Elkhart Lake Improvement Association joined with over 560 attendees from more than 175 groups, to participate in the Annual Wisconsin Lakes Partnership Convention in Stevens Point, WI, which ran from April 5-7, 2017.

Titled "Minding Our Waters," the convention brought together people from local lake associations, farmer-led conservation teams, state and regional DNR staff, county conservation staff, and educators from around the state to share information on topics from managing invasives, to local farmer-led conservation programs, legislative updates, fisheries, citizen led watershed management plans, and much more.


This annual event brings together the people who are really the "boots on the ground" helping to make things happen in relation to water quality, water management, and environmental enhancement for Wisconsin lakes and streams.

With reductions in funding and staffing at the DNR and local county offices, it is more important than ever for local groups, supported by these talented agencies, step forward to implement programs and projects that enhance the water quality and quality of life for our waters in Wisconsin.

Today, ELIA is working closely with the Sheboygan County Office of Planning and Environment on a point source pollution problem on the south shore of Elkhart Lake. With the help of local landowners and farmers, this project will help significantly reduce the amount of phosphorous



that is entering the lake. # "Spring"

The parentheses simply highlight the unfortunate fact that Wisconsin doesn't actually have what might be called a "spring." May is the would-be spring month we never really have. We have a snow-covered winter, a hot and humid summer, and a beautiful and colorful fall. But spring? No way.


I only became aware of this fact when I lived in England doing my graduate work in the 1960s. Flowers blossomed, bushes grew thick and tall, and even the trees responded to the warm sunny weather. Residents seemed to take a personal pride in their gardens and yards as spring sprung forth in all its beauty and glory.

My other experience and enjoyment of a real spring came during the years I lived in Washington, DC, while completing my graduate work. Part of what was so lovely was the variety of flowers and shrubbery, which I had never seen before, but which was quite common to Washington parks, gardens, and lawns.

A Wisconsin spring in contrast consists of rain, mist, periodic weak sunshine, but mostly clouds, cold weather, and drab foliage. Summer, in contrast, brings forth hot weather, but wilted flowers and bushes. Where did all the colorful flowers go? It reminds one of the poem "Spring has sprung, the grass is ris" I wonder where the flowers is?" Not in a Wisconsin spring!

But there is at least one compensation for our icy winters, hot and humid summers, and nonexistent springs, we do have a gorgeous autumn—usually from late September to early November. It is in the fall when the leaves dress themselves in bright reds and golds, that we can enjoy the autumn—a season more beautiful and colorful than any other can offer.

So, perhaps we should be willing to compromise, we'll live with Wisconsin winters of snow and ice, its summers of heat and humidity—and the absence of anything resembling a spring. But at least give us the crisp freshness of autumn breezes and the colors of autumn foliage. Wisconsin falls compare with all the best.

# Fitness studio expanding site

In its fourth year of business SOEL-Elkhart Lake is excited about changes in the wind for its business.

Ellen Dupuy and Lynn Shovan, owner of Lake Street Cafe, an avid SOELdier, have combined their talents to continue building SOEL as Elkhart Lake's premier fitness studio. They work well together, creating a personable and inviting environment.

In 2017, they are expanding the Elkhart Lake fitness studio to include bigger workout spaces and more class offerings.

A key reason for the expansions is Ellen's expanded training. This year she has grown her knowledge and experience in yoga, undergoing more than 200 hours of training.

As a result, the menu of SOEL training opportunities is expanding to include more yoga classes, as well as private yoga sessions for clients.

SOEL is also using her additional training in fitness to expand into areas of strength, weight lifting and resistance training, as well as specialized TRX training (total body exercise).

<sup>4</sup>With Ellen's expanded training, we have also decided to expand our space to be able to include the new varieties of training classes," Lynn said.

Additional garage space on the west end of the SOEL studio is being targeted for special events and other training opportunities.

"It gives us a cooler spaces, with the ability to open the doors on either end to create a more open space. It has the feel of being outside, without being truly out in the open," she added.

#### More space options

The expanded space, nearly doubling the size of the facility, has also opened up room for a new reception area and a retail/ boutique space for SOEL.

In the boutique, SOEL offers fitness products as well as featuring apparel from After Dinner Print, Ellen's company that

designs and prints shirts and other apparel on site.

The retail offerings though small in number at this time, are expected to grow.

SOEL's concept of fitness training offers opportunities for people to work out in a small group setting.

Nearly 20 fitness classes are offered each week, with varying group sizes.

"People really form valuable relationships working with the instructor and with others. They form bonds between them that help support them in their training goals," Ellen said. "The encouragement and support people find in a group setting is so important to everyone."

Lynn added that the SOEL environment is more like a boutique gym. "We are attracting people that don't want to go to the big cookie cutter gyms and hang out with a million other people," she added.

At SOEL, the individual is guided by a trainer/instructor to help formulate a plan for training. Instructors guide participants in the proper training methods and form. "Beyond helping to reduce injuries," Lynn said, "the trainer will help you push harder than you might on your own."

While SOEL originally appealed most to Elkhart Lake area residents and tourism guests, its reach is now including clientele from Kiel, Plymouth and other area communities.

Many who participate in classes at SOEL come to the studio in their workout attire. SOEL does offer changing facilities for those who require them.

Reservations for classes are recommended. Other accommodations can be made by individual appointment.

"We have people coming for all kinds of events....including girls nights out, bachelorette parties, or even fitness classes before dinner," Lynn said.

"We are willing to do special events as well as individualized services and planning," Ellen added.

Captain Alicia K. Grados will be the featured speaker. Alicia grew up in Elkhart Lake and graduated from Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School. She earned a Bachelor of Business Administration from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh and a Master of Science in Information Technology from the Florida Institute of Technology.



# Milhome Nursery turns 20 Starting point for your beautiful gardens and landscaping

for the Depot Dispatch Art and Candy VanderWaal have been

giving your beautiful gardens and landscape a start for the 20 years at Millhome Nursery and Greenhouses.

They celebrate their 20th season as owners of the nursery, gardening and landscape business this spring season, though Art actually worked one year prior for a previous owner, when the business was founded in 1996.

He recalls quitting his teaching job in 1996 to the join the original owner for the new greenhouse business.

By December of that year, he received word that the owner was putting the business up for sale, and the die was cast. The VanderWaals would give the business a shot, purchasing Millhome Nursery & Greenhouses in May 1997.

"We learned more that year than we did in our entire lives leading up to it," Art said. "Learning the retail business and how to make it work were vital to our success."

He added that a lot of neighboring green house owners were helpful in assisting Millhome Nursery & Greenhouses establish pricing, determining what to grow, when to grow it and all other aspects of the business.

The VanderWaals continue to value the support of their industry peers. "The Commercial Flower Growers of Wisconsin is a great organization," Art said. "They get together on a monthly basis and talk about the business. It's a great chance to sit around with other growers and just share ideas. That's neat."

#### **Evolution of business**

In their 20-year history, both Art and Candy have evolved in their professional careers and their work at the nursery/ greenhouse business.

Three years into the venture, while landscaping at his former principal's house, Art was lured back to his old teaching job. "I was asked to fill in for a while," he

said. "It turned out to be 14 years."

Last year, he had the opportunity to retire from teaching for good, as Art stepped down from a part time position in the Kiel Area School District, as an agriculture educator along with David Friend at Kiel High School.

Candy, on the other hand, was weaning herself from a nursing career. As Art returned to teaching, she took on more of the duties with the nursery and greenhouses.

#### Your beautiful gardens

"Though we have been at the business now for 20 years, we like to think that we are not simply getting older, but better at what we do," Candy said.


Millhome Nursery and Greenhouses continues to emphasize its core theme "Your beautiful gardens start here."

#### Busy throughout the year

To most people it may seem like spring is the business season at the nursery busi-

ness. While the retail portion of the business picks up tremendously from mid-April to mid-June, the planning, growing and decorating seasons are a year round proposition for the VanderWaals.

"We get a lot of our planting started by the end of January," Candy said.

"Even as things start to taper off toward the end of June, we are already thinking about upcoming seasons. The seasons truly keep overlapping each other. We already have our mums and poinsettias ordered. By Thanksgiving we have to get our orders in for plugs and plants, otherwise we will miss out on the best available things for the following spring."

At Christmas time, the order starts being prepped for Easter lilies, shipped in by a remote vendor.

#### Landscaping services

Starting on the cold days of January, calls are beginning to come in for landscaping and design work that begins in the cold spring, but continues throughout the growing season.

Millhome Nursery and Greenhouses offers landscape design, installation and maintenance services.

One of their true niches in Elkhart Lake and the surrounding area is handling landscape maintenance for absentee owners.

"We mow, fertilize, mulch and take care of properties so that when the owners come up for the weekend, they can put their feet up, relax and enjoy their properties," Art said.

Early in the year, time is spent with cleanups and getting mowing equipment ready for the grass growing season.

Last year, the mowing business carried well into November due to the positive growing conditions.

"It's a great part of the business. We

love to see a design come together, seeing it from start to finish. And, you get to be outside all summer," Art said. Most of landscaping work is done in Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Calumet and Fond du Lac Counties.

#### **Retail side of business**

On the retail side of the business, Millhome Nursery and Greenhouses offers a wide variety of products including—

- annuals;
- trees and shrubs;
- fruit trees and shrubs;
- aqua plants;
- planters and baskets;
- seasonal accents;
- perennials; and

gardening supplies.

Planters are a significant segment of the business, as Candy directs the preparation

of planters for customers who bring them in for her to fill.

A large number of customers are from the business and resort sector, when people simply run short of time to do it themselves.

"We prepare the planters and drop them off by Memorial Day—and they have something that looks like it's been growing for months," Candy said.

"We are able to get things growing in the greenhouse where it's safe, and if something doesn't survive, we change it out. It takes all the worry out of planting for business owners and residents who don't want to worry about it."

# Warm weather heats up Y-Koda schedule

Along with the warm weather comes more fun events at Camp Y-Koda, including the Intro to Geocaching series on Saturdays, April 29 and May 6 and the High Ropes Family Challenge on Sunday, May 7. You can also sign up for a free canoe or kayak trip on the river on May 13, May 21 and June 10, or volunteer to help clean it up on May 20. Take the opportunity to get outside, enjoy nature and challenge yourself. At Camp Y-Koda's geocaching program, you will learn how to operate a GPS unit and use it to find hidden treasure, or caches, while enjoying a nature hike at a local park. The high ropes program will allow you to challenge yourself, family and friends on the many towering obstacles at Camp Y-Koda's high ropes course.

The Intro to Geocaching programs are a great introduction for those who have had little or no previous experience. You may participate in one or both sessions, which each take place at a different location. You will learn what geocaching is and how to locate caches hidden among nature by programming coordinates into a GPS unit. GPS units and instruction will be provided, with a pleasant nature hike along the way. This program is open to adults and children of all ages, however, children age 8 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Young children may have trouble operating the GPS unit on their own, but do enjoy the experience. The fee for each session is \$5 per person for Y members and \$8 per person for nonmembers with family discounts available.


Scaling a 40-foot wall and flying through the air is not just for super heroes - you can do it too. The High Ropes Family Challenge is your chance to challenge yourself and give it a try. The program is open to children ages 10 and older, who may attend without an adult, but parents/family members are encouraged to sign up as



well if they are up for the challenge. Participants will get to challenge themselves on the 40' Climbing Wall, the Giant's Ladder, Catwalk, Multivines, Swinging Chairs and the infamous Zip Line. The fee is \$18 per person for Y members or \$25 for non-members.

Get to know the Sheboygan River through our free events. Discovering the Sheboygan River Path is a series of canoe and kayak trips that will highlight a river mapping project that is in progress. Instruction and equipment will be provided, along with information about the stretch of the river being explored. Do your part to clean up the river by volunteering at the 11th Annual Sheboygan River Clean Up. Pick up litter on land or from a canoe and then join in a celebration at Camp Y-Koda after the work is done.

# ELIA joins conservation voters on legislative visit

The Elkhart Lake Improvement Association (ELIA) joined with the non-partisan Wisconsin League of Conservation Voters for their annual "Day with the Legislature" program in Madison.

The convention broke into small groups to visit with local legislators. Our representative, Jinny Jacob, was given a warm welcome by both Sen. Devin LeMahieu and with Rep. Tyler Vorpagel.

The annual "Day with Legislature" brought people from many groups to a single event, to visit our local legislators, telling the important stories: 1. Protecting our drinking water, 2. Funding Wisconsin State Parks, and 3. Removing Lead from Water Supplies. ELIA's focus on clean water activities aligns nicely with the overall Wisconsin League of Conservation Voters initiatives. Speaking as part of a much larger group adds more emphasis to these concerns.

# Mini golf, batting cages spell fun

Tom and Jerry Wieser once had to fight a major cartoon company about the right to use their own names to identify their business.

Fortunately, they weren't trying to portray the cartoon characters from film and TV in their business. They simply wanted to create a place to have fun—something they truly believed in, along with their wives.

From their vision, Tom & Jerry's Mini Golf and batting cages has grown as a fun spot for young people and families on Plymouth's north end.

The business got its start in 1994 when Tom and his wife Terri, joined forces with Jerry, and his wife Mary, to build the first of two 18-hole mini golf courses.

"We had been to Wisconsin Dells many times with our kids," Mary said. "And we were looking for something like that in our area."

About the same time, a mini-golf course in Elkhart Lake had just gone out of business, leaving a gap in that form of recreation.

"We built the course ourselves," Tom said. "We hired a mason to do the concrete work, but the rest we did on our own."

The Wiesers have managed Tom & Jerry's Mini Golf as a family operation ever since, with their children growing up to help in the business over the past 23 years. Today, they hire teens from the community and college students to help fill the open hours—between 12 and 13 young people each summer.

The business has expended to offer a second 18 hole course. The Shady Trails, the original 18 built among the shady trees on the lot, was enhanced by the Stoney Creek Course, built in 1998.

Batting cages have been available at Tom & Jerry's since 1996.

#### Wide age appeal

Tom & Jerry's offers recreational appeal to all ages.

"We seem to have hit another generation here," Terri said. "A lot of young adults are coming back to the area with their kids."

Tom & Jerry's draws a lot of family traffic from Plymouth, Elkhart Lake and the surround communities. In summer time, the mini golf and batting cages attract resort and camp guests.

"We get a lot of groups coming through here," Jerry said.

Some of the local youth camps use Tom & Jerry's as part of their activity schedule. But, the mini golf and batting cage business also attracts other youth groups, including school groups, summer school events, Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts, church youth groups. Tom & Jerry's is even a favorite spot for an area disabled adults group.

Family reunions and company picnics also book events into Tom and Jerry's.

Group discounts for golf are part of the amenities offered at Tom and Jerry's. Reservations are advised for larger groups

Picnic tables are located alongside the mini-golf courses, and serve as a great place for family picnics, birthday parties and other events. "We have a lot of moms who bring out the birthday cakes, but we also allow people to bring other food as well," Mary said.

"It's really a great place for people to host almost any event," Terri added. "It's a good date night spot for teenagers, and it's amazing to get so many requests for people to take their graduation and even wedding pictures out here. The convenient northside location in Plymouth pairs Tom & Jerry's with both the municipal swimming pool and the local skateboard park, offering an even wider recreational opportunity.

On Thursdays during the summer season, food trucks are located just around the corner at Badger Restoration and Wieser Cabinets, adding to the family atmosphere.

Thursdays are also senior citizen days, with special pricing for the 60+ crowd that wants to enjoy mini golf.

Wednesdays are Family Days, with golf reduced to \$5 for all ages.

Normal rates for 18 holes of mini golf are \$6.75 for adults, \$6 for children 12 and under and \$1 for children 3 and under. All players save \$1 on their second consecutive round.

Concessions offered at Tom and Jerry's include candy bars, nachos, soda, Gatorade, water, and the famous Tom and Jerry's Granitos—frozen non-alcoholic fruity drinks.

#### Batting cages attract many

Adding the batting cages to the park has been a bonus for Tom & Jerry's.

"It really gives people a chance to do both of the activities," Mary said. "We have the Quit Qui Oc softball complex right down the road, and we have a lot of players who stop in here to get some practice swings."

A lot of players on area teams have also come out to get extra practice.

Tom & Jerry's features six batting cages, three each devoted to hardball and slow pitch softball.

Three different speeds are offered in each of the hardball cages. Tokens are used for the cages, accounting for 15 pitches each. Rates can be reduced by purchasing VIP cards.

Similarly, patrons can purchase individual 18-hole rounds on the golf course or Fun Paks for families or adults.

Tom & Jerry's is open weekends in April, weather permitting (50 degrees or over) from noon to 6 p.m.

From May 1 to June 4, the hours are 4-7:30 p.m. Mondays through Fridays, and noon to 8 p.m. Saturdays, Sundays and Memorial Day.

From June 5 to August 30, the hours are 10:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Saturday and noon to 8 p.m. on Sundays.

Hours are noon to 8 p.m. on Labor Day Weekend. After Labor Day, the facilities are open Saturdays and Sundays from noon to 6:30 p.m.

The mini golf and batting cage facilities will close during inclement weather.







# ELGHS students trek to Lakeland



They represent a broad cross section of Wright's work after 1900, including Prairie style, a zoned home, Usonian public buildings, and his only realized true taproot tower. The lecture will be preceded by a complimentary reception featuring microbrews and light hors d' oeuvres, which will begin at 6:30 p.m.

Mark Hertzberg is the author and photographer of three books about Frank Lloyd Wright's work in Racine. His next book, a commission to write about Wright's Penwern estate on Delavan Lake, will be published by the Wisconsin Historical Society in the fall of 2018. Hertzberg chronicled daily life in Racine for The Journal Times for 33 years, first as a staff photographer and then as Director of Photography.

Wade House's fourth "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original" lecture will take place on Wright's birthday, Thursday, June 8 at 7 p.m. and will feature Ron McCrea, author of "Building Taliesin: Frank Lloyd Wright's Home of Love and Loss." Utilizing letters, memoirs, contemporary documents, and a stunning assemblage of photographs-many of which have never before been published—author Ron McCrea will tell the fascinating story of building Frank Lloyd Wright's Taliesin, which would be the architect's principal residence for the rest of his life.

Prior to Mr. McCrea's lecture on June 8, there will be a 6 p.m. exhibit opening for three "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original" displays: "A Taliesin Album: Rare Photographs of Frank Lloyd Wright's First Spring Green Home," "The Wright Carriages," and "Young Masters Workshop."

The "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original" monthly speaker series will take place at the Wade House Visitor Center located at W7965 Hwy. 23 in Greenbush, WI, halfway between Sheboygan and Fond du Lac. Admission to the "Wright in Racine" lecture on May 11 is complimentary. Admission to the exhibit opening and lecture "Building Taliesin: Frank Lloyd Wright's Home of Love and Loss" on June 8 is \$5 per adult.




#### Memorial Day Event May 27

#### **Boating Regulations**

1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 pm-10 a.m. each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).

6. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the second Sunday of June and ending the third Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

7. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 MPH on the water.

8. A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc., and during the times of high-volume boat activity.




