The new memorial to fallen officers on the front lawn of the Aitkin County Courthouse was dedicated on May 15.

In 1932 and 2015, Aitkin County law enforcement officers were shot and killed in the line of duty. In between,

three more officers died on the job through accident and injury.

These five fallen officers were honored on May 15

with a dedication and the placing of wreaths near a new memorial stone placed on the front lawn of the Aitkin County Courthouse.

Officers included James Harney, a federal prohibition officers, shot by moonshiners in September 1932; Russell Nelson, a conservation officer who died in September of 1975; Benjamin Christensen, an Aitkin Police officer who died in August of 1979; Thomas Wyatt, a Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension agent who died in a car accident near McGregor

in March of 2004 and Steve Sandberg, an Aitkin County Sheriff's Deputy who died in St. Cloud in October 2015 while guarding another Aitkin County man at the St. Cloud Hospital.

Over a hundred people were gathered for the ceremony held on National Peace Officers Memorial Day, which was signed into law by President John F. Kennedy in

Hunter's attorney asks questions and reveals information about case

Attorney Ed Shaw asked questions and revealed some information about the case against his client, Crosby Mayor Jim Hunter.

Shaw said it was extremely unusual to have the investigation of a city official being done by the police department of that city. He said it is usually handled by a sheriff's department or police department from another town.

"You're not going to have the Minneapolis police investigating the Minneapolis mayor," Shaw said. "Why is no one from outside leading this? I would say because no one from the outside would bring a case, because the evidence isn't there."

Swindle sham

Hunter recalled some of the history of the business relating to the sale of Buy Sell Trade to Candice and Tom McCartan in July 2016. He said that Candice had worked for him for two years. A problem arose when a customer came into Buy Sell Trade inquiring about marijuana. Candice McCartan referred the customer to her now ex-husband, Tom; and the purchase of marijuana was made later at the McCartan's home.

Hunter said he found out about the transaction about a week later from the person that bought the marijuana. He told Candice that he "couldn't have that" activity going on in the store. Hunter told Candice, if the activity continued, he would have to let her go and close the business. It was at that time he suggested an idea of the McCartans purchasing the business. After about a week, the McCartans decided they were interested in purchasing Buy Sell Trade, so Hunter had an attorney, Charles Barnum, draw up an agreement.

Following a full inventory of Buy Sell Trade and a meeting with both Tom and Candice at their home. Hunter gave a copy of the agreement to the McCartans for them to review. In the agreement, a sale price of \$90,000 was established for the inventory, shelving, equipment like pop machines, cash register, copy machine and including a new cash machine worth \$4,000 plus \$3,000 cash inside and a business with monthly cash flow between \$9,000-\$13,000.

Hunter said the sale did not include the building.

The McCartans house valued at \$46,000 was used as collateral on the note. Later in the divorce agreement filed on February 27, 2017 Tom McCartan was to pay Candice \$23,000 from loan proceeds or sale of their home. Tom McCartan will be released from his obligation to purchase Buy Sell Trade once payment is made.

Hunter said when asked about the transaction, "Tom McCartan never ever lost ten cents. He never invested any money, any money at all. In his divorce, I agreed to take him off that contract, if Candy would pay on the contract that money."

Lovers label

In clarifying his relationship with Candice, Hunter indicated there was no affair or living together. Candice had rented her own apartment before leaving Tom McCartan. **Assault twist**

A charge of second degree assault was made by Nick McCartan. According to Shaw, the complaint states that in September Nick and his friend had been out drinking at the Spalding and other bars. They then decided to pay Hunter and Nick's mother, Candice McCartan, a visit at Buy Sell Trade. Following some crude language directed at Hunter and Candice who were both in Hunter's truck, which was parked outside the business, Nick claims Hunter pointed a gun towards the truck door he was standing by.

Shaw said, Hunter, age 67 at the time, felt threatened by the two men in their twenties. According to Hunter the two men had been there twice that night. The second time they aggressively tried to open his truck door. The gun served as a deterrent and was pointed toward the front of the truck, never at Nick or his friend.

Hunter said, a third event occurred at the Roadside Restaurant in Aitkin when Nick blocked Hunter from getting into his truck. Hunter asked Candy to call the police and then Nick drove off in his vehicle.

Shaw said, even if you believe Nick's assault story, why does he keep seeking Hunter out, even after the court placed an order for protection against Nick and his dad Tom last fall? Shaw said Nick didn't claim he was a victim of this alleged assault until months after the events. Shaw wondered why didn't the law enforcement investigation include looking into the amount of alcohol consumed by Nick prior to these events and why was the order of protection not followed?

Missing Firearm

Hunter said that there is a firearm that is missing from the inventory from his home. The only gun not accounted for is his duty weapon a .357 Smith and Wesson revolver, holster that was removed from the head of his bed in his home. Hunter had it from when he worked for the City of Holly in Colorado as a Transportation Officer and Deputy Coroner.

Pull tabs and vehicle sales

According to Shaw, the details of the charges relating to pull tabs and vehicle sales are at this point not clear. Shaw said the records he has been reviewing do not have any evidence of wrong doing.

"And Mr. Hunter never charged any interest in the sale of the vehicles on payments, just a document fee," Shaw said.

"Accusations are easy," Shaw said, "A lot of backstory on this. Obviously, Tom McCartan, we know, a bitter extremely angry ex-husband. You get the leadership from the Crosby Police Department, the Lieutenant and the Chief jump all over this. They never liked Mr. Hunter from the get go. They weren't happy to see him elected."

Shaw said at this point he has not been provided the discovery or supporting documents of the evidence in the case against Mr. Hunter.

He said he plans to file next week that all charges be dismissed. Included in that filing he will also request that the interview videos of Tom and Nick McCartan be released for public inspection.

Shaw said, "I want the whole world to see what those videos are. Not just rely on the Crosby Police Chief and Police Lieutenant summary of what was said in those interviews. Because, frankly, the summary doesn't match up with what I've seen in the interviews."

Traffic delays will be short, similar to standard lights. Obeying the law, by stopping on the red light, waiting and then continuing at the advisory speed when the light turns green will help keep you and the workers in the work zone safe.

The portable signal lights improve safety by reducing the need for human flaggers standing in the road to control traffic flow. The lights are more universally recognized and less confusing to motorists than flaggers are.

"We stand ground with those members of the law enforcement community and bless this dedication to honor officers who sacrificed their lives for the well-being of the community."


