



Continued from page 1 of the accident, when monitoring his webcam, he noticed that the mom was no longer there.

It was confirmed that the mom was killed in a hit-and-run accident on Almaden Expressway. Rossi contacted the Wildlife Center of Silicon Valley to inform them of the five orphaned coyote pups and continued to monitor the Den.

A group of wildlife experts went out to the property in an attempt to rescue the coyotes. After four days, they were finally able to extract all of the pups and bring them to the Wildlife Center of Silicon Valley's Hospital Manager at 10:30 p.m. on Sunday, May 7.

Ashley Kinney. The Center's Hospital Manager, conducted the initial intake exam and found that "in

addition to being orphaned, the pups were severely dehydrated and covered in fleas. These coyotes will most likely need to be in our care until the fall. It is estimated that they are five-and-a-half to six weeks old. Natural dispersal of coyotes in the wild generally happens in the fall, as that is when they are fully weaned and able to fend for themselves."

The Wildlife Center of Silicon Valley is no stranger to receiving orphaned animals. With intake numbers exponentially increasing every day, the Center is in the height of their busy season, receiving up to sixty sick, injured, and orphaned animals per day.

Two days after the Center received the coyotes from the Rossi property, another coyote was hit by a car -- this time, at the intersection of Hellyer Avenue and Embedded Way near the Sportsplex.

San Jose Animal Care Center brought the injured coyote the Wildlife Center and it was discovered that she was lactating. Unfortunately, she didn't make it due to the





severity of her injuries. After posting this info on social media, 390 people had shared the post by the end of the day in an attempt to help find the orphaned pups.

Those living and working in the area near Silver Creek Country Club are on the bokout for the orphaned coyotes; and are calling the Center (408-929-WILD) whenever there is a sighting.

This misunderstood, and often disliked, native mammal is a part of our local environment. In addition to rehabilitating them, the Wildlife Center of Silicon Valley is one of the few advocates that work on a daily basis to help educate the public on ways to positively coexist with our covote neighbors.

The WCSV is a leased facility of the Santa Clara Parks & Recreation Department, funded in part by support from the City of San Jose, the City of Milpitas, The city of Sunnyvale and the Silicon Valley Animal Control Authority.

At a recent Almaden Valley Community Association meeting, Allen unveiled the district's 2017-2020 Strategic Plan. Among its objectives is providing a high-quality, comprehensive instructional program. "We want to make sure students feel empowered, safe, and secure," says Allen, "and that parents have all the information they need to become more engaged."

A new, more informative SIUSD website will be launched in August, coinciding with the new school year. Featured on the district's website will be their new logo, which consists of multi-colored circles surrounding a U-shaped shield. The shield represents safety and the "U" stands for the unified school district. The circles represent the district's stakeholders: students, parents, teachers, staff and com-

The district tasks itself with demonstrating effective, efficient and exemplary practices in all

divisions, departments and schools. To Allen | that means, "Do your job. Do it well and go above and beyond."

Attracting, recruiting, supporting and retaining a highly effective and diverse worklive here."

demonstrating cost-effective budget management. "With the budget, we want to make sure we're spending money wisely and putting it in the right places," says Allen. With equity policy, the district seeks to ensure that teachers and staff receive professional development and that every student has an equal opportunity to succeed. Using a baseball fence analogy to drive his point home, Allen says to imagine a tall child being able to see over a fence. With the help of a box, a shorter child can also see over the fence. However, the district takes equality one-step further. "Equality means taking away the fence and making sure there are no obstacles," says Allen, "so that everyone has an equal opportunity to see the game and be in the game."

Residents expressed concern with the status of education, graduation rates and declining enrollment.

Allen says that SJUSD's 87 percent graduation rate and 50 percent college readiness is similar to other comparable districts. To make a difference early on with reading readiness and education, SJUSD is adding transitional kindergarten classes and offering preschool at 11 district schools.

Like other districts, SJUSD is experiencing declining enrollment due to socioeconomic factors. "People can't afford to live here and are moving out," says Allen. "It's something we have to address, but can't control." Due to a decline in funding, tied in with their number of students, Allen says that the school dis-

trict will have to adjust, switching around teaching and staff positions. They hope to avoid many lavoffs due to attrition and retirement. However, they are still trying to recruit teachers for math and science. "We'll see how it all shakes out," says Allen. "We're doing everything we can to align our resources, look at staffing sheets, shift things around and view this as an opportunity."

When asked by residents if illegal immigrants affect enrollment, Allen notes that the

district doesn't track immigration status. "The bigger concern is how it affects education," he says. "We make sure students know their rights and that they're in a safe space where they can get a quality education. We try to allay fears of INS raids and deportation. We're also hoping for more clarity from the federal government on policy."

Residents asked if private and charter schools are responsible for public school's declining enrollment and if public schools now mainly serve lower-income students. "The cost of living and students moving out of the area affects it more," says Allen. "We

suffer from having a broad geographic base, including areas with a lack of diversity economically, but we have a large population of middle and upper class students as well. A lot of parents want to send their kids to neighborhood schools."

Allen also outlined recent bond projects (which fund brick and mortar physical projects). Measure H allocates \$290 million for upgrades to school facilities and classrooms. "About \$180 million has been issued so far," says Allen. "Paint and new carpet make everyone feel more comfortable and successful." The district office is also undergoing a remodel, which includes relocating SJUSD's Enrollment Center from its Pearl Ave. address in June, making one stop shopping for parents.

Measure H bond projects include updating high school aquatic and Performing Arts centers. Before planning and construction, a Blue Ribbon board will examine the district's six high schools, set a standard and bring all the facilities to that standard.


The district has earmarked \$15 million for solar energy projects at 25 school sites (\$13 million is from Clean Renewable Energy Bonds). "The solar panels will save \$50 million over the next 25 years," says Allen. They provide shade as well, which is lacking at some schools

Bond Measure Y, an eight-year, \$72 parcel tax passed in November 2016, generates \$5 million a year for school staff and programs. Exemption applications for seniors are due

Allen urges the community to become more involved with School Site Councils and Citizens' Bond Oversight Committees, as well as with the school district. SJUSD Board of Education meetings are held on Thursday nights at 6 p.m. at 855 Lenzen Ave., SJ 95126. Upcoming meetings are scheduled for June 1 and 15.

"We're trying to actively reach out as much as possible," says Allen. "It's incumbent on us to give you more information and to be more present in the community. It's important for our community to be involved and to speak out."

#### **Route 87 congestion to be studied**

t my request, the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) and the City of San Jose have entered into a partnership to study traffic congestion on the State Route 87 corridor between State Route 85

and US 101, along with potential technology-related solutions to this challenge. The study is funded with \$150,000 from the VTA and \$75,000 from the City of San Jose.

The enhancements would focus on operational treatments, assessments of all modes of travel, and programs that could be implemented to encourage

commuters to consider modes other than driving solo. This could include use of shoulders on ramps and/or the mainline as travel lanes during certain times of the day.

The longer-term goal is to identify enhancements for possible inclusion in future updates of the VTA's Valley Transportation Plan. In April 2017, VTA started the study with a review of existing traffic conditions. The VTA is reaching out to City staff to discuss details on the scope of the study and provide an update on what has been learned to date. The study is projected to be completed by the end of the 2017 calendar year.

#### **Jocelyn Horng**



#### **Senior Tax Exemption**

**School Parcel Taxes** 

Most school districts in the valley have recently passed parcel taxes with built-in exemptions for Seniors who live in their districts. This means that Seniors meeting the following \*criteria can file for the exemption and not have to pay the added tax. \*CRITERIA: (1) You must be 65+ years of age; (2) You must own the property; and, (3) You must live in the property.

#### IF YOU DO NOT FILE YOU WILL HAVE TO PAY THE TAX.

The amount you save will depend on the school district where you live.

#### **Mortgage applications** rise as more home buyers hit the spring market

ortgage volume is improving again as more home buyers are entering contracts for the spring housing market.

Total mortgage application volume increased 2.4 percent on a seasonally adjusted basis last week from the previous week, according to the Mortgage Bankers Association.

"Continuing strength in the job market and improving consumer confidence drove overall purchase applications to increase last week," said MBA economist Joel Kan. "The index for purchase applications reached its highest level since the beginning of October 2015, which was the week prior to the implementation of the federal government's 'know before you owe' rule."

Mortgage rates have been inching higher in general and have only moved lower on three out of the past 15 business days, according to Mortgage News Daily.
