerized caller, instead of mentioning who they are, instead asks "Can you hear me?" If you say 'Yes" that you can hear the robocall, your reply of 'Yes" is recorded and then used to authorize freedulent charges via telephone. used to authorize fraudulent charges via telephone on utility or credit card accounts. This is according to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). The FCC recently issued a consumer alert against just such scammers. They are saying the scam is prevalent, based on complaints the agency has received and from news reports across the U.S. The fraudulent callers may impersonate familiar organizations to get you to answer and talk.

Also, according to FCC chairman, Ajit Pai, "Robocalls are the number one consumer complaint to the FCC from the public. Every month, U.S. consumers are bombarded by an estimated 2.4 billion robocalls". In March, the commission voted to begin a rulemaking process to eliminate robocalls.

"Not only are unwanted robocalls intrusive and irritating, but they are also frequently employed to scam our most vulnerable populations, like elderly Americans, out of their hard-earned dollars," Pai said.

So, what should you do if you receive a Robocall? Hang up immediately or don't even answer, especially if it is from an unknown number.

If you have gotten a call such as this, review your credit card and telephone bills immediately, as well as your bank statement for unauthorized charges. If there are unauthorized charges, immediately report the incident to the FCC Consumer Help Center at the following web address (www.consumercomplaints. fcc.gov). If you have the number saved in your phone, write the number down and add that to your FCC complaint.

I personally have all my family and other loved one's telephone numbers registered with the National Do Not Call Registry and I suggest you do so as well. It is very easy to do. Just go to www.donotcall.gov and follow the directions.





The U.S. continues to develop new clean and renewable energy resources to replace aging, carbonemitting generating facilities. Lightly populated rural areas provide ample space for this new development, wind energy.

Rural communities stand to benefit from new economic activity, tax revenue, and short- or longterm project employment.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics noted that the fastest growing profession in the country is wind turbine technicians. The Department of Energy estimates the wind energy industry could support up to 380,000 jobs by 2030, a significant increase over the current 88,000 jobs.

While rural areas have significant potential to generate renewable wind energy, development has traditionally been hindered by a lack of means to transmit that power.




