

Chaboya students take the gold in Science Olympiad

old medal science awards were proudly won by Chaboya students for the first time in school history. For the past 33 years, Science Olympiad has led a revolution in science education. Chaboya Middle School students excelled at Santa Clara County Regional Science Olympiad held recently at San Jose City College.

The event categories that the teams participated and won include Bottle Rocket, Crime Busters. Disease Detectives. Dynamic Planet, Experimental Design, Hovercraft, Invasive Species, Meteorology, Microbe Mission, Optics, Reach for the Stars, Tower, Write it Do it and Wright Stuff.

There were a total of 45 highly motivated students split into three teams; Red, White and Black. The teams participated in 23 events. 

A call for pedestrian safety echoes the memory of brave revered man in the Evergreen Community

od has sent us... when he calls we have to go..." this general statement is known in Sikhism.

Sukhdev Gill's tragic death did not have to occur. On March 21st, 2017, while using a crosswalk in front of the Tully Road library, Sukhdev was bluntly hit by a car and died the same day.

"I always met with Sukhdev most every day at the Gurdwara," said Gurdevsingh Sing, a close friend of Sukhdev. (The Gurdwara is a place of worship and a community gathering area in which the meaning is translated to, "Door to God.) "He was a good man, a Seva (Servant of God)."

Comments from Sukhdev's relatives and friends

"Sukhdev is my brother ... he started the Gurdwara with many others. He loved this holy place and came here most every day, said Sukdey's brother, Bob Gill. "Each day, he stood for

long periods of time with the honor of watching over (standing behind and fanning with sweeping motion over the holy book) which we call the Garanth. (The Garanth is composed of words of wisdom by many in the Sikh religion.) My brother is remembered fondly by his children, Davinder Gill, Aman Gill, Simran Gill and also my children. Parvinder Gill, Manpreet Gill and Gurneet Gill. Sukhdev is survived by his wife Darshan Kaur, and his sister, Kuldeep Kaur Bias, his children (as stated earlier), and his brothers, Dalgit Gill and myself...He loved coming to the Gurdwara most every day, rain or shine. People marveled at his dedication to the Sikh beliefs and all honored him greatly. He gave his time lovingly to everyone and was devoted to honoring the words in the Garanth,"

Another family friend named Satnam Soingh stated, "God bless him...we all appreciated all his efforts for what he did for our community."

Many declarations of honor were bestowed to Sukhdev Gill by our city of San Jose and higher levels of government.

'The following letter signed by all ten of our San Jose city councilmembers and Mayor Liccardo expressed his sentiment of honor for Sukhdev.

"March 20, 2017

Family of Sukhdev Singh Gill,

It is with great sadness that the San Jose City Council learned of the passing of Sukhdev. In reverence to him, we dedicated our meeting on March 7, 2017 in his honor and memory.

We know that this is a difficult time for you and we share in your grief. Sukhdev's public service and his genuine care for the less fortunate showed his dedication to building strong and thriving communities. His hard work and leadership, raising money for the San Jose Sikh Gurdwara, the largest Sikh Temple in the United States will always be remembered. Sukhdev was a wonderful example of a gracious, loving and a

kind community leader. Please know that we mourn with you, and we honor his life and the extraordinary example he leaves behind."

A note on safety

"As his brother, I also wish to express a note about safety to all in our community; the safety of the children, safety of the mothers, safety of the seniors, safety of the disabled as well as all others," said Bob. "We must be careful. If you drive from point A to point B, be aware! Do not text! Keep your mind on one thing when you drive, for God sake do this for all. In my brothers memory I wish all to reflect and honor safety in our lives;

Safety, Safety, Safety. Thank you all."


Additional comment of forgiveness

"To those whom inadvertently struck Sukhdev with their car while being distracted, I wish to say the following; In our community, the Sikh religion teaches that God encourages us to forgive," said Bob. "I forgive the people who caused this and I believe everyone should learn to forgive and forget and not carry on the sin of negativity," said Gill

Editor's note: At the Gurdwara on a recent sunny Sunday morning with a slight breeze of the fresh air, many stopped and looked out at the beautiful Evergreen valley below, it was heard that "Sukhdev is with us and he always will be." Those in the Sikh religion are known to be very brave and referred to as "faith protectors." It is seldom seen that a man might cry, but on that day some who were discussing Sukhdev's passing were touched so deeply by his memory that were seen softly privately crying. As each footstep carried them slowly down the hill, they turned away to wipe their eyes and clear their thoughtful tears. Some said out loud, "He will always be here


These Evergreen students are among approximately 30,000 students, faculty, professional staff and alumni to be initiated into Phi Kappa Phi each year. Membership

ay 12, 2017 marks the day that Cadwallader Elementary School located at 3799 Cadwallader Avenue San Jose, Ca. in the Evergreen School District will celebrate Fifty successful years since the opening of the school

All Cadwallader families, alumni, and the local community are invited to celebrate Cadwallader's Golden Anniversary at the school from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.

The celebration will pay tribute to the successes in the past and a look forward to a great future with staff and children of the school.

This gala celebration will include an innovative speaker who will give all an insight into what life was like in early Evergreen days. The talk will include history about who the school is named for, 1960's dances and games; a scavenger hunt and trivia will also be included.

A 25 year old time capsule has been dug up and will be on display as well as a new time capsule of current items. Some other fun activities on the agenda include a slide show, photo booth, a t-shirt design competition and you will be able to purchase a tile to later be displayed on site. Food trucks will be available during the program and a live DJ who is also a Cadwallader Alumni. Please save this date to come celebrate with Cadwallader.

Nirum Cadwallader

Nirum Cadwallader (1833-1890) was the great grandson of Ohio's Seneca County's Hopewell Township's first settler, Nathan Cadwallader. Nirum's father Samuel Cadwallader and wife Mary would raise seven children of which Nirum was the eldest. He would have been only sixteen years old when he heard the news of the gold rush in California and arrived there in 1855. As a young man, Cadwallader would work his way up the chain at the Milton Mining Company, getting much necessary experience. He is believed to have moved to San Jose in 1881 after having been involved in quicksilver mining in San Jose.

Cadwallader donated five acres of land for a school in Evergreen as early as 1860 and possibly additional land for future schools. Mr. Nirum Cadwallader, for whom the school is named, donated the lands to both the Evergreen Schoolhouse at the corner of San Felipe and Evergreen Roads and to the Women's Relief Corps in 1887 located on Cadwallader Avenue which used to run all the way through to San Felipe. Cadwallader is mentioned in Clyde Arbuckle's 'History of San Jose' as "Being a wealthy mining man and having donated land for several projects in San Jose" Too often we forget the importance of place names. Thanks to Pat Loomis' 'Signposts' book, our place and street names are not lost forever.

Existing home sales surge; highs not see since 2007

S. home resales rose to the highest level in more than a decade in March, as reported by The National Association of Realtors (NAR)

Existing home sales climbed 4.4 percent for the month, while economists were expecting a smaller increase of 2.5 percent, according to Thomson Reuters consensus estimates.

Home sales have now increased to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 5.71 million units, the highest level the gauge has seen since February 2007.

Demand for existing homes is outweighing supply, as housing inventory is down 6.6 percent from one year ago.

Properties typically remained on the market for 34 days in March, compared to 45 days in February, the NAR added.

The NAR's existing home sales data measures sales and prices of existing single-family homes for the nation overall, providing breakdowns for the West, Midwest, South and Northeast regions of the U.S.

New online service for replacement Social Security Cards in California

ost or misplaced your Social Security Number (SSN) card? You can now order you SSN through the Social Security Administration's (SSA) website: ssa.gov

"California residents can replace their SSN card online, without having to travel to a Social Security Office," said DMV Director Jean Shiomoto. "That is an added benefit to our DMV customers."

The DMV collaborated with the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrations (AAMVA) and the SSA on the innovative benefit. The online service is available to California residents through the SSA's my Social Security portal at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount.

Residents in California and 16 other states including the District of Columbia currently have the online card replacement option. The SSA is gradually rolling out the service in other states.

U.S. citizens age 18 or older and who are residents of California can request a replacement SSN card online by creating a my Social Security account. In addition, they must have a U.S. domestic mailing address, not require a change to their record (such as a name change), and have a valid driver's license, or state identification card in participating states.

In addition to California residents replacing their SSN card through the portal, current Social Security beneficiaries can also make adjustments to their accounts.

Movie Review: Gifted

n a small town near Tampa,

seven-year-old Mary Adler shows remarkable mathematical talent on her first day of school; she has already mastered advanced calculus.

Adler is offered a scholarship to a private school for gifted children. However, her uncle and de facto

guardian, Frank, turns it down, fearing that it will deny Mary a chance at a "normal" childhood.

What follows is a custody battle where the adult players remain very civilized to each other throughout; even though Mary is freaking at the possibility of being separated from her uncle. Their bond remains interesting and funny throughout, as their conversations exploit but don't oversell Mary's precociousness. "Is there a God?" she asks Frank during one of their conversations. "I don't know," he says, trying to be earnest and honest. "Just tell me," she eye-rolls.

Mary's mother, Diane, had been a genius mathematician, dedicated to the Navier-Stokes problem (one of the unsolved Millennium Prize Problems). In the movie, the scientific community called Diane one of the greatest scientific and mathematic minds in the history of mankind. In the movie, they displayed on a wall seven of the Millennium Prize Problems. Only above the Poincare conjecture problem was there a portrait of Grigori Perelman. All the other six unsolved problems had no portrait listed above them.

Millennium Prize Problems

- P versus NP Problem
- Hodge conjecture
- Poincaré conjecture (solved)
- Riemann hypothesis
- Yang-Mills existence and mass
 gap
- Navier–Stokes existence and smoothness
- Birch and Swinnerton-Dyer conjecture

(Movie Reviewer personal note) In 2016, I filed a patent solving all the remaining six Millennium Prize Problems. I believe that my algorithm provides not only efficient Solutions to Millennium Prize problems but also solves many other important problems, such as problems in binary protein structure prediction and spurs considerable advances in life sciences and biotechnology. But such changes may pale in significance compared to the revolution an efficient method for solving non-binary NPcomplete problems would cause in mathematics itself.

In the movie "Gifted," Evelyn, Frank's estranged mother (and Mary's maternal-grandmother), seeks to gain custody of Mary and move her to Massachusetts, believing that Mary is a "one-in-a-billion" mathematical genius who should be specially tutored in preparation for a life devoted to mathematics. Frank, who was a professor at Boston College was deemed by the State Courts not to be intelligent enough or wealthy enough to raise his niece.



(Movie Reviewer personal note) I recently had the same experience when the State Court presided over by Judge Dylan Sullivan in El Dorado County, California ruled that my sister, myself, and our family nurse were not qualified to take care of our mother in a home that my father bought for her before he passed away. The State took our mother and placed her into a nursing home against her wishes and the wishes of her family. Today, the State will not allow any member of our family to talk to her, visit her, or tell us where she is being held captive. My mother told our family many times over the years that it was her greatest wish to spend her last dying breath in her home with her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren watching and praying over her.

Frank, in the movie "Gifted" is adamant that his sister would want Mary to be in a normal public school and have the childhood she didn't have. After it emerges that Frank doesn't have medical insurance, he accepts a

compromise brokered by his lawyer allowing Mary to be placed in foster care and attend the private school where Evelyn wanted to have her enrolled. However, the foster home is within driving distance of Frank's home, and Mary will be able to decide where she wants to live after her 12th birthday.

Frank later finds out that Evelyn provided the foster care home with financial support prior to the State Court ruling and is overseeing Mary's education and has also taken up residence in the guest house of Mary's foster home. He then reveals to Evelyn that Diane had solved the Navier-Stokes problem, but stipulated that the solution was to be withheld until after Evelyn's death. Knowing that it meant everything to Evelyn to see Diane solve the problem, Frank offers to publish Diane's work if she drops her objection to him having custody of Mary. Evelyn reluctantly agrees because the only thing that really matters to her in life was solving one of the Millennium Prize Problems.

I cried when I left this movie for this review because it hit home on multiple fronts.





Tips to sleep better during allergy season

Spring is the season of renewal Plants and trees start to rebound from the harsh winter that claimed most of their leaves and vegetation. Birds return from their Southern vacations, serenade us with their morning songs and rebuild their nests in preparation for new arrivals.

Unfortunately, there is another renewal that many people don't look forward to in the spring: the return of hay fever season along with symptoms such as sneezing and sniffling that can give you sleepless nights.

In an allergy survey conducted by HayMax whaymax.us, 92 percent of respondents said their hay fever symptoms affect their work, school or daily routine, which includes sleep patterns.

"The trick to sleeping well when you suffer from hay fever is to reduce the amount of pollen getting into your body at night," says Max Wiseberg, creator of HayMax Allergen Barrier Balm.

People can tolerate a certain amount of pollen without reaction, he says, but once this amount is exceeded – called the trigger level – hay fever symptoms start to occur. Stay below this level at night, you won't get the symptoms and your sleep won't be affected. Go above it and that's when the trouble starts.

Wiseberg offers a few tips on how to avoid reaching that trigger level, allowing you to rest easy at night.

- Keep bedding and fabrics clean. Vacuum the house regularly, especially beds and fabrics, such as bed covers and curtains, to remove pollen, dust and pet allergen particles. Wash bedding regularly to remove allergens and dry them indoors rather than on a clothes line to prevent pollen particles being blown onto them by the wind.
- Keep the house closed from the outside world. Close windows and use an air conditioner, preferably with a HEPA (High Efficiency Particle Arresting) filter to capture pollen and dust particles, as well as cool and circulate the air.
- Have a nightly routine before bed. Shower at night before skeeping to remove pollen particles and pet hair from your hair and body. Clear the nasal passages with water, or use a saline nasal spray, to clear pollen from the nose. Finally, apply an allergen barrier balm to the nostrils and

around the bones of the eyes to trap pollen, dust and pet allergens before they enter the body.

• Ensure that pets are well groomed. If you own a pet, shampoo it as much as possible to remove pet allergens and pollen particles, or ban it from the bedroom completely.

"Loss of sleep because of hay fever is very significant, as it can impact how a person functions the next day at school or at work," Wiseberg says. "The effect of sleep deprivation on productivity and health loses costs companies billions of dollars each year."
