Governor goes to school

EL-G Schools host visit from top Wisconsin official

Students and staff members of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Elementary and Middle Schools paid host to an important dignitary Thursday, May 11.

Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker toured the school as part of a statewide effort to highlight the historic K-12 and rural school investments included in his biennial budget proposal.

Although the governor had his sights set on highlighting the budget package, he also made the tour more personal for the students, taking time to visit their classrooms and to speak to an all-school assembly.

Governor Walker was escorted on his school tour by the "school administrators for the day"—sisters Abby and Alyssa Tegen.

The governor stopped in to kindergarten classes and talked with students about their art projects. He shared a visit with the fourth graders, looking in on their social studies work, then whisked off to science classes where students were honed in on robotics projects.

At the school assembly, Governor Walker touted the importance of education, commending the quality teachers and principals that make the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah system work.

He recalled the importance of summer reading programs he participated in during his youth, and encouraged students to read during the summer months.

"Reading is a great way to see the world without ever leaving home," he told the

"Getting a good education is one of the most important things you can do. You help yourself and you help yourself prepare for a career," the 45th governor of Wisconsin told the student gathering.

Budget push

Governor Walker told the students that the proposed budget brings help to the more rural districts like their own.

The governor's budget lifts K-12 investment to \$11.5 billion over two years, an all-time high and includes \$649 million in new state aids for all K-12 schools in



One of the most frequent tasks we all face in our daily lives is the need to plan ahead—whether it be for that once in a lifetime overseas vacation or for what dress or suit to wear to a high school dance. We all face the need to plan for upcoming exciting events as well as for the routine requirements of our day-today existence.

The following questions may seem overly obvious to the frequent traveler, but they could make the difference between an exciting and fun-filled trip and the disaster of arriving at our destination without required medications or appropriate clothing for the weather. Regardless of age, we all have to plan our meals and the food needed to make those meals or to accompany them. When shopping for meats or vegetables, we frequently add other items to our grocery lists, even if they were not included in our original plan. Looking ahead need not dictate inflexibility or exclusions.

Planning is a function of living that all of us are to some extent dependent upon, whether we recognize it or not. Simple living requires at least some planning: When do we want to get up? Go to bed? What are we going to do today? If we shower, which soap and washcloth do we want to use? What are we going to wear? More specifically, what are our plans for the day? Where do we want to go if anywhere? Admittedly, routine actions determine many of our daily decisions, like the above. But when the option of choice enters the picture, then planning also has its role.

So? What are your plans for the day?








back on track and move it forward," Governor Walker said.

"Thanks to these reforms, we now have the Reform Dividend. The Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District, like every other school district in Wisconsin, is directly benefiting from these savings as we invest more money than ever before into K-12 education. One of the most important keys to the future success of our state is skilled workers and strong leaders, so it's crucial we provide them with the best education possible."

The Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District is estimated to receive more than \$1.4 million in funding from the state under Governor Walker's biennial budget, including:

An increase of \$269,988 in Per Pupil Aid. Governor Walker's budget proposal increases per-pupil funding by \$200 per pupil in Fiscal Year 2018 and \$204 per pupil in Fiscal Year 2019 - the largest increase since the 2005-2007 biennium.

An increase of \$105,792 in Sparsity Aid. Sparsity Aid provides \$300 per pupil of additional funding to small rural dis-



Though Kiel was the first location for Christel's Pet Supplies and More, Mary said that Plymouth's location was always part of their five-year plan.

Thanks to a nudge from Plymouth's downtown planners five years was reduced to two. "The downtown development manager came to us in August of 2015. We had a successful booth for Mill Street Days. The development manager came to us, found us a location and helped us with our business plan," she said.

Another factor that helped facilitate the growth plan was the availability of a ready and eager store manager in the person of Mary's daughter, Nadine Becker.

Food a staple product

The dog and cat food products are the staple for Christel's Pet Supplies & More.

"In addition, to being made here in Wisconsin, our pet food brands are known for their pet health benefits," Christel said. "These aren't the kind of products you would buy in a big box store. They are specially selected."

But, the selections of items help please pets and their owners in many other ways.

Treats for dogs and cats top the list of accessory products, along with leashes, collars, chew and play toys, stain and odor removers, flea and tick sprays to name a few.

About 95 percent of the items are manufactured in the US, with a handful from

Canada. Christel acknowledged that one leash variety is made in China, but she made the exception to feature it, since the firm was started by a US veteran.

Other forms of animal-friendly items include fair-trade constructed bird houses, and garden art items that are sold to benefit various animal rescue programs.

Christel's Pet Supplies & More believes in supporting rescue organizations.

"Almost monthly we hold some type



of event, at one or both of the stores, that benefits Pur-Fect Match Animal Rescue, ranging from nail clipping, to pet photos to specials on cookies, donating the proceeds," Mary said. "We plan to continue and expand our events for this rescue with a Poker ride this fall called 'Hogs for Dogs' (tentative date is Saturday, September 16, 2017) and a Jingle Bell Walk in December."

For now, the store staff is comfortable in their location on the sunny side of Mill

Street in Plymouth and Fremont Street in Kiel. Although expanding the Plymouth site may be in future plans, Christel said the most important thing is to "focus on providing exceptional customer service."





Cafe aims to be cultural Hub

Great coffee and a new community gathering place are blooming like a May flower in what was once an abandoned Plymouth automotive service building.

Hub Studio Cafe aims to bring its sense of community and sustainability to the Eastern Avenue site alongside the recently relocated Seranya Studios Art Boutique.

Local art now shares the same building with great coffee, tea and food, thanks to the vision of owner Susan Radke and her team.

A new member of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce, Hub Studio Cafe opened its doors in mid-May, offering breakfast, lunch and "items substantial enough to carry into dinner."

Sandwiches, paninis, pies, bakery, soup and salads are featured. But the mainstays for Hub Studio are great coffee and awesome tea.

Hub Studio Cafe also offers a slow bar, which is a unique way of brewing coffee.

French press, pour-overs and lattés are also on the menu.

Space and culture important

More important to Radke than the menu, is the kind of space and culture being offered through Hub Studio Cafe.

She wants the cafe to be a "hub" or central part of community. "We want this to be a beautiful community gathering place for co-workers, artists or other people who want to be part of something.

"Our goal is to be friendly enough that people will come here to meet friends and make friends," Radke said.

"We are hoping to do some really cool things, even allowing our customer to create art, perhaps. We want people to hang out in the cafe, and feel free to go into the artists space and beyond," she added.

An outdoor patio on the west side of the studio offers open-air space for socializing and relaxing.

Hub Studio Cafe comes complete with the convenience of wi-fi and device plugins, making it a perfect place to connect with the outside world.

The Hub Studio Cafe also looks to occasionally offer live bands and local musicians.

"We may also consider a little theater night, a poetry night or even some impromptu performances," Radke said.

Sustainability focus

Carrying over a sustainability focus from her art studio, Radke said the same culture will permeate the Hub Studio Cafe portion of her venture.

"Just like all of our artists are local, we want to be a leader in the community in terms of sustainability and reducing our footprint," she said.

Sustainability in Radke's eyes is a life style that allows harmony between land, people and community.

"We use things that are organic to the extent that is possible," and our waste stream will be locally compostable and recyclable as a goal."

Radke said Hub Studio Cafe has a strong commitment to sourcing its products as much as possible from local small farmers. A commitment to natural and organic foods goes beyond sourcing, to a responsible use and re-use of materials.

"That's part of the leadership we hope we are creating here," she added.



In fact, the whole business location is a major community recycling project.

"Coffee grounds can be composted. We get our organic tea from a source that has pouches which can be composted," she said. "This makes growing and recycling a beautiful circle."

Not only are the products organic, Radke believes strongly in promoting the use of fair-trade items.

Reclaiming a building

Radke is using the presence of Seranya and Hub Studio Cafe to reclaim a building and lot that once housed an automotive service business. Owner Brian Zurn has been a strong partner with Radke to convert a former automotive service business into an interesting and functional space for the twin businesses.

"The building had been empty for 10 years, and we are excited to be giving it a new life," Radke said.

The owner of the former downtown Plymouth art boutique had been looking for a location to expand.

After driving by the building, she happened to stop for a peek inside. Seeing a ceiling tile askew, she notice an amazing wood ceiling. "I knew this had to become the place," she said.

That's when Radke jumped on the idea to move Seranya Studios from its former East Mill Street location to the corner of Eastern and Highland Avenues.

Carrying over philosophy

Radke first opened Seranya Studio in 2013.

Hub Studio Cafe is being opened with the help of two of her daughters, who have a combined 20 years of experience in food service

"It's great to have my two daughters here and bringing them into the purpose and vision we see for Hub Studio Cafe," she said

Hub Studio Cafe will be open seven days a week. Most days the cafe will be open from 6 a.m. until at least 7 p.m. Sundays hours will start later and conclude by 4 p.m.







Old World charm for the ages

Nestled on both sides of County Road A just a short distance east of Elkhart Lake is St. John's Cemetery. On the south side is the new section with its first burial in the mid 1900's. On the north side is the older section with its earlier burials dating back to the mid 1800's.

It is on the older section that improvements have been made with funding generously given by a lady who has developed a sense of belonging to our charming village and its surrounding area.

Visits with her husband to his family's gravesite, as well as leisurely sunset walks through the cemetery, became lessons in community history as the names on the memorial stones became persons known to her husband while he grew up in Elkhart Lake. Some contributed considerably with their civic involvement, but most were just common folk whose lives were woven together through work and love.

After her husband's death several years ago, further visits became an inspiration to preserve the somewhat old-world charm of St. John's not only in its landscaping, but also with a new chapel-like storage building built for the ages.

Construction began in late summer of 2016, with the stonework completed this spring. New plantings and flowers will enhance the site as St. John's "residents" now have a cemetery that continues to offer a quaint and comforting charm to its visitors.

As you and your children take flowers to relatives' grave sites this spring, or at any other time of the year, take a few minutes—or longer—to meditate not only on the lives of those near and dear to you, but also on the lives of those names you recognize on other memorial stones. Help your children to absorb some family and community history while they walk around, unknowingly enjoying your togetherness and the peace you share.

The voices of those buried at our cemeteries have been silenced, but those of us who remain have a responsibility to keep their spirit—their history alive for future generations. We also have a responsibility in maintaining the cemetery-shared areas as a tribute to our ancestors and others who have laid the foundations for our lives today. Volunteers in this endeavor would be appreciated.





Our lake has important rules!

Question: The no wake rule for Elkhart is only in effect once the buoys are out.

Answer: Wrong. The no wake rule from 7:30 p.m. to 10 a.m. is in effect all year!

With the fishing and boating season getting started, it is probably a good time to review the rules that we have all likely looked at many times, but don't always exactly remember.

For example: No person operating a motorboat that is towing persons engaged in water skiing, aquaplaning or similar activity may operate the motorboat within 100 feet of any occupied anchored boat, or any personal watercraft or any marked swimming area or public boat landing.

No person may operate a personal watercraft within 100 feet of any of the following:

1. A motorboat towing a person who is engaged in water skiing, aquaplaning or similar activity. 2. The towrope of a motorboat towing a person who is engaged in water skiing, aquaplaning or similar activity. 3. A person who is engaged in water skiing, aquaplaning or similar activity.

There is no question that with the congestion on the lake this is almost impossible, but, that is the rule, and use of good judgment by all is required. The traffic level on the lake, as well as the size of the boats involved, has been steadily increasing. Larger boats, drawing deeper in the water, create more potential for wave action causing shoreline erosion. Not many of us think about that.

Keeping the lake safe for all who use it is one of the key goals of the Elkhart Lake Improvement Association. To this end, ELIA is working with the local police department to spend up to 400 hours patrolling the lake in 2017. This represents approximately 25 percent more hours on the water for enforcement officials who are there to help preserve a safe environment. And, to be there when help is needed!

Take a minute and review the rules. If you have friends coming to the area, be sure they know the rules. If you rent to people who use the lake, make sure a copy of the rules is posted where they can see them.

Observe Wisconsin Boating Laws

- Wisconsin Statutes prohibit the transmission of invasive species. Any boat or boat trailer or boating equipment must be clean and free from any invasive aquatic plants or animals. Zebra Mussels and Eurasian Water Milfoil are habitants of Elkhart Lake, please clean off your boats!
- No person under the age of 10 can operate a motorboat. A Boating Safety education certificate is required of anyone over the age of 16 years of age. (Wisconsin
- All recreational vehicles must have Wisconsin Registration numbers and expiration decals visible. With exception to sailboats under 12 feet length, manually







Wade House to honor Wright

In 2017, Wade House Historic Site will celebrate the 150th birthday of famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright with seasonlong exhibits, lectures, and educational activities focusing on Wright's life and work in Wisconsin and his relationship with Sheboygan carriage collector and restoration expert Wesley W. Jung.

The next event in Wade House's celebration of Frank Lloyd Wright will be a 150th Birthday Celebration which will take place on Thursday, June 8 from 6-9 p.m. The festivities will include an exhibit opening, lecture and book signing.

The highlights of our 6 p.m. "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original" exhibit opening include: The Wright Carriage Exhibit - A display of horsedrawn carriages owned and used by Mr. Wright from the Site's Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum collection including Mr. Wright's 1890 roof-seat omnibus. A Taliesin Album - An exhibit featuring rare photographs from 1911-12 of the construction of Taliesin, prior to its substantial destruction by fire in 1914. Young Masters Workshop - Architectural toys, books and activities for children located in the Museum including sets of Mr. Wright's beloved "Froebel" blocks which first captured the famed architect's imagination as a child and influenced his future work.

The exhibit opening will be followed by a beer and light hors d'oeuvres reception, which will precede a 7 p.m. lecture by Ron McCrea. During his presentation, Mc-Crea, author of Building Taliesin: Frank Lloyd Wright's Home of Love and Loss, will describe the love affair and personal drama of Wright and Mamah Borthwick Cheney that began in Italy in 1910 and led to the creation of the first Taliesin, their "Shining Brow" hillside retreat near Spring Green, Wisconsin, in 1911. Mc-Crea's presentation will include many never-before-published photos and recent discoveries. Ron will chronicle the turbulent life lived at Taliesin and the creative work accomplished by Wright and Cheney until it ended in disaster with the fire and mass murder of August 15, 1914. The lecture will be followed by a book signing with Ron McCrea. Copies of McCrea's Building Taliesin: Frank Lloyd Wright's Home of Love and Loss will be available for purchase in the Wade House gift shop.

Ron McCrea is an award-winning

newspaper journalist who has appeared in Frank Lloyd Wright documentaries including the Travel Channel's "Monumental Mysteries," the E! Entertainment Network's "Mysteries & Scandals," and the British Broadcasting Corporation's "Frank Lloyd Wright: Murder, Myth and Modernism." He publishes regularly in the Frank Lloyd Wright Quarterly magazine, and lectures in Wisconsin for his publisher, the Wisconsin Historical Society Press. A second Wright book by Ron, Frank Lloyd Wright and the Power of Women, is due for publication in 2018. Before retiring from newspapering in 2008, Ron worked as an editor for the Madison Capital Times, The Boston Globe, the Washington Post and Star, the San Jose Mercury News, and New York Newsday. He was the press secretary for Wisconsin Governor Tony Earl during his administration, and recently completed nine years of service as a non-architect member of the board of AIA-Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Society of Architects.



Elkhart Lake Village Report

Emerald Ash Borer in Village

On Friday, April 21, the presence of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) was identified and confirmed in the Village of Elkhart Lake, on Village-owned property along Highway 67 south of the Fire Station. Elkhart Lake now joins a growing list of Wisconsin communities where the insect has been detected.

Sheboygan County, which includes Elkhart Lake, has been under an EAB quarantine for the past few years, since the borer was found in the southern part of the County in July of 2014. Residents should be aware that it is illegal to move firewood out of the EAB quarantined area, as it is the primary means for the EAB to spread. It is best to keep firewood onsite. Homeowners who would like more information on EAB and the quarantine area, or are interested in determining whether they have an ash tree on their property and information on how they protect it from EAB, should visit the State of Wisconsin's official website, www.emeraldashborer. wi.gov, and click on the link for Homeowners. Additional information on the EAB is also available at Village Hall.

In preparation for the EAB, Elkhart Lake has not planted ash trees on Village Parkways or in Village Parks since 2007. The Village's Tree Commission has been proactive in identifying the ash trees located in parkways and parks. There are less than 50 ash trees in these areas. The Tree Commission has completed treatment of the eight ash trees located in Village Square Park. These treated trees will not have to be retreated for at least two years and there is a possibility that the treatment may prove to last for an additional year. The rest of our parkway ash trees will be removed proactively based on the health of the tree. Any ash tree in our parks or parkway that becomes a safety hazard will be removed. The Village will continue to diversify the trees that are planted throughout the Village. The Village has begun "shadow" planting trees in the park and will continue this planting procedure as much as possible over the next few years.

The emerald ash borer is a major threat to Wisconsin's trees. Once present in an area, the EAB kills all untreated ash trees within a few years. Even young, healthy ash trees are killed within three-five years of infestation. Whenever making choices for EAB prevention and treatment, homeowners and commercial industries should review the latest research and decisionmaking tools available. The Village will strive to continue diversification of the trees along the parkways. There is no solution to stopping the spread of EAB and no way in which to eradicate the EAB. Citizens concerned with the condition of an ash tree are encouraged to contact a tree service they are familiar with or an ISA certified arborist. A listing of certified arborists may be found on www.waa-isa.org.

Property owners should take these measures:

• Keep a close watch on ash trees for signs of possible EAB infestation: Thinning in the canopy, D-shaped holes in the bark, new branches sprouting low on the

- Consider preventive treatments for property within 15 miles of a known infestation. Whether to treat depends on several factors: the age of the trees, the size of the trees, and the number of trees. Treatment costs vary depending on size of the tree and whether you do the treatments yourself or hire a professional.
- Consider planting different species of trees that are not susceptible to EAB.
- Homeowners should visit www.emeraldashborer.wi.gov or contact the WI Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection at 1-800-462-2803 if they would like more information on EAB and the quarantine area, or are interested in determining whether they have an ash tree on their property and information on how they protect it from EAB.


Recycling and Trash Removal



Why ban items from the landfill and incinerator?

The items on this list are made of materials that can be reused in new products. Some also have toxic components that we do not want in our groundwater, air or soil. Recycling and composting allow landfills to last longer, provide markets with valuable reusable materials, create jobs, and prevent pollution.

Why not ban more materials?

Corrugated cardboard is banned while waxed cardboard is not. Some things with plugs, like computers, are banned, while others, like toasters, are not. Why? Current bans cover some of the most easily reusable or most toxic materials on the market today. Eventually more items may be added to this list as new recycling markets develop or the types of materials we throw away change.

Boating Regulations

- Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.
- A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 p.m.-10 a.m. each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining
- Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.
- No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.
- · All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).
- NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the third Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.
- There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 m.p.h. on the water.
- A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc., and during the times of high-volume boat activity.




